

**CHAPTER i.**

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order under the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1899 relating to Coatbridge Drainage. A.D. 1928.

[28th November 1928.]

WHEREAS the Provisional Order set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed has been made by one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State under the provisions of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1899 as read with the Secretaries of State Act 1926 and it is requisite that the said Order should be confirmed by Parliament: 62 & 63 Vict.
c. 47.
16 & 17
Geo. 5. c. 18.

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

SCHEDULE.

COATBRIDGE DRAINAGE.

Provisional Order to extend the time for the completion of certain works authorised by the Coatbridge Drainage and Burgh Extension Order 1914 to sanction and confirm the construction of a certain work by the Coatbridge Town Council and to sanction the expenditure of money thereon to make provision with respect to assessments which the Town Council may levy and for other purposes.

WHEREAS by the Coatbridge Drainage and Burgh Extension Order 1914 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order of 1914") the provost magistrates and councillors of the burgh of Coatbridge (hereinafter referred to as "the Town Council" and "the burgh" respectively) were authorised to make and maintain the main and branch sewers and sewage purification works in that Order described :

And whereas by the Coatbridge Burgh Order 1920 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order of 1920") the time limited for the construction of such sewers was extended until the twenty-eighth day of August one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight :

And whereas it is expedient that the period limited by the Order of 1914 and the Order of 1920 for the completion of the works authorised by the Order of 1914 so far as not yet constructed should be further extended as in this Order provided :

And whereas the Town Council have constructed a main sewer in the burgh for improving the efficiency of the sewerage and drainage undertaking of the Town Council and it is expedient that the construction of such main sewer should be sanctioned and confirmed and that it should be made part of the undertaking authorised by the Order of 1914 and the Order of 1920 and that

the expenditure thereon by the Town Council of moneys which they were authorised to borrow under the Order of 1914 and the Order of 1920 should be sanctioned: A.D. 1928.

And whereas the assessment which the Town Council were authorised by the Order of 1914 to apply to the purposes of their sewerage and drainage undertaking together with the new assessment which the Town Council were authorised by the Order of 1920 to assess levy and recover for those purposes is insufficient and it is expedient that the Town Council should be authorised to impose assess levy and recover an additional assessment as in this Order provided:

And whereas it is expedient that the further powers in this Order mentioned should be conferred on the Town Council:

And whereas the purposes aforesaid cannot be effected without an Order confirmed by Parliament under the provisions of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1899:

Now therefore in pursuance of the powers contained in the last-mentioned Act as read with the Secretaries of State Act 1926 the Secretary of State orders as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Coatbridge Drainage Order 1928. Short title.

2. The following words and expressions in this Order have the meanings hereby assigned to them (that is to say):— Interpretation.

“Burgh” means the burgh of Coatbridge;

“Town Council” means the provost magistrates and councillors of the burgh;

“Order of 1914” means the Coatbridge Drainage and Burgh Extension Order 1914;

“Order of 1920” means the Coatbridge Burgh Order 1920;

“Sewerage and drainage undertaking” means the sewerage and drainage undertaking of the Town Council authorised by the Order of 1914 and the Order of 1920.

3. The time limited by section 27 (Period for completion of works) of the Order of 1914 as extended by section 5 (Extending time for completion of works authorised by Order of 1914) of the Order of 1920 for the construction of Works Nos. 4 10 and 11 authorised by section 6 (Power to execute works) of the Order of 1914 is hereby extended for a period of three years from the twenty-eighth day of August one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight.

4. The construction and maintenance by the Town Council of the work hereinafter described is hereby sanctioned and confirmed and the said work shall form part of the sewerage and drainage undertaking and the Town Council may retain hold and use any lands and property or interest therein acquired by them for the purposes of or in connection with the said work and the construction of the said work shall be deemed to have been and shall be one of the purposes for which the Town Council were authorised to borrow money under the Order of 1914 and the Order of 1920 The work in this section referred to is :—

A main sewer conduit or line of pipes wholly in the burgh the parish of Old Monkland and county of Lanark commencing at a point in or under Woodside Street twenty yards or thereabouts northwards from the bridge carrying the London Midland and Scottish Railway (Rutherglen and Coatbridge Branch) over that street and terminating at a point in or under that street at or near its junction with Old Monkland Road.

5. Section 6 (New sewer assessment) of the Order of 1920 shall be read and have effect as if the maximum amount of the new assessment which the Town Council were by that section authorised to assess levy and recover for the purposes of the sewerage and drainage undertaking were increased to two shillings and sixpence in the pound :

Provided that the total amount of the assessments imposed and levied by the Town Council for the purposes of the sewerage and drainage undertaking shall not in any year exceed two shillings and sixpence in the pound.

6. All costs charges and expenses of and incident to the preparing for obtaining and confirming of this Order or otherwise in relation thereto shall be paid by the Town Council out of any moneys in their hands which are not specifically allocated to any other purpose or out of any money borrowed under the powers of the Order of 1914 or the Order of 1920 and if paid out of borrowed moneys shall be repaid out of revenue within five years from the passing of the Act confirming this Order.
