An Act for the Transfer of the Docks of the Swansea Dock Company to the Swansea Harbour Trustees; and for authorizing those Trustees to make further Works, and raise further Moneys; and for other Purposes.

[10th August 1857.]

HEREAS by "The Swansea Harbour Act, 1854," (in this 17 & 18 Vict. Act called "the Act of 1854,") the Swansea Harbour c. exxvi. Trustees (in this Act called the Trustees) were incorporated, and were made the Conservators of the Harbour of Swansea and the River Tawe, and the Parts therein specified of Swansea Bay, and Powers were conferred on them for the Conservancy, Improvement, Protection, and Regulation of the Harbour, and they were authorized to make and maintain Embankments, Cuts, Piers, Basins, and a Railway and other Works, and to maintain a Bridge, with Toll Gates and a Lighthouse, and they were authorized to take Light Dues on Vessels, Rates on Shipping, Rates on Goods, and Bridge Tolls, and Provision was made that all Rates, Dues, Damages, Penalties, and other Sums payable to and Income of the Trustees should be paid to the Credit of the Swansea Harbour Fund, and they were authorized to purchase and hold Lands for the Purposes of the Act, and to borrow, in addition to a Bond or Mortgage Debt of One hundred 24 E[Local.]

hundred and forty-six thousand two hundred and forty-two Pounds or thereabouts, to which the Swansea Harbour Fund was made subject, as therein expressed, any Sums not exceeding Eighty thousand Pounds on Mortgage of the Tolls, Rates, and Dues by the nowreciting Act authorized: And whereas the Trustees have proceeded in the Execution of the Act of 1854, and have raised by Mortgage thereunder Sixty-four thousand Pounds or thereabouts, and have expended the greater Part thereof on the Works authorized by that 10&11 Vict. Act: And whereas by "The Swansea Dock Act, 1847," the Swansea Dock Company (in this Act called the Dock Company) were incorporated, with a Capital of One hundred thousand Pounds in Shares, and with Power to borrow not exceeding Thirty-three thousand Pounds, and were authorized to make and maintain Docks and other Works at or near to the Southern Side of the Town of Swansea, and to demand and take Rates on Shipping, and Rates on Goods, and Wharfage Rates, and other Charges (in this Act called 13 & 14 Vict. the Dock Rates): And whereas by "The Swansea Dock (Amendment) Act, 1850," the Period for the Completion of the Docks and 18 & 19 Vict. Works was extended: And whereas by "The Swansea Dock (Amendment) Act, 1855," further Provision was made with respect 13 & 14 Viet. to the Capital of the Dock Company: And whereas by "The Swansea Corporation Act, 1850," the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Swansea (in this Act called the Corporation) were authorized to take and hold Shares in the Dock Company, and to borrow Money for the Purpose, and to join as Security for the Dock Company with respect to Interest on Mortgages or Bonds issued by the Dock Company for securing not exceeding Thirty-three thousand Pounds: And whereas the Corporation have not taken any Shares in the Dock Company, and have not joined in any such Security: And whereas the Sum of Sixty-four thousand Pounds or thereabouts has been paid up on the Ordinary Shares in the Dock Company, and the Sum of One thousand Pounds on the Preferential Shares, and they have borrowed Thirty-three thousand Pounds or thereabouts on Mortgage or Bond: And whereas a large Arrear of Interest is due on the Mortgages or Bonds of the Dock Company, and they are indebted on Judgments and otherwise to a large Amount: And whereas the Dock Company have acquired or are in a Position to acquire all the Lands requisite for their Docks and Works, and have proceeded with the Execution of the Docks and Works, but for Want of Funds they are unable to complete them: And whereas it is expedient that Provision be made for the Transfer of the Undertaking, Docks, and Works of the Dock Company to the Trustees, and for authorizing the Trustees to complete and maintain the Docks and Works, and an Agreement for those Purposes, dated the Twelfth Day of June One

thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, has been entered into between

been submitted to Parliament: And whereas it is expedient that the

Period for the Completion of the Docks and Works be extended: And whereas it is expedient that when the Docks and Works are vested in the Trustees the Affairs of the Dock Company be wound up, and the Dock Company be dissolved: And whereas it is expedient that the Trustees be authorized to demand and take in respect of the Docks and Works the same Rates as the Dock Company are now authorized to demand and take, and also the other Rates by this Act authorized: And whereas, the Corporation being entitled to Part of the Lands which the Dock Company were authorized to take, and which they required for the Purposes of their Docks and Works, and to other Lands adjoining, and it appearing that the Completion of the Docks and Works would greatly enhance the Value of the adjoining Property of the Corporation, by an Indenture, dated the Twentieth Indenture, Day of February One thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, between dated 20th Febthe Corporation of the one Part and the Dock Company of the other ruary 1852. Part, the Corporation, for a nominal Consideration, conveyed such Parts of their Lands as the Dock Company were so authorized to take and required to the Dock Company, and the Dock Company entered upon and took possession of those Lands accordingly, and have used Parts thereof for the Purpose of their Docks and Works: And whereas the Completion of the Docks and Works would be of great Advantage to the Borough of Swansea, and in order thereto it is expedient that that Conveyance be confirmed: And whereas it is expedient that the Trustees be authorized to make and maintain a Railway as a Means of Communication between the Docks and the South Wales Railway, and to form a Junction in the Parish of Swansea with the South Wales Railway: And whereas it is expedient that the Trustees be authorized to make and maintain, with such Consent as by this Act provided, a Dam or Embankment across the Black Pill Brook, and to divert the Waters of that Brook into the Docks: And whereas it is expedient that the Trustees be authorized to raise further Moneys for the Purposes of this Act, and that the South Wales Railway Company (in this Act called "the Railway Company") be authorized to guarantee Interest on Moneys borrowed by the Trustees for making the Railway by this Act authorized: And whereas it is expedient that the Trustees and the Railway Company be authorized to enter into Arrangements with respect to the making, using, working, and maintaining of that Railway, and into Traffic Arrangements: And whereas a Map, Plans, and Sections showing the Direction Line and Levels of the intended Railway, and Plans and Sections of the intended Dam, Embankment, and other Works, and Books of Reference to those Plans containing the Names of the Owners or reputed Owners, Lessees or reputed Lessees, and Occupiers of the several Lands required for the Purposes of the Railway, and the Dam, Embankment, and other Works respectively, have been deposited with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Glamorgan, and which Plans, Sections, and Books of Reference are in this Act respectively referred

referred to as the deposited Plans and Sections and Books of Reference: And whereas the following Act of Parliament has been 18 & 19 Vict. passed; (to wit,) "The South Wales Railway Consolidation Act, 1855:" And whereas the several Objects of this Act cannot be attained without the Authority of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, as follows; (to wit,)

Short Title.

I. This Act may be cited for all Purposes as "The Swansea" Harbour Act, 1857."

Limits of Act.

II. This Act shall be put in force within the Limits of the Harbour of Swansea, as defined by Section Three of the Act of 1854, and also within the Limits of the several Works by this Act authorized.

Act to be executed by the Trustees.

III. This Act shall be carried into execution by the Trustees, and, subject to the Provisions of this Act, the Powers of the Trustees under the Act of 1854 shall be applicable for the Execution by them of this Act

Construction of Terms.

IV. The following Words and Expressions have in this Act the following Meanings, unless there be in the Subject or Context something repugnant to such Construction; (to wit,)

The Expression "the Trinity House" means the Corporation of the Trinity House of Deptford Strond:

The Expression "the Trustees" means the Trustees incorporated. by the Act of 1854:

The Expression "the Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Swansea:

The Expression "Justices" means Justices of the Peace for the Borough of Swansea as well as Justices of the Peace for the County of Glamorgan:

The Expression "Ballast Lighter" means any Lighter, Barge, Boat, or other Vessel used for receiving or conveying Ballast:

The Word "Ballast" includes Stone, Gravel, Sand, Clay, Earth, Soil, and other Materials and Substances used as Ballast:

The Word "Rubbish" includes Ballast, Ashes, Filth, and other waste Materials and Substances.

the Twelfth Day of June One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, so far as it is not repugnant to any of the Powers and Provisions of this Act, may be carried into effect accordingly; and the vesting of the Undertaking, Docks, and Property of the Dock Company in the Trustees shall, except only so far as is by this Act otherwise provided, take effect subject and without Prejudice to the Terms and Conditions of that Agreement.

Docks vested in Trustees accordingly.

XI. Subject to the Provisions of this Act, the Undertaking, Docks, Estates, Lands, Works, Property, Books, Plans, Documents, Effects, Demands, Powers, Rights, and Privileges of or to which the Dock Company, by virtue of their several recited Acts or any other Act, or by any other Means whatsoever, are, on the First Day of September One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven (in this Act called the vesting Period), seised, possessed, or in any way entitled, at Law or in Equity, or otherwise howsoever, with the Appurtenances, except Arrears of Calls and Interest thereon, and other Moneys and Claims of or due to the Dock Company, shall by this Act be on and after the vesting Period transferred to and vested in the Trustees according to the Nature, Tenure, and Quality thereof respectively, but subject and without Prejudice to all Charges, Incumbrances, Claims, and Demands which at the vesting Period affect the Undertaking, Docks, Works, or Property of the Dock Company, or the Dock Company in respect of the same.

XII. Provided always, That as between the Trustees and the Dock Company all such Charges, Incumbrances, Claims, and Demands, except their Bond Debt of Thirty-three thousand Pounds, and the Interest, from and after the First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine inclusive, shall be borne and paid by the Dock Company.

The recited Agreement to be open to Inspection.

XIII. The recited Agreement of the Twelfth Day of June One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, now held by the Dock Company, shall, immediately after the passing of this Act, be deposited by the Dock Company at the Office of the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Glamorgan; and such Clerk of the Peace shall retain the said Agreement in his Custody, and shall at all reasonable Times permit all Persons to inspect the same, on Payment of One Shilling for every such Inspection, and the further Sum of One Shilling for every Hour during which such Inspection shall continue after the first Hour.

XVI. Notwithstanding such vesting and Repeal, the Docks and Docks, &c. Works of the Dock Company shall, with respect to all Duties, Tolls, Rates, Byelaws, Penalties, and Exemptions, be deemed to be within the Limits of the Harbour.

XVII. Notwithstanding such Repeal, the Enactment of the Act Provision as of the Forty-fourth Year of George the Third, Chapter Fifty-five, for to Coal on making a Railway or Tramroad from Swansea to Oystermouth, with Oystermouth respect to the Payment of Five Shillings a Ton on Coal and Culm to Railway the Trustees, shall not extend or apply to Coal or Culm carried along that Railway or Tramroad, and shipped at the Docks.

XX. After the vesting Period, and except only as is by the Act Trustees to otherwise expressly provided, the Trustees shall be subject to and perform Duties of shall perform and conform to all Duties, Obligations, and Liabilities Dock Comto which the Dock Company immediately before the vesting Period pany. are or but for this Act would become subject, and shall indemnify the Dock Company and their Officers and Servants, and the respective Representatives, from all such Duties, Obligations, and Liabilities, and all Costs, Damages, and Expenses in that Behalf.

XXI. Notwithstanding the vesting of the Undertaking, Docks, General Works, and Property of the Dock Company in the Trustees, and the Saving of Rights under Repeal of the recited Acts by this Act repealed, and except only as is repealed by this Act otherwise expressly provided, everything before the Acts. vesting Period done, suffered, and confirmed respectively under or by those Acts or any of them shall be as valid as if such vesting and Repeal had not happened, and such vesting and Repeal and this Act respectively

respectively shall accordingly be subject and without Prejudice to everything done, suffered, and confirmed respectively, and to all Rights, Liabilities, Claims, and Demands, both present and future, which, if such vesting and Repeal had not happened, and this Act were not passed, would be incident to or consequent on any and every thing so done, suffered, and confirmed respectively; and with respect to all such Rights, Liabilities, Claims, and Demands, the Trustees shall to all Intents represent the Dock Company: Provided always, that the Generality of this Enactment shall not be restricted by any other of the Clauses and Provisions of this Act.

XXII. Notwithstanding such vesting and Repeal, all the Provisions of any and every Act of Parliament (other than any Act by this Act repealed) relating to the Dock Company, and their Officers and Servants respectively, and at the vesting Period in force, shall be of like Force as if such vesting and Repeal had not happened, and may be exercised, enforced, and enjoyed by and against the Trustees, and their Officers and Servants respectively, in as full and beneficial a Manner, to all Intents and Purposes, as the same respectively might be exercised, enforced, and enjoyed by and against the Dock Company, and their Officers and Servants respectively, if this Act were not passed.

Contracts, &c. preserved. XXIII. Notwithstanding such vesting and Repeal, all Purchases, Sales, Conveyances, Deeds, Agreements, Securities, and Contracts before the vesting Period made under any Act by this Act repealed, or with respect to the Purposes thereof, shall be as effectual to all Intents for, against, and with respect to the Trustees as if the same had been made by, to, or with respect to them instead of the Dock Company, and may be proceeded on and enforced in like Manner to all Intents as if the Trustees were party or privy thereto, or referred to them instead of the Party actually party or privy thereto or referred to therein.

XXIV. Notwithstanding such vesting and Repeal, all Plans and Books of Reference, and all Corrections and Certificates of Corrections thereof respectively, deposited, for the Purposes of any Act by this Act repealed, with any Clerk of the Peace, shall remain in his Custody as if they were deposited for the Purposes of this Act, and according to the Provisions of the Act of the Session of the Seventh Year of William the Fourth and the First Year of Her present Majesty, Chapter Eighty-three; and every such Clerk of the Peace shall accordingly permit the same to be inspected, and Copies thereof and Extracts therefrom to be taken.

XXV. Notwithstanding such vesting and Repeal, in every Case in Money paid which under any Act by this Act repealed any Money is before the vesting Period paid into the Bank of England, or to any Trustee or Trustees, as Purchase or Compensation Money or on any Account, such Money, or the Stocks, Funds, or Securities in or upon which the same is from Time to Time, by the Order of the Court of Chancery or otherwise, invested, and the Interest, Dividends, and annual Produce thereof, shall, after the vesting Period, be applied and disposed of pursuant to such repealed Act.

XXVI. Provided always, That the Obligations of the Dock Com- But Trustees pany under such repealed Acts with respect to such Money, Stocks, to represent Dock Com-Funds, and Securities shall after the Commencement of this Act be pany as to performed and observed by the Trustees.

XXVII. Notwithstanding such vesting and Repeal, any Action, Actions not Suit, Prosecution, or other Proceeding commenced either by or to abate, &c. against the Dock Company before the vesting Period shall not abate or be discontinued or prejudicially affected by this Act, but, on the contrary, shall continue and take effect, both in favour of and against all Persons interested, in like Manner to all Intents as if this Act were not passed, save only that the Trustees shall be substituted therein for the Dock Company.

XXVIII. Notwithstanding such vesting and Repeal, all Persons Debts to be who immediately before the vesting Period owe any Money to the paid. Dock Company, or to any Person on their Behalf, shall pay the same, with all Interest (if any) due and payable or accruing for the same, to the Dock Company; and all Moneys which immediately before the vesting Period are owing by or recoverable from the Dock Company, or for the Payment of which they are or but for this Act would be liable, shall be paid, with all Interest (if any) due and payable or accruing for the same, by or be recoverable from the Trustees; but as between the Trustees and the Dock Company the Payments so made by the Trustees shall, save as regards the Bond Debt of the Dock Company for Thirty-three thousand Pounds, and the Interest thereon, from and after the First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine inclusive, be eventually borne by the Dock Company.

XXIX. Notwithstanding such vesting and Repeal, all Documents, Books, &c. Books, Plans, and Writings by any Act by this Act repealed directed continued Evidence, or authorized to be kept or made, and which if this Act were not passed would be receivable in Evidence, shall be admitted as Evidence in all Courts of Law and Equity and elsewhere accordingly.

Resolutions, &c. continued.

XXX. Notwithstanding such vesting and Repeal, all Resolutions, Orders, and Proceedings of General Meetings and Boards of Directors which immediately before the vesting Period are binding on the Dock Company, or their Directors, Officers, or Servants, or any of them, or the Corporation, or their Officers or Servants, or any of them, shall continue in full Force, and be in like Manner binding for the Purposes of this Act.

Certificates, &c. of Shares to remain in force.

XXXI. Notwithstanding such vesting and Repeal, all Certificates, Sales, Transfers, and Dispositions before the Commencement of this Act made or executed under the Acts by this Act repealed, or any of them, of or with respect to any Shares or Stock, shall, for the Purposes of this Act, remain in full Force and continue and be available in all respects.

Arrears of Calls on Shares to be Company.

XXXII. Notwithstanding such vesting and Repeal, the several Persons who immediately before the vesting Period are Shareholders paid to Dock of the Dock Company, their Heirs, Executors, Administrators, Successors, and Assigns respectively, shall pay such Part of the Amount subscribed by them respectively, and before the vesting Period called up, and at the vesting Period not paid, with all Interest due or to accrue due thereon, to the Dock Company when and as the Dock Company demand the same; and the Dock Company shall have all their now existing Powers for enforcing Payment of the same, and of forfeiting Shares for Nonpayment thereof.

Dock Company's Directors to remain in Office.

XXXIII. Notwithstanding such vesting and Repeal, but subject to the Provisions of this Act, the several Persons who at the vesting Period are the Directors of the Dock Company shall remain in Office until they respectively cease, according to the Provisions of this Act, to be Directors.

Repealed Acts to remain in force for winding up Affairs of Dock Company.

XXXIV. Notwithstanding such vesting and Repeal, all the Provisions of the several Acts by this Act repealed with respect to the Conduct and Regulation of the Affairs of the Dock Company, so far as is requisite for the winding up of that Company, and the several Purposes of this Act to be effected after the vesting Period by the Dock Company, shall remain in force.

Winding up and Dissolution of Dock Company.

XXXV. Forthwith after the vesting Period the Affairs of the Dock Company shall be wound up, and on their Affairs being wound up the Dock Company shall be dissolved, and shall thenceforth wholly cease to exist.

XXXVI. The winding up of the Affairs of the Dock Company shall take effect subject and without Prejudice to the Terms and Conditions

XXXVII. After Payment or Satisfaction of the Debts, Engage- Distribution ments, and Liabilities of the Dock Company, the Surplus of their of surplus of Assets of Assets shall be distributable among their Shareholders in rateable Dock Com-Proportion to their respective Shares in the Dock Company; and, so pany. far as is requisite for such Distribution, the surplus Assets may be sold or otherwise realized by the Dock Company.

XXXVIII. Such Distribution of Assets, so far as it is made in Cash, Mode of Disshall be made in like Manner in all respects as in the Case of tribution of Cash Assets. Payment of Dividends, and the Powers and Provisions in that Behalf of the several Acts by this Act repealed shall apply to such surplus Assets and the Distribution thereof accordingly: Provided always, that this Act shall not give to such surplus Assets the Character of Income, or interfere with the beneficial Enjoyment of the surplus Assets when distributed.

XXXIX. Such Distribution of Assets, so far as it is made in Mode of Dis-Dock Purchase Bonds, may be effected by the Dock Purchase Bonds tribution of being issued to the several Shareholders or any of them, or by being Mortgages. issued to the Dock Company, and transferred by them to the several Shareholders or any of them.

XL. Where any Person entitled to any distributable Share of the Payment of surplus Assets is not known, after diligent Inquiry, to the Dock Cash into Court. Company, or is by reason of any Incapacity or otherwise unable to give a valid Discharge for the same, or fails to give such Discharge when thereunto reasonably required by the Dock Company, the Sum, if any, payable in Cash to such Person may be paid by the Dock Company into the Court of Chancery under any Act for the Relief of Trustees from Time to Time in force.

XLIII. When the Affairs of the Dock Company are finally wound up, the Property in any Books, Papers, and Writings of the Dock Company, retained by them for the Purposes of such winding up, shall be by this Act vested in the Trustees, and shall be delivered to the Trustees accordingly; and the Trustees shall retain the same among their Records, and from Time to Time, on every reasonable Request, and at the Expense of any Person interested therein, shall produce the same as he requires, and shall permit every such Person to inspect the same, and shall deliver to him such Copies or Extracts of the same as he requires, on Payment of a reasonable Charge for the same.

LVIII. Provided always, That if and when such Canals, Tramroads, and Turntables, or any Part thereof, be wholly or partially removed, the Trustees shall restore the Road, Street, or Highway to its former Condition: Provided also, that where such Tramroads and Turntables cross any public Highway on the Level, the Flanges thereof shall not rise above or sink below the Level of the Highway more than One Inch: Provided also, that no Locomotive Engine shall be used upon any such Tramroad.

Power to erect leading Lights for Guidance of Vessels at Docks.

LXV. After the vesting Period, but subject to the Provisions of Section Seventy-eight of "The Harbours, Docks, and Piers Clauses Act, 1847," the Trustees from Time to Time may erect and maintain leading Lights for the Guidance of Vessels in such Positions upon any Parts of the Docks and Works as they think proper, and may charge the Swansea Docks Account with such reasonable Sums in that Behalf as they think fit.

Trustees to provide Lamps for lighting Docks, &c.

LXVI. After the vesting Period, the Trustees may from Time to Time provide and maintain such Lamps and Lights in such Places and in such Manner as they deem necessary for well and sufficiently lighting the Docks and Works, and may contract with any Person for lighting the Lamps, and the Trustees shall charge the Expense thereof to the Swansea Docks Account.

Penalty for breaking Lamps, &c.

LXVII. If any Person wilfully take away or damage any of the Lamps or Lights put up by virtue of this Act, or any of the Irons, Posts, or Furniture thereof, or wilfully extinguish the Light of any such Lamp or any such Light, every Person so offending shall for every such Offence forfeit not exceeding Forty Shillings; and if any Person accidentally break or otherwise damage any such Lamp, Light, Iron, Post, or Furniture thereof, and do not immediately on Demand make Satisfaction for the Damage done, then and in every such Case any One Justice may award such Sum to be paid by way of Satisfaction for such Damage as he thinks reasonable, and the same shall be deemed a Penalty imposed by this Act.

LXVIII. After the vesting Period, all Expenses incurred by the Trustees in respect of the Police of the Docks shall be charged by the Trustees to the Swansea Docks Account: Provided, that where any Constables are employed by the Trustees partly as the Police of the Docks, and partly as the Police of any other Parts of the Harbour, the Trustees shall apportion the Expenses of such Police between the Swansea Docks Account and the Swansea Harbour Account as is just and reasonable.

Class Two: For all Sugar, Grain, Corn, Flour, Hides, Dyewoods, Earthenware, Timber, Deals, Metals, except Iron, Tinplates, Nails, Anvils, Vices, and Chains, Threepence a Ton; and if conveyed in Carriages belonging to the Trustees, an additional Penny a Ton; and if propelled by an Engine belonging to the Trustees, an additional Penny a Ton:

Class Three: For all Cotton and other Wools, manufactured Goods, and all other Wares, Merchandises, Fish, Articles, Matters, or Things, Sixpence a Ton; and if conveyed in Carriages belonging to the Trustees, an additional Penny a Ton; and if propelled by an Engine belonging to the Trustees, an additional Penny a Ton:

Class Six: For every Ox, Cow, Bull, or Neat Cattle conveyed in or upon any such Carriage, Sixpence; and if conveyed in any Carriage belonging to the Trustees, an additional Twopence; [Local.] 24 K and

and if such Carriage be propelled by an Engine belonging to the Trustees, an additional Twopence:

Class Seven: For every Calf or Pig, Sheep, Lamb, or other small Animal, conveyed in or upon any such Carriage, Threepence; and if conveyed in or upon any Carriage belonging to the Trustees, an additional Penny; and if such Carriage be propelled by an Engine belonging to the Trustees, an additional Penny.

Tolls for Passengers.

In respect of Passengers conveyed in Carriages upon the Railway, as follows:

For every Person conveyed in or upon any such Carriage, Sixpence; and if conveyed in or upon any Carriage belonging to the Trustees, an additional Threepence; and if propelled by an Engine belonging to the Trustees, an additional Threepence.

Regulations as to the Tolls.

XCII. The following Regulations apply in the fixing of such Tolls; (to wit,)

For a Fraction of a Ton the Trustees may demand Toll according to the Numbers of Quarters of a Ton in such Fraction, and if there be a Fraction of a Quarter of a Ton the Fraction shall be deemed a Quarter of a Ton:

With respect to all Articles, except Stone and Timber, the Weight shall be determined according to the usual Avoirdupois Weight:

With respect to Stone and Timber, Fourteen Cubic Feet of Stone, and Forty Cubic Feet of Oak, Mahogany, Teak, Beech, or Ash, and Fifty Cubic Feet of any other Timber, shall be deemed One Ton Weight, and so in proportion for any smaller Quantity.

Tolls for small Parcels and single Articles of great Weight.

XCIII. With respect to small Packages and single Articles of great Weight, notwithstanding the Rate of Tolls prescribed by this Act, the Trustees may demand the Tolls following; (to wit,)

For the Carriage of small Parcels on the Railway, to wit, Parcels not exceeding Five hundred Pounds in Weight, the Trustees may demand and take any Sum they think fit:

Goods sent in large aggregate Quantities, although made up of separate Parcels, such as Bags of Sugar, Coffee, Meal, and the like, shall not be deemed small Parcels, but that Term applies only to single Parcels in separate Packages:

For the Carriage of any One Boiler, Cylinder, or single Piece of Machinery, or single Piece of Timber or Stone, or other single Article, the Weight of which, including the Carriage, exceeds Four Tons but does not exceed Eight Tons, the Trustees may demand any Sum not exceeding Two Shillings and Sixpence a Ton; and if conveyed in or upon a Carriage belonging to the Trustees, an additional One Shilling and Sixpence a Ton; and

if propelled by an Engine belonging to the Trustees, an additional Shilling a Ton:

For the Carriage of any single Article, the Weight of which, with the Carriage, exceeds Eight Tons, the Trustees may demand and take any Sum they think fit.

XCIV. Every Passenger travelling upon the Railway may take Passengers with him his ordinary Luggage, not exceeding in Weight One Luggage. hundred and twenty Pounds for First-class Passengers, One hundred Pounds for Second-class Passengers, and Sixty Pounds for Thirdclass Passengers, without any Charge being made for the Carriage thereof.

XCV. The maximum Rates of Charges to be made by the Trustees Maximum for the Conveyance of Passengers upon the Railway, including the Rates of Charges for Tolls for the User of the Railway and of Carriages, and for locomo- Passengers. tive Power, and every other Expense incidental to such Conveyance, shall not exceed the following Sums:

For every Passenger conveyed in a First-class Carriage, One Shilling:

For every Passenger conveyed in a Second-class Carriage, Ninepence:

For every Passenger conveyed in a Third-class Carriage, Fourpence.

XCVI. The maximum Rate of Charge to be made by the Trustees, Maximum including the Tolls for the User of the Railway, and of Carriages, Charges for and for locomotive Power, and every other Expense incidental to such Animals. Conveyance, except the loading and unloading of Goods, where that Service is performed by the Trustees, shall not exceed the Amounts following; (to wit,)

For Goods in Class One, Fourpence a Ton:

For Goods in Class Two, Fivepence a Ton:

For Goods in Class Three, Eightpence a Ton.

For any Carriage in Class Four not weighing more than One Ton, One Shilling and Tenpence; and if weighing more than One Ton, Fourpence for every Quarter of a Ton or Fraction of a Quarter of a Ton above Two Tons:

For Animals in Class Five, not exceeding One Shilling and Threepence each:

For Animals in Class Six, Tenpence each:

For Animals in Class Seven, Fivepence each.

XCVII. Nothing in this Act contained shall prevent the Trustees Trustees from taking any increased Charges, over and above the Charges by may take increased

Contracts and Traffic Arrangements with Railway Company.

Term of such Contracts.

XCIX. Any Contract or Arrangement from Time to Time made by and between the Trustees and the Railway Company for any of the Purposes for which they respectively are by this Act authorized to enter into Contracts or Arrangements may provide for all Matters incidental or accessary to those Purposes respectively, and may be on such Terms and Conditions whatsoever as the Parties thereto respectively think fit and mutually agree on.

Tolls to be taken by Railway Company.

C. It may be provided by any such Contract that the Railway Company may demand and take the Tolls by this Act granted for and with respect to the User of the Railway by this Act authorized to be made, and the Railway Company may demand and take Tolls accordingly, and for the Calculation of such Tolls Carriages and Engines belonging to the Railway Company while they work the Railway shall be deemed Carriages and Engines belonging to the Trustees.

Conditions of such Contracts.

Where the Trustees pay to any Mortgagee under this Act of the Swansea Docks Fund and the Swansea Harbour Fund jointly any Principal Money or Interest out of the Swansea Harbour Fund, the Amount so paid shall be entered in the Swansea Docks Account and the Swansea Harbour Account respectively as a Debt due from the Swansea Docks Fund to the Swansea Harbour Fund, and shall bear Interest after the Rate of Five Pounds per Centum per Annum from the Time of the Payment thereof by the Trustees.

Restriction on Payment out of Swansea Harbour Fund.

CXXXVII. Provided always, That the Trustees shall not apply, in Payment of any Principal Money or Interest secured by any Mortgage of the Swansea Docks Fund and the Swansea Harbour Fund jointly, any Moneys borrowed under this Act on the Security of the Railway Rates, Tolls, and Charges by this Act authorized, and of the Swansea Harbour Fund jointly, or vice versâ.

Application generally of Moneys borrowed.

CXXXVIII. All Moneys borrowed by the Trustees under this Act shall be applied only for the several Purposes for which the Moneys respectively are so borrowed.

Application of Penalties.

CXXXIX. The Justice by whom any Penalty is imposed by this Act, or any Byelaw made in pursuance thereof, may award not more than One Half thereof to the Informer, and shall award the Remainder to the Trustees, to be paid and applied to the Credit of the Swansea Harbour Fund.

Saving Rights of Admiralty. CXL. Provided always, That, except as is by this Act expressly provided, this Act, or anything therein contained, shall not take away, lessen, alter, or prejudice any of the Jurisdictions, Franchises, Rights, Powers, or Privileges of the Admiralty.

CXLI. Nothing in this Act contained shall defeat, prejudice, or affect any Right of the Duke of Beaufort, his Heirs and Assigns, as Lords of the Seigniories of Gower and Kilvey, or as Owner of any

Lands

Lands in, upon, or through which the Docks and Works by this Act Mines, &c. vested in the Trustees or any of them are made, to the Mines, under Docks. Minerals, or Quarries lying or being within or under the Lands used for such Docks and Works, or any of them, but all such Mines, Minerals, and Quarries are by this Act reserved to such Lords of Seigniories and to such Owners of such Lands respectively, their Heirs and Assigns; and, subject to the Provisions of this Act, including the Provisions of "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," incorporated therewith, the Lords of such Seigniories, or such Owner or Owners of such Lands respectively, may work all such Mines and Quarries, and take and carry away all such Coals, Ironstones, Ores, and other Minerals, as are gotten therein, to his and their own Use, in like Manner as if this Act were not passed.

CXLII. Provided always, That, except as is by this Act expressly Saving provided, this Act, or anything therein contained, shall not take Rights of away, lessen, prejudice, or alter the Royalty, Right, or Property of Beaufort to the Duke of Beaufort, his Heirs, Successors, or Assigns, in and to the River Tawe, Water Channel and Soil of the River of Swansea otherwise Tawe, and &c. the Port and Harbour thereof, and the Fisheries therein, and the River itself, or his or their Right, Power, or Authority to remove and prevent any present and future Weirs and Erections thereon, and to stop and impede any present or future Watercourses, Diversions, and perfect Use of the Streams thereof in anywise whatsoever, or in any Manner take away, lessen, prejudice, or alter any Royalties, Rights, Properties, Duties, Tolls, Payments, Powers, Authorities, Jurisdictions, Privileges, Liberties, and Franchises whatsoever of or belonging to the Duke, his Heirs, Successors, or Assigns, in the Seigniories of Gower and Kilvey, as Lord or Lords thereof, and otherwise, or of any future Lords or Ladies thereof, or as Admiral or Admirals of the Seas, Bays, Havens, Creeks, Ports, or Rivers within, bordering on, and surrounding the same, or of his or their Officer or Officers in their respective Duties within the same, but the same respectively shall remain to him and them entire wholly and altogether as if this Act were not passed.

CXLIII. with respect to all Matters under that Indenture, as modified by the recited Agreement of the Twelfth Day of June One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, represent the Dock Company.

Saving Rights of Water Bailiff and Layer Keeper of Swansea Harbour.

CXLIV. Nothing in this Act contained shall take away, lessen, prejudice, alter, or interfere with any Right, Power, Duty, or Authority of the Water Bailiff within the Port and Harbour of Swansea, or of the ancient Officer the Layer Keeper within the same; and the Docks shall be deemed to be within and Part of the Port and Harbour of Swansea in all Questions concerning any Fees, Dues, or Emoluments belonging or appertaining to those Offices respectively.

Saving the Rights of Traders to Port Tennant.

CXLV. Nothing in this Act contained shall defeat, take away, or prejudice any of the Rights, Benefits, Exemptions from Toll, or Privileges which any Person having or being entitled to any Property at or near to or trading to or from Port Tennant was possessed of or had any Right or Title to immediately before the passing of this Act, but all such Persons shall have and enjoy all such Rights, Benefits, Privileges, and Exemptions from Tolls, Rates, or Duties as they respectively were entitled to or might enjoy immediately before the passing of this Act.

Saving Corporation.

CXLVI. Provided always, That, except as is by this Act ex-Rights of the pressly provided, nothing in this Act contained shall take away, lessen, prejudice, or alter any of the Rights, Tolls, Benefits, Privileges, Emoluments, Liberties, Franchises, or Jurisdictions which the Corporation were possessed of or had a Right unto, by Charter, Prescription, Custom, or otherwise howsoever, before the passing of this Act.

Saving Rights of the Trustees generally.

CXLVII. Except as is by this Act expressly provided, nothing this Act contained shall take away, lessen, prejudice, or alter any of the Rates, Tolls, Dues, Rights, Interests, Powers, Privileges, or Authorities of the Trustees.

Provisions as to General Acts relating

CXLVIII. Nothing in this Act contained shall exempt the Docks, or the Harbour, or the Trustees, from the Provisions of any General to Docks, &c. Act relating to Docks or Harbours, or Dues on Shipping or Pilotage, now in force or which may be passed during the present or any future Session of Parliament.

Railway not exempt from Provisions of present and ral Acts.

CXLIX. This Act or anything therein shall not exempt the Railway from the Provisions of any General Act relating to this Act, or of any General Act relating to Railways, or to the better or more future Gene- impartial Audit of the Accounts of Railway Companies respectively, now in force or which may hereafter pass during this or any future

Session

Session of Parliament, or from any future Revision and Alteration, under the Authority of Parliament, of the maximum Rates of Fares and Charges, or of Tolls for small Parcels, by this Act respectively authorized.

CL. All the Costs, Charges, and Expenses of and incident to the Expenses of applying for, obtaining, and passing of this Act shall be paid in the Act. first instance by the Trustees out of the Swansea Harbour Fund, and the Swansea Harbour Fund shall be recouped for any Sums paid thereout for such Purpose out of the Moneys by this Act authorized to be borrowed for completing the Docks and making the said Railway, and the Amount repaid to the Swansea Harbour Fund shall be apportioned between the Swansea Docks Account and the Swansea Harbour Railway Account in such Proportions as the Trustees may determine.
