An Act for providing and constructing an improved Cattle Market, Market Places, and Slaughter-houses, with all necessary Approaches and Conveniences, within the Parish of *Saint Thomas* in the County of the City of *Dublin*.

[17th July 1862.]

WHEREAS the present Market called *Smithfield* Market, in the City of *Dublin*, for the Sale of Cattle, Horses, Sheep, Pigs, and other marketable Commodities, is insufficient for the Accommodation of the Inhabitants of the said City, and for the Purposes of Persons buying and selling therein: And whereas it is expedient to erect a new Market, to be called the *Dublin* Cattle Market, with necessary Slaughter-houses and other Offices and Buildings, to be situate on the North Side of the said City of *Dublin* in the Parish of *Saint Thomas*, for the Sale of Cattle, Horses, Sheep, Pigs, Hides, Skins, and other marketable Commodities: And whereas certain Lands and Premises in the *North Lotts*, immediately adjoining the *Liffey* Branch of the *Midland Great Western* Railway, and extending from the *Dublin and Drogheda* Railway to *East Road* and *Sheriff Street*, as delineated on a Plan or Plans thereof which have been deposited as herein-after

mentioned, would form a suitable Site for the Purposes aforesaid: And whereas the several Persons first herein-after named, with others, have agreed to form themselves into a Company and provide the necessary Capital for the said Purposes: And whereas it is expedient that the Right Honourable the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of *Dublin* should be enabled to purchase the said intended Market, Slaughter-houses, and other necessary Buildings, and all Rights, Powers, and Privileges to be conferred by the said Act: And whereas the Objects aforesaid cannot be effected without the Authority of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, as follows; (that is to say,)

1. The several Acts of Parliament following, *videlicet*, "The Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," except such Portions thereof as are repealed or otherwise provided for by "The Railways Acts (*Ireland*), 1851 and 1860," "The Railways Acts (*Ireland*), 1851 and 1860," with respect to the Purchase and taking of Lands otherwise than by Agreement, "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts Amendment Act, 1860," and "The Markets and Fairs Clauses Act, 1847," shall be incorporated with and form Part of this Act, save so far as is otherwise provided by this Act, or the same are inconsistent therewith.

Short Title.

2. This Act may be cited for all Purposes as "The *Dublin Cattle Market Act, 1862.*"

Limits of
Act.

3. The Limits within which this and the incorporated Acts shall be put in force shall comprise and include the Area of the said intended Market, together with the several Entrances and Approaches thereto, situate in the Parish of *Saint Thomas* in the County of the City of *Dublin*; that is to say, an Area bounded on the North-west by the *Dublin and Drogheda* Railway, on the West by the *Liffey* Branch of the *Midland Great Western* Railway, on the South by *Sheriff Street*, on the South-east by the Road or Street called *East Street*, and on the North-east by the Road or Street known as the *East Wall*.

4. The Newspapers in which Advertisements and Notices may be published under the Provisions of this Act shall be some daily Newspaper published or circulated in the City of *Dublin*.

5. Sir *Percy Nugent* Baronet, *Richard Martin*, *James Digges La Touche*, *Thomas M'Donnell*, *Ernest Knox*, *Henry Davis*, and all other Persons and Corporations who have subscribed or shall hereafter subscribe to the Undertaking, and the Executors, Administrators, Successors, and Assigns

Assigns of such Persons and Corporations respectively, shall be incorporated by the Name of "The *Dublin Cattle Market Company*," hereinafter called "the Cattle Market Company," and by that Name shall be a Body Corporate, with perpetual Succession and a Common Seal, and shall have Power to purchase and hold Lands within the Restrictions herein contained.

6. The Expression "Corporation" in this Act, and in the Acts incorporated therewith, shall be considered to mean the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of *Dublin*. Corporation.

7. The Capital of the Cattle Market Company shall be Forty thousand Pounds, and the Number of Shares in which the Capital shall be divided shall be Four thousand, and the Amount of each Share shall be Ten Pounds. Capital of Cattle Market Company.

8. The greatest Amount of any One Call which the Cattle Market Company may make on the Shareholders shall be Two Pounds *per Share*, and Three Months at least shall intervene between any Two successive Calls, and no more than Two Thirds of the Amount of each Share shall be called up in any One Year. Calls on Shares.

9. It shall be lawful for the Cattle Market Company to borrow on Mortgage any Sums not exceeding in the whole the Sum of Ten thousand Pounds, but no Part of such Sum shall be borrowed until the whole of the said Capital of Forty thousand Pounds shall have been subscribed for, and One Half Part thereof shall have been actually paid up, and until the Cattle Market Company shall prove to the Justice who is to certify, under the Provisions contained in the Fortieth Section of "The Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," before he so certifies, that all such Capital has been subscribed for *bonâ fide*, and is held by Subscribers or their Assigns, and for which such Subscribers or their Assigns are legally liable. Power for Cattle Market Company to borrow on Mortgage.

10. The Number of Directors of the Cattle Market Company in the first instance shall be Nine, but it shall be lawful for the Company at any Time to reduce the Number to Six. Number of Directors of Cattle Market Company.

11. Sir *Percy Nugent Bart.*, *Richard Martin*, *William Pare*, and *John Wallis*, with others hereafter to be named, shall be the First Directors of the Cattle Market Company. First Directors of Company.

12. The Qualification of a Director of the Cattle Market Company shall be the Possession of Forty Shares in the Undertaking Qualification of Directors.

13. The

Quorum of Meeting of Directors.

13. The Quorum of a Meeting of Directors of the Cattle Market Company shall be Three.

First Ordinary Meeting of Company.

14. The First Ordinary Meeting of the Cattle Market Company shall be held within Three Months after the passing of this Act.

Shareholders of Company may convene Meetings.

15. It shall be lawful for Ten or more Shareholders holding in the aggregate not less than One Fifteenth of the Capital of the Cattle Market Company to require that an Extraordinary Meeting of the Company shall be held.

Power to construct Market.

16. Whereas Plans of the proposed Market and of the Approaches thereto, and of the other Works in connexion therewith, to be authorized by this Act, and also a Book of Reference containing the Names of the Owners or reputed Owners, Lessees or reputed Lessees, and of the Occupiers of the Lands in, through, by, near, or along which the same are proposed to be executed, have been deposited with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of the City of *Dublin*: Be it enacted, That, subject to the Provisions in this Act and the Acts incorporated therewith contained, it shall be lawful for the Cattle Market Company, upon the Lands delineated on the said Plans and Sections and described in the said Book of Reference, to enter, and the same to take and appropriate for the Purposes of this Act, and upon the Lands so entered upon, taken, and appropriated to make, construct, provide, and establish a new Market Place or Market Places, and Slaughter-houses, with all necessary Buildings, Works, Approaches, Stalls, Pens, Conveniences, and Appurtenances thereto, for the Sale of Cattle, Horses, Sheep, Pigs, Hides, Skins, and other marketable Commodities, and of all such other marketable Commodities as are in Schedule (A.) to this Act annexed respectively mentioned or referred to, and to make, execute, and maintain the same, and the Approaches thereto, and other Works in connexion therewith, upon the Lands delineated and described in the said Plans.

Errors and Omissions in Plan and Book of Reference to be corrected by Justices, who shall certify the same.

17. If any Omission, Mis-statement, or erroneous Description shall have been made of any Lands, or of the Owners, Lessees, or Occupiers of any Lands described or purporting to be described on the said Plans or in the said Book of Reference, the Cattle Market Company may, after giving Ten Days Notice to the Owners, Lessees, and Occupiers of the Lands affected by such proposed Correction, apply to Two Justices acting in and for the Borough of *Dublin* for the Correction thereof; and if it shall appear to such Justices that such Omission, Mis-statement, or erroneous Description arose from Mistake, they shall certify the same accordingly, and shall in such Certificate insert the Particulars of any such Omission; and such Certificate shall be deposited in the Office of the Clerk of the Peace for the County of the City of *Dublin*, and shall be

kept by him along with the other Documents to which they relate, and thereupon such Plan and Book of Reference shall be deemed to be corrected according to such Certificate, and the Cattle Market Company may make the Market and all necessary Buildings in accordance with such Certificate.

18. It shall be lawful for the Cattle Market Company, for the Purpose of carrying into effect the Provisions of this Act, to stop up, temporarily or permanently, Part of *Church Road* in the said Parish of *Saint Thomas*, and temporarily to stop up, alter, or divert all other Streets, Lanes, Passages, Sewers, Watercourses, Gas and Water Pipes with which it may be necessary to interfere during the Progress of the Works hereby authorized; provided that before any such Stoppage, Alteration, or Diversion shall take place the Company shall provide and maintain during the Progress of the Works a suitable Road in lieu of that stopped up, altered, or diverted.

Power to stop up certain Lanes in the Parish of Saint Thomas.

19. Before the Cattle Market Company proceed temporarily to stop up, alter, or divert any Street, Lane, Passage, Sewer, Drain, or Water Pipe, they shall give to the Engineer of the Corporation, or other Officer under whose Control or Management the same may be, Notice in Writing of their Intention to stop up, alter, or divert the same, not less than Three clear Days before beginning such Work; and no such Street, Lane, Passage, Sewer, Drain, or Water Pipe shall be stopped up, altered, or diverted, except under the Regulations and according to such Plan as shall be approved of by such Engineer or other Officer, or in case of any Difference respecting such Regulations or Plan, then according to such Regulations and Plan as shall be determined by Two Justices; and such Justices may, on the Application of the Persons having the Control or Management of any such Street, Lane, Passage, Sewer, Drain, or Water Pipe, require the Cattle Market Company to make such temporary or other Works as they may think necessary for guarding against any Interruption of the Traffic, Water Supply, or Drainage during the Execution of any Works which interfere with the same: Provided always, that if the Persons having such Control or Management as aforesaid fail to attend at the Time fixed for the temporary stopping up, Alteration, or Diversion of such Street, Lane, Passage, Sewer, Drain, or Water Pipe, after having had such Notice of the Intention of the Cattle Market Company as aforesaid, or shall not propose any Plan for the same, or shall refuse or neglect to superintend the Operation, the Cattle Market Company may perform the Works specified in such Notice without the Superintendence of such Engineer or other Officer.

Notice to be served on Persons having Control, &c., before stopping up Streets, &c.

20. When the Cattle Market Company stop up, alter, or divert any Street, Lane, Passage, Sewer, Drain, or Water Pipe, they shall with all convenient Speed complete the Work for which the same shall be inter-

ferred with, and fill in the Ground, and reinstate and make good the Road or Pavement, or the Sewer, Drain, or Water Pipe so stopped up, altered, or diverted, and carry away the Rubbish occasioned thereby, and shall at all Times whilst any such Street, Lane, or Passage shall be so stopped up or interfered with cause the same to be fenced and guarded, and shall cause a Light sufficient for the warning of Passengers to be set up and maintained against or near such Street, Lane, or Passage where the same shall be stopped up or interfered with, every Night during which the same shall be stopped up or interfered with, and shall keep the Road or Pavement which has been broken up in good Repair for Three Months after replacing and making good the same, and for such further Time, if any, not being more than Twelve Months in the whole, as the Soil so broken up shall continue to subside.

21. If the Cattle Market Company stop up, alter, or divert any Street, Lane, Passage, or any Sewer, Drain, or Water Pipe, without giving such Notice as aforesaid, or in a Manner different from that which shall have been approved of or determined as aforesaid, or without making such temporary or other Works as aforesaid, when so required, or if the Cattle Market Company make any Delay in completing any such Work, or in filling in the Ground, or in reinstating and making good the Road or Pavement, or the Sewer, Drain, or Water Pipe so stopped up, altered, or diverted, or in carrying away the Rubbish occasioned thereby, or if they neglect to cause the Place where such Road or Pavement has been broken up to be fenced, guarded, and lighted, or neglect to keep the Road or Pavement in repair for the Space of Three Months next after the same is made good, or such further Time as aforesaid, they shall forfeit to the Persons having the Control or Management of the Street, Lane, Passage, Sewer, Drain, or Water Pipe in respect of which such Default is made a Sum not exceeding Five Pounds for each Day during which any such Delay or Omission as aforesaid shall continue after they shall have received Notice thereof, such Penalty to be recovered and recoverable before One or more Justice or Justices, in the Manner provided for the Recovery of Penalties by "The Railways Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," which Act, so far as it relates to the Recovery of Damages and Penalties not specially provided for, is hereby incorporated with this Act.

22. If any Delay or Omission as aforesaid take place, the Persons having the Control or Management of the Street, Lane, Passage, Sewer, Drain, or Water Pipe in respect of which such Delay or Omission shall take place, may cause the Work so delayed or omitted to be executed, and the Expense for executing the same shall be repaid to such Persons by the Cattle Market Company, and such Expenses may be recovered in the same Manner as Damages are recoverable under or in accordance with the Provisions of the said last-mentioned Act.

23. The Lands to be purchased by Agreement for the Extension or Improvement of the Market shall not exceed Two Acres.

Lands for extraordinary Purposes.

24. The several Works hereby authorized shall be completed within Three Years after the passing of this Act, and on the Expiration of such Period the Powers by this Act and the Acts incorporated herewith shall cease to be exercised, except as to so much of the Market as shall then be completed.

Period for Completion of Works.

25. The Powers for the compulsory taking of Lands shall not be exercised after the Expiration of Two Years from the passing of this Act.

Powers for compulsory Purchases limited.

26. If at any Time or Times hereafter the Market to be established under the Provisions of this Act shall be found to be not sufficiently commodious or capacious, it shall be lawful for the Cattle Market Company to enlarge and improve the same from Time to Time, and all and singular the Powers and Provisions of this Act and the said incorporated Acts, except the Powers for the Purchase of Lands otherwise than by Agreement, shall be applicable for the Purposes of enlarging and improving the same, and of regulating and maintaining the same when enlarged and improved.

Power to enlarge Cattle Market from Time to Time.

27. It shall be lawful for the said Cattle Market Company, and they are hereby empowered, with the Consent of the *Midland Great Western* Railway Company and the *Dublin and Drogheda* Railway Company, or either of them, to make and maintain suitable and convenient Roadways and Approaches to said Lines of Railway respectively, or either of them, and to construct all necessary Roadways and Approaches from said Lines of Railway respectively, leading to and terminating at convenient Points in said Market, for the safe and convenient Transmission of Cattle, Sheep, Pigs, Hides, Skins, and other marketable Commodities to the said Market, and for said Purposes or either of them to enter into all necessary Agreements for the running of Cattle Trains, Use and shunting of Waggon, Erection of Turn-tables, Points, Gates, Sheds, Embankments, and the Construction of all other Works, Conveniences, and Appurtenances necessary for such Purposes.

Power to make Approaches between Cattle Market and the *Midland Great Western* and *Dublin and Drogheda* Railways.

28. After the Market hereby authorized to be provided shall be opened for public Use, it shall be lawful for the Cattle Market Company, or any Inspector or other Person appointed by the said Company under this Act, to keep Order in such Market so opened as aforesaid, and the several Approaches thereto, and for any such Inspector or Person as aforesaid, or any Constable or Policeman, to summons before the Divisional Justices of the Police District of the *Dublin* Metropolis any Person causing or creating any Nuisance or Obstruction within the Limits of this Act, and every Person for every such Offence shall be liable to a Penalty not exceeding Forty Shillings.

When new Cattle Market opened, Cattle Market Company may keep Order therein.

29. The Rights, Powers, and Authority of the Right Honourable the Lord Mayor as Clerk of the Markets for the Time being, and also of the Corporation of *Dublin* in their corporate Capacity, whether by Prescription, Charter, or Statute Law, or under or by virtue of the Provisions of "The *Dublin* Improvement Act, 1849," and the several Acts incorporated therewith, as far as the same are not inconsistent with the Powers and Provisions expressly given by this Act, shall be hereafter exercised and enjoyed in as large and ample a Manner as they have been heretofore exercised and enjoyed by them respectively.

30. Provided always, That no Byelaws made under the Authority conferred by this Act or any Act incorporated therewith shall come into operation until the same shall have been allowed by the Lord Mayor; or, in case of his Refusal to allow the same or any Part thereof, it shall be lawful for the Cattle Market Company to lay the same before the Lord Lieutenant in Council, who shall have Power to examine into such Byelaws, and to allow or disallow the same or any Part thereof, as to him may seem meet.

31. The Production of a written or printed Copy of the Byelaws requiring Confirmation by the Lord Mayor for the Time being, authenticated by the Signature of the Lord Mayor for the Time being who shall have approved of the same, and a written or printed Copy of the Byelaws not requiring such Confirmation or Approval, authenticated by the Common Seal of the Cattle Market Company, shall be Evidence of the Existence and making of such Byelaws, in all Cases of Prosecution under the same, without Proof of the Signature of such Lord Mayor, or the Common Seal aforesaid; and with respect to the Proof of the Publication of any such Byelaws, it shall be sufficient to prove that a painted Board containing a Copy thereof was put up and continued in manner by this Act directed, and in case of its afterwards being displaced or damaged that such Board was replaced or restored as soon as conveniently might be, unless Proof be adduced by the Party complained against that such painted Board did not contain a Copy of such Byelaws, or was not duly put up or continued as directed by this Act.

32. This Act or anything therein shall not exempt the Slaughter-houses by this Act authorized to be erected from the Provisions of any General Act relating to Slaughter-houses, or to their better Regulation, within the County of the said City of *Dublin*, which may be passed during this or any future Session of Parliament.

33. The Cattle Market Company may let any of the Houses, Shops, Stalls, Pens, Stands, Benches, Ground Spaces, and other Conveniences in the Market to any Person for any Term not exceeding Fourteen
Years,

Years at such Rents and on such Terms and Conditions as shall be mutually agreed upon.

34. From and after the Commencement of this Act, the Cattle Market Company and their Lessees may from Time to Time demand and take from any Person offering or exposing for Sale any Cattle, Horses, Sheep, Pigs, Skins, or Hides in the Market, such Tolls as the Cattle Market Company or their Lessees may from Time to Time appoint, not exceeding the several Tolls specified in the Schedule (A.) to this Act annexed.

35. The Cattle Market Company and their Lessees from Time to Time may demand and take from every Person bringing into the said Market any Waggon or Cart, or who shall pitch any Commodities in such Market, such Tolls as the Cattle Market Company or their Lessees from Time to Time appoint, not exceeding the several Tolls specified in the Schedule (B.) to this Act annexed.

36. The Cattle Market Company and their Lessees from Time to Time may demand and take from any Person slaughtering Cattle in any Slaughter-house belonging to the Market Company any Tolls not exceeding those specified in the Schedule (C.) to this Act annexed.

37. The several Tolls in the Market payable with respect to the Occupation of any House, Shop, Stall, Pen, Bench, Compartment, or Space of Ground shall be paid, not only by the original Taker or Occupier thereof for the Part of a Day or other Time, but also by any subsequent Taker or Occupier thereof for any other Part of the same Day or other Time.

38. It shall be lawful for the Commissioners of Police within the District of the *Dublin* Metropolis from Time to Time to make and publish Orders for regulating the Route within the said District of Cattle to or from the Market to be holden under this Act, and the Times during which Cattle shall be allowed to be driven by such Routes; and any Person driving any Cattle within the said District who shall disobey any such Orders shall for every such Offence be liable to a Penalty not exceeding Forty Shillings.

39. If at any Time within Three Years after the passing of this Act the Corporation shall make an Offer in Writing under their Corporate Seal to purchase the said Market, Buildings, Works, Tolls, Property, Rights, and Privileges, for a Sum not less than the Amount then paid up, borrowed, and expended by the Cattle Market Company, or which the Cattle Market Company may be liable to pay, together with Interest thereon at the Rate of Five Pounds *per Cent. per Annum* from the

Date of the respective Payments of the Calls made on the Shareholders and of the borrowing by the Cattle Market Company, then the Cattle Market Company shall sell the same to the Corporation; but in the event of the said Cattle Market Company not agreeing to accept the said Amount, then the further Amount of Purchase Money or Compensation (not being less than the Amount so paid up and borrowed and expended by the Cattle Market Company, or which the Cattle Market Company may be liable to pay, together with Interest thereon as aforesaid,) shall be ascertained in the Manner provided by the Railways Clauses Acts, *Ireland*, 1851 and 1860.

40. It shall be lawful for the Cattle Market Company and they are hereby required, on Payment by the Corporation of the Purchase Money, to convey and absolutely dispose of to the Corporation the Market Buildings, Works, Tolls, Property, Rights, and Privileges, but subject to all Mortgages, Charges, Incumbrances, Claims, and Demands whatsoever at the Time of such Purchase affecting the same; and after the Sale and Transfer to the Corporation the Corporation shall hold, use, and enjoy all and every the Powers, Rights and Privileges, Claims, and Demands of the Cattle Market Company, in as full, ample, and beneficial a Manner as the said Cattle Market Company may have, possess, claim, or enjoy the same.

41. Such Transfer shall be evidenced sufficiently and conclusively by a Deed of Transfer, duly stamped, and in which Deed the Consideration for the same shall be fully and truly set forth.

42. Two Parts of the Deed of Transfer shall be executed, and one Part thereof shall be deposited by the Company with the Town Clerk of the Borough of *Dublin*, and the other Part thereof shall be retained by the Corporation.

43. The Part so deposited with the said Town Clerk shall be received and retained by him, and he shall permit all Persons interested to inspect the same, and to make Copies and Extracts from the same, upon the like Terms, and under like Penalty for Default, as provided by the Act of the Session of the Seventh Year of *William IV.* and the First Year of Her present Majesty, Chapter 83, with respect to Documents therein referred to.

44. All the Costs, Charges, and Expenses of and incidental to the preparing and passing of this Act shall be borne and paid by the Cattle Market Company.
