An Act to repeal the Waterford Road Act. [21st June 1847.]

HEREAS an Act was passed in the Eleventh Year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled An Act for more effectually repairing several Roads leading 11 G. 4. & from the Bounds of the County of Cork to the City of Waterford: And 1 W.4.c. 107. whereas certain Toll Gates have been erected, and certain Tolls have been and are continued to be taken, pursuant to the Provisions of the said recited Act, for the Repair of the Road from the Borough of Waterford to the Bounds of the County of Cork, and the said Tolls have been expended pursuant to the Provisions of the said Act, but such Mode of repairing the said Road has proved inconvenient, and not advantageous to the Occupiers of Land and to the Inhabitants of the Towns situate along the Line of the said Road: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That from Repeal of and after the First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and recited Act. forty-eight the said Act passed in the Eleventh Year of the Reign of King George the Fourth, intituled An Act for more effectually repairing several Roads leading from the Bounds of the County of Cork [Local.]to

to the City of Waterford, shall be and the same is hereby repealed, save and except so far as the said recited Act repeals all former Acts, and from and after the said First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and forty-eight all the Powers and Provisions in the said recited Act contained shall, with the Exception aforesaid, thenceforward cease and determine.

Road to be repaired by Grand Jury Presentment.

II. And be it enacted, That from and after the said First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and forty-eight the said Road shall be thenceforward repaired, as other public Roads in Ireland are repaired, by Grand Jury Presentment, under the Provisions of an Act passed in the Sixth and Seventh Years of the Reign of His late 6 & 7 W. 4. Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to the Presentment of Public Money by Grand Juries in Ireland.

III. And whereas a Contract is at present subsisting between Trustees of the said Road appointed under the said first-recited Act and Hamilton White of Dungarvan, for the keeping in repair of the said Road, which Contract will expire on the Thirty-first Day of December One thousand eight hundred and forty-seven; and by the said recited Act the Grand Jury of the County of Waterford are empowered, in certain Cases therein mentioned, to present in aid of the Tolls collected on the said Road for the Repair thereof; be it enacted, That it shall and may be lawful to and for the Grand Jury of the County of Waterford and they are hereby required to present at the Summer Assizes of the Year One thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and at the Spring Assizes of the Year One thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, and without any previous Application made for that Purpose to a Presentment Sessions, all such Sum and Sums of Money as may be necessary or requisite to pay all Arrears of Contracts due and owing to the said Hamilton White on foot of the said Contracts: Expences of Provided always, that any surplus Funds in the Hands of the said Trustees (after paying the Cost, Charges, and Expences attending and incident to the applying for or passing of this Act, which the said Trustees are hereby required first to pay,) shall in the first instance be applied to pay the Sum due on account of the said Contract, and that the Deficiency only (if any) shall be presented by the Grand Jury as aforesaid.

IV. And be it enacted, That the said Trustees shall sell and dispose of all the Toll Houses, Toll Bars or Gates, and Toll Boards, and other Fixtures and Property belonging to the said Trustees, as soon as the same may be conveniently done after the said First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, and render an Account thereof to the Grand Jury of the County of Waterford at the Assizes then next ensuing.

Commencement of Act.

V. And be it enacted, That this Act shall come into operation, so far as relates to the repealing of the said first-recited Act, upon the First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, and for all other Purposes from the passing thereof.

VI. And be it enacted, That in citing this Act in other Acts of Short Title. Parliament and in legal Instruments it shall suffice to use the Expression "The Waterford Road Act, 1847."

VII. And be it enacted, That this Act shall be deemed a Public Public Act. Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such.

VIII. And be it enacted, That this Act may be amended by any Act may be Act to be passed in the present Session of Parliament.
