An Act to continue, until the Fifth Day of July One thousand eight hundred and thirty-one, an Act passed in the Ninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, to enable His Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the County of Surrey to nominate and appoint Two or more Persons to act as Principal Land Coal Meters within and for the several Places therein mentioned.

[16th July 1830.]

HEREAS an Act was passed in the Forty-seventh Year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled An Act for repealing the several Acts for regulating the 47 G.3. c. 68. Vend and Delivery of Coals within the Cities of London and Westminster, and Liberties thereof, and in certain Parts of the Counties of Middlesex, Surry, Kent, and Essex, and for making better Provisions for the same: And whereas an Act was passed in the Ninth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled An 9 G. 4. c. 65. Act to enable His Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the County of Surrey to nominate and appoint Two or more Persons to act as Principal Land Coal Meters within and for the several Parishes and Places therein mentioned, in the said County; which said last-recited Act was to continue in force until the Fifth Day of July One thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine, and from thence to the $\lceil Local. \rceil$ End

End of the then next Session of Parliament: And whereas it is expedient that the said last-recited Act should be further continued; but the Purpose aforesaid cannot be effected without the Aid and Authority of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That the said recited Act passed 9.G. 4. c. 65. in the Ninth Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty King George the Fourth shall be and remain in full Force and Effect, from the Expiration thereof, for and during the Term herein-after mentioned.

II. And be it further enacted, That the Costs, Charges, and For paying the Expences Expences of obtaining and passing this Act, and incident thereto, of this Act. shall be paid and defrayed by and out of the County Rates or County Stock of the said County of Surrey.

Money advanced from the County Stock to be repaid.

III. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That when there shall be a Surplus of the Monies to be received by virtue of the said recited Act of the Ninth Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty, and of this Act, in the Hands of the Treasurer of the said County of Surrey, over and above what shall be necessary for the Payment of the Salaries, Wages, Allowances, and other Expences attending the Execution of the said recited Acts, then the Sum and Sums of Money which shall have been advanced and paid out of the said County Stock for the Purposes aforesaid shall from Time to Time be repaid to and replaced in the County Stock of the said County of Surrey.

Public Act.

IV. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others, without being specially pleaded.

Term and Continuance of Act.

V. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall commence and take effect immediately on the Expiration of the Term granted by the said recited Act of the Ninth Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty, and shall, together with the said Act, from thenceforth continue and be in full Force and Effect until the Fifth Day of July which will be in the Year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and thirty-one, unless sooner repealed.
