CHAPTER liv.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the A.D. 1928. Minister of Health relating to Amman Valley Joint Sewerage District Barry Bury Leicester Loughborough and Rugby. [3rd August 1928.]

HEREAS the Minister of Health has made the Provisional Orders set forth in the schedule hereto under the provisions of the Public Health Act 38 & 39 Vict. 1875: c. 55.

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

- 1. The Orders set out in the schedule hereto shall Orders in be and the same are hereby confirmed and all the schedule provisions thereof shall have full validity and force. confirmed.
- 2. This Act may be cited as the Ministry of Health Short title. Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 7) Act 1928.

SCHEDULE.

AMMAN VALLEY JOINT SEWERAGE DISTRICT.

Amman Valley Order. Provisional Order for altering a Confirming Act.

WHEREAS by virtue of the Amman Valley Joint Sewerage Order 1914 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order of 1914") which was confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 15) Act 1914 the Urban Districts of Ammanford and Cwmamman and parts of the Rural Districts of Llandilo Fawr and Pontardawe constitute the Amman Valley Joint Sewerage District (hereinafter referred to as "the United District") of which the governing body is the Amman Valley Joint Sewerage Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Joint Board");

And whereas by virtue of the Order of 1914 the Joint Board consists of two ex-officio members and of twelve members elected by the Councils of the above-named Urban and Rural Districts (each of which Councils is hereinafter referred to as a "Constituent Authority");

And whereas it is expedient that the contributory place of Llandebie in the Rural District of Llandilo Fawr should be included in the United District and that the Order of 1914 should be altered as hereinafter provided:

Now therefore the Minister of Health in pursuance of the powers given to him by Section 297 of the Public Health Act 1875 and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf hereby orders that from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order the Order of 1914 shall be altered so that the following provisions shall take effect that is to say:—

Extension of United District.

1. The United District shall be extended so as to include the contributory place of Llandebie in the Rural District of Llandilo Fawr and references in the Order of 1914 to the Constituent Districts shall be deemed to include that contributory place.

Increase in number of elective members of Joint Board. 2. The number of elective members on the Joint Board shall be increased from twelve to fourteen and the two additional members shall be elected by the Rural District Council of Llandilo Fawr whose representation on the Joint Board shall be increased from two to four members.

3. The provisions of Article XI of the Order of 1914 shall apply to the first election by the Rural District Council of Llandilo Fawr of the two additional elective members to represent that Council on the Joint Board as if the election related to the filling of vacancies occurring at the date of confirmation of this Order.

AmmanValleyOrder. First election of additional elective members.

4. For the purposes of the Order of 1914 as amended by this Definition of Order the expression "the Amman Valley drainage areas" shall be deemed to mean in addition to the areas mentioned in paragraph (8) of Article 1 of the Order of 1914 such part or parts of the contributory place of Llandebie as are reasonably capable of being drained into the existing sewers of the Joint Board.

Amman Valley drainage areas.

5. This Order may be cited as the Amman Valley Joint Short title. Sewerage Order 1928.

URBAN DISTRICT OF BARRY.

Provisional Order for altering and amending a Local Act.

Barry Order.

WHEREAS the Urban District Council of Barry (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") are the local authority within the meaning of the Public Health Act 1875 for the Urban District of Barry (hereinafter referred to as "the District") and there are in force in the District the unrepealed provisions of the Barry Urban District Council Act 1913 (hereinafter referred to as "the Local Act");

And whereas the Council carry on a water undertaking and supply water within certain limits (hereinafter referred to as "the limits of supply") and by Sections 17 18 and 25 of the Local Act the rates which the Council are authorised to charge for the supply of water are prescribed;

And whereas the Council have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order to alter and amend the Local Act in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore the Minister of Health in pursuance of the powers given to him by Section 303 of the Public Health Act 1875 and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf hereby

orders that the Local Act shall be altered and amended in manner following:—

Barry

water.

1.—(1) The provisions of Sections 17 and 25 of the Local Act are hereby altered so as to authorise the Council to charge for a sufficient supply of water for domestic purposes and in respect of waterclosets and fixed baths and for a supply of water by measure respectively rates sums and prices not exceeding by more than one hundred per centum the corresponding rates sums and prices prescribed by the said Sections:

Provided that the Council shall not under the powers conferred upon them by this Order charge for a supply of water such rates sums and prices as will be more than sufficient so far as can be estimated by the Council before the commencement of the period for which the said rates sums and prices are charged to enable the undertaking to be carried on without loss during that period.

(2) Section 18 of the Local Act shall be altered by the substitution for the words "not exceeding twenty shillings per annum" of the words "not exceeding thirty shillings per annum."

Power of Minister of Health to vary rates &c. for a supply of water.

- 2.—(1) The Minister of Health on the application of the Council or of a local authority having jurisdiction within the limits of supply or of twenty consumers within those limits may from time to time by order vary the rates sums and prices for the supply of water which the Council are by this Order authorised to charge.
- (2) The Council shall as soon as practicable after an order is made in pursuance of subdivision (1) of this Article cause the order to be published in two successive weeks in one or more local newspapers circulating throughout the area included in the limits of supply and the order shall come into operation on the quarter day next following the date of the last of the said publications.

Inquiries by Minister of Health.

- 3.—(1) The Minister of Health may direct any inquiries to be held by his inspectors which he may deem necessary with reference to the purposes of this Order and such inspectors shall for the purposes of any inquiry have all such powers as they have for the purposes of inquiries directed by the Minister under the Public Health Act 1875.
- (2) Where the Minister of Health causes any such inquiry to be held with reference to any of the purposes of this Order the costs incurred by the Minister in relation to that inquiry (including such sum not exceeding five guineas a day as the Minister may determine for the services of any inspector engaged in the inquiry) shall be paid by the Council and the Minister may certify the amount of the costs so incurred and any sum

so certified and directed by the Minister to be paid by the Council shall be a debt due to the Crown from the Council.

Provisional Order for altering a Local Act and a Confirming Act.

 $Bury \ Order \ (No.~2).$

WHEREAS the Borough of Bury (hereinafter referred to as "the Borough") is an Urban Sanitary District of which the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses acting by the Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") are the Local Authority for the purposes of the Public Health Act 1875 and the unrepealed provisions of the Bury Corporation Act 1909 (hereinafter referred to as "the Local Act") and the Bury Order 1925 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order of 1925") which was confirmed by the Ministry of Health Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 6) Act 1925 are in force in the Borough;

And whereas in pursuance of the provisions of the Order of 1925 the Corporation have acquired certain lands situate in the Borough for the purposes of street improvement and parts of the said lands are not required by the Corporation for such purposes;

And whereas by Section 117 of the Local Act the Corporation are empowered to retain hold and use or to sell lease or otherwise dispose of in such manner and for such consideration and purpose as they shall think fit any lands acquired by them under that Act or any other local Act for the time being in force in the Borough;

And whereas the Corporation have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order to alter or amend the Local Act in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore the Minister of Health in pursuance of the powers given to him by Section 303 of the Public Health Act. 1875 and by any other Statutes in that behalf hereby orders

Bury Order (No. 2). Power to develop lands &c. that from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order the Local Act shall be amended as follows:—

1.—(1) The Corporation may lay out and develop any lands acquired by them for the purposes of street improvement in pursuance of the provisions of the Order of 1925 and not required for those purposes or (with the consent of the Minister of Health) any other lands acquired by the Corporation for purposes of street improvement under any Act or Order and not required for the purposes for which they were acquired and may thereon erect and maintain shops offices warehouses and other like buildings and may sell lease exchange or otherwise dispose of any such shops offices warehouses or buildings upon and subject to such terms conditions and restrictions as they may think fit.

(2) Section 117 of the Local Act shall apply to any such lands as aforesaid notwithstanding that such lands were not acquired by the Corporation under the provisions of that Act

or a local Act:

Provided that the Corporation shall not without the consent of the Minister of Health sell lease exchange or otherwise dispose of any such lands or any interests therein at a price or rent or for a consideration of a value less than the current market value of such lands or interests but a purchaser or lessee shall not be concerned to inquire whether the consent of the Minister is necessary or has been obtained.

(3) The Corporation may enter into and carry into effect agreements and arrangements with the owners of or other persons interested in any lands or buildings which may have been or which may be acquired under the provisions of the Order of 1925 or with the owners or other persons interested in any other lands or buildings which the Corporation are authorised by local Act or Provisional Order to acquire for the purposes of street improvement with respect to the reinstatement of any such owners or other persons and with respect to the exchange of lands for that purpose and the Corporation may pay or receive money for equality of exchange.

Borrowing powers.

2. The purposes of this Order shall be deemed to be purposes of the Local Act for which the Corporation with the consent of the Minister of Health may borrow money under subsection (5) of Section 216 of that Act.

Inquiries and expenses.

- 3.—(1) Section 303 of the Local Act shall be repealed.
- (2) The Minister of Health may direct any inquiries to be held by his inspectors which he may deem necessary with reference to the purposes of this Order and of the Local Act and such inspectors shall for the purposes of any inquiry have all such powers as they have for the purpose of inquiries directed by the Minister under the Public Health Act 1875.
- (3) Where the Minister of Health causes any such inquiry to be held with reference to any of the purposes of this Order or

of the Local Act the costs incurred by the Minister in relation to that inquiry (including such sum not exceeding five guineas a day as the Minister may determine for the services of any inspector or officer of the Minister engaged in the inquiry) shall be paid by the Corporation and the Minister may certify the amount of the costs so incurred and any sum so certified and directed by the Minister to be paid by the Corporation shall be a debt due to the Crown from the Corporation.

URBAN DISTRICT OF RUGBY.

Rugby Order.

Provisional Order for altering and amending certain Local Acts.

WHEREAS the Urban District Council of Rugby (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") are the local authority within the meaning of the Public Health Act 1875 for the Urban District of Rugby (hereinafter referred to as "the District") and the unrepealed provisions of the Rugby Waterworks Act 1863 the Rugby Water and Improvement Act 1901 and the Rugby Urban District Council Act 1923 (each of which Acts is hereinafter referred to as the Act of the year in which it was passed and which Acts are hereinafter referred to collectively as "the Local Acts") are in force in the district;

And whereas under the Local Acts the Council carry on a water undertaking and supply water within the District and certain other areas;

And whereas by Section 13 of the Act of 1923 a period of five years from the Thirty-first day of July One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three was limited for the completion of the works authorised by that Act;

And whereas the Council have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order to alter or amend the Local Acts in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore the Minister of Health in pursuance of the powers given to him by Section 303 of the Public Health Act 1875 and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf hereby orders that from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order the Local Act shall be partially repealed altered and amended so that the following provisions shall take effect that is to say:—

- Extension of time for completion of works.

 Council to connect communication pipe with mains.
- 1. Section 13 (Period for completion of works) of the Act of 1923 shall have effect as if the words "seven years" had been inserted therein instead of the words "five years."
- 2. Notwithstanding anything contained in any Act relating to the Council the Council shall have the exclusive right of executing any works on any of the water mains of the Council for connecting any communication or service pipe therewith and the Council shall on the request of the owner or occupier of any premises who is entitled to be supplied with water by the Council execute on any such main any work which shall be necessary to connect the communication or service pipe of such owner or

occupier therewith but subject to any obligations of such owner or occupier in relation to the execution of such work and any expenses incurred by the Council in so doing shall be paid to the Council by the owner or occupier so requesting and shall be recoverable summarily as a civil debt.

3. If the owner of any house supplied with water by the Provision of Council when so required in pursuance of Section 31 (Council not bound to supply several houses by one pipe) of the Act of 1901 fails within a period of one month after the receipt of such requirement to provide a separate pipe from the main pipe into such house the Council may themselves do the work necessary in that behalf and may recover from such owner the cost incurred by them in so doing summarily as a civil debt.

5. This Order may be cited as the Rugby Order 1928 and Short title. the Rugby Acts 1863 to 1923 and this Order may be cited together as the Rugby Acts and Orders 1863 to 1928.
