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## Cap. lviii.

An Act for making and repairing the Road from  
*Linlithgow Bridge to Stirling*, and other Roads  
in the County of *Stirling*. [14th May 1829.]

**W**HEREAS an Act was passed in the Fifty-first Year of the  
Reign of His late Majesty King *George* the Third, in-  
tituled *An Act for more effectually repairing and improving* 51 G. 3.  
*certain Roads in the County of Stirling, and the Road from or near* c. 101.  
*from the West End of the Town of Linlithgow to Stirling, in the*  
*Counties of Linlithgow and Stirling*, whereby certain Persons were  
appointed Trustees for making and maintaining the following Roads;  
*videlicet*, the Road leading from *Linlithgow Bridge* to *Falkirk* and  
*Camelon*, and from thence to *Saint Ninians* and *Stirling*; the Road  
from *Stirling* to *Drip Bridge*; the Road from *Camelon* to *Kilsyth*,  
and from thence to *Inchbelly Bridge*; and the Road from *Saint*  
*Ninians* to *Loanhead*: And whereas an Act was passed in the Fourth  
Year of the Reign of His present Majesty King *George* the Fourth,  
intituled *An Act for regulating Turnpike Roads in that Part of Great* 4 G. 4. c. 49.  
*Britain called Scotland*: And whereas the Powers granted by the  
said first-recited Act have been found insufficient for improving the  
said Roads in a complete Manner, and for altering or varying the  
Line or Direction thereof, where necessary; and as the said Act will  
soon expire, and the Sums borrowed under it cannot be repaid, or the  
said Roads kept in repair, unless other and further Powers and  
Provision be made for these Purposes: And whereas it would be for  
the Public Accommodation and Advantage if the said Roads, and  
also the Road from the Turnpike Road at *Port Street, Stirling*, to  
[Local.] 16 X the

the Turnpike Road leading to *Dunblane* and *Crieff*, at or near *Causewayhead*, were, in Places where the same are steep, crooked, or incommodious, varied, straightened, widened, repaired, and kept in repair, and if proper and commodious Bridges were, where necessary, built and maintained; but as these Purposes cannot be effected without the Aid and Authority of Parliament, May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That the said first-recited Act shall from and after the passing of this Act be and the same is hereby repealed, and instead thereof this Act shall commence and take effect and shall continue in force during the Term hereinafter mentioned.

First-recited Act repealed, and this to take effect.

Powers of 4G. 4. c. 49. applied to this Act.

II. And be it further enacted, That the said recited Act of the Fourth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, and all and every the Powers, Provisions, Exemptions, Penalties, Forfeitures, Payments, Remedies, Matters, and Things therein contained, (save and except such Parts thereof as are expressly varied, altered, or repealed,) shall be as good, valid, and effectual for carrying this Act into execution as if the same had been herein repeated and re-enacted.

Covenants under the Act hereby repealed to remain in force.

III. And be it further enacted, That all Bonds, Covenants, Agreements, and Securities made or entered into by any Person or Persons to or with the Trustees for executing the said recited Act hereby repealed, according to the Provisions and Directions thereof, shall remain in full Force and Effect, and shall continue available in all Courts of Law and Equity, until the same are fully satisfied and performed; and all Contracts, Agreements, Bonds, Assignments, and Securities, duly made and entered into by the said Trustees to or with any Person or Persons, shall remain in full Force and Effect, and shall be binding on the Trustees for executing this Act.

Books under the repealed Act to be given in Evidence.

IV. And be it further enacted, That all Books containing the Accounts and Proceedings of the Trustees for executing the said recited Act hereby repealed, and made Evidence thereby, shall and may be given in Evidence in all Cases of Appeal, and in all Prosecutions, Suits, and Actions whatsoever, in such and the same Manner as if the said Act had not been repealed.

Trustees appointed.

V. And be it further enacted, That every Person who is at present or hereafter shall be, in his own Right or in the Right of his Wife, in the actual Possession and Enjoyment as Proprietor or Liferenter of the *Dominium utile* of Lands lying within any of the Parishes of *Muiravonside*, *Polmont*, *Falkirk*, *Larbert*, *Saint Ninians*, *Stirling*, *Logie*, *Dunipace*, *Denny*, *Kilsyth*, and *Campsie*, in the said County of *Stirling*, valued in the Cess Books of the said County at the Sum of One hundred Pounds *Scots*; as also One Guardian or Trustee of each Minor or other Person under Guardianship, in the actual Possession and Enjoyment in Manner aforesaid of Lands within any of the said Parishes of the Valuation aforesaid; and the eldest Sons and Heirs Apparent of Persons in the actual Possession and Enjoy-

ment as aforesaid of Lands lying as aforesaid, valued at Four hundred Pounds Scots or upwards; *Henry Home Drummond of Blair Drummond*; and also the Provost, the eldest Baillie, and the Dean of Guild of the Royal Burgh of *Stirling*, all for the Time being; shall be and they are hereby appointed Trustees for making, repairing, widening, altering, improving, and maintaining the several Roads contained in the said first-recited Act; *videlicet*, the Road from *Linlithgow Bridge* to *Falkirk* and *Camelon*, and from thence to *Saint Ninians* and *Stirling*; the Road from *Stirling* to *Drip Bridge*; the Road from *Camelon* to *Kilsyth*, and from thence to *Inchbelly Bridge*; the Road from *Saint Ninians* to *Loanhead*; and the Road from *Port Street*, on the South Side of the Town of *Stirling*, to the Turnpike Road leading to *Dunblane* and *Crieff*, at or near *Causewayhead* aforesaid; and for building a new, secure, and commodious Bridge over the River *Forth* in lieu of the present Bridge, and for repairing the other Bridges on the said several Roads, and for erecting other new Bridges thereon, where the same shall be requisite, and for putting into execution all the other Powers and Authorities in and by this Act given and granted; and it shall and may be lawful for the said Trustees and they are hereby empowered to improve the present Road from the Village of *Camelon* Eastward to the Town of *Falkirk*, and to carry the same over the Great Canal between the *Forth* and *Clyde* by a Drawbridge, to be erected and maintained by them; to widen and improve the present Line of Road at *Loanhead*, and to make a new Line of Road from the present Turnpike Road at or near *Loanhead*, to pass through the Lands of *Bankhead*, *Haircraigs*, *Muirhead*, *Chasefield*, *Myedub*, *Little Denny*, *Dryburgh*, *West Borland*, and others, to join the present Turnpike Road at or near *Denny Bridge*; and also to widen and improve the present Line of Road through the Village of *Saint Ninians*; and to make a new Line of Road from the present Turnpike Road from a Point in that Village, and to pass by the West Side of the Village, to join the present Turnpike Road at or near *Newhouse*; and to widen and improve the present Road from the Turnpike Road at *Port Street*, on the South Side of the Town of *Stirling*, leading Northward through the said Town to the Road or Street called *King Street*; and to form and make a new Line of Road from the Foot of the said Road or Street called *King Street* to the present Road or Street called *Mill Lane*; and to widen and improve the said Road or Street called *Mill Lane* to the Road or Street called *Friars Wynd*; and to form and make a new Line of Road from thence, to pass Northward, on the South Side of the Episcopal Chapel in *Stirling*, to join the present Road or Street at or near *York Place*; or to make a new Line of Road from the said Road or Street called *Mill Lane*, through the Gardens or Orchards situated at or near *Mill Lane*, and by the North Side of the Episcopal Chapel aforesaid, to or near to *York Place* aforesaid; or to widen and improve the aforesaid Road or Street called *King Street*, and to form and make a new Line of Road from or near from the Head of the Road or Street called *King Street*, and to cross the present Roads or Streets at or near the *Star Inn*, to pass in a Line Northward to join the present Road or Street at or near *York Place* aforesaid; and also to improve the present Road or Street from or near from *York Place*

Place to the Road or Street called *Lower Bridge Street*, and from thence to the present Bridge over the River *Forth*, and to the Turnpike Road leading to *Dunblane* and *Crieff* at or near to *Causewayhead*; and to form and make a new Line of Road from the said Road or Street called *Lower Bridge Street*, to pass Northward through the Lands of *Winchelhaugh* and others, on the South Side of the said River *Forth*, and through the Lands of *Spittal Kerse* on the North Side of that River, to join the present Road at the Farm of *Bridgehaugh*: Provided always, that in the Event of the Magistrates and Town Council of *Stirling* furnishing the said Trustees with Money or Funds towards defraying the Expence of widening, improving, and making the said Road from the Foot of *King Street*, by the *Star Inn*, to *York Place*, to such an Extent and within such Time as shall be fixed upon and determined by the said Trustees, in order to relieve the Trust of any additional Expence which might be occasioned by adopting that Line, in place of the said other Lines from the Foot of *King Street* to *York Place*, then and in that Event the said Trustees shall be bound to adopt and to make the said Line of Road from the Foot of *King Street*, by the *Star Inn*, to *York Place*; and the said Trustees shall further be and they are hereby empowered to design, direct, order, and build, or to cause to be built, and to complete, a Bridge across the River *Forth* near the Town of *Stirling* in the County of *Stirling*, in the Line of the said Road, and to dig and make proper Foundations in the said River, and on the Lands and Grounds lying on each Side thereof, for the Piers and Abutments of the said Bridge, and to cut and level the Banks of the said River in such Manner as shall be necessary and proper for the building of the said Bridge, and to cut, remove, take, and carry away all Trees, Roots of Trees, Beds of Gravel, Sand, Mud, or any other Impediment whatsoever which may in anywise tend to hinder the erecting and completing the said Bridge, and to execute all other Things requisite and necessary, useful or convenient, for erecting and building the said Bridge, according to the Tenor and true Meaning of this Act; and for the Purpose of erecting and building the said Bridge the said Trustees shall have full Power and Authority to carry and lay down on either Side of the said River, and to land and lay down on either Side thereof, within One hundred Yards of the Site of the said Bridge, all Materials and other Things to be used in and about the same, and there to work and use such Materials and Things, according as the said Trustees shall think proper, without any previous Agreement with the Owner or Owners of the Property on which such Materials and other Things shall be carted, landed, worked, or used, or of the Occupier or Occupiers thereof, doing as little Damage as may be, and making Satisfaction to the Owner or Owners, Occupier or Occupiers of the Lands or Grounds so taken, spoiled, or used for the Purposes aforesaid; and the said Trustees shall have full Power and Authority, if they shall think fit, to widen any Part of the said Roads already made to the Breadth of Forty Feet of clear Road, exclusive of Bank and Ditch or Footpath, and to make the said new Roads hereby authorized to be made of the like Breadth, and in Towns and Villages, and at the Entrance of Towns and Villages, to widen the said existing Roads to or make the said new Roads of the Breadth of Fifty Feet, exclusive of Bank and Ditch and Footpaths.

VI. Pro-

VI. Provided always, and be it enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the said Trustees and they are hereby authorized to carry the Road over the *Forth and Clyde Canal* as aforesaid, after filling up the Arch of the Aqueduct Bridge of the said Canal near *Camelon*, commonly called *Camelon Aqueduct*, and raising the present Road to the Level of the Top of the Banks of the said Aqueduct, and then erecting, placing, and maintaining a Drawbridge or Swing Bridge over that Part of the said Canal which passes over the present Arch of the said Aqueduct Bridge: Provided always, that the Consent and Approbation of the Governor and Council of the said Canal Company shall first be had and obtained as to the Operations and Works which will require to be made and finished for securing the Safety of the said Canal before placing and erecting the said Drawbridge or Swing Bridge, and also as to the Form and Construction of the said Drawbridge or Swing Bridge, and its Situation over such Part of the said Canal, and as to the Alteration, widening, and strengthening of the Banks, and the widening of those Parts of the said Canal to the East and West of the said Drawbridge or Swing Bridge, and the other Operations that will be necessary for enabling the Vessels navigating the said Canal to pass freely to and from the said Drawbridge, and through that Part of the said Canal over which the said Drawbridge or Swing Bridge shall be placed; and provided also, that the said Trustees shall always be liable to the Governor and Council of the said Canal Company for the Expences of all these Operations, and for all Damage or Damages which may be suffered by the said Company of Proprietors of the said Canal by any Stoppage of the Navigation occasioned by all or any of the Operations aforesaid, and that the said Trustees shall be obliged to be at the Expence of making and maintaining the said Bridge in Time coming; and of erecting and maintaining a Dwelling House for the Keeper of the said Bridge, in such a Situation adjoining to the same as the Committee of Council of the said Company shall select; and the said Committee shall have Power to nominate and appoint the Keeper of the said Bridge, and from Time to Time to remove such Keeper when they think fit, and to appoint another in his Place, and shall have the same Powers over the said Keeper as they have over the other Servants of the said Canal Company; and that the said Trustees shall be obliged to pay to the said Governor and Council a Sum of Money yearly, equal to the Wages paid by the said Canal Company to the other Drawbridge Keepers on the said Canal, as the same shall be ascertained by a Certificate under the Hand of the Superintendent of the said Canal.

VII. And whereas a Map or Plan, describing the said several new Roads, and the Alterations proposed on the present Roads, and the Lands, Grounds, Houses, Erections, Buildings, Tenements, and Hereditaments or other Property through which the said Roads lead or are intended to pass; together with a Book of Reference containing the Names of the Owners and Occupiers of such Lands, Grounds, Houses, Erections, Buildings, Tenements, and Hereditaments or other Property, have been deposited with the Clerk of the Peace for the said County of *Stirling*; be it further enacted, That the said Map or Plan and Book of Reference shall remain in the Custody

of the said Clerk of the Peace; and every and any Person, being an Owner or Occupier of any Lands or Tenements on the Line or Lines of the said Roads, shall at all seasonable Times have Access to the said Map or Plan and Book of Reference, and shall be entitled to inspect and peruse the same, paying for every such Inspection the Sum of One Shilling, and to take Copies or Extracts thereof, paying to the said Clerk at the Rate of Sixpence for every One hundred Words of such Copies or Extracts.

Trustees not to deviate from Lines laid down; nor to remove any Dwelling or Building, or enter on any Orchard, &c. not specified in the Schedules.

VIII. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees, in making or altering the said Roads hereby authorized to be made, altered, or repaired, shall not deviate more than One hundred Yards from the Lines described in the said Map or Plan, without the Consent and Approbation in Writing of the Person or Persons, Body or Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, through whose Lands or Grounds such Deviation shall be made; neither shall they take down or remove any Dwelling House or other Building the Side Walls of which exceed Twenty Feet in Height, or take or make use of any Policy, Orchard, or Garden, the Contents of which exceed Half an Acre, or any Lawn, planted Walk, or Avenue to a House, or any inclosed Ground planted as an Ornament or Shelter to a House, other than the Dwelling Houses or Buildings, Policies, Orchards, Gardens, Lawns, planted Walks, and Avenues, or inclosed Ground, planted as aforesaid, or any of them, described in the Schedule annexed to this Act, without the Consent in Writing of the Owner thereof, or in his Absence, of his Agent or Factor: Provided always, that it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Trustees to make, alter, or vary the said Roads on, into, through, across, or over the several Lands, Grounds, or Tenements of any Person or Persons, Body or Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, who is or are or shall be Owner or Owners of Land over, in, or through which the same is set out and described in the said Map or Plan, although the Name or Names of such Person or Persons may happen to be omitted in the said Book of Reference, in case it shall be made to appear to any Two or more Justices of the Peace for the said County, and be certified by Writing under their Hands, that such Error or Omission proceeded from Mistake.

Houses, &c. to be purchased within Five Years.

IX. Provided always, and be it enacted, That in case the said Trustees shall not purchase such Dwelling Houses, Orchards, Gardens, or other Heritages described in the said Schedule hereunto annexed, within the Space of Five Years from the passing of this Act, then and in such Case it shall not be lawful for the said Trustees to purchase any such Dwelling Houses, Orchards, Gardens, or other Heritages so remaining unpurchased, without the Consent of the Owners thereof first had and obtained thereto.

Quorum of Trustees.

X. And be it further enacted, That at all General Meetings of Trustees under this Act Seven Trustees shall be a Quorum.

Meetings of Trustees.

XI. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees shall meet at *Falkirk* on the Third *Monday* after the passing of this Act, at Twelve of the Clock Mid-day; and the said Trustees shall hold an Annual General

General Meeting at *Falkirk* in each Year thereafter during the Continuance of this Act, on the Second *Monday* of *April*, and shall also hold a General Meeting, when necessary, on Requisition of any Two of the Trustees, to be made and notified in Manner hereinafter specified, at *Stirling*, on the first *Tuesday* after *Michaelmas* yearly; at one or other of which said Meetings all Orders for borrowing Money, or assigning the Tolls and Duties in Security thereof, or for erecting Gates or Turnpikes or Side Bars, shall be issued; and at such Meetings, or any other General Meeting duly called, the said Trustees shall be and they are hereby empowered to proceed to carry this Act into execution, and to issue their Orders for surveying, making, altering, widening, and repairing the said several Roads, and to do, order, and perform all Acts, Matters, and Things which the said Trustees appointed by this Act are authorized to do, order, and perform; and all such Acts, Matters, and Things so done shall be as good, valid, and effectual as if the same were done by the whole of the said Trustees.

XII. And be it further enacted, That any Two of the said Trustees may at any Time call a Special General Meeting of the said Trustees for the Purposes of this Act, upon Ten Days previous Notice thereof given in some Newspaper generally circulated in the Shire of *Stirling*, of the Time and Place of such Meeting, and the special Purpose thereof. Special Meetings.

XIII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That the Clerks, Surveyors, Collectors, and all other Officers who have been appointed under and employed in the Execution of the said Act hereby repealed, shall respectively continue to exercise their Offices under this Act until they shall respectively be displaced or removed by the said Trustees, or be incapable of executing their Offices, and shall be subject to the like Rules and Regulations, and Pains and Penalties, in all Respects whatsoever, as if they had been appointed under or by virtue of this Act. Former Officers to continue.

XIV. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That it shall not be lawful for the said Trustees to continue or appoint any Person who has been or may be appointed the Clerk in the Execution of this Act, or the Partner of any such Clerk, or the Clerk or other Person in the Service or Employ of any such Clerk or of his Partner, the Treasurer for the Purposes of this Act, or to continue or appoint any Person who has been or may be appointed Treasurer, or the Partner of any such Treasurer, or the Clerk or other Person in the Service or Employ of any such Treasurer or of his Partner, the Clerk to the said Trustees; and if any Person shall accept both the Offices of Clerk and Treasurer for the Purposes of this Act, or if any Person, being the Partner of any such Clerk, or the Clerk or other Person in the Service or Employ of any such Clerk or of his Partner, shall accept the Office of Treasurer, or shall act as Deputy of the Treasurer, or in any Manner officiate for the Treasurer, or being the Partner of any such Treasurer, or the Clerk or other Person in the Service or Employ of any such Treasurer or of his Partner, shall accept the Office of Clerk in the Execution of this Act, or shall act as Deputy of such Clerk, Same Person not to be Clerk and Treasurer.

or in any Manner officiate for such Clerk, or if any such Treasurer shall hold any Place or Office of Profit or Trust under the said Trustees other than that of Treasurer, every such Person so offending shall for every such Offence forfeit and pay the Sum of One hundred Pounds Sterling to any Person or Persons who shall sue for the same, to be recovered, with Expences, by summary Action in the Court of Session.

XV. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Trustees, at the said First Meeting to be held after the passing of this Act, or at any Annual Meeting to be holden on the Second *Monday* of *April* thereafter, or at any Meeting to be holden on the first *Tuesday* after *Michaelmas* yearly, during the Continuance of this Act, and they are hereby authorized and empowered to continue or to erect, or cause to be continued or erected, a Gate or Gates, Turnpike or Turnpikes, in, upon, or across any Part or Parts of the said several Roads, or on the Sides thereof, and also such Number of Toll Houses, with proper Gardens adjacent thereto, as to them shall appear to be expedient, the Site of each such Toll House and Garden not exceeding One Eighth Part of a Statute Acre, and from Time to Time to alter the Situation of such Gates or Turnpikes and Toll Houses and Gardens.

XVI. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees, or any Person or Persons duly authorized by them, shall be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to demand and take, or cause to be demanded and taken, at the several Gates or Turnpikes which shall be continued or erected by virtue of this Act, a Sum not exceeding the Rates and Duties hereinafter specified, before any Carriage, Horse or other Cattle, shall pass through any Gate or Turnpike to be continued or erected on the said Roads; (that is to say,)

For every Horse or Beast of Draught drawing any Coach, Barouch, Chariot, Landau, Chaise, Calash, Chair, Cart now or formerly known by the named of a Taxed Cart, or any Hearse or other such Carriage, or any Stage Coach, Long Coach, or Diligence, or any Carriage of the like Kind, One Shilling:

For every Coach, Barouch, Chariot, Landau, Chaise, Calash, Chair, Cart now or formerly known by the Name of a Taxed Cart, or any Hearse or other such Carriage, or any Stage Coach, Long Coach, or Diligence, or any Carriage of the like Kind, having more than Two Wheels, drawn or propelled otherwise than by any Horse or other Beast, the Sum of Four Shillings, and having only Two Wheels, the Sum of Two Shillings:

For every Horse, Ox, or Beast of Draught, if more than Two in Number, drawing any Van or Caravan, or any Waggon, Wain, or Cart, or other such Carriage, Nine-pence:

For every Horse, Ox, or Beast of Draught, where not more nor less than Two in Number are drawing any Van or Caravan, or any Waggon, Wain, or Cart, or other such Carriage, Sixpence:

For every Horse, Ox, or Beast of Draught, where not more than One in Number is drawing any Waggon, Wain, or Cart, or other such Carriage, Four-pence:

For



For every Van or Caravan, or any Waggon, Wain, or Cart, or other such Carriage with more than Two Wheels, drawn or propelled otherwise than by any Horse or other Beast, the Sum of One Shilling and Four-pence, and having only Two Wheels, the Sum of Eight-pence :

For every Saddle Horse or Mule, with or without a Rider, Two-pence :

For every Ass, laden or unladen, One Penny :

For every Score of Horses or Fillies unshod, and for every Score of Oxen or Neat Cattle, One Shilling and Eight-pence ; and so in Proportion for any greater or less Number :

For every Score of Calves, Hogs, Sheep, Lambs, or Goats, Sixpence ; and so in Proportion for any greater or less Number.

XVII. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees shall, if they find it necessary, cause Weighing Machines to be erected upon such Parts of the said Roads as they shall think fit, for weighing all Vans or Caravans, Waggons, Wains, Carts, and other Carriages which shall pass along the same ; and it shall and may be lawful for them, or any Person having Authority from them, to demand, take, and receive, at the several Gates or Turnpikes which shall be continued or erected by virtue of this Act, in every Case where the Weight of any Carriage and its Loading shall be of the Weight of Thirty Hundred Weight of One hundred and twelve Imperial Pounds each, and shall not exceed Thirty-five Hundred Weight, a Sum equal to double the foresaid Tolls and Duties authorized to be levied by this Act ; and if the Weight of the Carriage and its Loading shall exceed Thirty-five Hundred Weight of One hundred and twelve Imperial Pounds each, and shall not exceed Forty-two Hundred Weight, a Sum equal to triple the foresaid Tolls and Duties granted by this Act ; and if the Weight of the Carriage and its Loading exceed Forty-two Hundred Weight of One hundred and twelve Imperial Pounds each, a Sum equal to quadruple the said Tolls and Duties by this Act granted.

XVIII. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Trustees to take and receive a lower Rate of Toll and Duty than that hereby granted, and to exempt from Payment of any Part of the said additional Toll or Duty for Overweight, if they shall think fit, every Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other such Carriage with Two Wheels, which shall have the Sole or Bottom of the Fellies of the Wheels thereof of the Breadth of Five Inches, and be cylindrical, that is to say, of the same Diameter on the Inside next to the Carriage and on the Outside, so that when rolling on a flat or level Surface the whole Breadth thereof shall bear equally on such flat or level Surface, and that the opposite Ends of the Axletrees of such Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other Carriage, so far as the same shall be inserted in the Naves of the Wheels thereof, shall not form an Angle with each other, but shall be in the Continuance of One straight Line ; so that in each Pair of Wheels belonging to such Carriages the lower Parts which shall rest on the Ground shall be at the same Distance from each other as the upper Parts of such Pair of Wheels, and further ; having the Nails sunk level with the Rings on the Wheels ; and every such Waggon, Wain, Cart, or Carriage with Four Wheels, which

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shall

shall have the Sole or Bottom of the Fellies of the Wheels thereof of the Breadth of Seven and Half Inches or upwards, and being cylindrical as before mentioned ; provided that every Person claiming the Privileges granted to Carriages with Wheels so constructed as aforesaid shall permit the same to be examined and measured by any Person appointed by the said Trustees, or concerned in the Collection of the said Tolls or Duties.

Coal Carts.

XIX. And be it further enacted, That every Cart and Carriage loaded with great Coal, where the Weight of the Carriage and Loading shall not exceed Fourteen Hundred Weight, of One hundred and twelve Imperial Pounds each, and every Cart and Carriage loaded with small Coal, shall only be chargeable with and pay One Half of the Rates of Toll by this Act granted, or One Half of the Tolls for the Time authorized to be levied at the Gates or Turnpikes aforesaid.

XX. And be it further enacted, That at any Gate or Turnpike, or Gates or Turnpikes, which shall or may be erected on the Road between *Stirling Bridge* and *Causewayhead*, there shall only be demanded and taken, for Horses and Fillies unshod, and for Oxen or Neat Cattle, and for Calves, Hogs, Sheep, Lambs, or Goats, One Fourth Part of the Rates of Tolls and Duties by this Act granted ; and for every Horse or Beast of Draught drawing any Coach, Chaise, Chair, Cart now or formerly known by the Name of a Taxed Cart, Hearse, Stage Coach, Waggon, Wain, or Cart, and for every Saddle Horse, Mule, or Ass, One Half of the Rates of Tolls and Duties to be levied at the Bars to be continued or erected on the other Roads aforesaid from *Linlithgow Bridge* to *Stirling*, and from *Camelon* to *Inchbelly Bridge*, and from *Saint Ninians* to *Loanhead* ; and that at any Gate or Turnpike, or Gates or Turnpikes, to be continued or erected on the Road from *Stirling* to *Drip Bridge*, there shall only be demanded and taken One Third Part of the Rates of Tolls and Duties to be levied at the Bars to be continued or erected on the said other Roads ; and in the Event of the said One Fourth, or One Half, or One Third, resolving into any fractional Part less than One Halfpenny, then the Whole of such One Halfpenny shall be demanded and taken.

XXI. And be it further enacted, That upon receiving Payment of the Tolls or Duties by this Act granted, the Receiver thereof, at any Gate or Turnpike to be continued or erected as aforesaid, shall deliver to the Person paying such Tolls or Duties a Note or Ticket denoting such Payment ; which Note or Ticket shall entitle the same Person, with the same Carriages, or Horses or other Cattle, to return through the same Gate on the same Day, before Twelve of the Clock at Night, and also to pass through any other Gate or Turnpike, or Gates or Turnpikes, placed on the said Roads, at a Distance not exceeding Five Statute Miles from the Gate or Turnpike where such Note or Ticket was delivered, and to return through any other such Gate or Turnpike, or Gates or Turnpikes, with the same Carriages or Horses or other Cattle on the same Day, before Twelve of the Clock at Night, without being liable to pay the said Tolls or Duties a Second Time for passing through such Turnpike Gate or Turn-  
pike

pike Gates, and for returning on the same Day, except as hereinafter mentioned: Provided always, that in case any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or Carriage of the like Description shall pass through any such Turnpike Gate or Turnpike Gates with a new Loading a Second or more Times in the same Day, the Tolls and Duties by this Act granted shall be paid for each Time such Waggon, Wain, Cart, or Carriage shall so pass, in the same Manner as for the First Time; provided also, that nothing under One Hundred Weight shall be reckoned a new Loading in any such Carriage; and provided further, that no Toll shall be demanded at any Gate or Turnpike to be continued or erected on the said Roads for any Horse or Carriage which shall only cross the Roads, or shall not travel altogether above One hundred Yards thereon, before arriving at or after passing any such Gate or Turnpike.

Proviso as to new Loadings.

XXII. Provided always, and be it enacted, That it shall and may be lawful to or for the said Trustees to continue or erect, or cause to be continued or erected, a Gate or Gates, Turnpike or Turnpikes, in, upon, or across any Part or Parts of the Road at *Torwood*, or upon the Road or Roads at the Village of *Saint Ninians*, and a Gate or Gates, Turnpike or Turnpikes, in, upon, or across any Part or Parts of the said Road from *Stirling* to *Drip Bridge*, and also to erect or cause to be erected a Gate or Gates, Turnpike or Turnpikes, in, upon, or across any Part or Parts of the aforesaid Road between *Stirling Bridge* and *Causewayhead* aforesaid, and to levy thereat the Tolls and Duties by this Act granted, although the same shall not be Five Miles distant from each other, or Five Miles distant from any Gate or Turnpike to be continued or erected on the Roads aforesaid, in pursuance of this Act; anything herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding.

Gates may be erected within Five Miles, at certain Places.

XXIII. And be it further enacted, That the said Tolls and Duties hereby granted and made payable, together with the Right and Property of every Gate or Turnpike, Toll House, and Garden, and whole Premises already erected or to be erected on the said Roads, are and shall be vested in the said Trustees; and the said Tolls and Duties, and every Part thereof, shall be paid over, applied, and assigned to and for the several Uses, Intents, and Purposes by this Act directed; and the same shall be made subject and liable to the Payment of all Sums of Money now due and owing upon the said Roads, and shall also be made liable to the Payment of all Sums of Money which may hereafter be borrowed on the Credit of this Act, and of all Interest due or which may hereafter become due thereon.

Tolls, &c. vested in the Trustees.

XXIV. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees, in General Meeting assembled, shall, out of the Monies to be borrowed for the Purposes of this Act, and the Tolls and Duties to be levied at the Gates or Turnpikes to be continued or erected on the said Roads, direct the Costs and Expences relative to the obtaining and passing of this Act to be paid, and the Remainder of all such Monies to be applied towards the making, completing, widening, and maintaining of the aforesaid Roads and Bridges, and thereafter towards the Payment of the Interest of the Sums already borrowed or to be borrowed by

Trustees to direct the Application of Monies.

by virtue of this Act, and then to the Repayment of the Principal Sums already borrowed or to be borrowed.

XXV. And be it further enacted, That for every Sum or Sums of Money which shall hereafter be borrowed on the Credit of the said Tolls the said Trustees shall be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to appropriate and set apart a certain annual Sum, arising out of the Produce of the said Tolls and Duties as a Sinking Fund, for the Redemption of the Sums so to be borrowed under this Act.

XXVI. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees, in making, widening, altering, or improving any Part of the said Roads, shall be and they are hereby empowered to raise or lower, and widen, as shall appear to them to be expedient and necessary, any Road, Passage, or Highway communicating therewith, so as that the Communication with such Road, Passage, or Highway respectively may be made on a Level with the aforesaid Roads contained in this Act.

XXVII. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees to treat, contract, and agree for, and they are hereby authorized and empowered to take, acquire, and use, and it shall be lawful for every Proprietor, Body or Bodies Politic or Corporate or Collegiate, Corporations Aggregate or Sole, Heirs of Entail, Husbands, Trustees, and also Guardians, Tutors, and Curators of every Person whatsoever under any legal Disability or Incapacity, and they are hereby empowered, to sell, feu, and convey all Lands, Grounds, Houses, Erections, Buildings, Tenements, and Hereditaments, and all other Property of whatever Description which the said Trustees shall or may deem requisite and necessary for the said Roads and Bridges, and whole other Purposes in and by the said recited Act and this Act directed, and to renounce any Claim of Damage or Compensation therefor; and in case the said Trustees shall not come to an Agreement with the respective Owner or Owners and Occupier or Occupiers, or in case the Claim of Damage or Compensation shall not be renounced and not agreed on, the same shall be ascertained by a Jury in the Manner and according to the Rules contained in the said recited Act of the Fourth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty; and on Payment or Consignation of the Price so agreed upon or fixed by such Jury, it shall and may be lawful for the said Trustees to enter upon, take, and use all such Lands, Grounds, Houses, and other Property for the Purposes of this Act.

To prevent

XXVIII. And be it further enacted, That if it shall happen that the repairing and maintaining the said Roads be neglected, it shall and may be lawful for any Person or Persons having paid Tolls thereupon, and finding Caution to pay Expences of Process, to proceed against the said Trustees before the Court of Session, in either of the Divisions thereof, by Petition and Complaint, and in no other Court; and the said Court of Session is hereby authorized and required to judge and determine therein in a summary Manner, and without abiding the Course of the Roll; and upon finding the said Roads not to be in such a State of Repair as the Funds of the Trust, if managed with  
due

due Care and Economy, shall be deemed sufficient to keep them in, the said Trustees shall and may be obliged to have the same amended and repaired within a certain short Space, to be limited by the said Court, who may award Expences of Process to the Pursuer or Pursuers, and whose Judgment shall be final and conclusive; and if any such Process shall be found to have been vexatious and groundless, the Pursuer or Pursuers shall, over and above the Expences of Process, be liable in the Sum of Thirty Pounds in Name of Penalty, which, on being recovered, shall be applied to the Purposes of this Act.

XXIX. And be it further enacted, That if any Person driving any Waggon, Wain, or Cart, or other such Carriage, upon the said Roads, shall suffer any Stone, Timber, or other Thing which shall be carried on any such Carriage, to project on either Side of the said Carriage more than Thirty Inches beyond the Wheels thereof; or if any Person driving any Waggon, Wain, or Cart, or other such Carriage, upon the said Roads, shall meet or shall be overtaken by a Rider on Horseback, and shall not keep his or her Carriage on his or her Left or Near Side of the said Roads, or shall not keep on the same Side him or herself, or shall not at any Time be at the Head of his or her Horse or other Beast of Draught, or shall suffer his or her Horse or other Beast of Draught to go on the said Roads, or stand thereon, without a Person guiding or leading the same, every Person so offending shall for every such Offence forfeit and pay any Sum not exceeding Five Pounds, to be recovered and applied in Terms of the said Act of the Fourth Year of His present Majesty.

XXX. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for any One of the said Trustees, or their Clerk or Treasurer, to prosecute for and recover any Fine, Penalty, or Forfeiture directed to be paid or inflicted by this Act, or by the said recited Act of the Fourth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty.

XXXI. And be it further enacted, That nothing herein contained shall extend or be construed to extend to take away, alter, abridge, or prejudice any Right, Jurisdiction, or Power of the Magistrates and Town Council of the Royal Burgh of *Stirling*, and Community thereof, or any Right, Authority, or Interest of the said Royal Burgh, under or by virtue of the Charter of Erection of the said Royal Burgh, or otherwise, nor shall any thing herein contained repeal or be construed to repeal, alter, or diminish, or to enlarge or extend, or in anywise affect, any Right of the said Magistrates and Town Council and Community, by Charter or otherwise, to levy Customs and Imposts at, in, for, or in relation to the said Royal Burgh of *Stirling*, or to repeal, alter, or diminish, or to enlarge, extend, or affect the Burdens or Obligations imposed on or prestable by the said Magistrates and Town Council and Community in relation to the Application of the Customs so leviabie, or any Portion thereof, or hinder or prevent the levying at the said new Bridge to be built over the said River *Forth* such Customs and Imposts as at present may lawfully be levied at the foresaid present Bridge; and it shall be lawful to the said Magistrates and Town Council, and they are hereby empowered, as soon

as the said new Bridge shall be erected and open to the Public, to levy such Customs and Imposts thereat, in all Time coming, in the same Manner as they can now by Law do at the said present Bridge.

XXXII. And be it further enacted, That when the said Trustees shall have made and completed, and opened for the Public, the Road from the South End of *Port Street, Stirling*, to the River *Forth* aforesaid, the same shall thereafter be held as excluded from this Act, and shall not be subject to any of the Powers and Authorities in and by it given and granted, and shall be maintained and kept in Repair by the said Magistrates and Town Council, and shall in all Time thereafter be subject to all the Powers and Privileges presently enjoyed by the said Magistrates and Town Council, as representing the Community of the said Burgh of *Stirling* : Provided always, that it shall and may be lawful to and for the Trustees of the Statute Labour Roads within the said County of *Stirling* to appropriate the annual Assessments or Conversion Money leviabie within the said Royal Burgh of *Stirling* for the Repair and Maintenance of the said Road ; but the so doing shall not confer on such Trustees any Right or Privilege regarding the said Road, or the other Roads or Streets within the said Burgh, not presently enjoyed by them.

Statute Labour Money levied within Burgh may be applied to this Road.

Public Act.

XXXIII. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others, without being specially pleaded.

Term of Act.

XXXIV. And be it further enacted, That the Powers granted by this Act shall commence from and after the passing of this Act, and shall continue from thence during the Term of Thirty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.
