## CHAPTER xv.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the Minister of Health relating to Cambridge Darwen Hyde Middlesex Districts Joint Small-pox Hospital District Portsmouth and Stoke-on-Trent. [14th July 1924.]

WHEREAS the Minister of Health has made the Provisional Orders set forth in the schedule hereto under the provisions of the Public Health Act 1875 :

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be confirmed by Parliament :

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows :—

1. The Orders set out in the schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby confirmed and all the provisions thereof shall have full validity and force.

WHEREAS the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Cambridge (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") acting by the Council as the local authority for that Borough for the purposes of the Public Health Act 1875 require to purchase and take the lands described in the Schedule hereto for the purposes of widening opening enlarging or otherwise improving the streets known as Coe Fen Lane East Road and Park Side in the said Borough :

Now therefore the Minister of Health in pursuance of the powers given to him by Section 176 of the Public Health Act 1875 and by any other Statutes in that behalf hereby orders that from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order the following provisions shall have effect that is to say :—

The Corporation shall be empowered for the purposes aforesaid to put in force with reference to the lands described in the Schedule hereto (subject to the continuance of existing public rights of highway if any) the powers of the Lands Clauses Acts as modified by the Acquisition of Land (Assessment of Compensation) Act 1919 with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement or any of them.

**BOROUGH OF HYDE.**

*Provisional Order for partially repealing altering and amending certain Local Acts.* *Hyde Order.*

WHEREAS the Borough of Hyde is an urban district of which the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses acting by the Council are the local authority for the purposes of the Public Health Act 1875 and the Borough is co-extensive with the Parish of Hyde;

And whereas there are in force in the Borough the unrepealed provisions of the Hyde Local Board (Waterworks) Act 1870 and the Hyde Corporation Act 1903 as altered by the Hyde Order 1912 and by other Provisional Orders duly confirmed by Parliament;

And whereas by Part XV. of the Hyde Corporation Act 1903 provision was made as to the collection of poor rates general district rates and water rates or rents within the Borough;

And whereas it is proposed that the district fund and general district rate of the Borough should be abolished and that all the expenses of the Corporation should be defrayed out of the borough rate levied under the Municipal Corporations Act 1882 and the borough fund mentioned in that Act;

And whereas the Corporation have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order partially to repeal alter or amend the Local Acts in force in the Borough in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore the Minister of Health in pursuance of the powers given to him by Section 303 of the Public Health Act 1875 and of any other power in that behalf hereby orders that from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order the Local Acts shall be partially repealed altered and amended so that the following provisions shall take effect that is to say:—

Short title  
and com-  
mencement.

1. This Order may be cited as the Hyde (Rates) Order 1924 and shall come into operation on the First day of April Nineteen hundred and twenty-five.

Interpreta-  
tion.

2. In this Order unless the context otherwise requires—

“The Act of 1870” means the Hyde Local Board (Waterworks) Act 1870 and “the Act of 1903” means the Hyde Corporation Act 1903;

“The Borough” means the Borough of Hyde;

“The commencement of this Order” means the first day of April Nineteen hundred and twenty-five;

“The Corporation” means the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough acting by the Council thereof;

“The Overseers” means the Overseers of the Parish of Hyde;

“The Parish” means the Parish of Hyde;

“Borough rate” when used in relation to a rate made by the Overseers means any rate made together with the poor rate for the purpose of satisfying a precept of the Corporation for contributions to the borough fund of the Borough or any separate rate made for that purpose.

3.—(1) All expenses of the Corporation which if this Order had not been made would have been payable out of the district fund and general district rate of the Borough shall be charged on and defrayed out of the borough fund and the borough rate

of the Borough and any reference to the district fund or general district rate in any Local Act or Provisional Order in force in the Borough shall be deemed to be a reference to the borough fund or borough rate of the Borough. A.D. 1924.

(2) The district fund of the Borough shall be closed and any balance which on the Thirty-first day of March Nineteen hundred and twenty-five is standing to the credit or to the debit of the said fund shall from and after that day be transferred to the credit or the debit (as the case may be) of the borough fund of the Borough and any moneys owing to the Corporation in respect of or in connection with the general district rate shall continue to be payable to and recoverable by the Corporation as if this Order had not been made and when received by the Corporation shall be carried to the credit of the borough fund.

(3) Nothing in this Order shall prejudice or affect any mortgage or other security which immediately before the commencement of this Order operates as a charge on the district fund and general district rate of the Borough in respect of moneys borrowed by the Corporation or the powers of any person entitled under any such mortgage or other security to enforce the same as if this Order had not been made and where for any such purpose it is necessary to continue the exercise of a power which would have existed but for this Order the power may continue to be exercised as if this Order had not been made.

4.—(1) The following provisions shall have effect with respect to any borough rate made after the commencement of this Order by the Overseers that is to say— Assessment  
of certain

rate.

(a) Subject to the provisions of this Article the owner of any tithes or of any tithe commutation rentcharge or the occupier of any other hereditament mentioned in the Schedule to this Order shall be assessed to the borough rate in respect of such hereditament on the full rateable value thereof but shall be liable to pay in each year fifty-four per centum only of the rate in the pound payable in respect of hereditaments not mentioned in the Schedule to this Order:

(b) During the continuance of the Agricultural Rates Acts 1896 and 1923 the occupier of any agricultural land within the meaning of those Acts shall be assessed to the borough rate in respect of such land on the full rateable value thereof but shall be liable to pay in each year twenty-five per centum only of the rate in the pound payable in respect of hereditaments not mentioned in the Schedule to this Order;

Provided that on the expiration of the Agricultural Rates Act 1923 thirty-five per centum shall during the

continuance of the Agricultural Rates Act 1896 be substituted for twenty-five per centum in the preceding provision of this Article :

(c) During the continuance of the Tithe Rentcharge (Rates) Act 1899 the owner of tithe rentcharge attached to a benefice shall under that Act be liable to pay thirty-five fifty-fourths of the amount of the borough rate assessed on him as owner of the tithe rentcharge and the remaining nineteen fifty-fourths thereof shall on demand being made by the collector of the rate on the surveyor of taxes for the Borough or any district therein be paid by the Commissioners of Inland Revenue out of the sums payable by them to the Local Taxation Account on account of the estate duty grant.

(2) Nothing in this Order shall affect the operation of the Ecclesiastical Tithe Rentcharges (Rates) Acts 1920 and 1922.

(3) Nothing in this Order shall affect the share of the annual grant payable under the Agricultural Rates Act 1896 to any spending authority or save as expressly provided in this Order the operation of that Act.

(4) Nothing in this Order shall affect the operation of the Agricultural Rates Act 1923 or the power of the Minister of Health to estimate as respects each half-year after the commencement of this Order the amount of the deficiency which would have arisen by reason of Section 1 of that Act if this Order had not been made in the produce of any precept of the Corporation for the purpose of the issue from the Local Taxation Account of the share of the Corporation in the additional annual grant under that Act.

5.—(1) For the purpose of satisfying a precept of the Corporation for the levy and collection of a borough rate the Overseers shall levy and collect the sums demanded by the Corporation together with the poor rate of the Parish or in the event of the issue by the Corporation of a supplementary precept for a further contribution to the borough rate the Overseers shall levy a separate rate on the Parish for which the Overseers shall have all the powers vested in them with respect to a poor rate of the Parish.

(2) Subsections (2) to (9) of Section 146 of the Municipal Corporations Act 1882 and Section 147 of that Act (which enactments provide for appeals against borough rates for the collection of such rates for the rating of owners and other matters) shall extend to any rate made by the Overseers under this Article.

6. For the purposes of Section 133 of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act 1845 the borough rate for any one year levied in the Parish shall to the extent of forty per centum thereof be deemed to be poor's rate within the meaning of that section.

8.—(1) Any water rate or water rent payable to the Corporation may be included with the borough rate and poor rate (but distinguished therefrom) in any book or books of account and in one demand note.

9.—(1) Subsection (3) of Section 146 of the Act of 1903 shall be altered so as to provide that William Oldham shall retire from the offices now held by him of chief assistant overseer of the Parish and rate collector of the Borough on the Thirty-first day of March Nineteen hundred and twenty-six or on such later day as may from time to time be prescribed by agreement between William Oldham and the Corporation :

(2) Upon the retirement of William Oldham from the said offices the Corporation shall pay William Oldham the sum of five hundred pounds and he shall be entitled to receive from the Corporation a superannuation allowance during life at the rate of two hundred pounds a year.
