An Act to continue An Act of the Fifth Year of His present Majesty, for enabling the Commissioners acting in execution of an Agreement made between the East India Company and the private Creditors of the late Rajah of Tanjore the better to carry the same into effect.

[26th April 1830.]

HEREAS by an Act passed in the Fifth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled 5G.4.c.117.

An Act for enabling the Commissioners acting in execution of an Agreement made between the East India Company and the private Creditors of His late Highness Ameer Sing, former Rajah of Tanjore, deceased, the better to carry the same into effect, certain Powers and Authorities are given to the Commissioners for the Time being acting in England and in India in execution of certain Articles of Agreement bearing Date the Eleventh Day of February One thousand eight hundred and twenty-four, made between the United Company of Merchants of England trading to the East Indies of the one Part, and the several Persons whose Hands and Seals should be thereto set and affixed, and who respectively were or claimed to be Creditors of His late Highness Ameer Sing, formerly Rajah of Tanjore in the East Indies, deceased, of the other Part, in the said Act mentioned; and by the said Act it is enacted, that the Powers and Authorities by that Act given to the said Commissioners then appointed, and to the Person and Persons thereafter to be appointed Commissioners, as well in England as in India, should $\lceil Local. \rceil$

should continue in force until the First Day of August which would be in the Year One thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight, and from thence until the End of the next Session of Parliament: And whereas it is expedient that the Time during which the Powers and Authorities given by the said Act, and which has now expired, should be renewed and further continued: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That the Powers and Authorities given by the said Act to the Commissioners therein mentioned, and to the Person or Persons hereafter to be appointed Commissioners, as well in England as in India, shall be renewed and continue in force until the First Day of August One thousand eight hundred and thirty-three, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.

The Powers given by the recited Act continued until August 1833.

Public Act.

II. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others, without being specially pleaded.
