# GEORGII IV. REGIS.

### Cap. xxviii.

An Act for more effectually repairing and improving several Roads in the Counties of Brecon, Radnor, and Glamorgan, and for making and maintaining several new Branches of Road to communicate therewith.

[8th April 1830.]

HEREAS an Act was passed in the Forty-ninth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled An Act for more effectually repairing, improving, 49 G. 3. c. 14. and keeping in repair several Roads in the Counties of Brecon, Radnor, and Glamorgan, and for making and maintaining Two new Branches of Road to communicate therewith: And whereas by virtue and under the Authority of the said Act the Trustees acting under the same have made very considerable Improvements on the said Roads, and have borrowed large Sums of Money upon the Credit of the Tolls arising thereon; but the said Roads cannot be effectually amended and kept in repair, nor the Monies now owing repaid, unless the Term of the said Act be continued, and its several Powers and Provisions enlarged: And whereas it would greatly tend to the Convenience of the Public if the Trustees were enabled to make the several Branches or new Lines of Road as well as the several Deviations of Road herein-after mentioned and described: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority [Local.]

Recited Act repealed.

of the same, That from and after the passing of this Act the said recited Act of the Forty-ninth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Third shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

Purposes of the present Act.

Description of old Roads to be repaired under this Act.

II. And be it further enacted, That from and after the passing of this Act the same shall commence and take effect and be put into execution, for and during the Term herein-after mentioned, for the Purpose of more effectually repairing, widening, altering, making, improving, and keeping in repair the several and respective Roads herein-after described; that is to say, the present Turnpike Road commencing from the Confines of the County of Carmarthen in the Valley of Cwmydwr, and extending from thence through the Town of Trecastle to the Town of Brecon, and from thence by Llansaintfread Church, through the Town of Crickhowell, to the Confines of the County of Monmouth, in the Road to Abergavenny; also the Road from Pontneathvechan, by Ystradvelltoy, to the Road leading from Brecon to Merthyr Tidvil; also the Road from the said Pontneathvechan Road at or near the Llosced Gate, through the Village of Devynnock, to the Trecastle and Brecon Turnpike Road at or near Rhydybriw; also the Road from Brecon, by Cappel Dyffryn Honddu, to Builth; also the Road from Cappel Dyffryn Honddu aforesaid, over New Bridge on Irvon, through the Vale leading by Llwynmadoc to Llanfihangel Abergwessin, from thence to the River Towey near Rhydarw, to the Confines of the County of Cardigan; also the Road from Brecon, by Battle and Pontfean, to Merthyr Church; also the Road from Talgarth, by Porthamal and the Three Cocks, through Llyswen, to Builth; also the Road from Builth aforesaid, by Taverny-prydd, to the Confines of the County of Carmarthen at or near Ludlowfach; also the Road diverging from the said last-mentioned Road at or near Maescynforth to Tuy Coch Vach; also the Road from Talgarth, through Bronthys, to Llyswen; also the Road from Talgarth aforesaid, by the Bwich, over New Bridge near Llanguennider, to Rhydyblew; also the Road from Derwen-y-Groes, over New Bridge near Cefnbrynich, crossing the Brecon and Abergavenny Turnpike Road, and branching off from the said Road at or near the Second Mile Stone from Brecon, through the Village of Llanvihangel Tallyllyn, over Hemley Common, to join the Turnpike Road leading from Talgarth by the Bwick to Rhydyblew, and from Lianvihangel Tallyllyn to the Village of Llangorse, to join the Talgarth and Bwlch Road aforesaid; also the Road from the Town of Brecon, by Penkerrig Cochon, to join the Brecon and Hay Turnpike Road; also the Road from Brecon aforesaid, through Glyn Tarrell, to the Confines of the County of Glamorgan, in the Direction of Merthyr Tidvil; also the Road leading from the Town of Brecon, through Bronllys, near the Turnpike Gates called the Black Lion Gate and the Whitney Gate, in Hay, to the Confines of the County of Hereford, and from the Brecon and Hay Turnpike Road, by the Tilly, Llanthomas, Tregoid, Velindre, and Gwernevet, to join the Turnpike Road leading from Talgarth by Porthamal towards the Three Cocks; also the Road leading from the Brecon Furnace Gate, through the Village of Llanthew, to the Gate leading to Garthbrengy Common; also the Road extending from the Blaentaff Gate on the Brecon and Merthyr Tidvil Turnpike Road over Hirwain Common to join the Glamorganshire Turnpike Road from Merthyr

Merthyr Tidvil aforesaid to Neath; also the Road leading from or near Crickhowell Bridge aforesaid to join the Turnpike Road from Abergavenny to Rhydyblew at or near Pentwyn Clydach in the Parish of Llanelly; also for the Purpose of more effectually making, New Lines repairing, widening, altering, improving, and keeping in repair or Branches the several new Lines or Branches of Road and Deviations of Road of Road. herein-after described, or so much or such Part or Parts thereof as shall be made and completed under the Provisions herein-after contained respecting the same; that is to say, a new Line or Branch of Road commencing on the North Side of Pentrevillin Bridge, and from thence to communicate with the present Turnpike Road from Builth to Llandovery at or near Cefn Llandewy, and which said new Line or Branch of Road will extend through the several Parishes of Llywell, Llandilo'rfane, New Church, and Llangammarch; also another new Line or Branch of Road branching off from the Brecon and Trecastle Turnpike Road aforesaid at or near Pontarclydach Bridge, and proceeding from thence by *Maespoth* to communicate with the beforedescribed new Branch of Road from Pentevelin Bridge to Cesta Llandewy aforesaid, and which said Branch of Road from Pontarclydach Bridge aforesaid will pass through the several Parishes of Llywell and Llandilo'rfane aforesaid; also another new Line or Branch of Road leading from the Village of Devynnock aforesaid to the Twrch Bridge in the Parish of Ystradgunlais, and which said last-mentioned new Line or Branch of Road will extend through the several Parishes of Devynnock, Llywell, and Ystradgunlais aforesaid; also another new Line or Branch of Road extending from the Brecon and Crickhowell Turnpike Road at or near Nant-y-feen, and proceeding by or near to the Church of Saint Michael Cwmdu, and thence to the Borough of Talgarth, and which said new Line or Branch of Road will pass through the several Parishes of Saint Michael Cwmdu and Talgarth; also another new Line or Branch of Road leading from the Brecon and Hay Turnpike Road at or near Pont-y-bat in the Parish of Llandevalley, and extending from thence to communicate with the Road by or near Trebarried, and thence following such Road to Llyswen, and extending through the several Parishes of Llandevalley, Bronllys, and Llyswen, and the Hamlet of Pipton; also another new Line or Branch of Road extending from or near Porthmaur in the Town of Crickhowell, over Crickhowell Bridge, through the Parish of Langattock juxta Crickhowell, to the West End of Glanusk Park Wall, and from thence crossing the Brecknock and Abergavenny Canal Bridge above the Vro Farm House, and from thence by Dyvnant, through or near to Llangunnider Village and Talybont, to Derwen y Groes, and which said last-mentioned new Line or Branch of Road will extend through the several Parishes of Crickhowell, Llangattock juxta Crickhowell, Llangunnider, Llanthetty, and Llanvigan; also One or more new Line or Lines or Branch or Branches of Road extending from the present Crickhowell and Llanelly Road at or near the Wenllan Brook, through or near to Llanelly Village, to join the Abergavenny and Merthyr Tidvil Turnpike Road at or near a Point between the Brecknock and Abergavenny Canal Railway and the Black Rock, and which said last-mentioned new Line or Lines or Branch or Branches of Road will extend through the several Parishes of Llangattock juxta Crickhowell and Llanelly; and also another new Line

Line or Branch of Road commencing at or near Tavern y Prydd, on the Turnpike Road leading from Builth to Llandovery, and thence crossing the Rivers Dulas and Irvon, to Pontrhydverre, and from thence to the Turnpike Road leading from the Confines of the County of Carmarthen to Llandovery, and which said last-mentioned new Line or Branch of Road will extend through the several Parishes of New Church, Llangammarch, and Llanwrtid; also another new Line or Branch of Road deviating from the present Brecon and Merthyr Tidvil Turnpike Road at or near Tuy Rhos, and continuing from thence on the West Side of the River Tarell till the same communicates with the said present Turnpike Road near the Seventh Mile Stone, and which said last-mentioned new Line or Branch of Road will pass through the several Parishes of Llanspythid and Devynnock; also another new Line or Branch of Road deviating from the Brecon and Hay Turnpike Road at or near the Bishop's Meadow, and proceeding from thence to communicate again with the said Brecon and Hay Turnpike Road at or near Penissar Wain, and which said lastmentioned new Line or Branch of Road will pass through the Parishes of Saint John the Evangelist and Llanthew.

Trustees nominated.

III. IV. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees shall meet First Meeting at the Shire Hall in the Town of Brecknock, or some convenient of Trustees. House or Place in the said Town, on the second Wednesday in the Month next after the passing of this Act, or as soon after as conveniently may be, between the Hours of Eleven of the Clock in the Forenoon and Two of the Clock in the Afternoon, and shall then and there proceed to the Execution of this Act, and adjourn themselves from Time to Time, and afterwards meet there or at any [Local.] Place

Place on or near the said Roads, as the said Trustees shall think proper and appoint, as often as it shall be necessary for putting this Act into execution.

Orders to have Precedence.

V. And be it further enacted, That all Orders or Resolutions made at any Meeting for the Deviation, Alteration, or Improvement of any or either of the Roads comprised in this Act, shall have Precedence in their Execution to any similar Orders or Resolutions made at any subsequent Meeting or Meetings.

Power to make new Branches and Deviations of Road.

VI. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Trustees from Time to Time to make, improve, and keep in repair the several new Lines or Branches of Road and Deviations of Road herein-before described, according to the Map or Plan herein-after mentioned.

Trustees not Branches until Subscriptions are advanced.

VII. And be it further enacted. That notwithstanding any thing to make new herein contained, it shall not be lawful to require the said Trustees to make or cause to be made any or either of the said new Lines or Branches of Road herein-before described, except the said new Line or Branch of Road deviating from the said Brecon and Merthyr Tidvil Turnpike Road at or near Tuy Rhos as aforesaid, and the said other new Line or Branch of Road deviating from the said Brecon and Hay Turnpike Road at or near the Bishop's Meadow as aforesaid, until the Amount in Money of the Estimate of the Expence of making the particular Line or Branch of Road required to be made shall be deposited with the Treasurer or Treasurers for the Time being of the said Trustees, for the Purpose of defraying such Expence, by the Subscriber or Subscribers or Person or Persons desirous of having the same particular Line or Branch of Road made.

Treasurer to certify Payment of Subscriptions.

VIII. And be it further enacted. That when and as soon as the whole Amount of such estimated Expence shall be deposited with the said Treasurer or Treasurers as before mentioned, and such Treasurer or Treasurers shall so certify the same in Writing to the said Trustees, it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Trustees to grant Mortgages on the Tolls to be raised on the particular Line or Branch of Road required to be made, as a Security for the Payment of the Principal Monies so advanced as aforesaid, and the Interest thereon, according to the Form set forth in any Act or Acts relating to Turnpike Roads in England, or as near thereto as the Case will allow, but nevertheless so, and in such Manner that the general Tolls of the said Trust shall in nowise be subject or liable to the Payment of the Principal Monies so advanced, or the Interest on the same, or to the future Repairs or Improvements of the said new Branches of Road.

Map or Plan deposited with the Clerk of the Peace to be open to Inspection.

IX. And whereas Maps or Plans describing the respective Lines of the said intended new Branches of Road and Deviations of Road, together with Books of Reference, containing a List of the Names of the several Owners and Occupiers of the Lands, Hereditaments, and Premises through which the same respectively are intended

to pass, have been deposited at the Office of the Clerk of the Peace for the said County of Brecon; be it therefore further enacted, That the said Maps or Plans and Books of Reference shall remain in the Custody of the said Clerk of the Peace, to the end that all Persons may, at all seasonable Times, have Liberty to inspect and peruse the same, and to take Copies and Extracts thereof, at their Will and Pleasure, paying the said Clerk of the Peace the Sum of One Shilling for every such Inspection, and at the Rate of Sixpence for every One hundred Words of such Copies or Extracts of such Maps or Plans and Books of Reference; and the said Trustees in making Limiting the such Branches of Road shall not deviate more than One hundred Deviation Yards from the Line described in any such Map or Plan without from Plan. the Consent in Writing of the Person or Persons, Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, through whose Lands or Grounds such Deviations shall be made.

X. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Lands mark-Trustees to make the said new Branches of Road and Deviations ed in Plan of Road into, through, across, or over the several Lands or Grounds may be used notwithof any Person or Persons who is or are or may be Owner or standing Owners of Lands or Grounds over which the same is or are set out Errors of and described in the said Maps or Plans as aforesaid, although the Description. Name or Names of such Person or Persons may happen to be omitted or mis-stated in the said Books of Reference, in case it shall appear to any Two or more Justices of the Peace for the said County of Brecon, and be certified by Writing under their Hands, that such Error or Omissions proceeded from Mistake.

XI. And be it further enacted, That the Powers and Authorities Trustees not hereby given to the said Trustees for putting this Act into execution to pull down shall not extend to the taking down of any Dwelling House or Houses, &c. other Building, or taking in the Scite of any House or other sent. Building, or to the taking of any Garden, Yard, Court, Park, Paddock, inclosed Shrubbery, planted Walk or Avenue to a House, (save and except such as are particularized in the Schedule to this Act annexed,) without the Consent in Writing of the Owners and Proprietors thereof respectively.

XII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That in case the Power of said Trustees shall not have purchased and paid for the several purchasing Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments required for the said new limited to Five Years. Branches and Deviations of Road, within Five Years from the passing of this Act, then and from thenceforth the Powers granted by this Act, or by any Act in force for regulating Turnpike Roads in England, shall cease and determine, save and except as to so much thereof as shall have been already purchased and paid for, and save and except with the Consent in Writing of the Owners and Proprietors of such Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments first had and obtained.

XIII. And be it further enacted, That the respective Sums of Power to Money following shall be demanded and taken at each and every take Tolls. Toll Gate, Chain, and Bar continued or erected or to be bereafter erected

erected on the said Roads, from the Owner or Owners of or Person or Persons using or attending any Horse, Beast, Cattle, or Carriage, before any such Horse, Beast, Cattle, or Carriage shall be permitted to pass through the same; (that is to say,)

Tolls.

For every Horse, Mule, or other Beast of Burthen, laden or unladen, and not drawing, not exceeding the Sum of Two-pence; except Horses, Mules, or Asses going for or returning laden only with Lime, carried and not drawn, and for each such Horse, Mule, or Ass, not exceeding the Sum of One Penny:

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other such like Carriage, not exceeding the Sum of Sixpence, except only those going for or returning laden with Lime, and

nothing else:

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other Carriage going for or returning laden with Lime, and nothing else, with the Wheels of such Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other Carriage of less Breadth than Six Inches, not exceeding the Sum of Three-pence; and with the Wheels of Six Inches or upwards, not exceeding the Sum of One Penny Halfpenny:

For every Horse, Mule, or other Beast drawing any Coach, Chariot, Chaise, Landau, Phaeton, Curricle, Gig, Car of Pleasure or for travelling, or any other such like Carriage, not exceeding the Sum

of Nine-pence:

For every Horse, Mule, or other Beast drawing any small Sledge,

not exceeding the Sum of Two-pence:

For every Score of Oxen or other Neat Cattle, not exceeding the Sum of One Shilling and Eight-pence; and for every Score of Calves, Swine, Goats, Sheep, or Lambs, not exceeding the Sum of Ten-pence; and so in proportion for any greater or less Number of Oxen or other Neat Cattle, Calves, Swine, Goats, Sheep, or Lambs:

Provided always, that in the meantime, and until the said Trustees shall direct the above-mentioned Tolls or any of them to be taken, the same and the like Tolls shall be taken and continued at the said last-mentioned Gates, Bars, and Chains, as shall be taken at the Time of passing this Act.

Tolls on Steam or other Carriages.

XIV. And be it further enacted, That the same Toll shall be paid for any Coach, Waggon, or other Carriage which shall pass along any of the said Roads, and shall be in any Manner propelled or drawn by Steam, Gas, or any other like Means, as would have been payable for Four Horses drawing the same, in case the same had been drawn by Four Horses; and the said Tolls shall be paid for every such Coach, Waggon, or other Carriage, for each Time of passing along any of the said Roads.

StageCoaches

XV. And be it further enacted, That the Tolls hereby made payto pay each Time of pass. Draught drawing any Stage Coach or Stage Waggon, Diligence, Van, Caravan, Cart, or other Stage Carriage conveying Passengers or Paward for every Time of passing and Goods for Payment, Hire, or Reward, for every Time of passing and repassing along the said Roads.

XVI. And

XVI. And be it further enacted, That the Tolls hereby made Post Chaises payable shall be paid for or in respect of all Horses or other Beasts of Draught drawing any Post Chaise or other Carriage every fresh travelling for Hire, for every Time of passing and repassing along the said Roads on the same Day, as often as a fresh Hiring shall take place.

XVII. And be it further enacted, That if any Person shall have Tolls to be paid the Toll hereby authorized to be taken for the passing of any paid but Horse, Cattle, Beast, or Carriage through any One of such Turnpikes once a Day. or Toll Gates, such Horse, Cattle, Beast, or Carriage shall, upon a Ticket denoting the Payment of such Toll on that Day being produced, be permitted to pass Toll-free with the same Horse, Cattle, Beast, or Carriage through the same Turnpike or Toll Gate, and through any other Gate or Gates situate within the Distance of Five Miles from the Turnpike or Toll Gate where he so paid, at any Time or Times during the same Day, to be computed from Twelve of the Clock at Night to Twelve of the Clock on the next succeeding Night; Provided always, that notwithstanding any thing last herein-before contained to the contrary, it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Trustees to take Tolls at any Gate or Turnpike erected on any new Lines or Branches of Road, although such Gate or Turnpike shall be erected within the Distance of Five Miles of any other Gate or Turnpike erected or to be erected on any Part of the present Turnpike Roads within the said Trust.

XVIII. And whereas some Parts of the Roads included in this To prevent Act lead over Open Wastes and Commons, and the Tolls at Gates evading Payin such Situations are liable to be evaded; be it therefore further on Commons. enacted, That the said Trustees shall and may cause Fences and Ditches to be made over such Parts of such Wastes and Commons as they shall think necessary, in order to prevent Payment of Toll being evaded; and if any Person or Persons shall pull down, or in anywise displace, destroy, or carry away any such Fence, or any Part thereof, or shall fill up or injure any such Ditch, every such Person shall for every such Offence forfeit and pay any Sum not exceeding Five Pounds: Provided always, that no ancient Road or Highway running across the said Roads shall be stopped up or obstructed, and no such Fence or Ditch to be made as aforesaid shall extend more than Half a Mile from any Turnpike Gate continued or erected or to be erected under or by virtue of this Act.

XIX. And be it further enacted, That this Act, and the Term and Tolls herein-before specified and hereby granted, (excepting the Tolls to arise on the new Lines or Branches of Road herein- Tolls on before described, other than the said new Lines or Branches of Branch Road respectively deviating from the said Brecon and Merthyr Roads) to be Tydvil Turnpike Road and the said Brecon and Hay Turnpike liable to Debts, &c. Road as aforesaid,) shall be and the same are hereby made subject and liable to the Payment of all Monies which have been borrowed and are now due and owing on the Credit of the Tolls authorized to be taken by the said recited Act of the Forty-ninth Year of the [Local.]

New Term and Tolls (except the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, hereby repealed, and as shall or may be borrowed or become due by virtue of or under this Act, (excepting such Sum or Sums of Money as shall be borrowed for making the said new Lines or Branches of Road as herein mentioned,) and of all Interest due and to grow due on such Monies, as fully and effectually, to all Intents and Purposes, as if the same Monies had been borrowed or become due or owing on the Credit or Security of the Tolls granted by this Act.

Gates to be erected on each Road, and Tolls taken.

XX. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees shall and they are hereby required to cause a Toll Gate or Gates, Turnpike or Turnpikes, to be erected on each of the several Lines of Road hereinbefore specified, and Tolls to be demanded and taken thereat; and it shall not be lawful for the said Trustees to expend a larger Sum of Money in any One Year in repairing and maintaining such Line of Road than shall have been collected thereon in such Year, after paying the Interest of the present Debt and Sinking Fund, as herein mentioned, proportionate to the Amount of the Tolls received.

Sinking Fund.

XXI. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees shall and they are hereby required to reserve a Sinking Fund of not less than the Sum of Three hundred Pounds per Annum out of the total Amount of the Tolls to be collected by virtue of this Act, and the same shall be annually applied, in such Manner as the said Trustees shall from Time to Time direct, in repaying the Principal Monies which, at the Time of the Commencement of this Act, shall be due and owing on the Credit of the Tolls arising on the said Roads.

Application of Tolls and Money to be borrowed.

XXII. And be it further enacted, That out of the Tolls or other Monies already received by virtue of the said Act hereby repealed, or out of the Tolls and all other Monies which shall be raised or received by virtue of this Act, in respect to the present existing Lines of Road, the said Trustees shall, in the first place, pay and discharge all the Costs and Expences relative to procuring and passing this Act; and the Remainder of all such Monies shall from Time to Time be applied, in the first place, in paying the Interest of the Money borrowed or now owing by virtue of the said Act hereby repealed, and also by virtue of the several Acts therein recited and set forth, or any or either of them, or to be borrowed in pursuance of the Power herein-before contained; in the second case, in paying the Sum herein-before directed to be paid and applied as a Sinking Fund; in the third place, in making, repairing, improving, and rendering commodious the said Turnpike Roads now existing, and in otherwise putting this Act in execution; and lastly, in paying off and discharging the Principal Monies due and owing on the said Roads, and to or for no other Use or Purpose whatsoever.

Toll Gates
to be erected
on new Lines
of Road.

XXIII. And be it further enacted, That when and as soon as any One of the said new Lines or Branches of Road (except the said new Lines or Deviations of Road from the said Brecon and Merthyr Tydvil Turnpike Road and the said Brecon and Hay Turnpike Road as aforesaid) shall be made and completed to the Satisfaction of the Surveyor for the Time being of the said Trustees, and he shall so certify

certify the same by any Writing under his Hand at any Meeting of the said Trustees, it shall and may be lawful to and for the Trustees assembled at such Meeting to order and direct One or more Toll Gate or Toll Gates, with a proper and sufficient Toll House or Toll Houses, to be erected and set up on such new Line or Branch of Road, for the Purpose of collecting and receiving the several Tolls herein-before specified at such Toll Gate or Toll Gates; and it shall not be lawful for the said Trustees to expend a larger Sum of Money in repairing and maintaining any such new Line or Branch of Road in any One Year than shall have been collected thereon: Provided always, that no Toll shall be taken at any such last-mentioned Gate within the Distance of Five Miles of any other Gate or Turnpike on the same new Line or Branch of Road, Toll having been on the same Day paid at such other Gate or Turnpike, and a Ticket thereof produced.

XXIV. And be it further enacted, That the Tolls arising from each Application of the said new Lines or Branches of Road shall be exclusively applied of Tolls by the said Trustees in manner following; that is to say, in the first Branch place, in paying and discharging the Interest on the several Sums Roads. borrowed for such Branch of Road on the Credit of the Tolls hereby imposed; in the next place, in contributing from Time to Time towards the Repairs of the said new Line or Branch of Road upon which such Toll has been raised, and in aid of the Statute Duty liable from Time to Time to be expended thereon; and in the next place, in paying, liquidating, and discharging the several Principal Sums borrowed on the Credit of the said last-mentioned Tolls.

XXV. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees shall Separate and they are hereby required to keep a separate and distinct Account Accounts to of the Monies borrowed on each new Branch or Line of Road, and be kept. of the Tolls arising therefrom, as well as of all Monies expended in respect thereof, so that the same shall in nowise be blended with the general Receipts and Disbursements of the said Trustees, but be a distinct Fund and Account.

XXVI. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed Public Act. and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others, without being specially pleaded.

XXVII. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall continue and Term of Act. be in force for the Period of Thirty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.
