An Act for more effectually repairing and improving several Roads leading from *Tavistock* to *New Bridge*, and other Roads therein mentioned, all in the County of *Devon*; and for making Diversions to communicaté therewith.

[20th May 1825.]

WHEREAS an Act was passed in the Forty-fourth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King *George* the Third, intituled *An Act for amending and repairing several Roads leading from the Guildhall and Market House in Tavistock to New Bridge, to Greston Bridge, to Downtown Gate, to Riccards House, to Cherrybrook and Dunabridge Pound, and to Morwellham and New Quay, all in the County of Devon*: And whereas the Trustees for executing the said Act have proceeded in the Execution thereof, for which Purpose they have borrowed several considerable Sums of Money upon the Credit of the Tolls thereby granted, which Money still remains due and owing, and cannot be paid off, nor can the said Roads be sufficiently amended, widened, altered, improved; and kept in Repair, unless the Term granted by the said recited Act be continued: And whereas an Act was passed in the Third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty King *George* the Fourth, intituled *An Act to amend the general Laws now in being for regulating Turnpike Roads in that Part of Great Britain called England*: And whereas an Act was passed in the Fourth Year of the Reign of His said present Majesty, intituled *An Act to explain and amend an Act passed in the Third Year of the Reign of His said present Majesty, to amend the* [Local.]

5 G. 4. c. 69. *general Laws now in being for regulating Turnpike Roads in that Part of Great Britain called England: And whereas an Act was passed in the Fifth Year of the Reign of His said present Majesty, intituled An Act to enable Justices of the Peace for Ridings, Divisions, and Sokes, to act as Trustees for repairing and maintaining Turnpike Roads: And whereas the making and maintaining of an Alteration or Diversion of the said Roads leading from Tavistock to Greston Bridge, commencing at Tuell Down in the Parish of Milton Abbott in the said County of Devon, and terminating at Milton Green in the same Parish; and also the making and maintaining of another Alteration or Diversion in the same Road, commencing at Eastacott in the Parish of Dunterton in the said County, and terminating at Greston Bridge in the same Parish; and also the making and maintaining of another Alteration or Diversion in the said Road, leading from Tavistock to Downtown Gate, commencing at Lanehead in the Parish of Mary Tavy in the said County, and terminating at Downtown Gate in the Parish of Lidford in the said County; and also the making and maintaining of another Alteration or Diversion in the said Road leading from Tavistock to Downtown Gate, commencing at Wringworthy Cross near Harford Bridge in the said Parish of Mary Tavy, and terminating at the River Dart in the Forest of Dartmoor in the said Parish of Lidford; and also the making and maintaining a Road from Riccards House in the Parish of Lamerton in the said County, to Downtown Gate in the said Parish of Lidford; and also the making and maintaining of another Alteration or Diversion in the said Road leading from Tavistock to New Bridge, commencing at Ford Street Toll Gate in the Parish of Tavistock in the said County, and terminating at the East End of New Bridge in the same Parish; and also the making and maintaining a Road from Cullacombe Down in the said Parish of Lamerton, by Chipshop, to near Hurditch Horn in the said Parish of Tavistock; and also the making and maintaining a certain other Road from Cullacombe Down aforesaid to the North End of Beckwell Farm in the Parish of Milton Abbott aforesaid, and from thence to Lifton Town in the Parish of Lifton in the said County; and also another Road leading from the Cross Road near Long Cross in the Parish of Lamerton aforesaid, by Chillaton Hill Head, to Lew Down, in the Parish of Lew Trenchard in the said County; and also the making and maintaining a Road from the Guildhall in Tavistock to a Lane leading towards Indiscombe in the said Parish of Tavistock; and also the making and maintaining of a Road from Heathfield near Hurdwick Lane in the Parish of Lamerton aforesaid, to Yelloway Lane in the Parish of Milton Abbott aforesaid; and also the making and maintaining of a Road from Milemead Head in the said Parish of Tavistock, to the present Turnpike Road near Hurdwick in the same Parish; and also the making and maintaining a Road leading from the Market House and Guildhall in Tavistock, to the North End of Westbridge in the said Parish of Tavistock, would be of great Utility and Advantage, not only to the Public, but also to the Proprietors and Occupiers of the neighbouring Estates: And whereas it would be more convenient if the said Act of the Forty-fourth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Third was repealed, and further, better, and more effectual Powers granted, as well for the amending, widening, and otherwise improving the several Roads now included in the said Act, as also for the making, maintaining, and from Time to Time improving the Alterations and Diversions herein-after particularly mentioned and described; but the beneficial Purposes aforesaid cannot be effected without the Aid and Authority of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it*

enacted, by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent, of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this Act the said recited Act passed in the Forty-fourth Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty King George the Third shall be, and the same is hereby declared, to be repealed, and null and void, to all Intents and Purposes whatsoever, and on the same Day this Act shall commence and take Effect instead thereof, and shall, together with the said recited Acts of the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Years of the Reign of His said present Majesty, be put in Execution for and during the Term herein-after mentioned, as well for the Purpose of more effectually repairing, widening, altering, diverting, and from Time to Time improving and keeping in Repair the said several Roads leading from the Guildhall and Market House in *Tavistock* to *New Bridge*, to *Greston Bridge*, to *Downtown Gate*, to *Riccards House*, to Three hundred Yards East of *Merreville Bridge* in the Parish of *Whitchurch* in the said County, and to *Morwellham* and *New Quay*, all in the County of *Devon*; and from *Tavistock* aforesaid to the East End of *Lumborn Bridge*, and from the West End of the said Bridge, by *Gulworthy*, to the East End of *New Bridge*, in the Road from *Tavistock* to *Callington*; and the Road from *Tavistock* aforesaid, through *Milemead Lane*, *Lamerton Green*, *Tooldown*, *Milton Abbott*, *Church Town*, and *Felldown Head*, to the East End of *Greston Bridge* in the Road to *Launceston*; and also the Road from *Tavistock* aforesaid, by *Wringworthy Lane Head* and *Beardon*, to a Place called *Downtown Gate* in the Parish of *Lidford*; and also the Road from *Tavistock* aforesaid, by *Hurdwick*, and over *Heathfield Down*, to a Public House called *Riccards House*, in the Parish of *Lamerton* aforesaid; and also the Road leading from the Guildhall of the said Borough of *Tavistock*, through *Matthew Street* and *Lowerbrook Street*, over the River *Tavy*, by *Tavyton*, over *Littledown*, to the North-west End of *Merreville Bridge*, and from thence to a Place lying Three hundred Yards from the South-east End of the said last-mentioned Bridge, on the Road leading to a Place called *Two Bridges*; and also the Road branching off from the Turnpike Road which leads from *Tavistock* towards *Callington*, and leading from the said Turnpike Road, through *Morwellham Lane*, by *Hurditch Horn*, over *Morwellham Down*, to certain Quays on the navigable River *Tamer*, called *Morwellham* and *New Quay*; as also for the Purpose of making, and from Time to Time amending, repairing, widening, altering, and improving a Diversion of the said Roads leading from *Tavistock* to *Greston Bridge*, commencing at *Tuell Down* in the Parish of *Milton Abbott* in the said County, and terminating at *Milton Green* in the same Parish; and also another Diversion in the same Road, commencing at *Eastacott* in the Parish of *Dunterton* in the said County, and terminating at *Greston Bridge* in the same Parish; and also a Diversion in the said Road leading from *Tavistock* to *Downtown Gate*, commencing at *Lanehead* in the Parish of *Mary Tavy* in the said County, and terminating at *Downtown Gate* in the said Parish of *Lidford* in the said County; and also an Alteration or Diversion in the said Road leading from *Tavistock* to *New Bridge*, commencing at the East End of *New Bridge* in the same Parish; and also a Road from *Riccards House* in the Parish of *Lamerton* in the said County, to *Downtown Gate* in the said Parish of *Lidford*; and also a Road leading from *Cullacombe Down* in the Parish of *Lamerton* aforesaid, by *Chipshop*, to near *Hurditch Horn* in the said Parish of *Tavistock*; and also Roads from *Cullacombe Down* aforesaid to the North End of *Beckwell Farm* in the Parish

Parish of *Milton Abbott* aforesaid, and from thence to *Lifton Town* in the Parish of *Lifton* in the said County; and also another Road leading from the Cross Road near *Long Cross* in the Parish of *Lamerton* aforesaid, by *Chillaton Hill Head*, in the Parishes of *Coryton* and *Milton Abbott* in the same County, and from thence to *Lew Down* in the Parish of *Lew Trenchard* in the said County; and also a Road from the Guildhall in *Tavistock* to a Lane leading towards *Indiscombe* in the said Parish of *Tavistock*; and also a Road from *Heathfield* near *Hurdwick Lane* in the Parish of *Lamerton* aforesaid, to *Yellowway Lane* in the Parish of *Milton Abbott* aforesaid; and also a Road from *Milemead Head* in the said Parish of *Tavistock*, to the present Turnpike Road near *Hurdwick* in the same Parish, and also from the Market House and Guildhall in *Tavistock* to the North End of *West Bridge* in the said Parish of *Tavistock*.

Powers of recited Acts 3, 4, & 5 G.4. extended to this Act.

II. And be it further enacted, That the said recited Act passed in the Third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, and all and every the Powers, Provisions, Exemptions, Penalties, Forfeitures, Payments, Remedies, Matters, and Things therein contained (save and except such Parts thereof as are expressly varied, altered, or repealed by the said recited Act of the Fourth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, or varied, altered, or otherwise provided for by this Act), and also the said recited Acts passed in the Fourth and Fifth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, and all and every the Powers, Provisions, Exemptions, Penalties, Forfeitures, Payments, Remedies, Matters, and Things therein respectively contained (save and except such Parts thereof as are expressly varied, altered, or otherwise provided for by this Act), shall respectively be as good, valid, and effectual for carrying this Act into Execution as if the same had respectively been repeated and re-enacted in the Body of this Act.

New Term and Tolls liable to Debts, &c.

III. And be it further enacted, That this Act, and the Term and Tolls hereby granted, shall be and they are hereby made subject and liable to the Payment of all Monies which have been borrowed and are now due and owing on the Credit of the Tolls authorized to be taken by the said Act of the Forty-fourth Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty King *George* the Third, hereby repealed, or any Act or Acts therein recited, and also of such other Sum or Sums of Money as may be borrowed by virtue of or become due on the Credit of the said Act and of this Act, or either of them, and of all Interest due and to grow due thereon respectively, as fully and effectually to all Intents and Purposes as if such Monies had been borrowed or become due and owing on the Credit or Security of the Tolls granted by this Act; and all and every Person and Persons who may owe or be subject or liable to the Payment of any Sum or Sums of Money to the Trustees for executing the said Act hereby repealed and this Act, or to any other Person or Persons, for the Benefit of the said Roads, shall be liable to the Payment of all such Sum and Sums of Money to the Trustees for executing this Act, in such and the same Manner as if this Act had not been passed.

Bonds, &c. under former Act to be good under this Act.

IV. And be it further enacted, That all Bonds, Covenants, Agreements, and Securities made or entered into by any Person or Persons to or with any of the Trustees for executing the said Act of the Forty-fourth Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty King *George* the Third, hereby repealed, or any Act or Acts therein recited, according to the Provisions and

and Directions thereof, shall remain in full Force and Effect, and shall be and continue available in all Courts of Law and Equity, until the same are or shall be fully satisfied and performed on account of or for the Benefit of the Roads included in this Act; and all Contracts, Agreements, Demises, Mortgages, and Securities duly made or entered into by the Trustees for executing the said Act hereby repealed, to or with any Persons, shall remain in full Force and Effect, and shall be binding on the Trustees for executing this Act and the said recited Acts of the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Years of the Reign of His said present Majesty, and be observed and kept by them according to the Terms, Stipulations, and Tenor thereof respectively.

V. And be it further enacted, That all Persons who are or have been employed, or who have received any Tolls or other Money on account of the said Roads comprized in the said recited Act of the Forty-fourth Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty King *George* the Third, or who have or shall have in their Custody or Possession any Money, Books, Papers, Writings, or other Things relating to the said Roads, shall account for and pay and deliver over the same and every Part thereof to the Trustees for executing this Act, in like Manner and under the like Penalties as the several Collectors and other Persons receiving any Money by virtue of the said recited Acts of the Third and Fourth Years of the Reign of His said present Majesty, and this Act, are required to pay or account for the same.

Persons employed under former Act to account to Trustees under this Act.

VI. And be it further enacted, That all and every Book and Books containing the Accounts and Proceedings of the Trustees for executing the said recited Act hereby repealed, or containing any Orders or Agreements made or entered into by them, and made Evidence thereby, shall and may be given in Evidence in all Cases of Appeal, and in all Prosecutions, Suits, and Actions whatsoever, in such and the same Manner as if the said Act had not been repealed.

VII. VIII. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees at their First and Second Meetings, or either of them, to be held under or by virtue of this Act, to elect, nominate, and appoint any Number of fit and proper Persons, not exceeding Three in the whole, to be Trustees for the Purposes of this Act, and of the said recited Acts of the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Years of the Reign of His said present Majesty, in addition to the Trustees hereby nominated and appointed; and such Trustees, when so elected and appointed, and being qualified according to the Directions of the said recited Acts or any of them, shall be and they are hereby invested with the same Powers and Authorities for executing the said Acts and this Act as if they had been named and appointed in and by this Act.

IX. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees shall meet at the Guildhall, or at some other convenient House or Place in *Tavistock*, on the Second *Wednesday* next after the passing of this Act, or as soon after as conveniently may be, and proceed to put this Act and the said recited Acts of the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Years of the Reign of His said present Majesty into Execution, with Power to adjourn from Time to Time, or to convene a Meeting, by advertising the same in any Paper printed or published in the said County of *Devon*.

X. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That it shall not be lawful for the said Trustees to continue or appoint the Person or Persons who has or have been or may be appointed their Clerk or Clerks in the Execution of this Act, or the Partner or Partners of any such Clerk or Clerks, or the Clerk or Clerks or other Person or Persons in the Service

or Employ of any such Clerk or Clerks, or of his Partner or Partners; the Treasurer or Treasurers for the Purposes of this Act; or to continue or appoint any Person or Persons who has or have been or may be appointed Treasurer or Treasurers, or the Partner or Partners of any such Treasurer or Treasurers, or the Clerk or Clerks or other Person or Persons in the Service or Employ of any such Treasurer or Treasurers, or of his or their Partner or Partners, the Clerk or Clerks to the said Trustees; and if any Person shall accept both the Offices of Clerk and Treasurer for the Purposes of the said recited Acts of the Third and Fourth Years of the Reign of His said present Majesty and this Act, or if any Person being the Partner or Partners of any such Clerk or Clerks, or the Clerk or Clerks or other Person or Persons in the Service or Employ of any such Clerk or Clerks, or of his or their Partner or Partners, shall accept the Office of Treasurer, or being the Partner or Partners of any such Treasurer or Treasurers, or the Clerk or Clerks or other Person or Persons in the Service or Employ of any such Treasurer or Treasurers, or the Clerk or Clerks or other Person or Persons in the Service or Employ of the Partner of such Treasurer, shall accept the Office of Clerk in the Execution of the said recited Acts of the Third and Fourth Years of the Reign of His said present Majesty and this Act, or if any such Treasurer shall hold or accept any Place or Office of Profit or Trust under the said Trustees other than that of Treasurer, every such Person so offending shall for every such Offence forfeit and pay the Sum of One hundred Pounds to any Person who shall sue for the same, to be recovered with full Costs of Suit in any of His Majesty's Courts of Record at *Westminster*, by Action of Debt or on the Case, or by Bill, Suit, or Information, wherein no Essoign, Protection, or Wager of Law, nor more than One Imparlance, shall be allowed.

XI. And for the Purpose of collecting and receiving the Tolls hereby granted and made payable, be it further enacted, That the said Trustees may and they are hereby authorized and empowered, if they shall think proper, to continue, remove, take away, or alter the Situation of all or any of the Toll Gate or Gates, Bar or Bars, Chain or Chains, and Toll Houses which have been erected in, upon, or across any Part of the several Roads made, altered, repaired, amended, diverted, or improved by virtue of the said recited Act of the Forty-fourth Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty King *George* the Third, hereby repealed, or any Act or Acts therein recited, and shall and may erect or cause to be erected such and so many other Toll Gate or Gates, Bar or Bars, Chain or Chains, Toll Houses, and Weighing Machine or Weighing Machines; in, upon, or across any Part or Parts of the said Roads, and also in, upon, and across any Part of the Diversions or Alterations, and new Branches, or additional Lines of Road by this Act authorized to be made, and upon the Side or Sides thereof respectively, as they the said Trustees shall think proper and expedient; and also shall or may erect or provide a Toll House, with suitable Outbuildings, a Garden, and other Conveniences, not exceeding One-eighth Part of a Statute Acre of Land, at or near each of the said Toll Gates.

Power to continue or erect Toll Gates, Toll Houses, &c.

XII. And be it further enacted, That the several Tolls following shall be demanded and taken at each of the Gates, Bars, or Chains now erected or hereafter to be erected upon the said Roads included in this Act, by such

such Person or Persons as the said Trustees shall from Time to Time appoint to receive the same, before any Horse, Cattle, or Carriage shall be permitted to pass through the same; (that is to say),

Tolls.

For each and every Horse or other Beast employed in drawing any Coach, Berlin, Landau, Sociable, Chariot, Curricule, Calash, Hearse, Chaise, Phaeton, Whiskey, Gig, or Chair, or other such Carriage, the Sum of Seven-pence Halfpenny :

For each and every Horse or other Beast drawing any Waggon, Wain, Dray, Cart, Caravan, or other such like Carriage, having the Sole or Bottom of the Fellies of the Wheels thereof of the Breadth of Six Inches, the Sum of Seven-pence Halfpenny :

For each and every Horse or other Beast drawing any Waggon, Wain, Dray, Cart, Caravan, or other such like Carriage, having the Sole or Bottom of the Fellies of the Wheels thereof of a less Breadth than Six Inches, and not less than Four Inches and a Half, the Sum of Seven-pence Halfpenny :

For each and every Horse or other Beast drawing any Waggon, Wain, Dray, Cart, Caravan, or other such like Carriage, having the Sole or Bottom of the Fellies of the Wheels thereof of a less Breadth than Four Inches and a Half, and not less than Three Inches, the Sum of Seven-pence Halfpenny :

For each and every Horse or other Beast drawing any Waggon, Wain, Dray, Cart, Caravan, or other such like Carriage, having the Sole or Bottom of the Fellies of the Wheels thereof of less Breadth than Three Inches, the Sum of Seven-pence Halfpenny :

For each and every Horse, Mule, or Ass, laden or unladen, and not drawing, the Sum of Three Halfpence :

For each and every Horse or other Beast employed in drawing Lime, or Culm for burning Lime, One Penny :

For each and every Horse or other Beast employed in carrying Lime, or Culm for burning Lime, One Halfpenny :

For every Score of Oxen, Cows, or Neat Cattle, the Sum of One Shilling and Eight-pence *per* Score; and so in proportion for any greater or less Number : And,

For every Score of Calves, Swine, Sheep, or Lambs, the Sum of Ten-pence *per* Score; and so in proportion for any greater or less Number :

Which said respective Sums of Money shall be demanded and taken in the Name of or as Tolls, and shall be and are hereby vested in the said Trustees, and shall be applied as herein-after is directed.

Trustees to erect Gates and take Tolls on the Diversions of Road.

XIII. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, and they are hereby authorized, empowered, and required to erect and set up, or cause to be erected and set up, in, upon, or across each of the said Diversions of Road hereby authorized to be made, One or more Gate or Gates, Bar or Bars, Chain or Chains, in such Situations and Places as they shall think proper; and it shall be lawful for the said Trustees to take down and remove the said Gate or Gates, and to erect and place the same in such other Place or Places upon the said Diversions as they shall from Time to Time think proper, and to take or cause to be taken at such Gate or Gates such and the like Tolls as are by this Act authorized to be taken upon any other Parts of the said Roads.

XIV. Pro-

XIV. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That when the full Toll shall have been paid for or in respect of any Horse, Cattle, Beast, or Carriage passing through any Toll Gate or Turnpike continued or erected by virtue of the said recited Acts of the Third and Fourth Years of the Reign of His said present Majesty and this Act (on producing a Note or Ticket denoting such Payment), the same Horse, Cattle, Beast, or Carriage shall be permitted to return Toll-free through such Toll Gate or Turnpike on the same Day, before Twelve of the Clock at Night, except as herein-after mentioned.

Tolls to be taken but Once for passing and re-passing.

XV. Provided nevertheless, and be it further enacted, That no more than Two full Tolls shall be demanded or taken in the same Day (to be computed from Twelve of the Clock in one Night to Twelve of the Clock in the next succeeding Night) for or in respect of the same Horses, Cattle, Beasts, or Carriages passing and re-passing through all the Turnpikes or Toll Gates maintained and supported by virtue of the said recited Acts of the Third and Fourth Years of the Reign of His said present Majesty and this Act, or either of them, upon the said Roads; but after Two full Tolls shall have been paid as aforesaid, on producing a Note or Ticket or Notes or Tickets denoting the Payment of such Tolls, the same Horses, Cattle, Beasts, and Carriages shall return Toll-free during such Day (to be computed as aforesaid), through all and every the Gate and Gates, Turnpike and Turnpikes, erected on the said Roads, or across any Road or Way leading out of the same, (except as herein-after mentioned); and all the respective Collectors of the Tolls are hereby required to deliver such Notes or Tickets *gratis* on Receipt of the Tolls in manner aforesaid.

Tolls to be paid but Twice a Day.

XVI. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That for or in respect of all Horses or other Beasts drawing any Stage Coach, or any Stage Waggon, Van, Caravan, or other Stage Carriage carrying Passengers or Goods for Payment, Hire, or Reward, for which Toll shall have been paid, and which shall return on the same Day through the same Turnpike or Toll Gate, the Tolls hereby made payable shall be paid for every Time of passing and re-passing through such Toll Gate, in like Manner, as if no Toll had been before paid; and the Tolls hereby made payable shall be paid for or in respect of all Horses or other Beasts drawing Post Chaises and other Carriages travelling for Hire, for every Time of passing or re-passing along the said Roads on the same Day with a Ticket denoting a fresh Hiring.

Stage Coaches, &c. to pay each Time of passing.

XVII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That all Waggon, Carts, or other such Carriages, having at the Time of the using thereof Wheels which shall deviate more than One Quarter of an Inch from a flat Surface, or shall not have the Nails thereof countersunk, so as to form a level Surface, shall be deemed liable and subject to the Payment of the same Toll as Carriages with Wheels of less than Three Inches in Breadth on the Soles thereof.

Proviso as to Wheels deviating from a flat Surface, &c.

XVIII. And be it further enacted, That in all Cases where there shall be a fractional Part of a Halfpenny in the Calculation or Amount of the Tolls hereby granted and authorized, or any of them, the Sum of One Halfpenny shall be demanded and taken in lieu of such fractional Part.

A Halfpenny to be taken when the Tolls amount to a Fraction of a Halfpenny.

XIX. And whereas it frequently happens that Carts drawn by One Horse passing along the said Roads carry a greater Weight than is by Law allowed for Carts drawn by Two or more Horses; be it therefore further enacted, That all Carts passing along the said Roads drawn by One Horse only shall and may be weighed at any Weighing Machine now erected or to be erected on the said Roads, and the like additional Tolls demanded, received, and recovered for the Overweight thereof as are by Law payable in respect of the Overweight of Carts drawn by Two or more Horses; and all the Powers, Regulations, and Penalties now in force relating to the weighing of Waggon, Carts, and other Carriages drawn by more than One Horse, shall be applicable to Carts passing on the said Roads drawn by One Horse only, and to the Drivers, Masters, and Owners thereof.

And whereas a Map or Plan describing the Line of the said intended Extensions, Branches, or additional Lines of Road, and the said several intended Diversions and Alterations of the present Lines of Road, together with a Book of Reference containing Lists of the Names of the several Owners and Occupiers of the Lands, Buildings, Tenements, and Hereditaments through which the same is and are intended to pass, hath been deposited at the Office of the Clerk of the Peace for the said County of *Devon*; be it therefore enacted, That the said Map or Plan and Book of Reference shall remain in the Custody of the Clerk of the Peace aforesaid, to the End that all Persons may at all seasonable Times have Liberty to inspect and peruse the same, and to take Copies or Extracts therefrom, at their Will and Pleasure, paying to the said Clerk of the Peace for the Time being the Sum of One Shilling for every such Inspection, and at the Rate of Sixpence for every One hundred Words of such Copies or Extracts; and the said Trustees in making the said Extensions, Branches, or additional Lines of Roads, and the said several Diversions and Alterations described in the said Map or Plan, shall not deviate more than One hundred Yards from the Line thereof without the Consent in Writing of the Person or Persons, Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, through whose Lands or Grounds such Deviation shall be made.

XXIV. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That if any of the Lands, Houses, Buildings, and other Premises to be taken or used for the Purposes of this Act shall happen not to be described in the said Map or Plan, or any of the Owners or Occupiers of the same, or any of the Lands, Buildings, or other Premises described in the said Map or Plan or any Part thereof, shall happen to be omitted, misnamed, or inaccurately described in the said Book of Reference, such Omission, Misnomer, or inaccurate Description shall not prevent or retard the Execution of the said recited Acts of the Third and Fourth Years of the Reign of His said present Majesty and this Act; but the several Lands, Houses, Buildings, and other Premises, and every Part thereof, shall and may be taken and used for the Purposes of this Act, as fully and effectually as if the Owners and Occupiers of the same had not been omitted, or were properly and accurately named; provided it shall appear to any Two or more Justices of the Peace of the County wherein such Lands, Houses, Buildings, or other Premises shall be situated, and be certified by Writing under their Hands, that such Omission, Misnomer, or inaccurate Description proceeded from Mistake, or that the real Owners or Occupiers of such Lands, Buildings, or other Premises had Notice that such Lands, Buildings, and other Premises would be wanted for the Purposes thereof.

XXV. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That nothing herein contained shall authorize or empower the said Trustees, or any Person or Persons acting by or under their Authority, to take, use, injure, or damage, for the Purposes of the said Extensions, Branches, or additional Lines of Road, any House or other Building which was erected or built on or before the First Day of *January* One thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, or any Land or Ground which was then set apart and used as and for a Garden, Orchard, Yard, Paddock, planted Walk, or Avenue to a House, without the Consent in Writing of the Owners or Occupiers thereof, and Persons interested therein respectively, other than and except those specified in the Schedule to this Act annexed; provided also, that

And be it further enacted, That if any Money shall be agreed or awarded to be paid for any Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments purchased, taken, or used by virtue of the Powers of the said recited Acts of the Third and Fourth Years of the Reign of His said present Majesty and this Act, for the Purposes thereof respectively, which shall belong to any Corporation, Feme Covert, Infant, Lunatic, Person or Persons under any other Disability or Incapacity, as in the said Acts of the Third and Fourth Years of the Reign of His said present Majesty is particularly mentioned, such Money shall, in case the same shall amount to the Sum of Two hundred Pounds, with all convenient Speed be paid into the Bank of *England* in the Name and with the Privity of the Accountant General of the Court of Exchequer, to be placed to his Account *ex parte* the Trustees for executing this Act, pursuant to the Directions of an Act passed in the First Year of the Reign of His present Majesty King *George* the Fourth, intituled *An Act for the better securing Monies and Effects paid into the Court of Exchequer at Westminster on account of the Suitors of the said Court, and for the Appointment of an Accountant General and Two Masters of the said Court, and for other Purposes*, and the General Orders of the said Court, and without Fee or Reward, to the Intent that such Money shall be applied, under the Direction and with the Approbation of the said Court, to be signified by an Order made upon a Petition to be preferred in a summary Way by the Person or Persons who would have been entitled to the Rents and Profits of the said Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, in the Purchase of the Land Tax, or Discharge of any Debt or Debts, or such other Incumbrances, or Part thereof, as the said Court shall authorize to be paid, affecting the same Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments, or affecting other Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments standing settled therewith to the same or the like Uses, Intents, and Purposes; or where such Money shall not be so applied, then the same shall be laid out and invested, under the like Direction and Approbation of the said Court, in the Purchase of other Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments, which shall be conveyed and settled to, for, and upon such and the like Uses, Trusts, Intents, and Purposes, and in the same Manner as the Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments which shall be so purchased, taken, or used as aforesaid stood settled or limited, or such of them as at the Time of making such Conveyance and Settlement shall be existing undetermined and capable of taking effect; and in the meantime and until such Purchase shall be made, the said Money shall, by Order of the Court of Exchequer, upon Application thereto, be invested by the said Accountant General in his Name in the Purchase of Three Pounds *per Centum* Consolidated or Three Pounds *per Centum* Reduced Bank Annuities;

nuities; and in the meantime and until the said Bank Annuities shall be ordered by the said Court to be sold for the Purposes aforesaid, the Dividends and annual Produce of the said Consolidated or Reduced Bank Annuities shall from Time to Time be paid, by Order of the said Court, to the Person or Persons who would for the Time being have been entitled to the Rents and Profits, of the Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments so hereby directed to be purchased, in case such Purchase or Settlement were made.

And be it further enacted, That if any Money so agreed or awarded to be paid for any Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments purchased, taken, or used for the Purposes aforesaid, and belonging to any Corporation, or to any Person or Persons under Disability or Incapacity as aforesaid, shall be less than the Sum of Two hundred Pounds, and shall amount to or exceed the Sum of Twenty Pounds, then and in all such Cases the same shall, at the Option of the Person or Persons for the Time being entitled to the Rents and Profits of the Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments so purchased, taken, or used, or of his, her, or their Guardian or Guardians, Committee or Committees, in case of Infancy or Lunacy, to be signified in Writing under their respective Hands, be paid into the Bank of *England*, in the Name and with the Privity of the said Accountant General of the Court of Exchequer, and be placed to his Account as aforesaid, in order to be applied in manner herein-before directed; or otherwise the same shall be paid, at the like Option, to Two Trustees, to be nominated by the Person or Persons making such Option, and approved of by the said Trustees (such Nomination and Approbation to be signified in Writing under the Hands of the nominating and approving Parties), in order that such Principal Money, and the Dividends arising thereon, may be applied in manner herein-before directed, so far as the Case be applicable, without obtaining or being required to obtain the Direction or Approbation of the said Court.

And be it further enacted, That where such Money so agreed or awarded to be paid as before mentioned shall be less than Twenty Pounds, then and in all such Cases the same shall be applied to the Use of the Person or Persons who would for the Time being have been entitled to the Rents and Profits of the Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments so purchased, taken, or used for the Purposes of this Act, in such Manner as the said Trustees shall think fit; or in case of Infancy or Lunacy, then to his, her, or their Guardian or Guardians, Committee or Committees, to and for the Use and Benefit of such Person or Persons so entitled respectively.

XXX. And be it further enacted, That where any Question shall arise touching the Title of any Person to any Money to be paid into the Bank of England in the Name and with the Privity of the Accountant General of the Court of Exchequer, in pursuance of the said Acts and this Act, for the Purchase of any Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments to be purchased in pursuance of the said Acts and this Act, or to any Bank Annuities to be purchased with any such Money, or the Dividends or Interest of any Bank Annuities, the Person or Persons who shall have been in possession of such Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments at the Time of such Purchase, and all Persons claiming under such Person or Persons, or under the Possession of such Person or Persons, shall be deemed and taken to have been lawfully entitled to such Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments, according to such Possession, until the contrary shall be shown to the Satisfaction of the said Court; and the Dividends or Interest of the said Bank Annuities to be purchased with such Money, and also the Capital of such Bank Annuities, shall be paid, applied, and disposed of accordingly, unless it shall be made appear to the said Court that such Possession was a wrongful Possession, and that some other Person or Persons was or were lawfully entitled to such Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments, or to some Estate or Interest therein.

The Court of Exchequer may order reasonable Expences of Purchases to be paid by Trustees.

XXXI. And be it further enacted, That where by reason of any Disability or Incapacity of the Person or Persons, or Corporations, entitled to any Lands, Tenements, Hereditaments, and Premises to be purchased under the Authority of this Act, the Purchase Money for the same shall be required to be paid into the Court of Exchequer, and to be applied in the Purchase of other Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments, to be settled to the like Uses in pursuance of this Act, it shall be lawful for the said Court to order the Expences of such last-mentioned Purchases from Time to Time to be made in pursuance of this Act, or so much thereof as the said Court shall deem reasonable, to be paid by the said Trustees out of the Monies to be received by virtue of this Act, who shall

shall from Time to Time pay such Sums of Money for such Purposes as the said Court shall direct.

XXXII. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed Public Act, and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken Notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others, without being specially pleaded.

XXXIII. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall commence and take effect from the passing thereof, and shall continue and be in force for and during the Term of Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.
