An Act for making and maintaining a Turnpike Road from Barnstaple to the Town or Village of Braunton in the County of Devon.

[13th April 1829.]

HEREAS the making and maintaining of a Turnpike Road from the North End of the High Street of the Town of Barnstaple, over and through the Lands lying on the South Sides of the several Parishes of Pilton, Ashford, and Heanton Punchardon, and over and through a certain Part of the Parish of Braunton, partly along the present Highway, unto the Town or Village of Braunton in the County of Devon, and the building, erecting, and constructing a Bridge on the Line of such new Road across the River Yeo, at or near a Place called the Mill End Quay in Barnstaple aforesaid, will be of great Benefit and Convenience to the Owners and Occupiers of Estates, and also of Persons resident near to the Line of such new Road, and also of great public Utility, by opening a nearer, more level, and better Communication between the said Town of Barnstaple and the said Town or Village of Braunton, and other Parts of the adjacent Country; but the same cannot be effected without the Aid and Authority of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority $\lceil Local. \rceil$

Power to appoint additional Trustees.

II. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the said Trustees, and they are hereby authorized and empowered, from Time to Time, at any of their Meetings, to elect and appoint any Number of Persons, being duly qualified to act as Trustees of Turnpike Roads, (not exceeding Three in the whole, in addition to the Number of Trustees herein named and appointed,) to be Trustees for the Purposes of this Act; and such Persons so elected and appointed shall be Trustees for the Purposes of this Act, and are hereby invested with the same Powers and Authorities for executing this Act as if they had been herein named.

First Meeting of Trustees.

III. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees shall hold their First Meeting at the New Inn in the Town or Village of Braunton, or at some other convenient Place in the Neighbourhood of the said Road, on the Second Wednesday after the passing of this Act, or as soon afterwards as conveniently may be; and the said Trustees shall proceed in the Execution of this Act, and shall and

may then and from Time to Time afterwards adjourn to and meet again at such Times and at such Place or Places in the Neighbourhood of the said Road as they shall think proper.

IV. And be it further enacted, That the respective Sums herein- Tolls, after mentioned shall and may be demanded and taken for Tolls; (that is to say,)

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Coach, Stage Coach, Landau, Chariot, Chaise, Curricle, Phaeton, Caravan, Hearse, Litter, Chair, Gig, Taxed Cart, or other such light Carriage, a Sum not exceeding Sixpence:

For every such Carriage with Four Wheels, affixed to any Waggon,

Cart, or other Carriage, a Sum not exceeding Sixpence:

And for every such Carriage with Two Wheels, affixed to any Waggon, Cart, or other Carriage, a Sum not exceeding Three-

pence:

For every Horse, Mule, Ass, or other Beast or Animal, drawing any Waggon, Wain, Dray, Cart, Tumbrel, Drag, Sledge, or other such Carriage, having the Fellies of the Wheels of less Breadth than Four and a Half Inches, a Sum not exceeding Sixpence; and of the Breadth of Four and a Half Inches and less than Six Inches, a Sum not exceeding Five-pence; and of the Breadth of Six Inches or upwards, a Sum not exceeding Four-pence:

For every Horse or other Beast or Animal drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other Carriage, when laden with Timber, where the same shall be drawn by not more than One Horse or other Beast or Animal, having the Fellies of the Wheels of less Breadth than Six Inches, a Sum not exceeding Sixpence; and of the Breadth of Six Inches or upwards, a Sum not exceeding Four-

pence:

And when drawn by Two Horses or other Beasts or Animals, having the Fellies of the Wheels of less Breadth than Six Inches, a Sum not exceeding One Shilling; and of the Breadth of Six Inches or upwards, a Sum not exceeding Six-

pence:

And when drawn by Three Horses or other Beasts or Animals, having Four Wheels, and the Fellies of the Wheels of less Breadth than Six Inches, a Sum not exceeding One Shilling; and of the Breadth of Six Inches or upwards, a Sum not exceeding Sixpence; and having but Two Wheels, and the Fellies of the Wheels of a less Breadth than Six Inches, a Sum not exceeding Two Shillings; and of the Breadth of Six Inches or upwards, a Sum not exceeding One Shilling:

And when drawn by Four Horses or other Beasts or Animals, having Four Wheels, and the Fellies of the Wheels of a less Breadth than Six Inches, a Sum not exceeding One Shilling; and of the Breadth of Six Inches or upwards, a Sum not exceeding Sixpence; and having but Two Wheels, and the Fellies of the Wheels of a less Breadth than Six Inches, a Sum not exceeding Two Shillings and Sixpence; and of the Breadth of Six Inches or upwards, a Sum not exceeding One

Shilling and Three-pence:

And when drawn by Five Horses or other Beasts or Animals, having the Fellies of the Wheels of a less Breadth than Six Inches, a Sum not exceeding One Shilling; and of the Breadth of Six Inches or upwards, a Sum not exceeding Sixpence:

And when drawn by more than Five Horses or other Beasts or Animals, having the Fellies of the Wheels of a less Breadth than Six Inches, a Sum not exceeding One Shilling and Three-pence; and of the Breadth of Six Inches or upwards, a Sum not exceeding Sixpence:

For every Horse, Mule, Ass, or other Beast of Burthen, laden or unladen, and not drawing, a Sum not exceeding Two-pence:

For every Drove of Oxen, Cows, or other Neat Cattle, the Sum of One Shilling and Three-pence per Score, and so in proportion for any less Number than a Score:

For every Drove of Calves, Hogs, Swine, Goats, Sheep, or Lambs, the Sum of Ten-pence per Score, and so in proportion for any less Number than a Score.

One Half

V. And be it further enacted, That One Half Toll, and no more, shall be demanded or taken for any Horses or other Beasts drawing Carts or other Carriages when employed only in carrying or conveying Lime, Salt, or Sea-sand, to be used solely for Manure; and no Toll shall be taken for such Horses, Beasts, Carts, or Carriages when going empty to fetch, carry, or convey, nor when returning empty from carrying or conveying, such Lime, Salt, or Sea-sand, whether the same shall go and return the same Day or not; and if any Person shall claim or take the Benefit of the said Exemption, not being legally entitled to the same, any Person so offending shall forfeit and pay for every such Offence a Sum not exceeding Five Pounds; and the Proof of Exemption shall lie on the Person claiming the same.

Fraction of a Halfpenny in Tolls.

VI. And be it further enacted, That in all Cases where there shall be a fractional Part of a Halfpenny in the Calculation or Amount of the Tolls herein mentioned, or any of them, the Sum of One Halfpenny shall be demanded and taken in lieu of such fractional Part.

One Payment only to be taken on the whole Line of Road.

VII. And be it further enacted, That it shall not be lawful for the said Trustees, or any Person appointed or continued Collector of the Tolls mentioned in this Act, to demand or take the respective Sums or Tolls aforesaid at more than One Gate for or in respect of the same Horse, Beast, or Cattle passing or repassing at any Time or Times in any One Day through all the Toll Gates, Turnpikes, Side Gates, Side Bars, or Chains along the whole Line of the said Road, any thing contained in any Law or Statute relating to Turnpike Roads to the contrary notwithstanding.

Horses, &c. drawing different Carriages to be again liable to Toll.

VIII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That in case the Toll in this Act mentioned shall have been paid for the passing of any Horse, Beast, or Animal drawing any Waggon, Cart, or other such Carriage of any Description, for passing through any Toll Gate or Turnpike, or Side Gate or Side Bar or Chain, on the said Road, and any such Horse or other Beast or Animal shall afterwards be employed

employed on the said Road, during the same Day, in drawing a different Waggon, Cart, or other such Carriage from that which they were employed in drawing when the Payment was made, every such Horse or other Beast or Animal so drawing shall be again liable to Toll in respect of being employed in drawing such different Waggon, Cart, or other such Carriage.

IX. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That the Tolls Stage payable for and in respect of all Horses or Beasts drawing any Stage Coaches to Coach, Diligence, Van, Caravan, Stage Waggon, Cart, or other Stage pay every Carriage, conveying Passengers or Goods for Pay or Reward, shall passing.

be payable and paid every Time of passing or repassing along the said Road.

X. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That the Tolls Post Chaises payable for and in respect of all Horses or Beasts let out to Hire, on every and drawing any Post Chaise or other Carriage, shall be payable fresh Hiring. and paid every Time of passing along the said Road, whenever any new Hiring thereof shall take place.

XI. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That the Tolls Tolls on Carpayable for the Horses or other Beasts or Animals drawing Carriages riages with shall, when any such Carriages shall be laden with Timber, be paid for Timber. and in respect of such Horses or other Beasts or Animals every Time they shall be employed in drawing a fresh Load of Timber along the said Road; and that unconverted Plank, Beams, Joists, Rafters, and Spars shall be deemed and considered as Timber for the Purposes of this Act.

XII. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That the like Tolls Empty Timshall be paid for and in respect of Horses or other Beasts or Animals ber Carriages drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or Carriage employed or used for the Purpose of conveying Timber, when passing or repassing along the said Road empty, or laden only with other Materials than Timber, riages. as are payable for Horses or other Beasts or Animals drawing other Waggons, Wains, Carts, or Carriages not laden with Timber; which Tolls, when paid for any Horses or other Beasts or Animals drawing such empty Waggon, Wain, Cart, or Carriage, shall, in case such Horses or other Beasts or Animals drawing the same Waggon, Wain, Cart, or Carriage shall pass or repass on the same Day laden with Timber, be deducted and allowed out of the Tolls payable in respect of the same being laden with Timber.

XIII. And be it further enacted, That out of the Monies already Application subscribed or advanced for the Purposes of this Act, the said Trustees of the Money shall in the first place pay and discharge all the Costs and Expences borrowed. relating to the applying for and obtaining and passing this Act, with Interest on any Sum or Sums of Money which shall be advanced for that Purpose; and the Remainder of all such Monies shall be applied in defraying the Expences of making the said new Turnpike Road and Bridge, together with such Monies as shall be borrowed on the Credit of this Act, and in purchasing Lands, Hereditaments, and Materials for that Purpose, and in erecting, making, or providing Turnpikes, [Local.] 5 B

Turnpikes, Toll Gates, Toll Bars, Chains, and Toll Houses, with Outhouses and Conveniences thereto, and also Footpaths, Causeways, Bridges, Ditches, Fences, Hedges, Rails, Posts, and all other Matters and Things necessary or requisite for carrying the Purposes of this Act into execution; and after the Payment of all such Expences, the Residue (if any) of such Monies, and all Monies which shall arise or be received from the Tolls payable on the said Road, and all other Monies which shall come to the Hands of the said Trustees by virtue of this Act, shall from Time to Time be applied in the first place in maintaining and keeping in repair such Part of the said new Turnpike Road as extends from Barnstaple to Ashford Marsh, and afterwards in paying and keeping down the Interest of the Monies subscribed or borrowed on the Credit of this Act; and in the next place, in maintaining, amending, and keeping in repair the other Part of the said Road, and the Turnpikes, Toll Gates, Toll Bars, Chains, Toll Houses, Outhouses, and Conveniences aforesaid, and in otherwise putting this Act in execution, and in repaying the Principal Monies subscribed and borrowed by virtue of this Act, and to or for no. other Use or Purpose whatsoever.

Road may be XIV. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, and they are hereby authorized and empowered, to make the said Road, and to build, erect, and construct a Swingbridge or Drawbridge across the River Yeo; and to make such Cuts and Banks and Embankments as shall be necessary for turning and straightening the Course of the Rivulet called the Bradiford River, and for the Improvement of other Parts of the Line of such Road, and for such Purposes also to take and use the Buildings, Gardens, Orchards, Hereditaments, and Premises described in the Schedule to this Act annexed, any Law or Statute to the contrary notwithstanding.

Plan and Book of Reference deposited at the Office of the Clerk of the Peace to be open to Inspection.

XV. And whereas a Map or Plan describing the Line of the said Road, and of the Lands, Hereditaments, and Premises through or over which the same and the said Bridge are to be carried or made; together with a Book of Reference containing a List of the Names of the Owners and Occupiers or reputed Owners and Occupiers of such Lands, Hereditaments, and Premises, have been deposited at the Office of the Clerk of the Peace of the County of Devon; be it therefore further enacted, That the said Map or Plan and Book of Reference shall remain in the Custody of the said Clerk of the Peace, to the end that all Persons may at any seasonable Time or Times have Liberty to inspect and peruse the same, and to take Copies or Extracts thereof at their Will and Pleasure, paying to the Clerk of the Peace the Sum of One Shilling for every such Inspection, and at the Rate of Sixpence for every One hundred Words of such Copies or Extracts of any such Map or Plan and Book of Reference; and the said Trustees in making the said Road shall not deviate more than One hundred Yards from the Line described in such Map or Plan, without the Consent or Approbation in Writing of the Person or Persons, Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, through whose Lands or Premises such Deviation or Deviations shall be made.

XVI. XVII. XVIII. Provided always, and be it further enacted. That no Part Turnpike of the said Turnpike Road shall extend into the Town or Borough of Road not to Barnstaple further than the Foot of the said intended Bridge over extend into the River Yco, such Foot to be made to terminate at a Distance not exceeding Thirty Yards from the Centre of the said River.

XIX. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That in case the Powers to said Trustees shall not purchase the Buildings, Lands, or Premises Purchase specified in the Schedule to this Act annexed, within the Space of specified in Five Years from the passing of this Act, all the Powers hereby granted the Schedule for purchasing, taking, or using the same, or such of them as shall to cease in not then have been purchased, shall thenceforth cease and determine Five Years. and be utterly void, except with the Consent of the Owners or Proprietors thereof for the Time being.

XX. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees from Time to Time to treat, contract, and agree with the Parties or Persons who shall be Owners of or interested in any Lands, Buildings, Tenements, Hereditaments, or Premises to be taken or made use of in the Execution of this Act, or who shall sustain any

Loss or Damage by means thereof, for the Purchase of such Lands, Buildings, Tenements, Hereditaments, or Premises, and for the Value, Consideration, Compensation, or Satisfaction to be made for the same, or for such Loss or Damage as aforesaid; and it shall be lawful for all Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, Ecclesiastical or Civil, Corporations Aggregate or Sole, Tenants for Life or in Tail, Husbands, Guardians, Trustees, Feoffees in Trust, Committees, Executors, Administrators, and all other Persons whomsoever, not only for and on behalf of themselves, their Heirs and Successors, but also for and on the Behalf of the Person or Persons entitled in Reversion, Remainder, or Expectancy after them, and for and on behalf of their Cestuique Trusts, whether Femes Covert, Wards, Infants, or Issue unborn. Lunatics, Idiots, Persons of unsound Memory and Understanding, or other Person or Persons whomsoever, and to and for all Femes Covert who are or shall be seised or interested in their own Right, or entitled to Dower, and to and for all and every Persons and Person whomsoever, who are or is or shall be seised or possessed of or interested in any such Lands, Buildings, Tenements, Hereditaments, or Premises, to give their Consent in Writing to the said Trustees for the taking and using of any such Lands, Tenements, Hereditaments, and Premises, and the pulling down of any Dwelling House or any other Building, and to treat, contract, and agree with the Trustees for executing this Act for the Value, Consideration, Compensation, or Satisfaction to be made for such Property or Interest, or for any Loss or Damages as aforesaid, and by Conveyance, Lease and Release, or Bargain or Sale, to sell and convey unto the said Trustees any such Lands, Buildings, Tenements, Hereditaments, or Premises, or any Part thereof, for any of the Purposes of this Act; and all Contracts, Agreements, Sales, and Conveyances which shall be so made shall be good, valid, and effectual to all Intents and Purposes, without Fine or Recovery, and shall be a complete Bar to all Estates Tail, and other Estates, Rights, Titles, Trusts, and Interests whatsoever, any Law, Statute, Usage, or other Matter whatsoever to the contrary notwithstanding; and all such Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, Ecclesiastical or Civil, Corporations Aggregate or Sole, Tenants for Life or in Tail, Husbands, Guardians, Trustees, Feoffees, Committees, Executors, and Administrators, and all other Persons, shall be and are hereby indemnified for what they shall do by virtue or in pursuance of this Act; and if any such Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, Ecclesiastical or Civil, Corporations Aggregate or Sole, Tenants for Life or in Tail, Husbands, Guardians, Trustees, Feoffees, Committees, Executors, or Administrators, or any other Person or Persons as aforesaid, upon Notice to him, her, or them given, or left in Writing at the Dwelling House or Houses or other Place or Places of Abode of such Person or Persons, or of the principal Officer or Officers of such Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, Ecclesiastical or Civil, or at the House of the Tenant in Possession of the Premises, shall, for the Space of Thirty Days next after such Notice given or left, neglect or refuse to treat, or shall not agree, or by reason of Absence shall be prevented from treating, then and in every or any such Case the said Trustees shall cause such Value, Consideration, Compensation, or Satisfaction or Damages, to be inquired into and ascertained by a Jury in the Manner prescribed by the Act passed in the Third Year

of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled An Act to amend the 3 G.4. c. 126. General Laws now in being for regulating Turnpike Roads in that Part of Great Britain called England, in Cases where any Damages, Value, or Recompence for Premises thereby authorized to be taken and used for widening, diverting, altering, and improving any Turnpike Road, are directed to be inquired into and ascertained, subject to all the Regulations and Provisions of such Act relative to the summoning and impannelling the Jury, the summoning of Witnesses, the fining of the Sheriff, his Deputy, Bailiff, or Agent, and fining the Witnesses, and to the Payment of the Expences of summoning and maintaining the Jury and Witnesses.

XXI. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That the said Regulating Trustees shall and they are hereby required to make the said Road on such a Level, or so to erect and construct the said Bridge over the River Yeo, that the Ascent of the Road over the said Bridge shall and Height not exceed One Foot in Thirteen: Provided also, that the Fence on of the Fence. each Side of such Bridge shall not be less than Four Feet above the Surface of the Road and Footpath.

XXII. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That the said Trustees to Trustees shall and they are hereby required to appoint some Person to be stationed at or near the said Swingbridge or Drawbridge, for the open or draw Purpose of opening or drawing the same for the Passage of Vessels the Bridge. on the said River Yeo at all seasonable Times, and for closing or letting down the same again immediately on the Passage of every such Vessel; and every such Person shall be subject to the same Penalty for any Neglect of Duty in refusing or neglecting to open or draw the said Bridge on any reasonable Request, and to close or let down the same again immediately after the Passage of any Vessel, or for any Misbehaviour in the Execution of his Duty as an Officer of the said Trustees, as any Collector or other Officer of the said Trustees is subject or liable to by Law; and such Person shall put up and affix a Board, with his Name painted thereon, in some conspicuous Place at or near such Bridge, and at all Times keep such Board so affixed.

And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the Ditches, said Trustees, and their Surveyor or Surveyors, or other Person or Persons by them appointed, and they are hereby authorized and Bridges, &c. empowered, to make such Ditches, Drains, or Watercourses of such a be made and sufficient Depth and Breadth as shall be necessary for keeping the cleansed. said Road dry, and for conveying the Water from the same on the Sides of the said Road, and also, where necessary, into or through any Fields, Lands, or Grounds adjoining to or lying near the said Road, (not being a Yard, Garden, Orchard, Park, Paddock, planted Walk, or Avenue to a House,) at the Expence of the said Trustees, out of the Monies to be received by virtue of this Act, and also such sufficient Bridges, Arches, Culverts, Trunks, Tunnels, or Plats as shall be necessary, also at the Expence of the said Trustees, out of the Monies aforesaid, any Law or Statute to the contrary notwithstanding; and all such Ditches, Drains, and Watercourses, Bridges, Arches, Culverts, Trunks, Tunnels, or Plats, when so made and completed, [Local.] shall

Drains,

shall for ever afterwards be scoured, cleansed, and kept open, repaired and maintained, by the Occupiers of the adjoining Fields, Lands, or Grounds; but all such new Bridges, Arches, Culverts, Trunks, Tunnels, and Plats as shall cross or pass in or under the said Road shall be scoured, cleansed, and kept open, repaired and maintained, by the said Trustees, subject to the Provisions of any Law or Statute relating to Turnpike Roads.

Trustees to make Communications from Lands where the present Communications are obstructed.

XXIV. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That if the Communication to any Lands or Grounds shall be cut off or obstructed by the making of the said new Turnpike Road, then and in such Case it shall be lawful for the said Trustees to order and lay out a Passage from the said Turnpike Road to and from such Lands or Grounds, in like Manner as Trustees or Commissioners of any Turnpike Road are authorized to order and lay out Passages to any new Road in Cases where any Turnpike Road shall be diverted or turned.

Public Act.

XXV. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others, without being specially pleaded.

Term of Act.

XXVI. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall commence upon the passing thereof, and shall continue and be in force for Thirty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.
