An Act to enable the Grand Jury of the County of Dublin to raise a sufficient Sum of Money, by Presentment, for completing the rebuilding Lucan Bridge over the River Anna Liffey at Lucan, in the Parish of Lucan in the County of Dublin.

T20th March 1812.]

HEREAS the completing and rebuilding of Lucan Bridge over the River Anna Liffey, at Lucan in the Parish of Lucan, in the County of Dublin, is an Object of great Public Utility: And whereas the Grand Jury of the County of Dublin have not Powers under any Act or Acts of Parliament now in force, to enable them to raise a Sum sufficient for that Purpose: For Remedy whereof, May it please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That from and after the The Grand passing of this Act it shall and may be lawful to and for the Grand Jury Jury of the of the County of Dublin, at every Easter and Michaelmas Term, to present Dublin may from Time to Time, to be raised upon the County at large, such Sum raise Money or Sums of Money as the said Grand Jury for the Time being shall deem fur the Purnecessary to be expended in completing the rebuilding the said Bridge at pose of build-Lucan, over the River Anna Liffey at Lucan, until the said Bridge shall ing a Bridge over the be completely finished, according to such Plans and Estimates for com- River Anna pleting the rebuilding of said Bridge, and other Works in and about the Liffey. fame, as shall be approved of by such Grand Jury: Provided however, that the said Money so to be presented and raised, shall not at any One Term exceed the Rate of Sixpence per Part upon the said County at large, according to the Parts into which the said County of Dublin is divided in and by an Act passed in the Parliament of Ireland, in the Twenty-sixth Year of His present Majesty, intituled An Act for making, widening, and repairing Public Roads in the County of Dublin, and for repealing Parts of several Acts formerly made for that Purpose; and which said Sum or Sums of Money shall be presented, raised, levied, advanced upon Recognizance, and accounted for in the Manner other Sums are directed in and by the said Act; and which said Sum or Sums so to be raised for the Purpose aforesaid, shall be applied in addition to such Sum or Sums of Money as shall or may be presented by the said Grand Jury for making and repairing any Public Works in the said County of Dublin, by virtue of any Act or Acts of Parliament already in force.

For paying the Expences of the Act.

II. And be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That it shall and may be lawful for the Grand Jury of the said County of Dublin, and they are hereby required at Easter or Michaelmas Term immediately after the passing of this Act, to present on the County at large, such Sum of Money as shall be necessary for defraying the Costs, Charges, and Expences of obtaining this Act, and other Expences incident thereto; and if any Person or Persons shall have advanced or lent any Money in Discharge of such Costs, Charges, and Expences, the Money so advanced shall be repaid and satisfied to him, her, or them, by Direction of the said Grand Jury, together with lawful Interest for the same.

Certain Powers of an Act of 26 G 3. extended to this Act.

III. And be it further enacted, That all and every Person and Persons who collectively or individually shall or may be in anywise concerned or employed from Time to Time in ordering, presenting, collecting, levying, or expending the Money herein or hereby authorized to be levied, raised, and expended, shall have the like Powers, Authority, Privileges, and Protections, in all respects for that Purpose, as fully to all Intents and Purposes, as are given in and by the said Act of the Twenty-sixth Year of His present Majesty's Reign.

Publick Act.

IV. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Publick Act, and shall be judicially taken Notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others, without being specially pleaded.
