All other Words and Expressions in the Sections of the said General Acts respectively incorporated herewith shall have the several Meanings assigned them in the General Act of which they form Part:

The Expression "the Commissioners" in this Act shall mean the *Bournemouth Commissioners*:

The Expression "the Limits" in this Act shall mean the Limits of this Act:

The Expression "Quarter Sessions" in this Act shall mean the Quarter Sessions for the County of *Southampton*:

The Word "County" in this Act shall mean the County of *Southampton*.

Limits of Act.

II. The Limits of this Act shall be so much of the Ecclesiastical District of *Saint Peter Bournemouth* in the Parishes of *Christchurch* and *Holdenhurst* in the County of *Southampton* as is comprised within the following Metes and Bounds; (that is to say,) within a Circle of the Radius of a Mile, whereof the Centre is the Front Door of the *Belle Vue* Hotel in the said District, such Limits being defined on a Plan deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons, and thereon coloured Pink; and this Act may be put in force within the said Limits, or any Part thereof.

Act to be carried into execution by Commissioners.

III. This Act shall be carried into execution by means of Thirteen Commissioners, to be called "The *Bournemouth Commissioners*;" and such Commissioners shall be incorporated by the Name of "The *Bournemouth Commissioners*," and shall have perpetual Succession, a Common Seal, Powers to sue and be sued, and such other Powers as are by this Act and the Acts incorporated therewith conferred upon them.

IV. The Lord of the Manor of *Westover* for the Time being, a Person to be nominated by him in Writing, and the following Persons, (that is to say,) *Samuel Bayly, William Clapcott Dean, Robert Kerley, George Ledgard, Charles William Packe, William Robson, Thomas Shettle, David Tuck, John Tregonwell, Samuel Thompson, and William Esdaile Winter*, shall be the First Commissioners for carrying this Act into execution.

V. The Lord of the said Manor and a Person to be so nominated by him as aforesaid shall always be Commissioners under this Act; the Residue of the said Commissioners shall continue in Office until other Commissioners shall be elected in their Place in manner prescribed by "The Commissioners Clauses Act, 1847."

VI. The Lord for the Time being of the said Manor may from Time to Time, by Writing under his Hand, remove from Office any Commissioner nominated by him or his Predecessors, and may in like Manner from Time to Time appoint any other Person to be a Commissioner in the Room of any Commissioner previously nominated by him or his Predecessors who shall be so removed, or who shall die or resign his Office; and the Provisions of this Act and of the incorporated Acts with respect to the Qualification, Election, Rotation, and Retirement of Commissioners shall not apply to the Lord for the Time being of the said Manor, nor to the Commissioner for the Time being nominated by him.

VIII. The Qualification of a Commissioner shall be as follows: he shall be seised or possessed in his own Right, or in the Right of his Wife, for any Estate not being less than an Estate for a Term of which Twenty-one Years shall be unexpired, of Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments within or within One Mile from the Limits, which shall be of the annual Value of Thirty Pounds at the least, or he shall be rated to the Rate for the Relief of the Poor, or to some Rate made under the Provisions of this Act, in respect of Property situate as aforesaid, in the annual Sum of Thirty Pounds at the least.

IX. The Placards required by Section Twenty-one of "The Commissioners Clauses Act, 1847," shall be affixed on the Doors of the District Church of the said Ecclesiastical District of *Saint Peter*, and on the Doors of Chapels or Meeting Houses of Roman Catholic and Protestant Dissenters of every Denomination properly registered according to Law, and situate in the said District.

X. At all Elections of Commissioners the Chairman for the Time being of the Commissioners shall be the Returning or Presiding Officer: Provided always, that when such Chairman shall go out of Office by Rotation, or when from any other Cause there shall be no Chairman of the Commissioners for the Time being, One of the Commissioners who shall have been longest in Office without going out of Office by Rotation, and who shall not then be going out by Rotation, to be nominated by the other Commissioners not then going out by Rotation,

tion, shall be the Returning or Presiding Officer at that Election ; and for the Purpose of nominating such Returning or Presiding Officer, when from any Cause he shall not have been nominated at the last monthly or adjourned Meeting of the Commissioners before the Election, a Meeting of the Commissioners shall be convened by the Clerk, to be holden at the usual Place of Meeting, of which Meeting Seven Days or the longest practicable Notice the Circumstances admit of shall be given to the Commissioners.

XI. All Meetings of the Commissioners shall commence between the Hours of Ten of the Clock in the Forenoon and Two of the Clock in the Afternoon.

XII. Every Person who shall be rated under the Provisions of this Act in respect of any Property within the Limits of this Act upon an annual Value of Seven Pounds, and who shall on or before the Day previous to the Day of Election of the Commissioners have paid all the Rates (if any) which shall have become payable by him under the Provisions of this Act previous to the Commencement of the Sixth Month next before such Election, shall be entitled to vote in the Election of Commissioners.

XIII. And whereas Plans and Sections of a Pier and of the Works connected therewith showing the Line and Level thereof, and a Book of Reference containing the Names of the Owners, Lessees, and Occupiers of the Lands through, in, or upon which the same is intended to be made, have been deposited with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of *Southampton*: Be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the Commissioners to make and maintain the said Pier and Works in the Line and Levels shown by such Plan and Section, and for that Purpose to enter upon, take, purchase, and hold all or any Part of the Lands delineated on the said Plans and described in the said Book of Reference.

XIV. The said Pier and Works shall be completed within Five Years from the passing of this Act, and on the Expiration of such Period the Powers given by this Act to the Commissioners for executing the same shall cease to be executed, except as to so much of the said Pier and Works as shall then be completed.

XV. Previously to commencing the Pier or the Works connected therewith, the Commissioners shall deposit at the Admiralty Office Plans, Sections, and Working Drawings of the said Pier and Works connected therewith, for the Approval of the Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom of *Great Britain and Ireland*, or the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral aforesaid, such

such Approval to be signified in Writing under the Hand of the Secretary of the Admiralty, and such Pier and Works shall be constructed only in accordance with such Approval.

XVI. If at any Time or Times it shall be deemed expedient by the Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom, or the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral, to order a local Survey and Examination of any Works of the Commissioners in, over, or affecting any tidal or navigable Water or River, or of the intended Site thereof, the Commissioners shall defray the Costs of every such local Survey and Examination, and the Amount thereof shall be a Debt due to Her Majesty from the Commissioners, and if not paid upon Demand may be recovered as a Debt due to the Crown, with the Costs of Suit, or may be recovered with Costs as a Penalty is or may be recoverable from the Commissioners.

XVII. If any Work to be constructed by the Commissioners in, under, over, through, or across any tidal Water or navigable River, or if any Portion of any Work which affects or may affect any such Water or River, or Access thereto, shall be abandoned or suffered to fall into Disuse or Decay, it shall be lawful for the Lord High Admiral, or the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral, to abate and remove the same, or such Part or Parts thereof as he or they may at any Time or Times deem fit and proper, and to restore the Site thereof to its former Condition at the Cost and Charge of the Commissioners, and the Amount thereof shall be a Debt due from the Commissioners to the Crown, and be recoverable accordingly with Costs of Suit.

XX. The Commissioners may levy from every Person who shall land from or embark in any Boat or Vessel at or from the Pier other than Government Packets, and from any Person who shall be on or otherwise shall use the Pier, or shall lade or unlade thereat any of the Goods, Articles, or Things mentioned in the Schedule (A.) to this Act annexed, such Sum as they shall appoint, not exceeding in any Case the Sums mentioned in the said Schedule (A.): Provided always, that every Officer of Customs or other Person in the Service of Her Majesty going on to or using or passing over the said Pier in the Discharge of his Duty shall not be liable to pay to the Com-

missioners any Sums whatsoever, and every such Person shall have free Access to the Pier at all Times for the Purpose of discharging his Duty.

XXI. It shall be lawful for the Commissioners, after Notice in Writing for that Purpose given to the Owner or other Person having the Control of any Vessel or Boat, to demand and receive from such Owner or other Person, for any Period that any such Vessel or Boat shall make fast to or remain at the said Pier, any Sum not exceeding the Sum specified in Schedule (B.) to this Act annexed.

XXII. "The Towns Improvement Clauses Act, 1847," is hereby incorporated with this Act.

Power to purchase Lands by Agreement.

XXIII. The Commissioners may from Time to Time purchase by Agreement with the Owners, Lessees, and Occupiers thereof any Lands which they may require for any of the Purposes of this Act or any of the Acts incorporated herewith, and shall resell such Parts of the Lands so purchased as shall not be required for such Purposes.

XXIV. The Commissioners may contract, for any Period not exceeding Three Years at any Time, with any Person or Company for the Supply of Gas, Oil, or other Means of lighting the Streets and Public Buildings within the Limits of this Act, and may provide such Lamps, Lamp Posts, and other Works as they may think necessary for that Purpose.

Power to provide additional Sites for Markets and Fairs.

XXV. It shall be lawful for the Commissioners to purchase or provide such Places or Sites for the holding of Markets as they shall from Time to Time think fit, and to construct and establish a Market House and Market Place thereon.

XXVI. The Sections of "The Markets and Fairs Clauses Act, 1847," with respect to the holding of the Market or Fair and the Protection thereof; and with respect to weighing Goods or Carts, and with respect to the Stallages, Rents, and Tolls to be taken by the Undertakers, and with respect to the Byelaws to be made by the Undertakers, are hereby incorporated with this Act.

XXVII. The Commissioners may levy from every Person using any Market House or Market Place established by them such Sums as they shall appoint, not exceeding in any Case the Sums mentioned in the Schedules (C.) and (D.) to this Act annexed.

XXVIII. The Commissioners may from Time to Time demise the Market House and Market Place, or any Part thereof respectively, and

and the Stallages, Rents, and Tolls for the Markets and Fairs, or any of them, for any Term not exceeding Three Years, upon such Terms as may be agreed upon between them and the Person to whom the Demise is made: Provided always, that before making any such Demise for any Period exceeding One Year, they shall by Advertisement or otherwise, as they think fit, give not less than One Month's public Notice of their Intention to make the same, and of their Willingness to receive Tenders in Writing in that Behalf.

XXIX. The Sections of "The Towns Police Clauses Act, 1847," with respect to Obstructions and Nuisances in the Streets, and with respect to Places of public Resort, and with respect to Hackney Carriages, and with respect to public Bathing, are hereby incorporated with and shall form Part of this Act.

XXX. The Commissioners shall make a Rate, to be called "The General Improvement Rate," for the Payment of all Expenses which may from Time to Time be incurred by them in the Execution of this Act, and which may not otherwise be sufficiently provided for by this Act; and such Rate shall be of such Amount as, together with the Monies which by virtue of this Act shall be added thereto or brought in aid thereof from Time to Time, shall be sufficient to defray the Expenses last aforesaid, to pay the Interest for the Time being due on Principal Monies borrowed under the Powers herein contained, and as shall be sufficient to pay annually a Thirtieth Part at least of the Principal Monies charged upon or due on Mortgage of the said General Improvement Rate: Provided always, that the Amount of such Rate to be levied in any One Year shall not exceed the Sum of Three Shillings in the Pound on the annual Value of the Property assessed thereto.

XXXI. The Owners of all rateable Property of which the full net annual Value does not exceed the Sum of Seven Pounds, or which are let to weekly or monthly Tenants, or in separate Apartments, shall be rated to and pay the General Improvement Rate instead of the Occupiers thereof.

XXXII. It shall be lawful for the Commissioners from Time to Time to borrow any Sum or Sums of Money not exceeding at any One Time the Sum of Five thousand Pounds for the Purposes of the said Pier and Works on Mortgage of the General Improvement Rate, and of all the Tolls, Rates, and Duties hereby authorized to be levied, and to borrow any Sum or Sums of Money not exceeding at any One Time the Sum of Five thousand Pounds for the other Purposes of this Act on Mortgage of the General Improvement Rate and of the Rates and Tolls hereby authorized to be levied (except in respect of the said Pier and Works); and in order to discharge the Principal Monies borrowed

borrowed as aforesaid, the Commissioners shall in every Year pay off not less than One Thirtieth Part of any Principal Sums so borrowed.

Power to borrow Money to pay off former Mortgages.

XXXIII. If at the Time appointed by any Mortgage Deed for the Payment of the Principal Money secured thereby the Commissioners are unable to pay off the same, they may, if they shall think fit, borrow such Sum of Money as may be necessary for the Purpose of paying off the whole or any of the Principal Money (except such Part thereof as may or ought to have been paid off by means of the Sinking Fund), and may secure the Repayment of the same and the Interest to be paid thereon in the same Manner in all respects and upon the Rates or Property upon which the Principal Money to be paid off was secured.

Power to appoint Receiver.

XXXIV. The Mortgagees of the Commissioners shall be at liberty and they are hereby empowered to enforce the Payment of Arrears of Interest, or the Arrears of Principal and Interest, for the Time being due to them by the Appointment of a Receiver; and in order to authorize the Appointment of such Receiver, the Amount owing to the Mortgagee or Mortgagees by whom Application for such Receiver shall be made shall not be less than One thousand Pounds in the whole.

Application of Pier Tolls.

XXXV. The Receipts of the Commissioners in respect of the Tolls hereby authorized to be levied in respect of the said Pier and Works connected therewith shall be applied as follows; (that is to say,)

First, In Payment of a Moiety of the Charges and Expenses which shall have been incurred in or shall be incident to the obtaining and passing of this Act:

Second, In Payment of the annual Interest of Monies borrowed for the Purposes of the said Pier and Works under the Powers of this Act:

Third, In appropriating the Sum by this Act directed to be appropriated as a Sinking Fund for paying off the Monies borrowed as last aforesaid:

Fourth, In Payment of the Expenses incurred by the Commissioners in reference to the said Pier and Works:

Fifth, In Payment of the Principal Sums borrowed as last aforesaid.

XXXVI. The Receipts of the Commissioners in respect of Tolls and Rates under this Act (except of the Tolls in respect of the said Pier and Works) shall be applied as follows; that is to say,

1st. In Payment of a Moiety of the Charges and Expenses which shall have been incurred in or shall be incident to the obtaining and passing of this Act:

2nd. In Payment of the annual Interest of Monies borrowed under the Powers of this Act for Purposes other than the said Pier and Works, and of so much of the annual Interest of Monies borrowed under the said Powers for the Purposes of the said Pier and Works as the Tolls in respect of the said Pier and Works may be insufficient to satisfy :

3rd. In appropriating the Sum by this Act directed to be appropriated as a Sinking Fund for paying off the Monies borrowed for Purposes other than the said Pier and Works, and of so much of the Sum directed to be appropriated as a Sinking Fund for paying off the Monies borrowed under the said Powers for the Purposes of the said Pier and Works as the Tolls in respect of the said Pier and Works may be insufficient to satisfy :

4th. In Payment of the Expenses incurred by the Commissioners in carrying this Act into effect (except as to the said Pier and Works) :

5th. In Payment of the Principal Monies borrowed under the Powers of this Act for Purposes other than the said Pier and Works.

XXXVII. Nothing contained in this Act or in any of the Acts herein referred to shall extend to authorize the Commissioners to take, use, or in any Manner interfere with any Land, Soil, Tenements, or Hereditaments, or any Rights in respect thereof, belonging to the Queen's most Excellent Majesty in right of Her Crown, without the Consent in Writing of the Commissioners for the Time being of Her Majesty's Woods, Forests, and Land Revenues, or One of them, on behalf of Her Majesty first had and obtained for that Purpose (which Consent such Commissioners are hereby respectively authorized to give), or to take away, prejudice, diminish, or alter any of the Estates, Rights, Privileges, Powers, or Authorities vested in or enjoyed or exerciseable by the Queen's Majesty, Her Heirs or Successors.

XXXVIII. Nothing in this Act contained shall be deemed to exempt the Pier or the Commissioners from the Provisions of "The Merchant Shipping Law Amendment Act, 1853," "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," or "The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1855," relating to Pilotage, Lights, Buoys, and Beacons, or to the Powers, Rights, Privileges, or Jurisdiction of the General Lighthouse Authorities therein mentioned, but such Provisions shall be in force with respect to the Pier and the Commissioners so far as the same are applicable thereto, and not otherwise specially provided for by this Act.
