An Act for more effectually repairing and improving several Roads leading from Tavistock to New Bridge, and other Roads therein mentioned, all in the County of Devon; and for making Diversions to communicate therewith.

[20th May 1825.]

HEREAS an Act was passed in the Forty-fourth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled An Act for amending and repairing several Roads leading from 44 G. 3. c.76. the Guildhall and Market House in Tavistock to New Bridge, to Greston Bridge, to Downtown Gate, to Riccards House, to Cherrybrook and Dunnabridge Pound, and to Morwellham and New Quay, all in the County of Devon: And whereas the Trustees for executing the said Act have proceeded in the Execution thereof, for which Purpose they have borrowed several considerable Sums of Money upon the Credit of the Tolls thereby granted, which Money still remains due and owing, and cannot be paid off, nor can the said Roads be sufficiently amended, widened, altered, improved, and kept in Repair, unless the Term granted by the said recited Act be continued: And whereas an Act was passed in the Third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled An Act to amend the general Laws now in being for regulating 3G.4.c.126. Turnpike Roads in that Part of Great Britain called England: And whereas an Act was passed in the Fourth Year of the Reign of His said present Majesty, intituled An Act to explain and amend an Act passed in 4 G. 4. c. 95. the Third Year of the Reign of His said present Majesty, to amend the [Local.]

general Laws now in being for regulating Turnpike Roads in that Part of Great Britain called England: And whereas an Act was passed in the Fifth 5 G. 4. c. 69. Year of the Reign of His said present Majesty, intituled An Act to enable Justices of the Reace for Ridings, Divisions, and Sokes, to act as Trustees for repairing and maintaining Turnpike Roads: And whereas the making and maintaining of an Alteration of Diversion of the said Roads leading from Tavistock to Greston Bridge, commencing at Tuell Down in the Parish of Milton Abbott in the said County of Devon, and terminating at Milton Green in the same Parish; and also the making and maintaining of another Alteration or Diversion in the same Road, commencing at Eastacott in the Parish of Dunterton in the said County, and terminating at Greston Bridge in the same Parish: and also the making and maintaining of another Alteration or Diversion in the said Road, leading from Tavistock to Downtown Gate, commencing at Lanehead in the Parish of Mary Tavy in the said County, and terminating at Downtown Gate in the Parish of Lidford in the said County; and also the making and maintaining of another Alteration or Diversion in the said Road leading from Tavistock to Downtown Gate, commencing at Wringworthy Cross near Harford Bridge in the said Parish of Mary Tavy, and terminating at the River Dart in the Forest of Dartmoor in the said Parish of Lidford; and also the making and maintaining a Road from Riccards House in the Parish of Lamerton in the said County, to Downtown Gate in the said Parish of Lidford; and also the making and maintaining of another Alteration or Diversion in the said Road leading from Tavistock to New Bridge, commencing at Ford Street Toll Gate in the Parish of Tavistock in the said County, and terminating at the East End of New Bridge, in the same Parish; and also the making and maintaining a Road from Cullacombe Down in the said Parish of Lamerton, by Chipshop, to near Hurlditch Horn in the said Parish of Tavistock; and also the making and maintaining a certain other Road from Cullacombe Down aforesaid to the North End of Beckwell Farm in the Parish of Milton Abbott aforesaid. and from thence to Lifton Town in the Parish of Lifton in the said County: and also another Road leading from the Cross Road near Long Cross in the Parish of Lamerton aforesaid, by Chillaton Hill Head, to Lew Down, in the Parish' of Lew Trenchard in the said County; and also the making and maintaining a Road from the Guildhall in Tavistock to a Lane leading towards, Indiscombe, in the said Parish of Tavistock; and also the making and maintaining of a Road from Heathfield near Hurdwick Lane in the Parish of Lamerton aforesaid, to Yelloway Lane in the Parish of Milton Abbott aforesaid; and also the making and maintaining of a Road from Milemead Head in the said Parish of Tavistock, to the present Turnpike Road near Hurdwick in the same Parish; and also the making and maintaining a Road leading from the Market House and Guildhall in Tavistock, to the North End of Westbridge in the said Parish of Tavistock, would be of great Utility and Advantage, not only to the Public, but also to the Proprietors and Occupiers of the neighbouring Estates: And whereas it would be more convenient if the said Act of the Forty-fourth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Third was repealed; and further, better, and more effectual Powers granted, as well for the amending, widening, and otherwise improving the several Roads nôw included in the said Act, as also for the making, maintaining, and from Time to Time improving the Alterations and Diversions herein-after particularly mentioned and described; but the beneficial Purposes aforesaid cannot be effected without the Aid and Authority of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it

enacted, by, the King's most Excellent Majesty,, by and with the Advice; and Consent, of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present. Parliament, assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That Recited Act from and after, the passing of this Act the said recited, Act passed in the Forty-fourth Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty King George the this Act to Third shall be and the same is hereby declared to be repealed, and null and void to all Intents, and Purposes, whatsoever, and on the same Day this Act shall commence and take Effect instead thereof, and shall, together, with the said recited Acts of the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Years of the Reign of His said present Majesty, be put in Execution for and during the Term herein-after mentioned as well for the Purpose of more effectually repairing, widening, altering, diverting, and from Time to Time improving and keeping in Repair the said several Roads leading from the Guildhall and Market House in Tavistock to New Bridge, to Greston Bridge, to Downtown Gate, to Riccards Houses to Three hundred Yards East of Menreville Bridge in the Parish of Whitchurch in the said County; and to Morwellham and New Quay, all in the County of Devon; and from Tavistock, aforesaid to the East End of Lumborn Bridge, and from the West End of the said Bridge, by Gulworthy, to the East End of New Bridge, in the Road from Tavistock: to Callington; and the Road from Tavistock afonesaid, through Milemead Lane, Lamerton Green, Tooldown, Milton Abbotts Church Town, and Felldown Head, to the East End of Greston Bridge in the Road to Launceston; and also the Road from Tavistock aforesaid by Wringworthy Lane Head and Beardon, to a Place called Downtown Gate, in the Parish of Lidford; and also the Road from Tavistock aforesaid, by Hurdwick, and over Heathfield Down, to a Public House called Riccards House, in the Parish of Lamerton aforesaid; and also the Road leading from the Guildhall of the said Borough of Tavistock, through Matthew Street and Lowerbrook Street, over the River Tavy, by Tavyton, over Littledown, to the North-west End of Merreville Bridge, and from thence to a Place lying Three hundred Yards from the South-east End of the said last-mentioned Bridge, on the Road leading to a Place called Two Bridges; and also the Road branching off from the Turnpike Road which leads from Tavistock towards Callington, and leading from the said Turnpike Road, through Morwellham Lane, by Hurlditch Horns. over Morwellham Down, to certain Quays on the navigable River Tamer, called Morwellham and New Quay; as also for the Purpose of making, and from Timesto Timesamending, repairing, widening, altering, and improving a Diversion of the said Roads leading from Tavistock to Greston; Bridge, commencing at Tuell Down in the Parish of Milton Abbott in the said County, and terminating at Milton Green in the same Parish; and also another Diversion in the same Road, commencing at Eastacott in the Parish of Dunterton in the said County; and terminating at Greston Bridge in the same Parish; and also a Diversion in the said Road leading from Tavistock to Downtown Gate, commencing at Lanehead in the Parish of Mary Tavy in the said County, and terminating at Downtown Gate in the said Parish of Lidford in the said County, and also an Alteration or Diversion, in the said Road leading from Tavistock to New Bridge, commencing at the East End of New Bridge in the same Parish; and also a Road from Riccards House in the Parishs of Lamerton in the said County, to Downtown Gate in the said Parish of Lidford; and also a Road leading from: Cullacombe Down in the Parish of Lamerton aforesaid, by Chipshop, to near Hurlditch Horn in the said Parish of Tavistock; and also Roads from Cullacombe Down aforesaid to the North End of Beckwell Farm in the

III. And be it further enacted, That this Act, and the Term and Tolls hereby granted, shall be and they are hereby made subject and liable to the Payment of all Monies which have been borrowed and are now due and owing on the Credit of the Tolls authorized to be taken by the said Act of the Forty-fourth Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty King George the Third, hereby repealed, or any Act or Acts therein recited, and also of such other Sum or Sums of Money as may be borrowed by virtue of or become due on the Credit of the said Act and of this Act. or either of them, and of all Interest due and to grow due thereon respectively, as fully and effectually to all Intents and Purposes as if such Monies had been borrowed or become due and owing on the Credit or Security of the Tolls granted by this Act; and all and every Person and Persons who may owe or be subject or liable to the Payment of any Sum or Sums of Money to the Trustees for executing the said Act hereby repealed and this Act, or to any other Person or Persons, for the Benefit of the said Roads, shall be liable to the Payment of all such Sum and Sums of Money to the Trustees for executing this Act, in such and the same Manner as if this Act had not been passed. That all Bonds, Covenants, Agreements, and Securities made or entered into by any Person or Persons to or with. any of the Trustees: for executing the said Act of the Forty-fourth Year: of the Reign of His said late Majesty King George the Third, hereby repealed, or any Act or Acts therein recited, according to the Provisions, and 161 131

and Directions thereof, shall remain in full Force and Effect; and shall be and continue available in all Courts of Law and Equity, until the same are or shall be fully satisfied and performed on account of or for the Benefit of the Roads included in this Act; and all Contracts, Agreements, Demises, Mortgages, and Securities duly made or entered into by the Trustees for executing the said Act hereby repealed, to or with any Persons, shall remain in full Force and Effect, and shall be binding on the Trustees for executing this Act and the said recited Acts of the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Years of the Reign of His said present Majesty, and be observed and kept by them according to the Terms, Stipulations, and Tenor thereof respectively.

V. And be it further enacted, That all Persons who are or have been Persons ememployed, or who have received any Tolls or other Money on account ployed under of the said Roads comprized in the said recited Act of the Forty-fourth former Act Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty King George the Third, or who Trustees have or shall have in their Custody or Possession any Money, Books, under this Papers, Writings, or other Things relating to the said Roads, shall account Act. for and pay and deliver over the same and every Part thereof to the Trustees for executing this Act, in like Manner and under the like Penalties as the several Collectors and other Persons receiving any Money by virtue of the said recited Acts of the Third and Fourth Years of the Reign of His said present Majesty, and this Act, are required to pay or account for the same.

VI. or

or Employ of any such Clerk or Clerks, or of his Partner or Partners, the Treasurer or Treasurers for the Purposes of this Act; or to continue or appoint any Person or Persons who has or have been or may be appointed Treasurer or Treasurers, or the Partner or Partners of any such Treasurer or Treasurers, or the Clerk or Clerks or other Person or Persons in the Service or Employ of any such Treasurer or Treasurers, or of his or their Partner or Partners, the Clerk or Clerks to the said Trustees; and if any Person shall accept both the Offices of Clerk and Treasurer for the Purposes of the said recited Acts of the Third and Fourth Years of the Reign of His said present Majesty and this Act, or if any Person being the Partner or Partners of any such Clerk or Clerks, or the Clerk or Clerks or other Person or Persons in the Service or Employ of any such Clerk or Clerks, or of his or their Partner or Partners, shall accept the Office of Treasurer, or being the Partner or Partners of any such Treasurer or Treasurers, or the Clerk or Clerks or other Person or Persons in the Service or Employ of any such Treasurer or Treasurers, or the Clerk or Clerks or other Person or Persons in the Service or Employ of the Partner of such Treasurer, shall accept the Office of Clerk in the Execution of the said recited Acts of the Third and Fourth Years of the Reign of His said-present Majesty and this Act, or if any such Treasurer shall hold or accept any Place or Office of Profit or Trust under the said Trustees other than that of Treasurer, every such Person so offending shall for every such Offence forfeit and pay the Sum of One hundred Pounds to any Person who shall sue for the same, to be recovered with full Costs of Suit in any of His Majesty's Courts of Record at Westminster, by Action of Debt or on the Case, or by Bill, Suit, or Information, wherein no Essoign, Protection, or Wager of Law, nor more than One Imparlance, shall be allowed.

XI. And for the Purpose of collecting and receiving the Tolls hereby Power to granted and made payable, be it further enacted, That the said Trustees may and they are hereby authorized and empowered, if they shall think proper, to continue, remove, take away, or alter the Situation of all or any of the Toll Gate or Gates, Bar or Bars, Chain or Chains, and Toll Houses which have been erected in, upon, or across any Part of the several Roads made, altered, repaired, amended, diverted, or improved by virtue of the said recited Act of the Forty-fourth Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty King George the Third, hereby repealed, or any Act or Acts therein recited, and shall and may erect or cause to be erected such and so many other Toll Gate or Gates, Bar or Bars, Chain or Chains, Toll Houses, and Weighing Machine or Weighing Machines; in, upon, or across any Part or Parts of the said Roads, and also in, upon, and across any Part of the Diversions or Alterations, and new Branches, or additional Lines of Road by this Act authorized to be made, and upon the Side or Sides thereof respectively, as they the said Trustees shall think proper and expedient; and also shall or may erect or provide a Toll House, with suitable Outbuildings, a Garden, and other Conveniences, not exceeding One-eighth Part of a Statute Acre of Land, at or near each of the said Toll Gates.

XII. And be it further enacted, That the several Tolls following shall Power to take be demanded and taken at each of the Gates, Bars, or Chains now erected Tolls. or hereafter to be erected upon the said Roads included in this Act, by

For each and every Horse or other Beast drawing any Waggon, Wain, Dray, Cart, Caravan, or other such like Carriage, having the Sole or Bottom of the Fellies of the Wheels thereof of the Breadth of Six

Inches, the Sum of Seven-pence Halfpenny:

For each and every Horse or other Beast drawing any Waggon, Wain, Dray, Cart, Caravan, or other such like Carriage, having the Sole or Bottom of the Fellies of the Wheels thereof of a less Breadth than Six Inches, and not less than Four Inches and a Half, the Sum of Seven-pence Halfpenny:

For each and every Horse or other Beast drawing any Waggon, Wain, Dray, Cart, Caravan, or other such like Carriage, having the Sole or Bottom of the Fellies of the Wheels thereof of a less Breadth than Four Inches and a Half, and not less than Three Inches, the Sum of

Seven-pence Halfpenny:

For each and every Horse or other Beast drawing any Waggon, Wain, Dray, Cart, Caravan, or other such like Carriage, having the Sole or Bottom of the Fellies of the Wheels thereof of less Breadth than Three Inches, the Sum of Seven-pence Halfpenny:

For each and every Horse, Mule, or Ass, laden or unladen, and not

drawing, the Sum of Three Halfpence:

For each and every Horse or other Beast employed in drawing Lime, or Culm for burning Lime, One Penny:

For each and every Horse or other Beast employed in carrying Lime, or

Culm for burning Lime, One Halfpenny:

For every Score of Oxen, Cows, or Neat Cattle, the Sum of One Shilling and Eight-pence per Score; and so in proportion for any greater or less Number: And,

For every Score of Calves, Swine, Sheep, or Lambs, the Sum of Tenpence per Score; and so in proportion for any greater or less Number:

Which said respective Sums of Money shall be demanded and taken in the Name of or as Tolls, and shall be and are hereby vested in the said Trustees, and shall be applied as herein-after is directed.

Trustees to erect Gates and take Tolls on the Diversions of Road.

XIII. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, and they are hereby authorized, empowered, and required to erect and set up, or cause to be erected and set up, in, upon, or across each of the said Diversions of Road hereby authorized to be made, One or more Gate or Gates, Bar or Bars, Chain or Chains, in such Situations and Places as they shall think proper; and it shall be lawful for the said Trustees to take down and remove the said Gate or Gates, and to erect and place the same in such other Place or Places upon the said Diversions as they shall from Time to Time think proper, and to take or cause to be taken at such Gate or Gates such and the like Tolls as are by this Act authorized to be taken upon any other Parts of the said Roads.

XIV. Pro-

XIV. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That when the full Toll shall have been paid for or in respect of any Horse, Cattle, Beast, or Carriage passing through any Toll Gate or Turnpike continued or erected passing and by virtue of the said recited Acts of the Third and Fourth Years of the repassing.
