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## VICTORIÆ REGINÆ.

Cap. ccxxxix.

An Act for authorizing the East and West Junction Railway Company in the Construction of their authorized Railway to divert, alter, and stop up certain Roads in the Parish of Alderminster and County of Worcester. [23d July 1866.]

HEREAS the East and West Junction Railway Company 27 & 28 Vict. (in this Act called "the Company"), incorporated by c. lxxvi. "The East and West Junction Railway Act, 1864," (in this Act called the Act of 1864,) were empowered to make a Railway from the authorized Line of the Northampton and Banbury Junction Railway near Towcester in the County of Northampton to the Great Western Railway in the Parish of Old Stratford in the County of Warwick, and the Company were authorized to raise Three hundred thousand Pounds by Shares, and One hundred thousand Pounds by borrowing: And whereas it is expedient that the Company should be empowered in the Construction of their authorized Railway to divert, alter, and stop up certain Roads, or Parts thereof, wholly situate in the Parish of Alderminster and County of Worcester: And whereas Plans and Sections showing the Lines and Levels of the Works by this Act authorized, and also a Book of Reference 36 S containing [Local.]

The East and West Junction Realway (Diversion of Roads)

containing the Names of the Owners and Lessees, or reputed Owners and Lessees, and of the Occupiers of the Lands required or which may be taken for the Purposes of the said Works, have been deposited with the Clerk of the Peace for Worcestershire, and such Plans, Sections, and Book of Reference are in this Act referred to as "the deposited Plans, Sections, and Book of Reference:" And whereas the Objects of this Act cannot be effected without the Authority of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and of the Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, as follows; (that is to say,)

Short Title.

1. This Act may be cited for all Purposes as "The East and West Junction Railway (Diversion of Roads) Act, 1866."

2. "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts Amendment Act, 1860," "The Railways Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," and Part I., relating to Construction 26 & 27 Vict. of a Railway, of "The Railways Clauses Act, 1863," are (except where expressly varied by this Act) incorporated with and form Part of this Act.

Interpretation of Terms.

3. In this Act the several Words and Expressions to which Meanings are assigned by the Acts wholly or partially incorporated herewith shall have the same respective Meanings, unless there be something in the Subject or Context repugnant to such Construction; the Expression "the Company" shall mean the East and West Junction Railway Company; the Expression "the Undertaking" shall mean the Undertaking by this Act authorized, or any Part thereof; and the Expression," Superior Courts," or "Court of competent Jurisdiction," or any other like Expression in this Act or any Act wholly or partially incorporated herewith, shall be read and have Effect as if the Debt or Demand with respect to which the Expression is used were a common Simple Contract Debt, and not a Debt or Demand created by Statute.

Nothing herein contained shall be deemed or construed to exempt Railway the Railway by this Act authorized to be made from the Provisions of from Proany General Act relating to Railways, or the better and more impartial Audit of the Accounts of Railway Companies, now in force or which may hereafter pass during this or any future Session of Parliament, or from any future Revision or Alteration, under the Authority of Parliament, of the maximum Rates of Fares and Charges or of the Rates for small Parcels authorized by this Act.
