

CHAPTER cliv.

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order under the Private A.D. 1912. Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1899 relating to Falkirk Burgh. [13th December 1912.]

WHEREAS His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland has after inquiry held before Commissioners made the Provisional Order set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed under the provisions of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 62 & 63 Vict. 1899 and it is requisite that the said Order should be confirmed c. 47. by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

- 1. The Provisional Order contained in the schedule hereunto Confirmation of Order in annexed shall be and the same is hereby confirmed.

- 2. This Act may be cited as the Falkirk Burgh Order Short title. Confirmation Act 1912.

FALKIRK BURGH.

Provisional Order to provide for the costs of promoting the Falkirk Burgh Extension Draft Provisional Order 1911 and for other purposes.

WHEREAS the provost magistrates and councillors of the burgh of Falkirk (herein-after called "the Town Council") acting under the Burgh Police (Scotland) Acts 1892 to 1911 and the Town Councils (Scotland) Acts 1900 and 1903 are the local authority within the said burgh under those Acts and the Public Health (Scotland) Act 1897:

And whereas it is expedient that provision should be made for payment of the costs charges and expenses of and incidental to the Falkirk Burgh Extension Draft Provisional Order promoted by the Town Council in the Session of 1911:

And whereas it is expedient that the Town Council should be empowered to levy collect and recover rates assessments and charges and to borrow money for the purposes of this Order:

And whereas the purposes aforesaid cannot be effected without an Order of the Secretary for Scotland confirmed by Parliament under the provisions of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1899:

Now therefore in pursuance of the powers contained in the last-mentioned Act the Secretary for Scotland orders as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Order may be cited for all purposes as the Falkirk Burgh Order 1912.

Commencement of Order. 2. This Order shall commence and have effect on and from the date of the passing of the Act confirming this Order.

Interpretation.

- 3. In this Order unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant to such construction the following expressions shall have the meanings herein assigned to them namely:—
 - "The burgh" means the burgh of Falkirk;
 - "The Town Council" means the provost magistrates and councillors of the burgh.

4. The Town Council—

(1) may pay the costs charges and expenses of and Payment of incidental to the promotion of the Falkirk Burgh costs of Extension Draft Provisional Order by the Town Council in the Session of 1911; and

(2) shall pay all the costs charges and expenses of and incidental to the preparing for obtaining and confirming this Order or otherwise in relation thereto

out of any one or more of the assessments leviable by the Town Council within the burgh as the Town Council may determine and the Town Council may borrow on mortgage or otherwise such money as may be necessary for the payment of such costs charges and expenses on the security of any one or more of such assessments and may assign so much or such part or parts as may be required of such assessments as security for the money which may be so borrowed Provided that all money so borrowed shall be repaid within a period of five years from the commencement of this Order.
