

**CHAPTER xliii.**

An Act to unite the Hackney College Foundation and the New College London Foundation in one corporation to be called Hackney and New College and for other purposes. A.D. 1924.

[14th July 1924.]

WHEREAS the governors of the Hackney College Foundation Registered being the governing body of the Hackney College Foundation (which is a foundation comprising the educational endowment as determined by an order of the Charity Commissioners of the twenty-seventh day of July nineteen hundred and six of the charity formerly known as the Village Itinerancy or Evangelical Association for the Propagation of the Gospel but now called Hackney College founded by deed poll dated the first day of May eighteen hundred and eleven) are incorporated under a certificate of the Board of Education dated the fourth day of May nineteen hundred and fifteen and all real and personal property of the Hackney College Foundation (other than property held by the official trustees of charitable funds) is by the said certificate vested in the said governors as a body corporate:

And whereas under an order made by the Charity Commissioners on the eighteenth day of January nineteen hundred and sixteen the said charity and the endowments thereof with the exception of the Hackney College Foundation comprised in the said order of the twenty-seventh day of July nineteen hundred and six are administered and managed by the said governors as the

A.D. 1924. trustees of the charity and all freehold and leasehold lands belonging to or held in trust for the said charity are vested in the said governors for all the estate and interest therein belonging to or held in trust for the said charity :

And whereas the governors of New College London Registered being the governing body of the New College London Foundation regulated by an indenture dated the tenth day of December eighteen hundred and twenty-nine made between Thomas Wilson of the one part and the Reverend Henry Forster Burder and others of the other part and therein called Highbury College but now known as New College London are incorporated under a certificate of the Board of Education dated the tenth day of November nineteen hundred and sixteen and all real and personal property of the New College London Foundation is by the said certificate vested in the said last-named governors as a body corporate :

And whereas under an order made by the Charity Commissioners on the thirtieth day of March nineteen hundred and seventeen the charities of Joshua Wilson and Matthew Witton and the endowments thereof (held in connexion with New College London) are administered and managed by the said last-named governors as the trustees of the said charities and the sums of stock of which the said endowments consist were directed by the said last-named order of the Charity Commissioners to be transferred into the name of the official trustees of charitable funds :

And whereas the religious doctrines which the said two foundations are by their constitutions required to promulgate are substantially identical although differently expressed and the objects of the College as set forth in this Act are in all essentials consistent with such doctrines :

And whereas the governors of the said two foundations with the concurrence of the members of and subscribers to the said two foundations expressed at special meetings called for the purpose and held on the fourteenth day of March nineteen hundred and twenty-three and the twentieth day of March nineteen hundred and twenty-three respectively have agreed that the said two foundations should be united to form one corporation under the name of Hackney and New College :

And whereas it is expedient that the said two foundations should be united to form one corporation

under the said name of Hackney and New College and that the said deed poll of the first day of May eighteen hundred and eleven and indenture of the tenth day of December eighteen hundred and twenty-nine and the said certificates of the Board of Education be revoked :

And whereas the purposes aforesaid cannot be effected without the authority of Parliament :

May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows (that is to say) :—

1. This Act may be cited as the Hackney and New College Act 1924. Short title.

2. In this Act unless the context otherwise requires— Definitions.

The expression "the College" means Hackney and New College as incorporated by this Act;

The expression "the members" means the members of the College;

The expression "the Board of Governors" means the Board of Governors of the College;

The expression "Hackney College" means the Hackney College Foundation;

The expression "New College" means the New College London Foundation.

3. The persons at the date of the passing of this Act holding office as the governors of Hackney College and the persons who are at that date annual subscribers or subscribers for life to Hackney College and the persons at the said date holding office as governors of New College and the persons who are at the said date annual subscribers or life subscribers to New College and all persons who shall for the time being be members or life members of the College incorporated by this Act are hereby constituted and henceforth shall be one body corporate by the name of "Hackney and New College" for such objects and purposes as in this Act appear and by the same name shall have perpetual succession and a common seal and may by and in the same name sue or be sued in any court or place of judicature within Great Britain and

4.—(1) On and from the date of the passing of this
Act—

(a) the real and personal property belonging to or held by or held in trust for or in connexion with Hackney College (including the real and personal property held by the governors of Hackney College in trust for non-educational purposes) and New College respectively which property is included in the First Schedule to this Act or belonging to or held by or held in trust for any charity subsidiary or ancillary to either of the said foundations (other than property held by the official trustees of charitable funds) shall by virtue of this Act without any conveyance or other instrument be transferred to and vest in the College and the College (without licence in mortmain) may hold the said property in perpetuity or otherwise and may acquire and hold in perpetuity or otherwise any other real and personal estate and chattels real of whatsoever tenure which the College shall think it desirable to acquire or hold for the use or for the purposes of the College or in connexion therewith and with a view to the future advantage thereof Provided that the property set out in Part IV. of the said Schedule and held in trust for bodies other than the College shall be held by the College and administered by them in accordance with the trusts relating thereto respectively as existing at the date of the passing of this Act And the College shall be capable in law (but subject to any such consent as may by law be required) to grant sell exchange mortgage let on lease or otherwise dispose of or assure or in any way deal with all or any of the real estate and chattels real and personal property belonging to the College (but as regards any property held in trust for bodies other than the College only in accordance with the trusts relating thereto respectively) and all persons and corporations otherwise competent thereto may assure in perpetuity or otherwise or demise to or for the

benefit of the College any lands tenements and hereditaments Provided that as regards endowments within the jurisdiction of the Charity Commissioners or the Board of Education none of the powers of disposition given by this paragraph of this subsection shall be exercised without the approval of the Charity Commissioners or the Board of Education as the case may be;

- (b) the property now held both for educational and non-educational purposes by the official trustees of charitable funds for or in connexion with Hackney College or for or in connexion with New College (including the property set out in the Seccnd Schedule to this Act) shall be held by the said trustees for or in connexion with the College Provided that the property set out in Part IV. of the said Second Schedule held by the said trustees in trust for bodies other than the College shall be held by the said trustees in accordance with the trusts relating to such property respectively as existing at the date of the passing of this Act;
- (c) the provisions of the said orders of the Charity Commissioners of the eighteenth day of January nineteen hundred and sixteen and the thirtieth day of March nineteen hundred and seventeen or of any orders amending those orders respectively shall continue to apply to the properties referred to therein respectively except that they shall be administered and managed subject to the provisions of the section of this Act of which the marginal note is "Revocation of deeds and of orders of Board of Education" by the governors of the College instead of by the governors of Hackney College and the governors of New College.

(2) In place of the stamp duties payable in respect of the transfer of property effected by this section there shall be levied and raised for the use of His Majesty a stamp duty of five pounds which shall be impressed upon a King's printer's copy of this Act and the College shall produce the stamped copy to the Commissioners of Inland Revenue within six months after the passing of

A.D. 1924. — this Act and in default of such production the said duty with interest thereon at the rate of five pounds per centum per annum from the passing of this Act until payment shall be a debt due to His Majesty from the College.

5. Any bequest or gift contained in the will or in a codicil to the will of any person having died before or dying after the passing of this Act or in a deed whether executed before or after the passing of this Act in favour of or directed to be administered by or in connexion with either Hackney College or New College or a charity subsidiary or ancillary to either of the said colleges whether for educational or non-educational purposes shall take effect in favour of or be administered by or in connexion with the College.

6. In any case where by the will or a codicil to the will of any person having died before or dying after the passing of this Act or by any deed whether executed before or after the passing of this Act any bequest or gift has been or shall be made in favour of or directed to be administered by or in connexion with either Hackney College or New College or a charity subsidiary or ancillary to either of the said colleges whether for educational or non-educational purposes and the legal personal representatives of such person or any trustees in whom such bequest is vested are unable for any reason to obtain the receipt for such bequest of any person whose receipt is an effectual discharge for the same the receipt of the treasurer or the secretary of the college shall be an effectual discharge to such legal personal representatives or trustees as aforesaid (as the case may be) and shall exonerate them from being concerned to see to the application of such bequest and from being answerable for the misapplication or non-application thereof.

Objects of
the College.

7.—(1) The objects of the College shall be first the training of men and women for the Christian ministry especially in churches belonging to the Congregational order and secondly the propagation of the Gospel in general accordance with the principles and doctrines for the time being accepted by Congregationalists.

(2) The object of the non-educational Hackney College Charity comprised in the said order of the Charity

Commissioners of the eighteenth day of January nineteen hundred and sixteen shall be the propagation of the Gospel in general accordance with the said principles and doctrines. A.D. 1924.

8.—(1) Every person who at the date of the passing of this Act shall be an annual subscriber to Hackney College or to New College shall be a member of the College during the currency of such annual subscription and every person who shall be a subscriber for life to Hackney College or a life subscriber to New College shall be a life member of the College. Members of College.

(2) Every person who shall annually subscribe or pay to the College the sum of one guinea at the least to be applied to promoting the objects of the College shall during the currency of such annual subscription be a member of the College and the minister or duly appointed representative of every church or society contributing not less than one guinea annually to the College to be applied as aforesaid shall also be a member of the College during the currency of such annual contribution.

(3) Every person who shall make one payment of ten guineas at the least to the College to be applied as aforesaid shall be a life member of the College.

9. The College shall be governed by a board of governors consisting of at least twenty-four members of the College together with the treasurer the secretary the principal the professors and the warden of the College. Provided that until the first appointment of a board of governors under the provisions of this Act the College shall be governed by the persons who at the date of the passing of this Act are the governors of Hackney College and the governors of New College. Government of College.

10. A general meeting of the members for the time being (in this Act called "the first general meeting") shall take place within three months after the passing of this Act at such time and place as the governors of Hackney College and the governors of New College shall jointly appoint and thereafter an annual general meeting of the members for the time being shall take place in every year at such time and Meetings of members.

A.D. 1924. — place as the Board of Governors shall appoint An extraordinary general meeting of the members may be convened at any time by the Board of Governors at their discretion at such place as the Board of Governors may appoint.

11. The Board of Governors shall be appointed by the members at the first general meeting and thereafter from time to time at any annual general meeting and the members may at the first general meeting and thereafter at any annual general meeting make rules for the appointment of governors and for fixing the period during which a governor shall hold office At least fourteen days' notice in writing specifying the nature of such rules shall be given to every member by letter properly addressed prepaid and posted to him at his last known place of abode of any meeting at which such rules are to be proposed.

Powers of
Board of

12. The Board of Governors shall have full power—

- (1) To receive and apply the balances of all moneys and property transferred to the College from the governors of Hackney College and the governors of New College and from the trustees of any property held on behalf of or in connexion with Hackney College or New College and to receive and apply all moneys and property of the College and to manage all the concerns of the College at their discretion and to receive and apply all moneys paid to them on behalf of bodies other than the College referred to in the section of this Act of which the marginal note is "Transfer of property and acquisition and sale of land" Provided that in the application of the said moneys and property strict regard shall be had to the several objects and purposes indicated in the headings of Parts I. II. and III. respectively of the First and Second Schedules to this Act as applying to the moneys and property included thereunder respectively and that money or property now applied to scholarships or to the Drew Lecture shall not be diverted to any other purpose Provided further that all

moneys and property transferred or paid to the College in trust for or on behalf of bodies other than the College shall be applied by the Board of Governors in accordance with the trusts relating to such moneys and property respectively;

- (2) Subject to the provisions of the section of this Act of which the marginal note is "Principal and others" to appoint and to remove the principal the professors the warden and the tutors and the treasurer and the secretary of the College and all other officers and servants whom they shall deem necessary for the promotion of the objects of the College;
- (3) To appoint or approve the appointment of ministers to officiate in any places of worship held by the College in trust for non-educational purposes; and
- (4) To admit men and women as students to the College under such regulations as the said Board may make from time to time Provided that such students at the time of their admission shall be members of a Christian church.

13. To constitute a legal meeting of the Board of Governors seven governors at least shall be present at the meeting and no acts or directions except an appointment of the time and place for the next meeting of the Board of Governors shall be valid unless seven governors be present when such acts are done or such directions are given and the acts and directions of the majority of the governors present at any meeting whereat seven or more governors are present shall be valid and effectual An entry in a book of minutes of the proceedings of the said governors signed by the chairman at the next or a subsequent meeting of the said governors recording that any act has been done or direction given shall be conclusive evidence thereof.

Quorum of meetings of governors.

14. The first principal professors warden and tutors of the College shall be the persons who at the passing of this Act hold the respective offices of principal professors warden and tutors of Hackney College and New College.

15. The principal the professors the warden and the tutors of the College and all ministers appointed or approved by the Board of Governors to officiate in any places of worship belonging to the College shall discharge their respective duties in general accordance with the principles and doctrines for the time being accepted by Congregationalists.

Byelaws &c.

16.—(1) The members may make such byelaws rules and orders for the regulation of their meetings and proceedings and for better conducting the affairs of the College and effecting the objects thereof as they may from time to time deem expedient and may from time to time repeal or vary any byelaws rules and orders so made.

(2) Such byelaws rules and orders may be made repealed or varied at any annual general meeting or at any extraordinary general meeting provided that fourteen days' notice in writing of such meeting specifying the nature of the byelaws rules or orders or of the repeal or variation thereof shall be given to every member by letter properly addressed prepaid and posted to him at his last known place of abode.

(3) The Board of Governors may make such rules for the regulation of their meetings and proceedings and with regard to the officers and servants of the College and for the conduct of all matters with which they have power to deal as they may from time to time deem expedient and may from time to time repeal or vary any rules so made.

(4) Any rules referred to in subsection (3) of this section and any repeal or variation thereof may be made at any meeting of the Board of Governors provided that fourteen days' notice of such meeting specifying the nature of the rules or of the repeal or variation thereof shall be given to every governor by letter properly addressed prepaid and posted to him at his last known place of abode.

(5) No byelaws rules or orders made under the powers of this section shall contravene or violate the objects of the College as set forth in the section of this Act of which the marginal note is "Objects of the College" nor permit nor tend to permit any appropriation of any of the real or personal estate of the College to

any other objects than those set forth in the said section. A.D. 1924.

17. As from the date of the passing of this Act the said deed poll of the first day of May eighteen hundred and eleven and the said deed of the tenth day of December eighteen hundred and twenty-nine and the said certificates of the Board of Education dated respectively the fourth day of May nineteen hundred and fifteen and the tenth day of November nineteen hundred and sixteen are hereby revoked and rendered null and void without prejudice to anything done or suffered thereunder respectively and the trust deeds of any places of worship or other properties held by the governors of Hackney College in trust at the date of the passing of this Act whereby trusts are declared by reference to the said deed poll shall thereafter be construed as though they referred to this Act instead of to the said deed poll. Revocation of deeds and of orders of Board of Education.

18. From and after the transfer of the property and powers of the governors of Hackney College and New College or of any trustees of property held on behalf of the said Colleges or either of them to the College the said governors and trustees respectively shall be released and discharged from all duties payments and liabilities in respect of the said Colleges or trusts or of the management thereof or in anywise relating thereto. Saving for governors of Hackney College and New College.

19. The College may by resolution of the annual meeting of the members unite or amalgamate with any other college or society upon such terms and conditions as the College by a resolution of the said annual meeting may determine or may by like resolution change the name of the College whether in connexion with any such amalgamation or not Provided that every resolution to which this section refers shall be carried in one year by the votes of not less than three-fourths of the members present and voting on the resolution and confirmed in the next subsequent year by a resolution of the annual meeting of the members similarly carried Provided also that the objects of the College as set forth in the section of this Act of which the marginal note is "Objects of the College" shall not be varied by any such union or amalgamation. Amalgamation with other colleges and change of name.

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Schemes.

20. Nothing in this Act shall take away abridge or affect any power or jurisdiction of the Charity Commissioners or Board of Education who may deal with modify or vary any of the provisions of this Act relating to or affecting any charity (educational or otherwise as the case may be) whether already dealt with by a scheme of the Charity Commissioners or Board of Education or not by a scheme in the exercise of their ordinary jurisdiction as if those provisions had been contained in a scheme of the Charity Commissioners or so far as they affect educational charities of the Board of Education. Provided that nothing in this section contained shall take away abridge or affect any exemption from the operation of the Charitable Trusts Acts 1853 to 1914 conferred upon any charity by the said Acts or by any of them.

Costs of Act.

21. The costs charges and expenses preliminary to and of and incidental to preparing obtaining and passing this Act or otherwise in relation thereto shall be borne and paid as to one-half thereof by and out of the general funds of Hackney College and as to the other half thereof by and out of the general funds of New College.
