

The Port Talbot Company's Act, 1865.

Company is Seventy thousand Pounds, divided into Seven hundred Shares of One hundred Pounds each, the whole of which have been fully paid up, and the Company have borrowed and now owe on Mortgage the Sum of Twenty-five thousand Pounds: And whereas it is expedient that the Company be empowered to raise a further Sum of Money for the Purposes of their Undertaking, and that some of the Provisions of the recited Acts be amended: And whereas it is also expedient that the Company should be authorized to alter their existing Tolls, Rates, and Duties, and in lieu thereof to charge the Tolls, Rates, and Duties herein-after mentioned, and to make other Provisions with respect to Tolls, Rates, and Duties; but the Purposes aforesaid cannot be effected without the Authority of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, as follows; (that is to say,)

Short Title. 1. This Act may be cited for any Purpose as "The *Port Talbot Company's Act, 1865.*"

Certain Provisions of 8 & 9 Vict. c. xvi. and 26 & 27 Vict. c. cxviii. incorporated.

2. The Clauses and Provisions of "The Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845,"

With respect to the Distribution of the Capital of the Company into Shares;

With respect to the Transfer or Transmission of Shares;

With respect to the Payment of Subscriptions and the Means of enforcing the Payment of Calls;

With respect to the Forfeiture of Shares for Nonpayment of Calls;

With respect to the borrowing of Money by the Company on Mortgage or Bond;

With respect to the Conversion of borrowed Money into Capital;

With respect to the Consolidation of Shares into Stock;

With respect to the Remedies of the Creditors of the Company against Shareholders, and with respect to affording Access to the Special Act;

and also the Clauses and Provisions of "The Companies Clauses Act, 1863," following; namely,

Part I., with respect to Cancellation and Surrender of Shares;

Part II., with respect to additional Capital;

shall, so far as the same respectively are applicable to the Purposes of and are not altered or varied by this Act, be incorporated with this Act, and shall apply to all Shares created, and to Mortgages granted, and Money borrowed under the Powers of this Act.

3. The Company may from Time to Time raise, by the Creation of new Shares, such Sums of Money as they shall think fit, not exceeding in the whole Eighty thousand Pounds, and may create and issue such Shares either wholly or partially as Ordinary or wholly or partially as Preference Shares, as they think fit.

Power to raise additional Capital by new Shares.

4. It shall not be lawful for the Company to issue any new Share under this Act, nor shall any Share vest in the Person accepting the same, unless and until a Sum not being less than One Fifth Part of the Amount of such Share shall have been paid in respect thereof.

Shares not to issue until One Fifth paid up.

5. Except as by this Act otherwise provided, the Shares created by the Company under this Act, and the Holders of those Shares respectively, shall be subject and entitled to the same Powers, Provisions, Forfeitures, Liabilities, Rights, Privileges, and Incidents whatsoever in all respects as if those Shares formed Part of the now existing Capital of the Company.

New Shares to be subject to same Incidents as Ordinary Shares.

6. Every Holder of a Share created under this Act shall in respect of the same be a Shareholder in the Company, and shall be entitled to a Dividend, either preferential or ordinary, as the Case may be, with the other Holders of Shares of the same Class or Description, proportioned to the whole Amount from Time to Time called and paid on such Shares.

Dividends on new Shares.

7. The Holders of Shares created under this Act shall have Rights of voting and Qualifications in respect thereof on the Principle that each Sum of One hundred Pounds paid up in respect of the Shares held by any such Holder shall be deemed equivalent to One original Share of One hundred Pounds in the Capital of the Company: Provided, that no Person shall be entitled to vote in respect of any less amount than One hundred Pounds paid up; provided also, that (unless otherwise specified in any Resolution of the Company) no Person shall be entitled to vote in respect of any Share created or issued under this Act to which a preferential Dividend shall be assigned.

Votes and Qualifications in respect of new Shares.

8. The Company may borrow on Mortgage any Sum not exceeding in the whole the sum of Twenty-five thousand Pounds, but they shall not borrow any Part of the said Sum until after Shares for the whole of the Sum by this Act authorized to be raised by Shares shall have been issued and taken up, and One Half of such Sum shall have been paid up, and the Company shall have proved to the Justice who is to certify under the 40th Section of "The Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," before he so certifies, that Shares for all the Capital which the Company are by this Act authorized to raise by the Creation of new Shares have been issued and accepted, and that

that One Half of such Capital has been paid up, and that not less than One Fifth Part thereof has been paid on account of each separate Share before or at the Time of the Issue or Acceptance thereof, and that such Shares were issued and taken *bonâ fide*, and are held by the Subscribers or their Assigns, and that such Subscribers or their Assigns are legally liable for the same, of which Facts the Certificate of the Justice under that Section shall be sufficient Evidence.

Priority of existing Mortgages.

9. All Mortgages granted by the Company before the passing of this Act, and which shall then be in force, shall during their Continuance have Priority over all Mortgages granted by the Company under this Act.

Debenture Stock.

10. For the Purpose of discharging the Mortgage and Bond Debts of the Company, and of raising Money which the Company are authorized to borrow, the Company may create and issue Debenture Stock at such Rate of Interest as they may think fit, but not to exceed Four Pounds Ten Shillings *per Cent. per Annum*; and Part III. of "The Companies Clauses Act, 1863," is incorporated with this Act.

Certain Sections of Two first-recited Acts repealed.

11. The 80th Section of the Act of 1834 and the 19th and 20th Sections of the Act of 1836 are hereby repealed.

Tonnage Rates.

12. The Company from Time to Time may ask, demand, take, recover, and receive for every Ship or Vessel of the Burthen of Three hundred Tons and upwards by Admeasurement which shall enter *Port Talbot* a Sum for every Time of entering the same not exceeding One Shilling and Threepence *per Ton Register Burthen*, and for every Ship or Vessel of a less Burthen than Three hundred Tons by Admeasurement which shall enter the said Port a Sum for every Time of entering the same not exceeding One Shilling *per Ton Register Burthen*, to be paid by the Master thereof before leaving the said Port or Harbour; and for every Ship or Vessel built within the said Port or Harbour One Half of the above Rates, according to her Tonnage; and such Rates shall be collected, paid, recovered, and applied in the same Manner and by the same Ways and Means as in the recited Acts are mentioned with regard to the Tolls or Duties granted by such Acts: Provided always, that the Exemptions granted to certain Ships and Vessels by the 59th and 60th Sections of the Act of 1834 shall not be in any Manner affected or prejudiced by this Enactment.

Further Rates payable by Vessels remaining in

13. If any Vessel using *Port Talbot*, whether the same shall previously have paid or been liable to pay Rates or not, remain in the said Port longer than Thirty Days, the Company may demand for every such Vessel a further Rate of Twopence *per Ton* for every Week, and

and so in proportion for any Period less than a Week, during which such Vessel remains in the Port beyond Thirty Days, in addition to the Tolls payable by virtue of this Act: Provided always, that such additional Rates shall not be payable for any Vessel prevented from leaving the Port or Harbour by an Embargo or Stress of Weather.

14. The Company may take or receive for every Article of Goods, Wares, Merchandise, Iron, or Minerals brought into or landed or deposited within or delivered or shipped from the Docks and Works such reasonable Rates, Rents, or Sums as the Company from Time to Time appoint for and in respect of Wharfage, unshipping, landing, relanding, piling, housing, warehousing, weighing, coopering, sampling, unpling, unhousing, watching, shipping, loading, and delivering of every such Article, and of any Work to be performed in respect of the same; and the Company shall from Time to Time make a Table of the Rates, Rents, and Sums charged by them for and in respect of the Wharfage, unshipping, landing, relanding, piling, housing, warehousing, weighing, sampling, unpling, unhousing, watching, shipping, loading, and delivering of every such Article, and the Table shall be printed, and open to Inspection in the several Offices of the Company, and Copies be delivered free of Expense to any Persons having Occasion for and reasonably requiring the same: Provided, that as regards Import Rates or Export Rates the Company shall not demand or take any Rates exceeding the Sums specified in the Schedule to this Act annexed; provided also, that all Goods, Wares, Merchandise, Iron, or Minerals brought into or passing through the Dock, and landed or shipped by or on account of the Governor and Company of Copper Mines in *England* and Messrs. *Vivian* and Sons respectively, or by or on account of any other Party, at the Wharves belonging to them respectively, or in their respective Occupation, the Access to which shall be through the Dock of the Company, shall be wholly exempt from all such Import or Export Rates.

15. So much of the 43rd Section of the Act 4 *William* IV., Chapter 43, as provides that the Meetings of the Company shall be held in the County of *Glamorgan*, within Ten Miles of the said Port and Harbour, and that the Annual Meeting shall be holden in the Month of *May* in every Year, is hereby repealed; and the Company may at all Times hereafter hold their Meetings at any Place within the County of *Glamorgan*, or in the Cities of *London* and *Westminster*, and may hold the Annual Meeting at such Time, as any General Meeting of the Company may from Time to Time prescribe.

16. Nothing in this Act contained shall exempt the Company or their Undertaking from the Provisions of "The Merchant Shipping Law Amendment Act, 1853," "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854,"

17. All the Costs, Charges, and Expenses of and incidental to the preparing and applying for, obtaining and passing, of this Act shall be borne and paid by the Company.
