An Act for increasing the Fund for watching, lighting, cleansing, watering, and repairing Blackfriars [27th June 1812.]

HEREAS by an Act passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, intituled 29 G.2. c. 86. An Act for building a Bridge cross the River Thames, from Blackfriars in the City of London, to the opposite Side in the County of Surry; the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London, in Common Council assembled, were authorized and empowered to build the said Bridge, and to preserve and maintain the same when built: And whereas by another Act passed in the Seventh Year of His present Majesty's Reign; intituled An Act for completing the Bridge cross the River Thames, 7 G.3. c. 37. from Blackfriars in the City of London; to the opposite Side in the County of Surry, and the Avenues thereto on the London Side, for redeeming the Tolls on the said Bridge and on London Bridge, for rebuilding the Gaol of Newgate in the said City, for repairing the Royal Exchange within the same, for embanking Part of the North Side of the said River within certain Limits, and for further continuing towards those Purposes the Imposition of Sixpence per Chaldron or Ton of Coals and Culm imported into the Port of the said City, established by an Act of the Fifth and Sixth Years of the Reign of King William and Queen Mary; and also for carrying on the new Pavements in the City and Liberties of Westminster and Parishes adjacent, and in the Town and Borough of Southwark, and for other Purposes therein mentioned; the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons, in Common Council assembled, were authorized and empowered to inclose and embank the Ground and Soil of the River Thames, between the West Corner of Powell's Wharf, near Puddle Dock, in the said City of London, and the East Corner of Robert's Wharf, near Milford Lane, in the County of Middlesex; and were further authorized and empowered to borrow and raise, in Manner therein mentioned, a certain Sum of Money upon the Credit of the said Fund, so by the said Act [Loc. & Per.]

5 % 6 W. & of the Fifth and Sixth Years of King William and Queen Mary (intituled An Act for Relief of the Orphans and other Creditors of the City of Lindon) established; Part thereof to be applied in defraying the Exp-nce of embanking so much of the North Side of the said River, within the Limits aforesaid, as should be embanked by virtue of the said Act; and the Residue of such Part of the said Sum of Money (if any) after defraying such Expences, to be applied in Manner therein mentioned, as Part of a Fund for lighting, watching, cleansing, and repairing the said then intended Bridge; and the Soil and Ground of the said River Thames, which, by virtue of the said Act, should be so inclosed and embanked, was thereby charged with certain Quit Rents, which were thereby vested in and made payable to the Mayor, and Commonalty and Citizens of the faid City for ever; but to be respectively redeemable upon Payment to the Chamberlain of the said City for the Time being, of the Price or Value thereof, to be estimated as therein is mentioned; and it was further enacted, That all the Monies which should be so paid for the Redemption or Purchase of any Part of the said Quit Rents, and also the Residue, if any, (of fuch Part as aforesaid, of the Sum of Money so to be borrowed and raised as aforesaid) which might remain after defraying the Expence of the said Embankments, should be placed out at Interest, upon Government Securities, in the Name of the Chamberlain, Comptroller, and Town Clerk of the said City for the Time being; and the Interest or Dividends of the said Sums, so placed out at Interest, which should accrue before the Twenty-ninth Day of September One thousand seven hundred and seventy, and the said Quit Rents which in that Time should become due and payable, should in like Manner be placed out at Interest, in Addition to the said Principal Sums, and the Interest or Dividends of the said accumulated Sums, together with the Quit Rents which should not be redeemed and should accrue from and after the said Twenty-ninth Day of September One thousand seven hundred and seventy, should from Time to Time be issued and applied, and the same were thereby appropriated to. for, or towards the lighting, watching, cleansing, and repairing the said Bridge: And whereas the annual Produce of the Fund actually provided by the said last recited Act, amounts to no more than the Sum of One hundred and fixty-seven Pounds Eight Shillings and Tempence: And whereas by an Act passed in the Twenty-sixth Year of the Reign of His 26 G. 3. c. 37. present Majesty, intituled An Act for laying a Toll upon all Horses and Care riages passing on a Sunday over Blackfriars Bridge, and for applying the Money to arise thereby towards increasing the Fund for watching, lighting, cleansing, watering, and repairing the said Bridge, several Tolls and Duties, were granted to and vested in the said Mayor and Commonalty and Citizens of the City of London, and their Successors, for a certain Term, which expired on or about the Fourth Day of July One thousand eight hundred and eight: And whereas by an Act passed in the Forty-ninth 49G.3.c.171. Year of His present Majesty, intituled An Act for reviving, continuing, and amending an Att, passed in the Twenty-sixth Year of His present Masesty, for laying a Toll upon all Horses and Carriages passing on a Sunday over Blackfriars Bridge, and for applying the Money to arise thereby towards increasing the Fund for watching, lighting, cleansing, watering, and repairing the said Bridge, the said last recited Act, and the Tolls and Duties thereby granted, were revived from the Day of the passing thereof, and continued for the Term of One Year, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, which Term expired on or about the Twenty-fourth Day

of July last: And whereas inasmuch as the said Tolls have ceased, the Said yearly Sum of One hundred and sixty-seven Pounds Eight Shillings and Ten-pence only is applicable for the Support and Maintenance of the said Bridge, as well as the lighting, watching, paving, cleansing, and watering thereof; and as the same is quite insufficient, it is necessary and expedient that the said Fund provided for these Purposes by the said recited Act of the Seventh Year of His present Majesty should be increased: And whereas the laid Fund so by the said Act of the Fifth and Sixth Year of King William and Queen Mary established, called The Orphans Fund, (which was originally intended, together with the said Quit Rents, to provide a Fund for the Purposes aforesaid), and the Receipts and Disbursements thereof are under the Management and Direction of the Court of Mayor and Aldermen of the said City of London: And by Three Acts passed, One in the Twenty-first Year of His late Majesty King George the Second, 21 G. 2. c. 29 intituled An AEt for the further Relief of the Orphans and other Creditors of the City of London, and for other Purposes therein mentioned; another in the Seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, and herein-before in Part recited; and the other in the Forty-fourth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled An Act for raising an additional Sum of Money 44 G.3. c.27. for carrying into Execution several Acts for widening the Entrance into the City of London near Temple Bar, for making a more commodious Street at Snow Hill, and for raising on the Credit of the Orphans Fund eertain Sums of Money for those Purposes, and also for enlarging the Powers of the said Acts, the several Provisions for supporting the said Fund have been continued and augmented, and the Whole of the Rates and Charges applicable to the said Fund, from the Time of passing the said Act of the Seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, are to remain and continue until the Fifth Day of July, which will be in the Year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, when some of the said Rates and Duties are to cease; but the Sum of Ten thousand Pounds per Annum, by the said Acts of Parliament of the Fifth and Sixth Years of King Widliam and Queen Mary, and of the Twenty-first Year of His late Majesty King George the Second, charged upon or made payable out of the Revenues of or belonging to the said City of London, and certain other of the Rates and Charges therein also mentioned, are thereby continued until all the Principal Monies charged upon the faid Orphans Fund, together with Interest for the same, shall be paid off and annihilated: And whereas the Income of the said Fund called The Orphans Fund, hath for several Years past so much increased as to afford a reasonable Probability, that if the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons, in Common Council assembled, were enabled to raise the Sum of Twenty thousand Pounds for the Purpose's aforelaid, upon the Credit of the Surpluses to arise from the said Fund, fuch Surplusses will be amply sufficient to pay off such further Charge, together with the Whole of the Debt and Sums of Money already charged thereon, within the Time for swhich the said Fund is now continued by the Acts of Parliament aforesaid, or some of them; but the same cannot be done without the Aid and Authority of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That it shall be lawful for Common the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London, in Council em-Common Council assembled, at any Time or Times after the passing of to raise

Contributors to be entitled to redeemable Aunuities.

on the Credit this Act to borrow and raise by Annuities any Sum or Sums of Money not exceeding in the Whole the Sum of Twenty thousand Pounds upon the Credit of the said Fund, called The Orphans Fund, over and above the several Sums heretofore charged and now remaining due thereon; and all such Monies so to be raised shall be paid into the Receipt of the Chamber of the City of London, by such Instalments, in such Proportions, at such Times, and in such Manner, as the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons, in Common Council assembled, shall direct; and the Persons who shall contract to advance or contribute any Part of the said Monies, shall, in respect of the Sums which they shall so respectively advance, be entitled to Annuities at such Rates of Interest as the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons, in Common Council assembled, shall think reasonable, to commence from the Fifth Day of January One thousand eight hundred and twelve, to be payable Half Yearly, and continue until Redemption thereof by Payment of each tespective Principal Sum.

II. And be it further enacted, That the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons, in Common Council affembled, shall cause a Bond, or Note, or other Security in Writing, under the Common Seal of the said City, to be delivered to every Person advancing any Part of the said Monies for the Payment of such Annuities, in respect thereof, until redeemed, as is herein-after mentioned; which Bonds, Notes, or other Securities, shall be assignable by Indorsement.

The Orphans Fund charged with fuch Annuities.

III. And be it further enacted, That the said Fund, called The Orphans Fund, shall be, and the same is hereby charged and made chargeable with the Annuities which shall be payable in respect of the said Sum of Twenty Thousand Pounds to be borrowed and raised by virtue of this Act, subject nevertheless and without Prejudice to the Payment of Interest on the Principal Debts remaining due to the Orphans and other Creditors of the said City, and to the Payment of the several Annuities which are, or shall be payable in respect of the several Principal Sums borrowed and raised upon the Credit of the said Fund, by virtue of any Act or Acts of Parliament already passed, and now in force, or by virtue of any Act or Acts to be passed in this present Session of Parliament. IV. And be it further enacted, That out of the future Surplusses of the said Orphans Fund, (after reserving so much Money as will be sufficient to fatisfy the Interest payable: from Time to Time to the Orphans and other Creditors of the said City, as also to satisfy the Annuitants and yearly Interest payable from Time to Time, in respect of the several other Principal Sums raised and borrowed by virtue or under the Authority of the several Acts of Parliament already passed for that Purpose, and now in force, or to be raised and borrowed by virtue or under the Authority of any Act or Acts to be passed in this present Session of Parliament), the Annuities payable and to be paid in respect of the said Sum of Twenty thousand Pounds authorized and directed to be raised and borrowed under and by virtue of this Act, shall be paid from Time to Time as the same shall grow due; before any Part of such Surplusses shall be applied in Redemption of the Annuities, and the Payment of the Principal Monies already charged upon the faid Fund; and that

that the Residue of such Surplusses, after such Payment as by this or by any other Act or Acts of Parliament already passed, and now in Force, or by any Act or Acts to be passed in this present Session of Parliament, are or shall be directed to be made out of the same, shall be paid and satisfied, shall from Time to Time, by Order of the Court of Mayor and Aldermen of the said City of London, (which Orders the said Court are hereby authorized and directed to make), or by the Chamberlain of the said City for the Time being, be applied towards the Redemption of all and singular the Annuities payable in respect of the said Sum of Twenty thousand Pounds by this Act charged on the said Fund, in such Order and Course as the said Court of Mayor and Aldermen shall think fit.

With to make considerable and substantial Repairs to the said Bridge; be it therefore further enacted, That it shall be lawful to and for the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons, in Common Council affembled, within the Space of Five Years, to be computed from the passing of this Act, either by and out of the Monies to be raised by virtue of this Act, before the same shall be placed out at Interest as aforesaid, or by Sale or Conversion into Money of the Government, or Real Securities, in which the same shall be invested, after the same shall be placed out at Interest as aforesaid, or a sufficient Part thereof, to raise and apply any Sum or Sums of Money (not exceeding in the Whole the Sum of Five thousand Pounds) for or towards the substantial Repairs of the said Bridge, any Thing herein-before contained to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding.

Securities to be entered in Books.

IX. And be it further enacted, That the Chamberlain of the said City for the Time being, shall enter into a Book or Books to be kept for that Purpose all Securities for Monies borrowed, or Monies granted in pursuance of this Act, and all Assignments and Transfers thereof, expressing in Words at length the Names, Surnames, Additions, Places of Abode, and other Descriptions of all such Persons as shall from Time to Time be entitled to such Securities, and the Sums received upon such Securities, and the Days whereon the said Annuities respectively shall be payable, to which Book and Books, all and every Person and Persons intitled to or interested in such Annuities, shall at all reasonable Times in the Daytime have Accels, with free Liberty to inspect the same without Fee or Reward.

X. And be it further enacted, That from Time to Time there shall also be provided and kept by the Chamberlain of the said City for the Time being, one or more Book or Books, in which all the Monies which by virtue of this Act shall be raised or borrowed upon the Credit of the said Fund, shall from Time to Time, as the same shall be received, be entered and set down, and wherein also all the Monies paid and dispursed and laid out at Interest, and the Monies to be received, shall from Time to Time be entered and set down; and such Entry shall express the Time when the same shall be paid, disbursed, or laid out at Interest, and the Occasions for which, and the Names of the Persons to whom the same shall be paid.

And be it further enacted, That in the annual Account in and by the said Act of the Seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, directed to be by the Chamberlain of the said City for the Time being, laid before each House of Parliament, shall be included an Account of the Disbursements and Investments of the said Sum of Twenty thoufand

of Ten in the Morning and Two in the Afternoon), be paid at the faid Office the Sum or Sums so due, or for which such Annuity or Annuities respectively shall have been granted, together with Interest, or a proportionate Part of the same Annuity or Annuities respectively, up to the Day expressed in such Declaration for receiving the same; and such Interest, or Annuity and Annuities respectively shall, upon the Day specified in such Declaration for Payment, cease and determine.

XXII. And be it further enacted, That no Action or Suit shall be of Actions. commenced against any Person or Persons, for any Thing done in pursuance, or under Colour of this Act, until Twenty-one Days Notice shall be thereof given in Writing, to or after sufficient Satisfaction for Tender thereof hath been made to the Party or Parties aggrieved, for after Three Calendar Months next after the Fact committed, for which such Action or Actions, Suit or Suits, shall be so brought; and every such Action shall be brought, laid, and tried in the City or County where the Cause of Action shall arise, and not elsewhere; and that the "Defendant or Defendants in such Actions or Suits, and every of them, General Issue, may plead the General Issue, and give this Act and the special Matter in Evidence at any Trial or Trials which shall be had thereupon; and , that the Matters or Things for which such Action or Actions, Suit or Suits. shall be so brought, was done in pursuance and by the Authority of this Act; and if the said Matter or Thing shall appear to have been so done, or if it shall appear that such Action or Suit was brought before Twenty-one Days Notice given as aforesaid, and that a sufficient Satisfaction was made or tendered as aforesaid; or if any such Action or Suit shall not be commenced within the Time before for that Purpose limited, or shall be laid in any other County or Place than as aforesaid, then the Jury or Juries shall find for the Defendant or Defendants therein; and if the Plaintiff or Plaintiffs in such Action or Actions, Suit or Suits, thall become non-suited, or suffer a Discontinuance thereof; or if Judgment shall be given for the Defendant or Desendants therein, then, and in any of the Cases aforesaid, such Defendant or Defendants shall have Double Costs, and shall have such Remedy for recovering the same as any Desendant or Desendants hath or have for Costs in other Cales by Law.

XXIII. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken Notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others, without being specially pleaded.
