An Act for raising a further Sum of Money, by Annuities or otherwise, for the Purpose of erecting a Workhouse for the Use of the Poor of the Parish of *Saint John of Wapping*, in the County of *Middlesex*.
[6th April 1819.]

WHEREAS an Act was passed in the Twenty-second Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled *An Act for the better Relief and Employment of the Poor of the Parish of Saint John of Wapping, in the County of Middlesex; and for providing a proper Workhouse and Burial Ground for the Use of the said Parish, and for opening certain Communications, and making certain Streets within the said Parish:* And whereas an Act was passed in the Twenty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled *An Act for amending an Act made in the last Session of Parliament, for the better Relief and Employment of the Poor of the Parish of Saint John of Wapping, in the County of Middlesex; and for providing a proper Workhouse and Burial Ground for the Use of the said Parish; and for opening certain Communications, and making certain Streets, within the said Parish:* And whereas an Act was passed in the Fifty-seventh Year of the Reign of His said Majesty, intituled *An Act for raising Money, by Annuities or otherwise, for the Purpose of erecting a Workhouse for the Use of the Poor of the Parish of Saint John of Wapping, in the County of Middlesex:* And whereas the Trustees in the said recited Acts mentioned, have erected a Workhouse and proper Offices, and furnished the same, for the better receiving, employing, and maintaining the Poor of

the said Parish of *Saint John of Wapping*: And whereas, for defraying the Expence of completing the said Workhouse and Offices, it will be expedient that the said Trustees should be authorized to raise a further Sum of Money in the Manner directed in and by the last recited Act; but as the same cannot be effected without the Aid and Authority of Parliament, may it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That it shall and may be lawful for the Trustees appointed for putting in Execution the said recited Acts, and they are hereby authorized and empowered, to raise a further Sum of Six thousand Pounds, over and above the Sum authorized to be raised by the said last recited Act, by all or any or either of the Ways or Means by which the said Trustees were authorized to raise any Money by virtue of the said last recited Acts.

II. And be it further enacted, That all the Costs, Charges, and Expences necessary or incidental to the applying for and attending the obtaining and passing this Act, shall be borne, paid, and defrayed out of the first Monies which shall arise and be received, or which shall be raised by virtue of or under the said recited Acts or this Act.

III. And be it further enacted, That all and every the Powers, Authorities, Provisions, Regulations, and all Penalties, Forfeitures, Clauses, Matters and Things contained in the said recited Acts (as far as the same are applicable) respectively, shall, in the Execution of this Act (except where the same are altered, varied, or repealed) be used and applied, extend and be construed to extend to this Act, and shall operate and be in force as to all such additional Money to be raised by virtue of this Act, as fully and effectually, to all Intents and Purposes, as if the same were severally and particularly repeated and re-enacted in the Body of this Act, and made Part thereof; and the said recited Acts and this Act shall, as to all Matters and Things whatsoever in respect of which the same shall be requisite, be construed as One Act.

Public Act.

IV. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken Notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and other Persons, without being specially pleaded.
