An Act to repeal an Act made in the last Session of Parliament, for preventing Frauds in the Admeasurement and Delivery of Coals within the several Parishes lying contiguous to the Water-side in the [16th June 1817.] County of Kent.

HEREAS by an Act passed in the Fifty-sixth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled An Act for preventing 56G.3.c.78.

Frauds in the Admeasurement and Delivery of Coals within the Frauds in the Admeasurement and Delivery of Kent. several Parishes lying contiguous to the Water-side in the County of Kent, a certain Principal Land Coal Meter was appointed for executing the Provisions thereof, which said Principal Land Coal Meter was thereby directed and required, from Time to Time, to nominate and appoint a fufficient Number of labouring Land Coal Meters for the Admeasurement of Coals sold within the several Parishes of Saint Paul and Saint Nicholas Deptford, Saint Alphege Greenwich, Saint Luke's Charlton next Woolwich, Saint Mary Woolwich, Plumstead, Erith, Dartford, Stone, Swainscombe, Northfleet, Gravesend, and Milton next Gravesend, in the Town of Gravesend, and the Parish of Denton, lying contiguous to or adjoining the Water-side, in the said County of Kent; and certain Regulations were thereby made respecting the Vend and Delivery of Coals sold within the same respectively: And whereas the Regulations of the aforesaid Act have not been found to be beneficial, but, on the contrary thereof, have been and are inconvenient and burthensome to the Inhabitants of the said Parishes, and ought to be repealed: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That the said Act shall be, and the same Act Recited Act is hereby repealed, and declared to be null and void, to all Intents and repealed. Purposes whatsoever.
