An Act to amend some of the Provisions of the Manchester Markets Act, 1846.

[8th June 1847.]

HEREAS an Act was passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled An Act for providing Market Places and 9 & 10 Vict, for regulating the Markets and Fairs in the Borough of c. 219. Manchester in the County Palatine of Lancaster: And whereas it is expedient that some of the Powers and Provisions of the said Act should be altered and amended, but the same cannot be effected without the Aid and Authority of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That all the Provisions of Powers and Provisions of the said recited Act, so far as the same are recited Act or may be applicable, and are now in force, and not by this Act repealed, altered, or otherwise provided for, shall extend to this Act, and to the several Purposes thereof and the several Matters and Things hereby authorized to be done, as fully and effectually as if the said Provisions were re-enacted in this Act in reference to such Purposes, Matters, and Things; and the said recited Act and this Act shall be construed and read together as forming One Act.

So much of recited Act as relates to granting Licences in certain Cases repealed.

II. And whereas by the said recited Act, after stating that it was then unlawful for any Person to carry on the Trade or Business of a Butcher or Fishmonger in any Part of the Township of Manchester other than and except in such Places as were specially appointed for that Purpose, it was enacted, that it should be lawful for the Council to grant a Licence to any Person authorizing such Person to carry on the Trade or Business of a Butcher or Fishmonger in any Part of the Township of Manchester: And whereas it is expedient that the said Enactment should be repealed, and that further and more effectual Provision should be made for the granting of such Licences; be it therefore enacted. That the said Enactment shall be and the same is hereby declared to be repealed.

Council to grant Licences.

III. And in lieu thereof, be it enacted, That the said Council shall and they are hereby required to grant a Licence to any Person applying for the same in the Manner provided by the said recited Act, authorizing such Person to carry on the Trade or Business of a Butcher or Fishmonger in any Part of the Township of Manchester.

Altering visions of recited Act as to Tolls.

IV. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the Council from certain Pro- Time to Time to demand and take from any Person occupying or using any Stall, Shed, or Stand, or erecting any Booth in any Fair under the said recited Act, or bringing therein any Caravan or other Vehicle, or any Cattle, Provisions, Articles, or Things specified not only in the Schedulc B. but also in Schedule C. to the said recited Act annexed, such Stallage, Rents, and Tolls as the Council shall from Time to Time appoint, not exceeding the several Stallages, Rents, and Tolls specified in the said Schedules B. and C. herein-before mentioned.

List of Tolls to be set up in every Market and Market Place.

V. And be it enacted, That the Council shall from Time to Time cause, either to be painted on Boards or printed in legible Characters and placed on Boards, which shall be affixed and continued in some conspicuous Place in the Market Hall, and in every Market or Market Place or Place for holding any Market or Fair, a List of the several Stallages, Rents, and Tolls which shall from Time to Time be payable in respect of the Market to which each such List shall relate; and no Stallage, Rent, or Toll shall be payable in respect of any Market during such Time as such List shall not continue to be so affixed therein, or for any Matter or Thing not specified in the said List: Provided always, that if any such List shall be destroyed, injured, or obliterated, the Stallages, Rents, and Tolls shall continue to be payable during such Time as may be reasonably required for the Restoration or Reparation of such List, in the same Manner as if such List had continued affixed in the State required by this Act.

Explaining so much of recited Act es relates to borrowing Money.

VI. And whereas Doubts have arisen as to the Amount which the Council are authorized to borrow under and by virtue of the Provisions of the said recited Act, and it is desirable that such Doubts should be removed; be it therefore enacted, That it shall be lawful for the Council and they are by the said recited Act authorized to borrow at Interest for the Purposes of the said recited Act, in the Manner and upon the Security and Terms therein mentioned, over and above and in addition to any other Sum or Sums of Money which they may be authorized to borrow under the Provisions of any other Act or Acts, any Sum of Money not exceeding in the whole the Sum of Two hundred thousand Pounds.

VII. And be it enacted, That in citing this Act in other Acts of Short Title. Parliament, and in legal Instruments, it shall be sufficient to use the Expression "The Manchester Markets Act, 1847."

VIII. And be it enacted, That the Costs, Charges, and Expences Expences of attending or incident to the obtaining and passing of this Act shall Act. be paid by the Council out of the Borough Fund of the Borough.

IX. And be it enacted, That this Act shall be deemed a Public Public Act. Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such.
