An Act to enable the Commissioners of Wide Streets to widen and improve certain Ways, Streets, and Passages in and about the City and County of Dublin; and to amend and extend the Provisions of Two Acts passed in the Forty-seventh and Fifty-seventh Years of the Reign of His late Majesty, for improving and rendering more commodious such Parts of the County and County of the City of Dublin as are situate on the South Side of the River Anna Liffey, and West of His Majesty's Castle of Dublin. [17th June 1830.]

HEREAS an Act was made in the Thirty-first Year of the Reign of King George the Second, intituled An Act for 31 G.2. (I.) making a wide and convenient Way, Street, or Passage from Essex Bridge to the Castle of Dublin, and for other Purposes therein mentioned: And whereas one other Act was made in the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of King George the Second, intituled An Act for 33 G.2. (I.) amending an Act passed in the Thirty-first Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled An Act for making a wide and convenient Way, Street, and Passage from Essex Bridge to the Castle of Dublin, and for other Purposes therein mentioned; as also for amending another Act passed in the same Year, for widening and repairing or rebuilding [Local.] 34 L Baal's

Baal's Bridge in the County of Limerick: And whereas one other Act was made in the Seventh Year of the Reign of King George the Third, intituled An Act for further amending an Act passed in the Thirty-first 7 G. 3. (I.) Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, intituled 'An Act for making wide and convenient Way, Street, and ' Passage from Essex Bridge to the Castle of Dublin, and for other Purposes therein mentioned . And whereas one other Act was made in the Twenty-first and Twenty-second Years of the Reign of King 21 & 22 G.3. George the Third, intituled An Act for the Improvement of the City of Dublin, by making wide and convenient Passages through the same, and (I.)for regulating the Coal Trade thereof: And whereas one other Act was made in the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Years of the Reign 23 & 24 G. 3. of King George the Third, intituled An Act for continuing and (I.)amending an Act passed in the Twenty-second Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled 'An Act for the Improvement of the City of Dublin, by making wide and convenient Passages through the same, and 'for regulating the Coal Trade thereof;' and for other Purposes: And whereas one other Act was made in the Twenty-sixth Year of the 26 G. 3. (I.) Reign of King George the Third, intituled An Act for explaining and further amending the several Acts heretofore passed for the Improvement of the City of Dublin, by making wide and convenient Passages through the same, and for other Purposes: And whereas one other Act was made in the Twenty-seventh Year of the Reign of King 27 G.3. (I.) George the Third, intituled An Act for the further explaining and amending the several Acts now in force for making wide and convenient Passages in the City of Dublin: And whereas one other Act was made 30 G. 3. (I.) in the Thirtieth Year of King George the Third, intituled An Act for further amending an Act, intituled An Act for continuing and amending ' an Act passed in the Twenty-second Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for the Improvement of the City of Dublin, ' by making wide and convenient Passages through the same, and for " regulating the Coal Trade thereof," and for other Purposes: And whereas one other Act was made in the Thirty-sixth Year of the 36 G. 3. (I.) Reign of King George the Third, intituled An Act to ascertain the Powers of the Commissioners for making wide and convenient Streets in the City of Dublin, for opening the Passage from Sackville Street to Carlisle Bridge, and for laying out new Streets to the Eastward thereof. and to ratify certain Grants heretofore made by the said Commissioners: And whereas one other Act was made in the Thirty-ninth Year of the 39 G.3. (I.) Reign of King George the Third, intituled An Act to grant certain Duties therein mentioned to His Majesty, to be applied to the Purpose of making wide and convenient Ways, Streets, and Passages in the City of Dublin, and for enabling the Commissioners therein mentioned more effectually to execute the Trusts reposed in them: And whereas one other Act was made in the Fortieth Year of the Reign of King 40 G. 3. (I.) George the Third, intituled An Act to amend and explain an Act passed in the Thirty-ninth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled An Act to grant certain Duties therein mentioned to His Majesty, to be applied to the Purpose of making wide and convenient Ways, Streets, ' and Passages in the City of Dublin, and for enabling the Commissioners 'therein mentioned more effectually to execute the Trusts reposed in 'them:' And whereas one other Act was made in the Forty-seventh 47 G. 3. c. 74. Year of the Reign of King George the Third, intituled An Act for

improving and rendering more commodious such Parts of the County and County of the City of Dublin as are situate on the South Side of the River Anna Liffey, and West of His Majesty's Castle of Dublin, and for the Appointment of an Inspector of the Presentments and other Accounts of the County of the City of Dublin: And whereas one other Act was made in the Fifty-seventh Year of the Reign of King George the Third, intituled An Act to amend an Act passed in the Forty- 57G.3. c.39. seventh Year of His present Majesty's Reign, for improving and rendering more commodious such Parts of the County and County of the City of Dublin as are situate on the South Side of the River Anna · Liffey, and West of His Majesty's Castle of Dublin, and for the Appointment of an Inspector of the Presentments and other Accounts of the County of the City of Dublin: And whereas several Ways, Streets, and Passages in and about the City and County of the City of Dublin have been widened and rendered more commodious, and several other Improvements have been made by the Commissioners for making wide and convenient Streets in and about the City and County of the City of *Dublin*, in pursuance of the Powers vested in them by the said several recited Acts; and in particular the several Improvements and Alterations specified and set forth in the said Two last-recited Acts, and in the Map or Schedule therein respectively referred to, have been nearly completed and carried into effect: And whereas it will tend much to the Convenience and Safety of the Inhabitants of the said City, as well as of the Persons frequenting the same, and to the Benefit of the Public in general, if the Ways and Passages herein-after particularly specified and referred to in the Map hereafter mentioned and by the Schedule hereunto annexed are widened and improved: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That the said several recited Acts, Clauses and and all and every the Clauses, Powers, Provisions, Penalties, For- Provisions feitures, Matters, and Things therein contained, (save and except of former such Part or Parts thereof as may be varied, altered, or repealed, or such as are as are by this Act varied, altered, or repealed,) shall be as good, valid, altered (exand effectual for carrying this Act into execution, to all Intents and tended to this Purposes whatsoever, as if the same had been repeated and re-enacted Act. in the Body of this present Act.

II. And whereas the several Improvements in and about the City Improveof Dublin now in contemplation and to be hereby carried into effect ments to be are as follow; (that is to say,) to complete Dame Street, by widening the North Side thereof, commencing at Fownes Street and extending to Eustace Street; to complete the Opening of the Quay on the North Side of the River Anna Liffey, between West Liffey Street and George the Fourth's Bridge in front of the Royal Barracks; to improve Pill Lane, by widening the same on the South Side thereof from Mountrath Street to Church Street; to remove the Projections of Two Houses on the South Side of Nassau Street, between Grafton Street and Dawson Street; to improve the Avenues contiguous to Saint Patrick's Cathedral Church, by widening Part of Lower Kevin Street

Street on the North and South Sides thereof, West of the Deanery, and to widen the East Side of Mitre Alley; to remove the projecting Houses on the East Side of North Great George's Street, and the South End thereof; to widen Part of the North Side of Little Ship Street leading to His Majesty's Castle of Dublin; to open the Passage from Thomas Street to the Four Courts Marshalsea; to remove the projecting Buildings on the East Corner of Upper Bride Street and Upper Kevin Street, and the projecting House and Premises situate on the East Corner of Townsend Street and Sandwith Street: And whereas Maps or Plans have been made of the said several Streets, Lanes, Passages, and Places which are intended to be altered or otherwise improved under the Provisions of this Act, and one Copy of such Maps or Plans has been deposited with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of the City of Dublin, and one other Copy of such Maps or Plans has been deposited with the Secretary or Clerk of the said Commissioners of Wide Streets, in order that such intended Improvements and the Particulars thereof may be generally known; be it therefore enacted, That the said several recited Acts, and all and every the Clauses, Powers, Provisions, Penalties, Forfeitures, Matters, and Things therein contained, (save and except such Part or Parts thereof as may be varied, altered, or repealed, or as are by this Act varied, altered, or repealed,) shall be as good, valid, and effectual for carrying this Act into execution, to all Intents and Purposes whatsoever, as if the same had been repeated and re-enacted in the Body of this present Act; and that the same and all and every such Clauses, Powers, Provisions, Penalties, Forfeitures, Matters, and Things shall and may extend and be construed to extend to complete Dame Street, by widening the North Side thereof, commencing at Fownes Street, and extending to Eustace Street; to complete the opening of the Quay on the North Side of the River Anna Liffey, between West Liffey Street and George the Fourth's Bridge in front of the Royal Barracks; to improve Pill Lane, by widening the same on the South Side thereof from Mountrath Street to Church Street; to remove the Projections of Two Houses on the South Side of Nassau Street, between Grafton Street and Dawson Street; to improve the Avenues contiguous to Saint Patrick's Cathedral Church, by widening Part of Lower Kevin Street on the North and South Sides thereof, West of the Deanery, and to widen the East Side of Mitre Alley; to remove the projecting Houses on the East Side of North Great George's Street, and the South End thereof; to widen Part of the North Side of Little Ship Street leading to His Majesty's Castle of Dublin; to open the Passage from Thomas Street to the Four Courts Marshalsea; to remove the projecting Buildings on the East Corner of Upper Bride Street and Upper Kevin Street, and the projecting House and Premises situate on the East Corner of Townsend Street and Sandwith Street, as particularly described or delineated on such Maps or Plans and in the Schedule hereunto annexed, as herein-before referred to, in such and the like Manner as if the same had been included in the said Acts or any of them, and had been delineated and laid down on the Map or Plan in the said Acts or any of them particularly mentioned and referred to: Provided always, that it shall and may be lawful for all Persons at all reasonable Times to resort to and

and examine such Maps and Plans, or either of them, paying to such Clerk or such Secretary, for such Examination, the Sum of One Shilling, and no more.

III. Provided also, and be it enacted, That it shall not be lawful Commissionto and for the said Commissioners to take down, remove, or make use of, for any of the Purposes of this Act, any Messuages, Houses, or Buildings, other than and except such as are specified in the Map tioned in the herein-before referred to, and mentioned and declared in the Schedule Schedule. hereunto annexed.

IV. And be it further enacted, That if the said Commissioners Limiting the shall not, within the Space of Seven Years (to be computed from the Power of passing of this Act), agree for or cause to be valued and paid for, in Houses to manner directed by the said recited Acts, the several Messuages and Seven Years. other Buildings, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments which they are hereby empowered to purchase, take, and use, or so much thereof as they shall deem necessary or proper for the Purposes of this Act, then and from thenceforth the Powers which are hereby given them for such Purpose shall cease, determine, and be utterly void, save and except with the Consent of the Owners or Proprietors thereof.

V. Provided also, and be it enacted, That it shall and may be Misnomers lawful to and for the said Commissioners to take down, alter, remove, and make use of any Messuage, House, or other Building, and to cut cution of the into, through, across, or over, and make use of the Lands and Grounds Act. whereon the same shall be situate, for any of the Purposes of the said recited Acts and this Act, in any such Street, Lane, Way, or Passage as aforesaid, notwithstanding that the Name or Names of the Owner or Owners, Occupier or Occupiers thereof, is or are not mentioned in the said Map or in the Schedule to this Act annexed, in all Cases where it shall appear to any Two or more of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the City and County of the City of Dublin, and be certified by them under their Hands, that the Name or Names of such Owner or Owners, Occupier or Occupiers, hath or have been omitted by Mistake, or in consequence of the Owner or Owners thereof not being to be found, in the said Map or in the Schedule, or that instead of his, her, or their Name or Names, the Name or Names of some other Person or Persons hath or have been by Mistake, or in consequence of the Owner or Owners thereof not being to be found, inserted or omitted therein; any thing herein contained to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding.

VI. And be it further enacted, That all the Powers and Authorities Powers given to or vested in the said Commissioners or their Successors, or vested in any Three or more of them, for the Purpose of carrying the said Commissionseveral recited Acts or any of them into execution, shall be and the former Acts same are hereby declared to be given to and vested in the said Com- to extend to missioners and their Successors, or any Three or more of them, for this Act. carrying this Act into execution; and the said Commissioners and their Successors, or any Three or more of them, shall have and enjoy the like Rights, Privileges, and Immunities, and shall be subject and [Local.] 34 M liable

VII. Provided always, and be it enacted, That none of the said Improvements specified in this Act shall be undertaken, commenced, or carried on by the said Commissioners until they shall have first out Order of obtained the Approbation and Consent of the Lord Lieutenant or Lord Lieute- other Chief Governor or Governors of Ireland for the Time being, to be signified in Writing by his or their Chief Secretary, or, in the Absence of such Chief Secretary, by the Under Secretary for the Time being.

VIII. And whereas by the said last-recited Act it was enacted, that all and every Suit and Suits, at Law or in Equity, which were then carrying on and prosecuting against the said Commissioners, or defended by the said Commissioners, in their own Names, should and might from and after the passing of that Act be carried on, prosecuted, and defended by the said Commissioners in the Name of their Clerk or Clerks, Secretary or Secretaries, or the Person or Persons appointed thereto for the Time being; and that all Suit or Suits, at Law or in Equity, touching or concerning any Contract or Contracts or Agreements theretofore made or entered into by the said Commissioners, should be carried on, prosecuted, and defended in the Name of such Clerk or Clerks, Secretary or Secretaries for the Time being; and that all such Suits and Proceedings in any Court of Law or Equity, in the Name of such Clerk or Clerks, Secretary or Secretaries, should be as good and effectual, to all Intents and Purposes, as if such Suits and Proceedings had been commenced, prosecuted, and defended or carried on in the Name of the said Commissioners or any of them; and in case any Bill or Petition shall be filed or exhibited in any Court of Equity against the said Commissioners for the Time being, or any of them, or their Clerk or Clerks, Secretary or Secretaries for the Time being, for or on account of any Matter or Thing by the said Commissioners, or any of them, made or done in execution of the Powers, Authorities, or Trusts heretofore or hereby vested in them, the said Commissioners, or any of them, shall not be obliged to answer such Bill or Petition, but that the Answer of such Clerk or Clerks, Secretary or Secretaries, to such Bill or Petition, shall be deemed and taken to be the Answer of the said Commissioners, and shall be binding upon them to all Intents and Purposes whatsoever; and in case such Clerk or Clerks, Secretary or Secretaries, shall happen to die, or be removed by the said Commissioners while such Suit or Suits shall be depending, that then and in such Case such Suit or Suits shall not abate by the Death or Removal of such Clerk or Clerks, Secretary or Secretaries, but shall be carried on and defended in the Name of the succeeding Clerk or Clerks, Secretary or Secretaries, or, if more than One, in the Name of the Survivor, and shall stand, to all Intents and Purposes, in the same State and Condition as it was immediately

immediately before the Death or Removal of such former Clerk or Clerks, Secretary or Secretaries; be it therefore enacted, That so much and such Part of the said recited Act shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

IX. And be it further enacted, That from and after the passing of Suits to be this Act all and every Suit and Suits, at Law and in Equity, which are prosecuted now carrying on and prosecuting against the said Commissioners, or defended by the said Commissioners, in their own Names, shall and of Clerk or may from and after the passing of this Act be carried on, prosecuted, Secretary to and defended by the said Commissioners in the Name or Names of the Commistheir Clerk or Clerks, Secretary or Secretaries, or the Person or sioners. Persons appointed thereto for the Time being; and that all Suit or Suits, at Law or in Equity, touching or concerning any Contract or Contracts or Agreements or other Matter or Thing heretofore made, done, or entered into by the said Commissioners, or touching or concerning any Contract or Contracts, Agreement or Agreements, or other Matter or Thing hereafter to be made, done, or entered into by the said Commissioners, shall be carried on, prosecuted, and defended in the Name of such Clerk or Clerks, Secretary or Secretaries for the Time being; and that all such Suits and Proceeding in any Court of Law or Equity, in the Name of such Clerk or Clerks, Secretary or Secretaries, shall be as good and effectual, to all Intents and Purposes, as if such Suits and Proceedings had been commenced, prosecuted, and defended or carried on in the Name of the said Commissioners, or any of them; and in case any Bill or Petition shall be filed or exhibited in any Court of Equity against the said Commissioners for the Time being, or any of them, or their Clerk or Clerks, Secretary or Secretaries for the Time being, for or on account of any Matter or Thing by the said Commissioners, or any of them, made or done in the Execution of the Powers, Authorities, or Trusts heretofore or hereby vested in them, the said Commissioners, or any of them, shall not be obliged to answer such Bill or Petition, but the Answer of such Clerk or Clerks, Secretary or Secretaries, to such Bill or Petition, shall be deemed and taken to be the Answer of the said Commissioners, and shall be binding upon them to all Intents and Purposes whatsoever; and in case such Clerk or Clerks, Secretary or Secretaries, shall happen to die or be removed by the said Commissioners whilst such Suit or Suits shall be depending, that then and in such Case such Suit or Suits shall not abate by the Death or Removal of such Clerk or Clerks, Secretary or Secretaries, but shall be carried on and defended in the Name of the succeeding Clerk or Clerks, Secretary or Secretaries, or, if more than One, in the Name of the Survivor, and shall stand to all Intents and Purposes in the same State and Condition as it was immediately before the Death or Removal of such former Clerk or Clerks, Secretary or Secretaries.

X. And whereas by the said last-recited Act it was enacted, that on all Indictments and Criminal Proceedings in all Cases whatever in all Courts of Law or Equity, and before all Magistrates in the Kingdom Orders or of Ireland, a Certificate of any Order, Proceeding, Appointment, or other Act of the said Commissioners, under the Hands and Seal of

the Clerk or Clerks, Secretary or Secretaries of the said Commissioners for the Time being, shall, without further Proof, be deemed and taken as conclusive Evidence that such Order, Proceeding, or other Acts as shall be thereby certified is the Order, Proceeding, Appointment, or Act of the Commissioners for making wide and convenient Streets in the City of Dublin, and every such Certificate of the Appointment of their Clerk or Clerks, Secretary or Secretaries shall be conclusive Evidence, in like Manner, that the Person or Persons so named in such Appointment is the Clerk or Clerks, Secretary or Secretaries to the said Commissioners; and it is doubtful whether the said lastmentioned Provision of the said last-recited Act extends to Proceedings in Law or Equity, or to any other than Criminal Proceedings; be it therefore enacted, That so much and such Part of the said recited Act shall be and the same is hereby repealed; and that from and after the passing of this Act, on all Indictments and Criminal Proceedings and in all Cases whatsoever in all Courts of Law or Equity, and before all Magistrates, in that Part of the United Kingdom called Ireland, or on any other Proceeding, a Certificate of any Order, Proceeding, Appointment, or other Act of the said Commissioners, under the Hands and Seal of the Clerk or Clerks, Secretary or Secretaries of the said Commissioners for the Time being, shall, without further Proof, be deemed and taken as conclusive Evidence that such Order, Proceeding, or other Acts as shall be thereby certified is the Order, Proceeding, Appointment, or Act of the Commissioners for making wide and convenient Streets in the City of Dublin; and every such Certificate of the Appointment of their Clerk or Clerks, Secretary or Secretaries, shall be conclusive Evidence, in like Manner, that the Person or Persons so named in such Appointment is the Clerk or Clerks, Secretary or Secretaries to the said Commissioners.

Power to ers to revalue Premises.

XI. And whereas Doubts have arisen as to the Powers of the said Commission- Commissioners to reject Findings of a Jury impannelled by Directions of the said Commissioners for the Valuation of Premises required by them, and which they considered excessive and above the Value thereof, and of the Power of the said Commissioners to have such Premises revalued by a new Jury; be it therefore enacted, That from and after the passing of this Act it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Commissioners, or any Three or more of them, to reject and abandon all and every or any Inquisition or Inquisitions, Finding or Findings of any Jury heretofore impannelled or to be hereafter impannelled by the Direction or under the Authority of the said Commissioners, which to the said Commissioners, or any Three or more of them, shall appear to be excessive and above the Value of the Premises so valued; and thereupon the said Commissioners, or any Three or more of them, shall and may, if they shall think fit and expedient so to do, but not otherwise, and they are hereby authorized and empowered, to have the same Premises or any Part thereof, or the same or any Part thereof, with others, revalued by a second Jury, in such and the like Manner as they the said Commissioners, or any Three or more of them, are now empowered to have any Lands, Tenements, and Premises valued by a Jury; and that the Inquisition or Inquisitions or Finding or Findings of the said Jury or Juries so rejected

rejected and abandoned shall thereupon become null and void to all Intents and Purposes, as if the same had never been had or made.

XII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That the said Indemnifying Commissioners shall in all and every Case and Cases in which they Parties where shall have rejected and abandoned any Inquisition or Inquisitions, Findings shall be re-Finding or Findings of a Jury, pay unto the Person or Persons to whom a Finding or Findings shall have been made, and so rejected and abandoned, all such reasonable Costs, Charges, and Expences as the said Person or Persons shall have been put to in the substantiating of their Claim or Claims before the said Commissioners and Jury on the said Valuation so rejected and abandoned as aforesaid.

XIII. And whereas by the said recited Act of the Twenty-first and Twenty-second Years of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Third it was enacted, that all Coals imported into the Harbour of *Dublin*, which should be intended or purchased for the Use of the Glass, Sugar, and Salt Manufacturers in the said City, should be exempted and discharged from the Payment of the additional Duty of One Shilling per Ton imposed by the said Act: And the Act of whereas it is expedient to extend the said Exemption to Coals 21 & 22 G.3. intended or purchased for certain other Uses; be it therefore enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That so much of the said recited Act shall be and the same is hereby repealed; and that from and after the passing of this Act all Coals imported into the said Harbour of Dublin, which shall be intended or purchased for the Use of the 'Glass, Sugar, and Salt Mannfacturers, and for the Use of Distillers, Brewers, Calico Printers, Iron, Brass, and Metal Founders, Paper Manufacturers, Woollen Manufacturers, Linen Manufacturers, Cotton Manufacturers, Stuff Manufacturers, Hat Manufacturers, Dyers, Chemical Workers, and all other Manufacturers requiring the Use of Coal in their respective Manufactories, shall be exempted and discharged from the Payment of the said additional Duty so by the said Act of the Twenty-first and Twenty-second Years of His late Majesty King George the Third imposed: Provided always, that the Importer or Purchaser of such Coals, or such Person authorized by such Purchaser, shall at the Time of Entry thereof make Oath before the Collector or other Chief Officer of the said Port, who is hereby empowered and required to administer the same, that the said Coals are purchased and bona fide intended for the Use of the Glass, Sugar, or Salt Manufacturers, Distillers, Brewers, Calico Printers, Iron, Brass, and Metal Founders, Paper Manufacturers, Woollen, Linen, and Cotton Manufacturers, Stuff Manufacturers, Hat Manufacturers, Dyers, Chemical Workers, or other Manufacturers requiring the Use of Coal in their Manufactories, and for no other Use whatsoever; and if any Person or Persons shall knowingly swear any thing that is false in such Affidavit, he or they shall, upon Conviction thereof, suffer such Punishment as Persons convicted of wilful and corrupt Perjury are by the Laws of this Realm subject to: Provided also, that if the said Importer or Purchaser shall sell or use the said Coals, or cause the same to be sold or used, for any other Purpose, except for the Purposes herein-before mentioned, that then and in every [Local.] 34 Nsuch

Coals imported for Use of Manufactories exempt from the additional Duty imposed by

such Case such Person or Persons shall forfeit the Sum of One hundred Pounds, to be recovered by Action of Debt or on the Case in any of His Majesty's Courts of Record at Dublin, to be brought by the said Commissioners in the Name or Names of their Clerk or Clerks, Secretary or Secretaries for the Time being, and applied to and for the Uses and Purposes of this Act.

XIV. And be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That nothing in this Act contained shall authorize that any of the Costs, ated towards Charges, and Expences for making the Improvements (other than the new Im- those directed and contemplated by the herein-before recited Acts or any of them) shall be defrayed out of any Funds or Taxes which may be raised on Coals in Dublin from and after the passing of this Act.

XV. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others, without being specially pleaded.
