An Act to amend an Act of the last Session of Parliament, for enlarging the Term and Powers of an Act of His present Majesty, for repairing the Road leading from *Towcester* to the Turnpike Road in *Cotton End*, in the Parish of *Hardingston*, in the County of *Northampton*. [17th March 1818.]

WHEREAS an Act was passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled *An Act for enlarging the Term and Powers of an Act of His present Majesty, for repairing the Road leading from Towcester to the Turnpike Road in Cotton End, in the Parish of Hardingston, in the County of Northampton*: And whereas it was (amongst other Things) by the said Act enacted, that from and after a certain Day therein mentioned, the several Tolls and Duties granted in and by the therein recited Act should cease, determine, and be no longer paid or payable, and that instead thereof the respective Tolls or Duties thereafter mentioned should be demanded and taken before any Horse or other Beast or Cattle or any Carriage should be permitted to pass through any Turnpike or Gate erected or to be erected by virtue of the said Acts upon and across the said Road, or upon and across any Lane or Way leading into the same; that is to say, (amongst other Tolls) for every Horse or other Beast of Draught drawing any Coach, Sociable, Berlin, Landau, Chariot, Vis-a-Vis, Barouche, Chaise, Chaise Marine, Calash, Curricule, Chair, Gig, Whiskey, Caravan, Hearse, Litter, or such like Carriage, if drawn by more than Four, the Sum of Sixpence, if drawn by Four the Sum of Four-pence Halfpenny, if drawn by Three the Sum of

Five-

Five-pence, and if drawn by Two the Sum of Sixpence, for each Horse respectively, except as therein is further mentioned : And whereas no Toll or Duty have been granted or made payable for any of the Carriages described in the afore-recited Clause, if drawn by only One Horse or other Beast of Draught: In order therefore to remedy such Defect, and inasmuch as it will tend to the Improvement of the said Road if the said recited Act was amended; may it please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this Act, in addition to the Tolls and Duties granted and made payable by the said recited Act of the last Session of Parliament, there shall, during the Continuance of such Act, be demanded and taken, at the Toll Gates erected or hereafter to be erected by virtue of the said recited Act, by the Person or Persons nominated and appointed Toll Collector, or hereafter to be so nominated or appointed, or by the Farmer or Renter of the said Tolls and Duties authorized to be taken by the said recited Act, before any Horse or other Beast of Draught, drawing any of the Carriages herein-after mentioned, shall be permitted to pass through the same respectively, the Toll or Duty following; (that is to say), For the Horse or other Beast of Draught drawing any Coach, Sociable, Berlin, Landau, Chariot, Vis-a-Vis, Barouche, Chaise, Chaise Marine, Calash, Chair, Gig, Whiskey, Caravan, Hearse, Litter, or such like Carriage, when drawn by One only, the Sum of Sixpence; which said additional Toll shall be vested in the said Trustees for executing the said recited Act, and shall and may be demanded, paid, levied, recovered, applied, and disposed of in such and the like Manner as the Tolls thereby granted are directed to be demanded, paid, levied, recovered, applied, and disposed of; any Thing in the said Act contained to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding.

II. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken Notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others, without being specially pleaded.
