## Cap. xcii.

An Act for improving and maintaining the Road from Werneth to Littleborough, and other Roads communicating therewith, in the County of Lancaster. [29th May 1830.]

HEREAS an Act was passed in the Seventh and Eighth Years of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled An Act for making and maintaining a 7 & 8 G. 4. Road from Hollinwood to Littleborough, and other Roads commu- c.55. nicating therewith, in the County of Lancaster: And whereas the Trustees appointed in or by virtue of the said recited Act of the Seventh and Eighth Years of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth have proceeded to put the same Act into execution, and have made considerable Progress in repairing and improving certain Parts of the Road therein mentioned; but no Part of the new Lines of Road mentioned in the said recited Act have yet been made: And whereas it would be of great public Utility if Powers were granted to vary and alter the Line of Road by the said Act intended or authorized to be made, and thereby directed to commence from, at, or nearly opposite to a certain Public House called the Waggon and Horses, situate at the Bottom of Hollinwood within the Township of Oldham in the said County of Lancaster, and continuing from thence, by a new Line of Road, to Dry Clough within the Township of Royton in the said County, and in lieu thereof to make the same commence from and out of the present Turnpike Road from Man-[Local.] chester 28 R

chester to Oldham, at or near Werneth in the Township of Oldham aforesaid, and proceeding from thence along the present Road, by Coppice Nook and Westwood, to Uin Nook, all within the Township of Oldham aforesaid; and by making a new Line of Road from thence to join the Line of Road from Hollinwood to Dry Clough, by the said Act authorized to be made, at or about the Place where the said last-mentioned Line of Road will cross the Road leading from Maygate Lane, within Oldham aforesaid, to Chadderton aforesaid, and proceed from thence along the Line of Road by the said recited Act authorized to be made to Dry Clough in the Township of Royton in the said County: And whereas several considerable Sums of Money are now due and owing on the Credit of the Tolls by the said recited Act granted, and the Roads comprised in the said Act cannot be sufficiently improved and maintained in repair, nor can the proposed Alteration in the Commencement of the said Road be made and completed, unless the Powers and Provisions of the said recited Act be enlarged, and the Tolls altered: And whereas it is expedient that the said Act should be repealed, and further and other Powers granted instead thereof: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Recited Act Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That from and after the Commencement of this Act the said recited Act of the Seventh and Eighth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty King George the Fourth shall be and the same is hereby declared to be repealed.

This Act to be put into execution for the Purposes herein mentioned.

II. And be it further enacted. That this Act shall be put into execution, for and during the Term herein-after mentioned, for the Purpose of improving, repairing, amending, widening, diverting, altering, and keeping in repair the Roads leading from Werneth, by Coppice Nook and Westwood, to Uin Nook; and for making, maintaining, and keeping in repair the aforesaid proposed new Line of Road from at or near Uin Nook, within Oldham aforesaid, to Dry Clough, within the Township of Royton aforesaid; and also for improving, repairing, amending, widening, diverting, altering, and keeping in repair the Itoad leading from Dry Clough through Show to New Hey; and for making, maintaining, and keeping in repair the proposed new Taher of Road from and out of the present Tumpike Road at New Mey to or near to Littleborough in the said County of Lancasten, by the said recited Act authorized to be made; and also for improving; repairing, amending, widening, diverting, altering, and keeping in repair the Branch Road leading from New Hey, through Milmrow, to Rochdale in the said County; and also the Branch of Road from, at, of hear Gotts within the Township of Crompton in the said County, to or near to Grains within the Township of Crompton aforesaid; and also the Branch Road leading from Bent Green to or near to Middleton in the said County.

pike Roads in *England*, shall be and they are hereby appointed Trustees for improving, making, and maintaining in repair the said Road and Branches, and for otherwise putting this Act into execution.

Power to appoint additional Trustees.

IV. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the said Trustees, and they are hereby authorized and empowered from Time to Time, at any of their Meetings, to elect and appoint any Number of Persons, being duly qualified to act as Trustees of Turnpike Roads in *England*, (not exceeding Three in the whole, in addition to the Number of Trustees herein named and appointed,) to be Trustees for the Purposes of this Act; and such Persons so elected and appointed shall be Trustees for the Purposes of this Act, and they are hereby invested with the same Powers and Authorities for executing this Act as if they had been herein named.

First Meeting of Trustees.

V. And be it further enacted, That for putting this Act into execution the said Trustees shall meet at the Kings Arms Inn, in Shaw aforesaid, or at some other convenient Place near to the said Roads, on the Third Friday next after the Commencement of this Act, or as soon after as conveniently may be, for the Purpose of proceeding to execute this Act, and shall and may then and from Time to Time afterwards adjourn to and meet at such Time and Times, and at such Place and Places, in the Neighbourhood of the said Roads as they shall think proper; and the Hours of such Meetings shall be between the Hours of Ten of the Clock in the Forenoon and Twelve of the Clock at Noon.

Tolls on Roads, except from Werneth to Dry Clough. VI. And be it further enacted, That the respective Sums hereinafter mentioned shall and may be demanded and taken for Tolls at all and every or any of the said Roads herein-before mentioned, save and except the proposed Road from Werneth to Dry Clough; (that is to say,)

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Hearse, Post Chaise, Chariot, Coach, Stage Coach, Diligence, Curricle, Gig, Caravan, or other such Carriage built and constructed with Springs, the Sum of Four-pence:

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Waggon, Dray, or other such Carriage, having the Sole or Bottom of the Fellies of the Wheels thereof of less Breadth than Four Inches and a Half, the Sum of Nine-pence:

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Waggon, Dray, or other such Carriage, having the Sole or Bottom of the Fellies of the Wheels thereof of the Breadth of Four Inches and a Half and under Six Inches, the Sum of Seven-pence:

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Waggon, Dray, or other such Carriage, having the Sole or Bottom of the Fellies of the Wheels thereof of the Breadth of Six Inches or upwards, the Sum of Five-pence:

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Cart, Wain, or other such Carriage with Two Wheels, of the Breadth of Six Inches or upwards

upwards at the Bottom or Soles thereof, the Sum of Four-pence

Halfpenny:

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Cart, Wain, or other such Carriage with Two Wheels, of less Breadth than Six Inches, but not less than Four Inches and a Half, the Sum of Sixpence:

For One Horse or other Beast drawing any Cart, Wain, or other such Carriage with Two Wheels, of less Breadth than Four Inches and a Half at the Bottom or Soles thereof, the Sum of Eightpence:

And for every additional Horse or other Beast, the Sum of Four-

pence:

For every Horse, Mule, or Ass, laden or unladen, and not drawing,

the Sum of One Penny Halfpenny:

For every Drove of Oxen, Cows, or Neat Cattle, the Sum of One Shilling and Three-pence per Score, and so in proportion for any less Number:

For every Drove of Calves, Pigs, Sheep, or Lambs, the Sum of Seven-pence Halfpenny per Score, and so in proportion for any less Number:

And in all Cases where there shall be a fractional Part of a Halfpenny in the Calculation or Amount of the Tolls hereby granted, or any of them, the Sum of One Halfpenny shall be demanded and taken in lieu of such fractional Part.

VII. And be it further enacted, That the respective Sums of Money Tolls on herein-after mentioned shall and may be demanded and taken for Road from Tolls on the proposed Road from Werneth to Dry Clough; (that is Dry Clough. to say,)

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Hearse, Post Chaise, Chariot, Coach, Stage Coach, Diligence, Curricle, Gig, Caravan, or other such Carriage built and constructed with Springs, the Sum of Three-pence:

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Waggon, Dray, or other such Carriage, having the Sole or Bottom of the Fellies of the Wheels thereof of less Breadth than Four Inches and a Half,

the Sum of Four-pence Halfpenny:

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Waggon, Dray, or other such Carriage, having the Sole or Bottom of the Fellies of the Wheels thereof of the Breadth of Four Inches and a Half and under Six Inches, the Sum of Four-pence:

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Waggon, Dray, or other such Carriage, having the Sole or Bottom of the Fellies of the Wheels thereof of the Breadth of Six Inches or upwards, the

Sum of Two-pence Halfpenny:

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Cart, Wain, or other such Carriage with Two Wheels, of the Breadth of Six Inches or upwards at the Bottom or Soles thereof, the Sum of Two-pence Halfpenny:

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Cart, Wain, or other such Carriage with Two Wheels, of less Breadth than Six Inches, but not less than Four Inches and a Half, the Sum of Three-pence Halfpenny:

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For One Horse or other Beast drawing any Cart, Wain, or other such Carriage with Two Wheels, of less Breadth than Four Inches and a Half at the Bottom or Soles thereof, the Sum of Fourpence:

And for every additional Horse or other Beast, the Sum of Two-

pence:

For every Horse, Mule, or Ass, laden or unladen, and not drawing, the Sum of One Penny:

For every Drove of Oxen, Cows, or Neat Cattle, the Sum of Ten-pence per Score, and so in proportion for any less Number:

For every Drove of Calves, Pigs, Sheep, or Lambs, the Sum of Sixpence per Score, and so in proportion for any less Number:

And in all Cases where there shall be a fractional Part of a Half-penny in the Calculation or Amount of the Tolls hereby granted, or any of them, the Sum of One Halfpenny shall be demanded and taken in lieu of such fractional Part.

Persons having paid the
Toll to return
Toll-free.

VIII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That all and every the Horses, Beasts, and Cattle (except Horses or Beasts drawing any Stage Coach, Diligence, Van or Caravan, or Stage Waggon, or other Stage Carriage or Cart herein-after specified,) in respect whereof the Toll hereby authorized to be taken shall have been paid at any Turnpike or Turnpikes, Toll Gate or Toll Gates, on any Part of the said Roads, shall, upon a Note or Ticket, Notes or Tickets, denoting such Payment, being produced, be permitted to return or repass once Toll-free the same Day through the same Turnpike or Turnpikes, Toll Gate or Toll Gates, and also through such other Gate or Gates (if any) as the Ticket for such Payment shall free.

Limiting the Number of Payments on each Line of Road.

IX. And be it further enacted, That it shall not be lawful for the said Trustees, or any Person appointed or continued Collector of the Tolls mentioned in this Act, to demand or take the respective Sums or Tolls aforesaid at any greater Number of Gates than is herein-after mentioned, for or in respect of the same Horses, Beasts, or Cattle passing or repassing once through all the Toll Gates, Turnpikes, or Side Gates along the whole Line of each of the respective Roads to be amended, improved, or made by virtue of this Act, any thing contained in any Law or Statute relating to Turnpike Roads to the contrary notwithstanding; (that is to say,) at no more than One Gate on the whole Line of Road from Werneth to Dry Clough, and at no more than One Gate on the whole Line of Road from Dry Clough to Shaw, and at no more than Two Gates on the whole Line of Road from Shaw to Littleborough, and at no more than Two Gates on the whole Line of Road from Shaw to Rochdale, and at no more than One Gate on the whole Line of Road from Goats to Grains, and at no more than One Gate on the whole Line of Road from Bent Green to Middleton.

No more than Three full Tolls to be paid in one Day at the same Gate.

X. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That from and after Payment of Three full Tolls in any One Day for and in respect of any Horse or Horses or other Beast or Beasts drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other Carriage, at any Toll Gate erected

or to be erected on any Part of the said Roads, the same Horse or Horses or other Beast or Beasts, drawing the same Carriages or Carts, shall be permitted to pass and repass through the same Toll Gate Toll-free during the Remainder of the Day on which such Three Tolls shall have been paid as aforesaid.

XI. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That the Tolls hereby Stage made payable for or in respect of Horses or Beasts drawing any Stage Coach, Diligence, Van or Caravan, or Stage Waggon, or other Stage Carriage or Cart, conveying Passengers or Goods for Pay or of passing. Reward, shall be payable and paid every Time of passing or repassing along the said Roads, or any or either of them: Provided also nevertheless, that in case the Horses or Beasts drawing any such Stage Coach, Diligence, Van or Caravan, or Stage Waggon, or other Stage Carriage or Cart, shall be changed after such Stage Coach, Diligence, Van or Caravan, or Stage Waggon, or other Stage Carriage or Cart, shall have passed through any Toll Gate or Turnpike on the said Roads, and Tolls shall have been paid thereat for the same, no further Toll shall be payable in respect of any such other Horses or Beasts than would have been payable in respect of such Stage Coach, Diligence, Van or Caravan, or Stage Waggon, or other Stage Carriage or Cart, in case such Stage Coach, Diligence, Van, or Caravan, or Stage Waggon or other Stage Carriage or Cart, had been drawn by the same Horses or Beasts along the whole Line of the said Roads.

Coaches, &c. to pay

XII. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That the Tolls Post Chaises, hereby made payable for or in respect of Horses or Beasts let out &c. on every to Hire, and drawing any Post Chaise or other Carriage, shall be payable and paid every Time of passing along the said Roads, or any or either of them, whenever any new Hiring thereof shall take place.

new Hiring.

XIII. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees shall and Toll Gates to they are hereby required to erect and continue upon the said Branch be erected on Road from New Hey to Rochdale One or more Toll Gate or Toll Branch Roads. Gates, Toll Bar or Toll Bars, Turnpike or Turnpikes; and upon the said Branch Road from Goats to Grains One or more Toll Gate or Toll Gates, Toll Bar or Toll Bars, Turnpike or Turnpikes; and upon the said Branch Road from Bent Green to Middleton, One or more Toll Gate or Toll Gates, Toll Bar or Toll Bars, Turnpike or Turnpikes; and to demand and take thereat respectively the Tolls by this Act granted, subject to the Provisions of this Act: Provided always, that no Money arising from any of the Tolls hereby authorized to be collected and taken shall be applied in or towards the Repair of any or either of such Branch Roads upon which there shall not be a Toll Gate or Bar erected or continued under the Authority of the Trustees for carrying this Act into execution: Provided also, that no more of the Monies arising by virtue of this Act shall be laid out or expended upon any or either of such Branch Roads than shall be collected thereon, or borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls collected thereon.

Regulating the charging of the Debt upon the several Roads.

XIV. And be it further enacted, That the several Principal Sums now due and owing on the Credit of the Tolls granted by the said recited Act, and the Interest thereon, and all Arrears of such Interest. shall be charged on the Tolls to arise by virtue of this Act on the said Line of Road from Werneth to Littleborough, and on the said Branch Road from New Hey to Rochdale, and on the said Branch Road from Goats to Grains, and on the said Branch Road from Bent Green to Middleton, in the Proportions and Manner following; that is to say, Thirteen equal Thirtieth Parts of the said Principal Sums and Interest, and Arrears of Interest, shall be and the same are hereby charged exclusively on the Tolls or Revenues arising or to be produced on the said Line of Road from Werneth to Littleborough; Ten other equal Thirtieth Parts of the said Principal Sums and Interest, and Arrears of Interest, shall be and the same are hereby charged exclusively on the Tolls or Revenues arising or to be produced on the said Branch Road from New Hey to Rochdale; Three other equal Thirtieth Parts of the said Principal Sums and Interest, and Arrears of Interest, shall be and the same are hereby charged exclusively on the Tolls or Revenues arising or to be produced on the said Branch Road from Goats to Grains; and the remaining Four equal Thirtieth Parts of the said Principal Sums and Interest, and Arrears of Interest, shall be and the same are hereby charged exclusively on the Tolls or Revenues arising or to be produced on the said Branch Road from Bent Green to Middleton.

This Act not to prejudice existing Securities;

the present Creditors to injure any future Creditors.

XV. And in order that the Securities of the Creditors to whom the several Principal Sums of Money and Arrears of Interest are now due and owing on the Credit of the said recited Act may not be prejudiced or lessened by any of the Provisions in this Act contained; be it further enacted, That the whole of the Tolls or Revenues to arise or to be produced on the said Line of Road from Werneth to Littleborough, and on the said respective Branches of Road, shall from henceforth be, remain, and continue, and be subject to and charged and chargeable with the whole of the said several Principal Sums of Money, and of all Interest and Arrears of Interest thereon, in such and the same Manner, and with such and the same Powers and Remedies for recovering and receiving the same respectively, as if such several Sums of Money had been borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls by this Act granted on the said Road, and respective nor to enable Branches of Road comprised in this Act: Provided always, that nothing herein-before contained shall extend or be construed to extend to enable the several and respective Creditors for the Time being of the Tolls granted by the said recited Act to demand, take, have, or receive any further Sum or Sums of Money from the Tolls or Revenues arising or to be produced on the said Road or respective Branches of Road than shall be equal to the aforesaid several Proportions of the several Principal Sums of Money and Interest, and Arrears of Interest, with which the same is or are herein-before respectively charged, to the Prejudice or Injury of any Person or Persons who shall or may hereafter advance or lend any Sum or Sums of Money on the Credit of the Tolls or Revenues to arise or be produced on the said Road or on any of the said respective Branches of Road.

XVI. And be it further enacted, That the Costs, Charges, and Ex. Expences of pences incurred in or incidental to the obtaining and passing of this Act, shall be paid out of any Monies remaining in the Hands of the Treasurer to the said Trustees, or undisposed of on the Day of the Commencement of this Act, or out of the first Monies to arise by virtue of this Act.

XVII. And be it further enacted, That Thirteen equal Thirtieth Application Parts of all such Monies (if any) as shall remain in the Hands of the of the Monies Treasurer to the said Trustees, or undisposed of, on the Day of the the Werneth Commencement of this Act (after Payment of such Costs, Charges, and Littleand Expences as aforesaid,) and all Monies which shall arise and be borough produced from the Tolls to be collected on the said Road from Road. Werneth to Littleborough, shall be applied in the first place in the Payment of Thirteen equal Thirtieth Parts of the Expences of Books, Advertisements, Salaries of Officers, and other such general current Expences of the Trustees in the Execution of this Act, and in the Payment of the Expences of repairing, altering, or erecting Toll Gates and Toll Houses, Fences, Ditches, Stones, and Posts on the same Road from Werneth to Littleborough; and in the next place in paying and discharging the aforesaid Proportion of Thirteen equal Thirtieth Parts of the Interest of the Monies now due and owing on the Credit of the said recited Act and of the Act thereby repealed, and of the Arrears now due thereon; and in the next place in Payment of the Interest of any Monies which shall be hereafter borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls arising on the same Road from Werneth to Littleborough; and in the next place in paying the Expences of making, completing, diverting, altering, widening, improving, repairing, and keeping in repair the same Road; and afterwards in reducing, paying off, and discharging the aforesaid Proportion of Thirteen equal Thirtieth Parts of the several Principal Sums secured on the Credit of the said recited Act and of the Act thereby repealed; and lastly in paying off and discharging all Principal Sums which shall be borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls arising on the same Road from Werneth to Littleborough.

XVIII. And be it further enacted, That Ten equal Thirtieth Parts Application of all such Monies (if any) as shall remain in the Hands of the of the Monies Treasurer to the said Trustees, or undisposed of, on the Day of the Branch Road Commencement of this Act, (after Payment of such Costs, Charges, from New and Expences as aforesaid,) and all Monies which shall arise and be Hey to Rochproduced from the Tolls to be collected on the said Branch Road dale. from New Hey to Rochdale, shall be applied in the first place in the Payment of Ten equal Thirtieth Parts of the Expences of Books, Advertisements, Salaries of Officers, and other such general current Expences of the Trustees in the Execution of this Act, and in the Payment of the Expences of repairing, altering, or erecting Toll Gates and Toll Houses, Fences, Ditches, Stones, and Posts on the same Branch Road from New Hey to Rochdale; and in the next place in paying and discharging the aforesaid Proportion of Ten equal Thirtieth Parts of the Interest of the Monies now due and owing on the Credit of the said recited Act and of the Act thereby repealed, and of the Arrears now due thereon; and in the next  $\lceil Local. \rceil$ 

place in Payment of the Interest of any Monies which shall be hereafter horrowed on the Credit of the Tolls arising on the same Branch Road from New Hey to Rochdale; and in the next place in paying the Expences of making, completing, diverting, altering, widening, improving, repairing, and keeping in repair the same Branch Road; and afterwards in reducing, paying off, and discharging the aforesaid Proportion of Ten equal Thirtieth Parts of the several Principal Sums secured on the Credit of the said recited Act and of the Act thereby repealed; and lastly in paying off and discharging, all Principal Sums which shall be borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls arising on the same Branch Road from New Hey to Rochdale.

Application of the Monies arising on the Branch Road from Goats to Grains.

XIX. And be it further enacted, That Three equal Thirtieth Parts of all such Monies (if any) as shall remain in the Hands of the Treasurer to the said Trustees, or undisposed of, on the Day of the Commencement of this Act, (after Payment of such Costs, Charges, and Expences as aforesaid,) and all Monies which shall arise and be produced from the Tolls to be collected on the said Branch Road from Goats to Grains, shall be applied in the first place in the Payment of Three equal Thirtieth Parts of the Expences of Books, Advertisements, Salaries of Officers, and other such general current Expences of the Trustees in the Execution of this Act, and in the Payment of the Expences of repairing, altering, or erecting Toll Gates and Toll Houses, Fences, Ditches, Stones, and Posts on the same Branch Road from Goats to Grains; and in the next place in paying and discharging the aforesaid Proportion of Three equal Thirtieth Parts of the Interest of the Monies now due and owing on the Credit of the said recited Act and of the Act thereby repealed, and of the Arrears now due thereon; and in the next place in Payment of the Interest of any Monies which shall be hereafter borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls arising on the same Branch Road from Goats to Grains; and in the next place in paying the Expences of making, completing, diverting, altering, widening, improving, repairing, and keeping in repair the same Branch Road; and afterwards in reducing, paying off, and discharging the aforesaid Proportion of Three equal Thirtieth Parts of the several Principal Sums secured on the Credit of the said recited Act and of the Act thereby repealed; and lastly in paying off and discharging all Principal Sums which shall be borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls arising on the same Branch Road from Goats to Grains.

Application Green to Middleton.

XX. And be it further enacted, That Four equal Thirtieth Parts of the Monies of all such Monies (if any) as shall remain in the Hands of the arising on the Treasurer to the said Trustees, or undisposed of, on the Day of the Branch Road Commencement of this Act, (after Payment of such Costs, Charges, and Expences as aforesaid,) and all Monies which shall arise and be produced from the Tolls to be collected on the said Branch Road from Bent Green to Middleton, shall be applied in the first place in the Payment of Four equal Thirtieth Parts of the Expences of Books, Advertisements, Salaries of Officers, and other such general current Expences of the Trustees in the Execution of this Act, and

in the Payment of the Expences of repairing, altering, or erecting Toll Gates and Toll Houses, Fences, Ditches, Stones, and Posts on the same Branch Road from Bent Green to Middleton; and in the next place in paying and discharging the aforesaid Proportion of Four equal Thirtieth Parts of the Interest of the Monies now due and owing on the Credit of the said recited Act and of the Act thereby repealed, and of the Arrears now due thereon; and in the next place in Payment of the Interest of any Monies which shall be hereafter borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls arising on the same Branch Road from Bent Green to Middleton; and in the next place in paying the Expences of making, completing, diverting, altering, widening, improving, repairing, and keeping in repair the same Branch Road; and afterwards in reducing, paying off, and discharging the aforesaid Proportion of Four equal Thirtieth Parts of the several Principal Sums secured on the Credit of the said recited Act and of the Act thereby repealed; and lastly in paying off and discharging all Principal Sums which shall be borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls arising on the same Branch Road from Bent Green to Middleton.

XXI. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees shall and New Pieces may and they are hereby authorized and empowered to set out and of Road may make the said several new Pieces of Road from at or near Werneth be made. to Dry Clough, and from at or near New Hey to or near to Littleborough, according to the Lines described in the Maps or Plans herein-after mentioned, and for such Purpose to take and use the Buildings, Gardens, and Premises described in the Schedule to this Act annexed, any thing in any Law or Statute relating to Turnpike Roads contained to the contrary notwithstanding.

XXII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That no Toll No Toll to be shall be demanded or taken on the said intended Line of Road from Werneth to Dry Clough until the whole of such intended Line of Road shall be completed and thrown open to the Public.

XXIII. And whereas a Map or Plan, describing the proposed Line Plan depoof Road from Werneth, by Coppice Nook, Westwood, and Uin Nook, sited with to the Road leading from Maygate Lane to Chadderton, and also the Clerk of another Map or Plan, describing the proposed Line of Road from Maygate Lane aforesaid to Dry Clough, and also the proposed Line and be open of Road from New Hey to Littleborough, and the Lands through or over which the same is or are to be carried or made, together with Books of Reference, containing Lists of the Names of the Owners and Occupiers of such Lands, have been deposited in the Office of the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Lancaster; be it therefore enacted, That the said Trustees, in making the said Lines of Road, shall not deviate more than One hundred Yards from the Lines described in the said Maps or Plans, without the Consent in Writing of the Person or Persons, or Party or Parties, or Body or Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, through whose Land such Deviation or Deviations shall be made; and the said Maps or Plans and Books of Reference shall remain in the Custody of the Clerk of the Peace for the said County of Lancaster, and the same, or any Copy or Copies

the Peace to remain there, to Inspection.

Copies thereof, shall and is and are hereby declared to be good Evidence, and shall be admitted as such, by all Judges, Justices, and others, in all Courts of Law and elsewhere.

Mistakes in Schedule or Book of Reference not to prevent the Road from being made.

XXIV. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees to make the said new Lines of Road into, through, across, or over the several Lands, Hereditaments, and Premises of any Person or Persons who is or are or may be Owner or Owners or reputed Owner or Owners of Lands, Hereditaments, or Premises over which the same is or are set out and described in the said Maps or Plans, or Schedule to this Act, as aforesaid, although such Lands, Hereditaments, or Premises, or the Name or Names of such Person or Persons, may happen to be erroneously described or omitted or mis-stated in the said Maps or Plans or Books of Reference, in case it shall appear to any Two or more Justices of the Peace for the said County, and be certified by Writing under their Hands, that such Error or Omission proceeded from Mistake, or was not wilful.

XXV. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That the Powers and Authorities given by this Act shall not extend or be construed to extend to empower or authorize the said Trustees to take, pull down, injure, or damage any Dwelling House or other Building, or to take in or make use of any Curtilage, Orchard, Garden, Yard, Park, Paddock, Lawn, Shrubbery, planted Walk or Avenue to a House, or any inclosed Ground planted or set apart as a Nursery for Trees, or any Part thereof respectively, without the Consent in Writing of the Owner or Proprietor thereof, or other Person interested therein, first had and obtained, except such as are mentioned in the Schedule to this Act.

Limiting the Period of purchasing to Five Years.

XXVI. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That in case the said Trustees shall not purchase the Buildings, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments mentioned in the Schedule to this Act annexed, within the Space of Five Years after the passing of this Act, all the Powers granted by this Act for the purchasing, taking, or using the same, or such of them as shall not have been purchased, shall cease and determine, save and except with the Consent of the Owners or Proprietors thereof for the Time being.

Bridge to be erected over Rochdale Canal.

XXVII. And whereas it will be necessary to make the said intended Diversion or new Branch of Road over and across the Rochdale Canal in the Township of Butterworth in the said County of Lancaster; be it therefore enacted, That the said Trustees shall and they are hereby required, by and out of the Tolls, Funds, or Monies to be received or raised by virtue of this Act, to erect and build a good, firm, and substantial Bridge of Stone or Brick, or both, over and across the said Canal and the Towing Path thereof, at the Point or Place denoted or shown upon or in the Map or Plan and Book of Reference deposited with the Clerk of the Peace for the said County of Lancaster, with proper and convenient Approaches to and from the same; and the Arch or Span of the said intended Bridge shall not be less than Thirty-six Feet (clear) between the Side Walls or Abutments thereof,

thereof, and the under Side of the Keystone in or the Crown of the Arch of the said Bridge shall not be less than Twelve Feet in Height above the Top-water Level of the said Canal where such Bridge shall be erected or built, and the Springers of the same Bridge shall not be less than Nine Feet in Height above the Top-water Level of the said Canal there, and the Surface of the said Bridge shall be so made or completed that the Ascent of the Road over the said Bridge shall not exceed One Foot in Thirteen Feet, and the Fence on each Side of such Bridge shall not be less than Four Feet above the Surface of the Road; and the said Trustees shall, at all Times for ever after such Bridge shall have been erected or built in manner aforesaid, keep the same Bridge, or any future Bridge to be erected in lieu thereof, (and which shall be composed of the like Materials, and be of the like Dimensions and Capacity as are herein-before directed,) in good, perfect, and complete repair.

XXVIII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That the Trustees said Trustees shall give Fourteen Days previous Notice in Writing not to obto the said Company of Proprietors, or to their Treasurer, Clerk, Struct the Navigation Engineer, or Agent for the Time being, when it shall be necessary of the Canal; for the Purposes of this Act to alter the Course of or to draw off the Water in the said Canal, and shall not in and by the Execution or Exercise of all or any of the Powers or Authorities hereby given or granted do or occasion any Obstruction, Damage, or Injury to the said Canal, or to any of the Works of or belonging thereto, or to any Boats, Barges, or other Vessels navigating therein, or obstruct, prejudice, prevent, or hinder the full and free Use and Enjoyment of the said Canal, and the Cuts or Branches communicating therewith, and the Towing Paths, Wharfs, or other Works belonging thereto, save only such as shall be unavoidable in the erecting or repairing the said Bridge.

XXIX. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That nothing herein-contained shall extend or be construed to extend to authorize viate in the or empower the said Trustees to turn, divert, alter, or make any Lands with-Part of the said Road or Branches to be repaired or amended and out Consent. made under or by virtue of the Powers of this Act over the said Rochdale Canal, or in or through the Hollingworth Reservoir, or the Plantation adjoining, or other the Lands of the said Company of Proprietors, at any other Point or Place, or in any other Line or Direction, than are respectively denoted or shown upon or in the said Map or Plan and Book of Reference so deposited with the Clerk of the Peace as aforesaid, without the express Consent and Approbation in Writing of the said Company of Proprietors, or their Committee, Treasurer, Clerk, or Engineer for the Time being, any thing to the contrary notwithstanding.

XXX. And be it further enacted, That Ditches, Drains, or Ditches, &c. Watercourses of a sufficient Depth and Breadth for keeping the said Roads dry, and conveying the Water from the same, shall be made be made and cleansed. by the said Trustees, or their Surveyor or other Officer, on the Sides of the said Roads, and also, where necessary, into or through any Fields, Lands, or Grounds adjoining to or lying near the said Roads, [Local.] 28 U (not

(not being a Yard, Garden, Orchard, Park, Paddock, planted Walk or Avenue to a House,) at the Expence of the said Trustees out of the Monies to be received by virtue of this Act; and sufficient Bridges, Arches, Culverts, Trunks, Tunnels, or Plats shall be made by the said Trustees, or their Surveyor or other Officer, where any Carriageways or Footways lead into or out of or cross the said Roads, also at the Expence of the said Trustees out of the Monies aforesaid, any Law or Statute to the contrary notwithstanding; and all such Ditches, Drains, and Watercourses, Bridges, Arches, Culverts, Trunks, Tunnels, or Plats, when made and completed by the said Trustees, shall for ever afterwards be scoured, cleansed, and kept open, repaired, and maintained by the Occupiers of the adjoining Fields, Lands, or Grounds; but all such new Bridges, Arches, Culverts, Trunks, Tunnels, and Plats as shall cross or pass in or under the said Roads, shall be scoured, cleansed, and kept open, repaired, and maintained by the said Trustees, subject to the Provisions of any Law or Statute relating to Turnpike Roads.

Public Act.

XXXI. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others, without being specially pleaded.

Term of Act.

XXXII. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall commence and take effect from the First Day of September next after the passing thereof, and shall continue and be in force for Thirty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.
