



CHAPTER xiv.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the Minister of Health relating to Leyton Plymouth Reading Rugby Joint Hospital District Scarborough and Worsley. A.D. 1924.

[14th July 1924.]

WHEREAS the Minister of Health has made the Provisional Orders set forth in the schedule hereto under the provisions of the Public Health Act 1875 and the Poor Law Amendment Act 1867: 38 & 39 Vict. c. 55.

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be confirmed by Parliament: 30 & 31 Vict. c. 106.

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. The Orders set out in the schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby confirmed and all the provisions thereof shall have full validity and force. Orders in schedule confirmed.

2. This Act may be cited as the Ministry of Health Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 2) Act 1924. Short title.

WHEREAS the Council of the Urban District of Leyton (herein-

otherwise than by agreement or any of them.

PLYMOUTH INCORPORATION.

Provisional Order for partially repealing and altering the Local Act 53 George III. Chapter 73.

Plymouth (Poor Law) Order.

WHEREAS by a Local Act (hereinafter referred to as "the Local Act") passed in the Fifty-third year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third and intituled "An Act for altering and amending Three Acts of the Sixth Year of Queen Anne the Thirty-second Year of King George the Second and the Twenty-sixth Year of His present Majesty for erecting a Workhouse in the Town and Borough of Plymouth in the County of Devon and for setting the Poor on Work and maintaining them there" the Guardians of the Poor of the Town of Plymouth (hereinafter referred to as "the Guardians") are empowered to raise and levy an annual rate (hereinafter referred to as "the Poor Rate") for employing and maintaining the poor of the Town and Borough of Plymouth;

And whereas it is enacted by Section 1 of the Local Act that except as provided by Sections 2 and 3 of that Act the

A.D. 1924. amount to be raised by the Poor Rate shall not exceed the sum of Six thousand pounds in any one year;

And whereas the Guardians have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order to alter the Local Act in the manner hereinafter set forth :

Now therefore the Minister of Health in pursuance of the powers given to him by Section 2 of the Poor Law Amendment Act 1867 and by any other Statutes in that behalf hereby orders that from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order the Local Act shall be partially repealed and altered so that the following provisions shall take effect that is to say :—

Alteration of
Section 1 of
Local Act.

1. Section 1 of the Local Act shall have effect as if the words "half-yearly and every half-year" had been inserted in the said Section instead of the words "yearly and every year" and as if the words "so as such sum or sums of money so to be" "annually raised and levied do not in all exceed the sum of" "six thousand pounds in any one year including such sum" "and sums of money as the said Guardians have a right or" "power to raise and levy by virtue of all any or either of the" "said recited Acts" and the words "so to be annually raised" "for the purposes aforesaid" were omitted from the said Section.

Repeal.

2. Sections 2 and 3 of the Local Act are hereby repealed.

3. This Order shall be deemed to effect any necessary amendment of any Local Act or Provisional Order which may be required to give effect to the provisions of this Order.

Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 9) Act 1905.*

WHEREAS by virtue of the Rugby Joint Hospital Order 1905 which was confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 9) Act 1905 (which Order and Act are hereinafter referred to respectively as "the Order of

And whereas by Article XIX. of the Order of 1905 provision is made with respect to the expenses incurred by the Joint Board and as to the manner in which those expenses shall be borne by the Constituent Authorities;

And whereas it is expedient that the Order of 1905 should be altered as hereinafter provided :

Now therefore the Minister of Health in pursuance of the powers given to him by Section 297 of the Public Health Act 1875 and by any other Statute in that behalf hereby orders that from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order the Confirming Act of 1905 so far as it relates to the Order of 1905 shall be altered in manner following that is to say :—

1. As from the Thirty-first day of March One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four the following clause shall be substituted for subdivision (2) of Article XIX. of the Order of 1905 namely :—

BOROUGH OF SCARBOROUGH.

*Provisional Order for altering the Scarborough
Improvement Act 1889.*

WHEREAS the Borough of Scarborough (hereinafter referred to as "the Borough") is an Urban District of which the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses acting by the Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") are the local authority for the purposes of the Public Health Act 1875;

And whereas there are in force in the Borough the unrepealed provisions of certain Local Acts and Provisional Orders duly confirmed by Parliament including the Scarborough Improvement Act 1889 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1889");

And whereas the Corporation are empowered by Section 260 of the Act of 1889 to levy any rate which they are for the time being authorised to make either in one sum or by instalments to be paid at such times within the financial year as they shall from time to time determine;

And whereas the Corporation are the owners of a water undertaking and levy rates and charges for the supply of water;

And whereas the Corporation have made application to the Minister of Health (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") for the issue of a Provisional Order to alter and amend the Act of 1889 in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore the Minister in pursuance of the powers given to him by Section 303 of the Public Health Act 1875 and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf hereby orders that from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order the Act of 1889 shall be altered or amended so that the following provision shall take effect that is to say:—

Discount on
rates.

1.—(1) The Corporation may if they think fit from time to time make an allowance by way of discount not exceeding five per centum on the net amount which would otherwise be payable in respect of any general district rate water rate or water charge (or of any instalment thereof) to every person who pays the same within such time after the rate or charge is demanded (or after the instalment falls due) as the Corporation shall prescribe Provided always that the percentage of such allowance shall be the same in every case.

(2) No such allowance as aforesaid shall be made to a person in respect of any hereditament unless he has paid or at the same time pays all rates (including water rates and charges) and instalments thereof then due from him either to the Corporation or to the Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Scarborough in respect of that hereditament or where two or more hereditaments are included in one demand note in respect of all such hereditaments.

(3) Notice of the effect of this Article shall be endorsed upon every demand note for a rate or water charge. A.D. 1924.

2. Where under Section 69 of the Act of 1889 water rates or charges are payable by the owner but are in the first instance recovered by the Corporation from the occupier the sum which the occupier is empowered to deduct from rent under the said Section shall be reduced by the amount of any discount allowed by the Corporation under Article 1 hereof. *Scarborough Order.*

3. This Order may be cited as the Scarborough Order 1924. Short title.

And whereas by several Orders made by the Local Government Board the Minister of Health and the Minister of Transport under Section 1 of the Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act 1915 the period so limited stands extended to the Fifteenth day of August One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four;

And whereas the Corporation have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order to amend the Local Act in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore the Minister of Health in pursuance of the powers given to him by Section 303 of the Public Health Act 1875 and by any other Statutes in that behalf hereby orders that
