## *Cap. xxvii.*

An Act for more effectually amending, improving, and maintaining the Road leading from *Nantgaredig* to *Brechfa*, and from *Brechfa* to the River *Tivy*, near *Llanllooney Church*, and also a Road from *Brechfa* aforesaid to *Llansawel*, all in the County of *Carmarthen*. [8th April 1830.]

**W**HEREAS an Act was passed in the Forty-ninth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King *George the Third*, intituled *An Act for making and maintaining a Road from a Place called Nantgaredig, adjoining the Turnpike Road leading from the Town of Llandilofawr to the Town of Carmarthen, through the Village of Brechfa, to the River Tivy, near Llanllooney Church, and also a Road from Brechfa aforesaid to the Village of Llansawel, all in the County of Carmarthen*: And whereas the Trustees appointed in or by virtue of the said recited Act for making and maintaining the Road leading from or near to a certain Place called *Nantgaredig*, adjoining the Turnpike Road leading from the Town of *Llandilofawr* in the County of *Carmarthen* to the Town of *Carmarthen*, through the Village of *Brechfa*, to a certain River called *Tivy River*, at, by, or near to *Llanllooney Church* in the said County, and also the Road leading from the same Village of *Brechfa* to the Village of *Llansawel* in the said County, in, by, through, or near to a

certain Village called *Abergorlech* Village, in the said County, (which said several Roads, some or one of them, lead or run through the several Parishes of *Abergwilly*, *Llanegwad*, *Brechfa*, *Llanfihangel-yeroth*, *Llanllooney*, *Llanfihangel-rhosy-Corn*, *Llanybyther*, *Llanfynydd*, *Llansawel*, *Llanllawthog*, and *Pencarreg*, in the said County of *Carmarthen*.) have made great Progress in the Execution thereof, and have borrowed several considerable Sums of Money upon the Credit of the Tolls authorized to be taken on the said Road, which Money still remains due, and cannot be repaid, nor the said Road effectually amended and kept in repair, unless the Term granted by the said Act be continued: And whereas it would facilitate the Execution of the Purposes aforesaid if the said recited Act were repealed, and if further and other Powers and Provisions were granted instead thereof: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this Act the said recited Act of the Forty-ninth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King *George* the Third shall be and the same is hereby repealed, and instead thereof this Act shall be put in execution, for and during the Term herein-after mentioned, for the Purpose of more effectually improving and keeping in repair the present Turnpike Roads leading from or near to a certain Place called *Nantgaredig*, adjoining the Turnpike Road leading from the Town of *Llandilofawr* in the County of *Carmarthen* to the Town of *Carmarthen*, through the Village of *Brechfa*, to a certain River called *Tivy* River, at, by, or near to *Llanllooney* Church in the said County, and also the Road leading from the said Village of *Brechfa* to the Village of *Llansawel* in the said County, in, by, through, or near to a certain Village called *Abergorlech* Village, in the said County (which said several Roads, some or one of them, lead or run through the several Parishes of *Abergwilly*, *Llanegwad*, *Brechfa*, *Llanfihangel-yeroth*, *Llanllooney*, *Llanfihangel-Rhosy-Corn*, *Llanybyther*, *Llanfynydd*, *Llansawel*, *Llanllawthog*, and *Pencarreg*, in the said County of *Carmarthen*).

II. And be it further enacted, That this Act, and the Term and Tolls hereby granted, shall be and the same are hereby made subject and liable to the Payment of all Monies heretofore borrowed for making, repairing, and maintaining the said Roads, and now due and owing upon the Credit or on account of the said former Act, or secured upon or made payable out of the Tolls thereby authorized to be taken upon the said Roads, and all Interest due and to grow due thereon, as fully and effectually, to all Intents and Purposes, as of such Monies had been borrowed and become due on the Credit of this Act, or if the Tolls hereby authorized to be collected, and also of all such other Sum or Sums of Money as shall or may hereafter be borrowed for the Purposes of or become due on the Credit of this Act, and all Interest due and to grow due for the same respectively.

And be it further enacted, That all His Majesty's Justices <sup>Trustees.</sup> of the Peace for the Time being acting for the said County of *Carmarthen*, together with *David Thomas Bowen Davies, John Bowen Davies, Reverend Joshua Davies, Deline Seymour Davies, John Lloyd Davies, John Davies, John Evans, Evan Evans, James Bevan Gwynne, Reverend Thomas Bevan Gwynne, David Griffith, Reverend John Griffith, Vicar of Brechfa, David Howells, James Hughes, Charles Hughes, David Walter Hughes, Thomas Hughes, John Morgan Howell, David Jones of Maesnonny, John Jones, David Jones of Bailybedw, Rees Jones, John Jones, David Jones of Nantygragen, the Reverend Enoch James, Vicar of Landyssil, Henry Jenkins, David Jones of Llandoverly, David Jones junior, of Llandoverly, David Jones Banker, Carmarthen, Thomas Hugh Jones, Thomas Jones, John Jones, Richard Jones, the Reverend Thomas Lloyd, John Lloyd, Charles Lloyd, William Lloyd, Henry Lawrence, George Morgan, William Morgan, David Morris Banker, Thomas Morris junior, Thomas Morris junior, Banker, Lewis Morice, Charles Morgan, David Heron Pugh, Richard Rees, George Saunders, Thomas Saunders, Henry Thomas, Reverend John Thomas, and their Successors, duly qualified to act as Trustees for repairing Turnpike Roads in *England*, shall be Trustees for the Purpose of putting this Act into execution.*

IV. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the said Trustees, at their First or any subsequent Meeting or Meetings to be holden in pursuance of this Act, to elect any Number of Persons (not exceeding Five in the whole), being duly qualified, to be Trustees for the Purposes of this Act, in addition to the Trustees hereby appointed; and such Trustees so elected shall be and they are hereby invested with the same Powers and Authorities for executing this Act as if they had been nominated and appointed by this Act. <sup>Power to appoint additional Trustees.</sup>

V. And be it further enacted, That the Trustees for executing this Act shall and may and are hereby required to meet together at the *Lark Inn, Carmarthen*, or at some other convenient Place in the County of *Carmarthen*, on the *First Monday* next after the Commencement of this Act, or as soon after as conveniently may be, and proceed to the Execution of this Act. <sup>First Meeting of Trustees.</sup>

VI. And be it further enacted, That from and after the passing of this Act the several Tolls following shall and may be demanded and taken, collected and paid, at each and every Toll Gate, Turnpike, and Side Gate now erected or to be erected upon, across, or on the Sides of the said Roads, before any Horse, Beast, Cattle, or Carriage upon which any Toll is by this Act imposed shall be permitted to pass through the same; (that is to say,) <sup>Tolls.</sup>

For every Horse, Mule, or Ass drawing any Coach, Landau, Berlin, Phæton, Chariot, Chaise, Calash, Hearse, Caravan, Gig, Chair, or such like Carriage, the Sum of Sixpence:

For every Horse, Mule, Ass, or Beast drawing any Waggon, Cart, or other Carriage, the Sum of Three-pence:

For

For every Horse, Mule, or Ass, laden or unladen, and not drawing, the Sum of One Penny Halfpenny :

For every Drove of Oxen, Cows, or Neat Cattle, the Sum of Ten-pence *per* Score, and so in proportion for any less Number :

And for every Drove of Hogs or Pigs, Calves, Sheep, or Lambs, the Sum of Five-pence *per* Score, and so in proportion for any less Number :

Which said respective Tolls, and all and every Sum and Sums of Money which shall arise and be produced therefrom, shall be and the same are hereby vested in the said Trustees; and the same and every Part thereof shall be paid, applied, and disposed of, and assigned in such Manner as herein-after is mentioned.

Trustees may reduce Tolls, &c. and afterwards advance them.

VII. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the said Trustees, and they are hereby empowered, at any Meeting to be held for that Purpose, (of which Fourteen Days Notice shall be given in Writing to be affixed on all the Turnpike Gates upon the said Road, and in the *Carmarthen Journal*, or some other public Newspaper circulated in the County of *Carmarthen*,) from Time to Time to lessen and reduce all or any of the Tolls granted by virtue of this Act, for and during such Time as the said Trustees shall think proper, and afterwards at any Meeting to be held as aforesaid from Time to Time, as they shall see Occasion, to advance all or any of the Tolls granted by virtue of this Act: Provided nevertheless, that when the whole Money borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls granted by this Act shall not have been paid and discharged, no such Tolls shall be lessened or reduced without the Consent of the Person or Persons entitled to Five Sixths of the Money remaining due upon such respective Tolls.

No Reduction without Consent of Creditors in certain Cases.

Tolls to be paid but once a Day.

VIII. And be it further enacted, That in case the Tolls hereby authorized to be taken shall have been paid for the passing of any Horse, Beast, or Cattle through any of the Gates or Turnpikes to be continued or erected upon the said Roads, such Horse, Beast, or Cattle shall, upon a Note or Ticket denoting such Payment on that Day being produced, be permitted to pass and repass Toll-free through all the same Gates or Turnpikes as the Ticket for such Payment shall free, at any Time or Times during the same Day, to be computed from Twelve of the Clock on one Night to Twelve of the Clock on the next succeeding Night; which said respective Notes or Tickets the Collectors of the said Tolls are hereby required to deliver *gratis* on the Receipt of the Toll.

Limiting the Number of Tolls to be taken at all the Gates.

IX. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That no more than Two full Tolls shall be demanded or taken upon the said Road for the same Horses, Beasts, Cattle, and Carriages passing through all the Toll Gates erected or to be erected across or on the Sides of the said Roads, in any one Day, such Day to be computed from Twelve of the Clock in one Night to Twelve of the Clock in the next succeeding Night.

Stage Coaches and Post Chaises.

X. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That the Tolls hereby made payable shall be paid for and in respect of all Horses or Cattle

Cattle drawing any Stage Coach, Van, Caravan, or Stage Waggon, or other Stage Carriage, conveying Passengers or Goods for Pay or Reward, for every Time of passing or repassing along the said Roads; and also for and in respect of all Horses or other Beasts drawing any Post Chaise or other Carriage travelling for Hire, for every Time of passing or repassing along the said Roads, whenever a new Hiring of such Post Chaise or other Carriage shall have taken place.

XI. And be it further enacted, That no Money arising from any of the Tolls hereby authorized to be collected and taken shall be applied in or towards the Repair of the said Road leading from *Brechfa* to *Llansawel*, unless there shall be a Toll Gate or Bar erected and continued thereon under the Authority of the Trustees for carrying this Act into execution: Provided also, that no more of the Monies arising by virtue of this Act shall be laid out or expended upon the said Road or in the Payment of any Principal Money borrowed on the Credit only of the Tolls arising or payable upon such Road, or the Interest thereof, than shall be actually raised or received upon or in respect of such Road: Provided always, that the said Road leading from *Brechfa* to *Llansawel* shall be subject and liable only to One Ninth Part or Share of the Principal Sum of Two thousand five hundred Pounds heretofore borrowed and now due and owing upon the Credit of the Tolls collected under and by virtue of the said recited Act, with all Interest due and secured thereon, such One Ninth Part or Share being the Proportion the Tolls collected on the said Road bears to the Tolls collected upon the whole District of Roads; any thing in this Act contained to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding.

No more Money to be laid out on Road from Brechfa to Llansawel than collected thereon.

XII. And be it further enacted, That it shall not be lawful for the said Trustees to apply, expend, or appropriate any of the Tolls hereby granted, or any of the Monies now borrowed or hereafter to be borrowed upon the Credit thereof, in or towards the widening, improving, or repairing any of the Streets in any Town or Place through which the said Roads pass, or to collect any Toll therein.

Money not to be appropriated for repairing Streets.

XIII. And be it further enacted, That out of any Monies already received by virtue of the said recited Act, or out of the first Monies which shall be raised or received by virtue of this Act, the said Trustees shall, in the first place, pay and discharge all the Costs and Expences relative to the procuring and passing of this Act; and the Remainder of such Monies shall from Time to Time be employed in erecting Turnpikes, Toll Houses, Toll Gates, and Weighing Engines, and in amending, widening, altering, and improving the said Roads, and in keeping the same in repair, and in defraying all the Charges and Expences of carrying this Act into execution, and in repaying the Principal Monies by this Act charged or to be borrowed, and the Interest due and to grow due thereon.

Application of Monies.

XIV. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others, without being specially pleaded.

XV. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall commence and take effect upon the passing thereof, and shall continue and be in force and be executed for and during the Term of Thirty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.
