

## CHAPTER cix.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the Local A.D. 1914. Government Board for Ireland relating to the Urban Districts of Cashel and Castlebar the Rural Districts of Mountmellick and Sligo and the Bangor and Newtownards Joint Hospital District. [31st July 1914.]

WHEREAS the Local Government Board for Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the Local Government Board") have made the Provisional Orders set out in the schedule hereto under the Public Health (Ireland) Acts 1878 to 1907:

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be confirmed by Parliament and that the provisions herein contained should be enacted with reference to those Orders:

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. The Orders set out in the schedule hereto are hereby Orders in schedule confirmed and all the provisions thereof shall have full validity confirmed. and force.

2. The urban authorities mentioned in the Orders relating Restriction to Cashel and Castlebar hereby confirmed shall not under the powers of those Orders purchase or acquire in any urban district of working any house which on the fifteenth day of December last was class. occupied either wholly or partially by thirty or more persons belonging to the working class as tenants or lodgers or except with the consent of the Local Government Board any house

- A.D. 1914. which was not so occupied on the said fifteenth day of December but has been or shall be subsequently so occupied.

If either of the said authorities acquire or appropriate any house or houses for the purposes of the Order relating to their district in contravention of the foregoing provisions they shall be liable to a penalty of five hundred pounds in respect of every such house which penalty shall be recoverable by the Local Government Board by action in the High Court and shall be carried to and form part of the Consolidated Fund of the United Kingdom Provided that the Court may if it think fit reduce such penalty.

For the purposes of this section the expression "house" means any house or part of a house occupied as a separate dwelling and the expression "working class" means mechanics artizans labourers and others working for wages hawkers costermongers persons not working for wages but working at some trade or handicraft without employing others except members of their own families and persons other than domestic servants whose income does not exceed an average of thirty shillings a week and the families of any of such persons who may be residing with them.

Now therefore We the Local Government Board for Ireland in pursuance of the powers given to Us by section 203 of the Public 41 & 42 Vict. Health (Ireland) Act 1878 and of all other powers enabling Us in that <sup>3, 52</sup>. behalf do hereby order that from and after the date of the Act confirming this Order the following provisions shall have effect namely:—

- 1. The district council shall be empowered to put in force with reference to the lands water and rights described in the schedule hereto and for the purpose aforesaid the powers of the Lands Clauses Acts as amended by section 8 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act 1896 with 59 & 60 Vict. reference to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by c. 54. agreement or any of them.
- 2. Any arbitrator appointed for the purposes of this Order may on the application of the district council award the provision of special supplies of water either in addition to or in substitution for other compensation.
- 3. For the purposes of this Order the expression "land" in the Lands Clauses Acts shall include the lands water and rights described in the schedule hereto.
- 4. The costs and expenses of the district council and the Local Government Board for Ireland incurred in respect of the application for preparation making and confirmation of this Order shall be paid by the district council out of any fund or rate applicable by that council to defray the expenses incurred by them in the execution of the Public Health (Ireland) Acts 1878 to 1907.
  - 5. This Order may be cited as the Cashel Order 1914.

# A.D. 1914. BANGOR AND NEWTOWNARDS JOINT HOSPITAL DISTRICT.

Provisional Order for partially repealing Confirming Acts.

WHEREAS by a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board for Ireland (in this Order referred to as "the Local Government Board") dated the twenty-seventh day of April one thousand nine hundred and four which was confirmed by the Local Government Board (Ireland) Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 2) Act 1904 (which Order and Act are in this Order respectively referred to as "the Order of 1904" and "the Confirming Act of 1904") the Bangor Urban District the Newtownards Urban District and the Newtownards Rural District were formed into a united district called the Bangor and Newtownards Joint Hospital District of which the governing body was the Bangor and Newtownards Joint Hospital Board (in this Order referred to as "the joint board"):

And whereas by an Order of the Local Government Board dated the third day of April one thousand nine hundred and five the town of Donaghadee was separated from the rural district of Newtownards and constituted an urban sanitary district called the urban district of Donaghadee:

And whereas by an Order of the Local Government Board dated the thirteenth day of March one thousand nine hundred and seven (in this Order referred to as "the first Order of 1907") the said united district was reconstituted and now consists of the urban district of Bangor the urban district of Newtownards the urban district of Donaghadee and the rural district of Newtownards the councils of which said several districts are in this Order referred to as "the component authorities" and the provisions of the Order of 1904 relating to the constitution of the joint board were adapted accordingly:

And whereas by the Order of 1904 the united district was constituted for the purpose of the provision maintenance and management for the use of the inhabitants of the districts therein mentioned of a hospital for the reception of cases of small-pox:

7 Edw. 7. c. cviii. And whereas by a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board dated the twenty-sixth day of March one thousand nine hundred and seven which was confirmed by the Local Government Board (Ireland) Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 1) Act 1907 (which Order and Act are in this Order respectively referred to as "the second Order of 1907" and "the Confirming Act of 1907" the Confirming Act of 1904 so far as it relates to the Order of 1904 was amended so as to extend the purpose for which the united district was formed to the provision maintenance and management for the use of the inhabitants of the component districts of a hospital for the reception of cases of infectious disease:

And whereas it is expedient that the Confirming Act of 1904 so A.D. 1914. far as it relates to the Order of 1904 the first Order of 1907 and the Confirming Act of 1907 so far as it relates to the second Order of Newtownards. 1907 should be repealed in manner herein-after provided so that the united district shall be dissolved the joint board abolished and such other provision made as is herein-after set forth:

Bangor and

Now therefore We the Local Government Board in pursuance of the powers given to Us by section 214 of the Public Health (Ireland) 41 & 42 Vict. Act 1878 and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf do hereby e. 52. order that from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order (herein-after referred to as "the commencement of this Order") the following provisions shall have effect that is to say:—

- 1.—(1) From and after the thirtieth day of September one thou- Repeals. sand nine hundred and fourteen the Confirming Act of 1904 so far as it relates to the Order of 1904 the first Order of 1907 and the Confirming Act of 1907 so far as it relates to the second Order of 1907 shall be repealed and the united district shall be dissolved and the joint board shall be abolished and cease to exist.
- (2) Every repeal under this Article shall have effect subject to the provisions of section 38 of the Interpretation Act of 1889 relating 52 & 53 Vict. to repeals of enactments.

2.—(1) Before the thirtieth day of September one thousand nine Debts and hundred and fourteen the joint board shall out of any moneys or liabilities of fund available for the purpose discharge all debts and liabilities of the joint board.

- (2) Any debts and liabilities of the joint board which are not discharged before the thirtieth day of September one thousand nine hundred and fourteen shall on that day be transferred to and become debts and liabilities of the component authorities and any money required for or in connexion with the discharge of the same shall be paid in the first instance by the Newtownards Rural District Council on behalf of all those authorities and as between those authorities shall be contributed in proportion to the rateable value of the property in their respective districts out of the respective rates or funds applicable by them to the purposes of the Public Health (Ireland) Acts 1878 to 1907.
- 3. All books of accounts minutes of proceedings plans deeds papers Custody of and writings belonging to or under the control of the joint board documents. shall on the thirtieth day of September one thousand nine hundred and fourteen be deposited with the Newtownards Rural District Council and kept by that council but the other component authorities and the ratepayers of the district of any of the component authorities shall at all reasonable times have the right of inspecting and of taking copies of or extracts from any of the said documents.

Audit of accounts.

- 4.—(1) The accounts of the joint board shall be made up to the thirtieth day of September one thousand nine hundred and fourteen Newtownards. and shall be audited in like manner and subject to the like incidents and consequences as if this Order had not been made and the audit may be held as soon as practicable after that date notwithstanding any statutory provision or any regulation to the contrary.
  - (2) Any sum certified by the auditor to be due from any person shall be paid to the treasurer of the Newtownards Rural District Council and shall be apportioned by him between the component authorities in the proportions mentioned in subdivision (2) of Article 2 of this Order.

Adjustment. c. 52.

- 5.—(1) For the purposes of any settlement adjustment proceeding 41 & 42 Vict. or matter under section 277 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act 1878 as it applies to anything arising out of incidental to or consequent upon this Order the Local Government Board may by order deal with any matter which under the said enactment may be dealt with by a Provisional Order.
  - (2) If in relation to any purpose of this Order any question or difficulty arises and the Local Government Board are satisfied that under the provisions of this Order the question or difficulty cannot otherwise be determined or removed they may by order do anything which appears to them to be necessary for the determination of the question or for the removal of the difficulty.

Any order made by the Local Government Board in pursuance of this subdivision may modify any provisions of this Order so far as may appear to the Local Government Board to be necessary or expedient for carrying into effect the order made in pursuance of this subdivision.

Costs of Order.

6. All the costs and expenses of the component authorities the joint board and the Local Government Board of and incidental to the application for preparation making and confirmation of this Order and any audit held in pursuance of this Order shall be treated as debts and liabilities of the joint board and shall be paid and contributed in the manner provided by subdivision (2) of Article 2 of this Order.

Short title.

7. This Order may be cited as the Bangor and Newtownards Joint Hospital Order 1914.
