



CHAPTER xvii

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order under the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1936 relating to Kilmarnock Corporation. [1st August 1952.]

WHEREAS the Provisional Order set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed has been made by the Secretary of State under the provisions of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1936 and it is requisite that the said Order should be confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. The Provisional Order contained in the schedule hereunto annexed is hereby confirmed. Confirmation of Order in Schedule.
2. This Act may be cited as the Kilmarnock Corporation Order Confirmation Act 1952. Short title.

SCHEDULE

KILMARNOCK CORPORATION

Provisional Order to provide for the removal of the limitation on the amount of the public library rate leviable within the burgh of Kilmarnock.

WHEREAS the Provost Magistrates and Councillors of the burgh of Kilmarnock (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") are the municipal and local authority for the burgh of Kilmarnock in the county of Ayr (hereinafter referred to as "the burgh") and are charged with the administration and management thereof:

And whereas it is expedient to provide for the removal of the limitation imposed by section 191 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1947 on the amount of the public library rate leviable by the Corporation within the burgh:

And whereas the purpose aforesaid cannot be effected without an Order confirmed by Parliament under the provisions of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1936:

Now therefore in pursuance of the powers contained in the last-mentioned Act the Secretary of State orders as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Order may be cited as the Kilmarnock Corporation Order 1952.

Removal of limitation on amount of public library rate.

2.—(1) The limitation on the amount of the library rate authorised by the Public Libraries Consolidation (Scotland) Act 1887 imposed by section 191 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1947 is hereby removed so far as applicable to the burgh and the Public Libraries (Scotland) Acts 1887 to 1920 and the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1947 shall in their application to the Corporation and the burgh be read and construed accordingly.

(2) This section shall be deemed to have come into operation on the sixteenth day of May one thousand nine hundred and fifty-two.

Costs of Order.

3. The costs charges and expenses preliminary to and of and incidental to the preparing for obtaining and confirming of this Order or otherwise in relation thereto shall be paid by the Corporation out of any funds (not being in the nature of capital) rates or revenues belonging to them or under their control or out of moneys which the Corporation are hereby authorised to borrow for that purpose and if paid out of borrowed moneys shall be repaid within five years from the date of the passing of the Act confirming this Order.
