An Act for the better Drainage of the Valley of the River Waveney in the Counties of Norfolk and Suffolk; and for other Purposes.

[23d July 1866.]

HEREAS there now exist great Obstructions to the free Discharge of the Waters of the River Waveney in the Counties of Norfolk and Suffolk, in consequence whereof the Lands in the Valley of that River are subjected to great Damage, and the Value of those Lands for the Production of Crops and the feeding of Sheep and Cattle, and in other respects, is much diminished, and Communication between the Counties of Norfolk and Suffolk is frequently interrupted or made inconvenient by Floods, and the Health of the Inhabitants of the Valley and its Neighbourhood is injuriously affected: And whereas the Execution of the Works in this Act referred to would much facilitate the Discharge of the Waters of the said River, and would to a great Extent remedy the Evils aforesaid; and it is expedient that Provision be made for the Execution, Maintenance, and Management of those Works accordingly: And whereas it is expedient that the Execution, Maintenance, and Management of those Works be intrusted to a Body of Commissioners constituted and empowered as in this Act provided: And whereas it is expedient that the Commissioners should be empowered to alter, raise, lower, or remove and rebuild Beccles Bridge, and that the Mayor, Aldermen, and [Local.]40 G

and Burgesses of the Borough of Beccles, the Commissioners for executing the Acts relating to the Beccles Navigation, and the Justices of the Peace for the Counties of Norfolk and Suffolk, being respectively locally interested in the Execution and Maintenance of the Works last aforesaid, be respectively empowered to contribute towards the Expenses thereof, and to raise or apply Money for that Purpose in manner in this Act provided: And whereas Plans and Sections describing the Line and Levels of the intended Cuts and Works authorized by this Act, and Plans of the Navigation, Sites of Mills, Houses, and Lands to be taken for the Purposes thereof, and a Book of Reference to those Plans, have been deposited with the respective Clerks of the Peace for the Counties of Norfolk and Suffolk (which respectively are in this Act referred to as the deposited Plans, Sections, and Book of Reference): And whereas the Objects of this Act cannot be effected without the Authority of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, as follows; that is to say,

Short Title.

1. This Act may be cited as "The Waveney Valley Drainage Act, 1866."

2. The following Enactments (as far as the Provisions thereof respectively are applicable for the Purposes and are not inconsistent with the Provisions of this Act) are hereby incorporated with this Act; namely,

The Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845:

The Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts Amendment Act, 1860:

The Commissioners Clauses Act, 1847, except the Provisions thereof with respect to the Qualification of Commissioners, and with respect to the Election and Rotation of the Commissioners, where the Commissioners are to be elected by the Ratepayers or other like Class of Electors:

Sections 6 to 10 (both inclusive) of the Railways Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, and for the Purposes of this Act the Word "Company" in those Provisions shall be taken to mean the Commissioners, and the Word "Railway" therein to mean any Work shown on the deposited Plans and by this Act authorized.

Interpretation of Terms in this and incorporated Acts.

- 3. With respect to the Interpretation of Terms in and for the Purposes of this Act the following Provisions shall have Effect, namely:
 - (1.) In this Act, and in any Act incorporated wholly or in part with this Act, the Term "Quarter Sessions" or "Court of Quarter Sessions" means the respective Courts of General or Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the Counties of Norfolk and Suffolk, according as the Matter requiring the Cognizance of Quarter Sessions arises therein respectively:

(2.) In

(2.) In this Act, and in any Act incorporated wholly or in part with this Act, the Expression "Superior Courts" or "Court of competent Jurisdiction," or any other like Expression, shall be read and have Effect as if the Debt or Demand with respect to which the Expression is used were an ordinary Simple Contract Debt, and not a Debt or Demand created by Statute:

(3.) Subject to the foregoing Interpretations, the several Terms to which Meanings are assigned by the Acts incorporated wholly or in part with this Act have in this Act the same

respective Meanings.

4. The Limits of this Act shall be and comprise the Lands lying Limits or on the River Waveney between Hoxne Mill and a Point a short Way Act. below Beccles Bridge, which are particularly described in the First Schedule to this Act.

5. With the Authority of Two Justices (not being Commissioners) Power for the Commissioners under this Act may from Time to Time alter the Limits. Limits of this Act by omitting any Lands comprised therein which appear to the Commissioners not to be benefited or not to be adequately benefited by the Execution of the Works authorized by this Act.

6. On any such Alteration being made by the Commissioners they Alteration to shall cause the same to be marked on any Map deposited with any be made in Clerk of the Posses for the Director of the Clerk of the Peace for the Purpose of showing the Limits of this Act or any Part of those Limits.

7. There shall be a Body of Commissioners for executing this Incorpora-Act, which Commissioners and their Successors shall be and are hereby tion of Commissioners. incorporated for that Purpose by the Name of the Waveney Valley Drainage Commissioners, and by that Name shall be One Body Corporate, with perpetual Succession and a Common Seal, and with Power to purchase, take, hold, and dispose of Lands and other Property for the Purposes but subject to the Restrictions of this Act (which Commissioners are in this Act called "the Commissioners").

8. The full Number of the Commissioners shall be Fifteen, namely, Number of Thirteen elective and the Mayor of Beccles and the Town Reeve of Commis-Bungay for the Time being by virtue of their respective Offices.

First Meeting.

10. The Commissioners shall hold their First Meeting at the King's Head Inn at Bungay at Twelve o'Clock on such One of the last Two Tuesdays in October One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, or on such earlier Day as any Five or more of the Commissioners appoint by a Notice under their Hands, a Copy thereof being sent in a registered Letter addressed to each of the Commissioners named in this Act at his respective usual or last known Place of Abode or Business in England, and posted not less than Ten Days before the Day appointed for the Meeting.

Annual Meetings.

11. The Commissioners shall hold an Annual Meeting on the last Tuesday in October One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and thenceforth on the same Day in every subsequent Year, at such Hour and Place as the Commissioners from Time to Time appoint.

Qualification of Commissioners and Electors.

12. The following Provisions shall have Effect with respect to the Qualifications of elective Commissioners and of Electors, namely:

(1.) The Qualification of an elective Commissioner shall be as follows, namely, he shall be either—

The Proprietor of not less than Fifteen Acres of Land within the Limits of this Act; or

The Heir Apparent of such a Proprietor; or

The occupying Tenant, from Year to Year, or otherwise, of not less than Twenty-five Acres of such Land; or The Agent of such a Proprietor as aforesaid:

(2.) The Qualification of an Elector of Commissioners shall be as follows, namely, he shall be either—

The Proprietor of not less than Ten Acres of Land as aforesaid; or

The occupying Tenant, from Year to Year, or otherwise, of not less than Ten Acres of such Land:

(3.) For the Purposes of the present Section, and of all Provisions of this Act relative thereto, those Persons shall be deemed Proprietors who would be Proprietors for the Purposes of The Land Drainage Act, 1861, and Sections Six, Seven, Eight, and Nine of that Act are, as far as the same are applicable for the Purposes of this Act, hereby extended and applied to those Purposes:

(4.) For the like Purposes the Person next in succession under any Settlement (as defined in the said Land Drainage Act), or otherwise, next presumptively entitled to become a Proprietor of Lands, shall be deemed an Heir Apparent:

(5.) For

- (5.) For the like Purposes a Person shall be deemed an Agent who is appointed by a Proprietor to act on his Behalf under this Act, such Appointment being in Writing under the Hand or under the Common Seal of the Proprietor.
- 13. At the Annual Meeting in One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven and in every subsequent Year new elective Commissioners shall be elected.

- 14. The Election shall be made by the Majority of the Votes of Election to be by Electhe Electors present personally or by proxy at the Meeting. tors present.
- 15. A Proprietor shall have One Vote for every Ten Acres of Votes of Land of which he is Proprietor, not exceeding in any Case Fifteen Proprietors. Votes in the whole.
- 16. An occupying Tenant shall have One Vote for every Ten Votes of Acres of Land occupied by him, not exceeding in any Case Fifteen Occupiers. Votes in the whole.
- 17. If Twelve Electors are not present in person or by proxy Adjournwithin One Hour after the Time appointed for the Annual Meeting, Election. the Election shall not be proceeded with on that Day, and if for that or any other Reason the Election is not made on that Day, the Meeting shall stand adjourned to the last Tuesday in the next following Month, and shall then be held at such Hour and Place as the Commissioners appoint.

18. If on the last-mentioned Day Twelve Electors are not present Failure to in person or by proxy within One Hour after the Time appointed for elect. the Meeting, the Election shall not be proceeded with, and if for that or any other Reason the Election is not made on that Day, the Elective Commissioners of the last preceding Year shall continue in Office as if they had been elected for another Year.

19. The Appointment of a Proxy shall be made by an Instrument Appointin Writing under the Hand or the Common Seal of the Appointor, ment of Proxies. and in all Cases attested by One Witness at least.

20. No one but an Elector shall be capable of being a Proxy.

Electorsonly to be Proxies.

21. An Instrument appointing a Proxy shall not be used at any Election unless it has been deposited at the principal Office of the Commissioners not less than Twenty-four Hours before the Time deposited. appointed for that Election.

22. Any such Instrument shall not be valid except for the Election next after the Date of its Execution.

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Equality of Votes.

23. If in any Case there is an Equality of Votes for Two or more Candidates for Election, the Chairman of the Meeting shall have a Second or Casting Vote.

Declaration of Result.

24. The Chairman of the Commissioners, or in his Absence a Commissioner elected by the Meeting, or in the Absence of all the Commissioners an Elector appointed by the Meeting, shall preside at the Meeting.

Payment of Acre Tax required.

25. An Elector shall not be entitled to vote unless he has paid the Amount of Acre Tax (if any) ordered to be paid by him under this Act.

26. The Body of elective Commissioners named in this Act, and all succeeding Bodies of elective Commissioners, from Time to Time shall vacate their respective Offices on a new Election of a Body of Commissioners being completed, but an elective Commissioner going out of Office shall in all Cases be re-eligible,

27. The Quorum of the Commissioners shall be Three.

28. The principal Office of the Commissioners shall be such as the Commissioners from Time to Time appoint.

29. The Commissioners shall require their Clerk or some Person authorized by them in this Behalf to attend at their principal Office on such Days and at such Hours as they from Time to Time think fit.

Meetings of Commissioners. 30. It shall not be necessary for the Commissioners to hold monthly Meetings, and they shall hold Meetings for the Transaction of Business at such Times and Places as they from Time to Time appoint, Notice thereof being given to the Commissioners individually by Advertisement, Circular, or otherwise, as the Commissioners from Time to Time direct.

Expenses of Commissioners. 31. The Commissioners may allow to any Commissioner reasonable Expenses incurred in the Execution of the Duties committed to him.

Appointment of Auditor. 32. An Auditor of the Accounts of the Commissioners (not being a Commissioner) shall be appointed from Time to Time by the High Sheriff of the County of Norfolk for the Time being, by Writing under his Hand, the first of such Appointments to be made within Three

Three Months after the passing of this Act, and subsequent Appointments to be made thenceforth from Time to Time annually in the Month of October, or on the Occurrence of Vacancies by Death, Resignation, or otherwise, between the annual Periods of Appointment.

33. The Provisions of Section Ninety-two of the Commissioners Remunera-Clauses Act, 1847, with respect to Remuneration and Expenses, and of Auditor. Sections Ninety-three and Ninety-four of that Act, shall apply to and in the Case of the Auditor so appointed.

34. Any Notice, Demand, or other such Document to be given or delivered by the Commissioners to or on any Person may be served Notices, &c. by the Delivery of it to the Person or to his Wife or Servant or any Inmate of his Dwelling House, or the Delivery of it at his usual or last known Place of Residence or Business in England.

35. The Newspapers for Advertisements shall be a Newspaper Newspapers published in the County of Norfolk and a Newspaper published in the County of Suffolk.

36. Subject to the Provisions of this Act, the Commissioners shall Power to be and they are hereby empowered to execute from Time to Time execute specification the following Works, in this Act called the special Works, namely,

- (1.) To widen, deepen, scour, and otherwise improve or alter the River Waveney, and to raise, widen, enlarge, or otherwise improve or alter both Banks or Haling paths of the same River from the Western Boundary of the Piece of Land near Hoxne Mill numbered 10 on the deposited Plans in the Parish of Thorpe Abbotts down to the South-eastern Boundary of the Piece of Land immediately below Beccles Bridge numbered 14 on the Tithe Map of the Parish of Gillingham:
- (2.) To widen, deepen, scour, or otherwise improve or alter the Drains and Watercourses communicating directly or indirectly with the River Waveney at any Point between those Boundaries, but so that the Commissioners do not for that Purpose enter on any Park or Pleasure Ground except with the written Consent of the Owner thereof:
- (3.) To alter, raise, lower, or remove and rebuild Beccles Bridge: And with respect to such of those Works as are shown on the deposited Plans and are made by the Commissioners, they shall (subject to the Provisions of this Act) make the same in the Lines and according to the Levels shown on the deposited Plans and Sections and on the Lands and within the Limits of Deviation shown on those Plans.

Power of Deviation.

37. In the Execution of the Works by this Act authorized, the Commissioners may make lateral Deviations from the Lines of such Works to any Extent within the Limits of lateral Deviation shown on the deposited Plans, and vertical Deviations from the Levels of such Works shown on the deposited Sections to any Extent not exceeding Three Feet upwards and Three Feet downwards, but shall not make any greater lateral or vertical Deviation without the Consent of the Owner of the Land in which the Deviation is made.

Limitation of Works in Tributaries.

38. Provided, that the Powers by this Act given to the Commissioners to widen, deepen, scour, and otherwise improve or alter Drains and Watercourses shall not extend to authorize any Variation, Extension, or Enlargement of any Cut for Drainage being more than Eleven Feet Wide at the Bottom thereof, or of any Cut for Navigation beyond the Extent to which the Variation, Extension, or Enlargement thereof is shown on the deposited Plans and Sections.

Power for Commiscioners to execute subsidiary Works.

39. Subject to the Provisions of this Act, the Commissioners shall be and are hereby authorized to execute from Time to Time the following Works (in this Act called the subsidiary Works), namely:

(1.) To deepen, widen, and alter or remove and rebuild all Locks, Bridges, Sluices, Milldams, Staunches, Flood-gates, Tunnels, Haling-paths, Works, and Conveniences on that Part of the River Waveney on which they are by this Act authorized to execute the special Works, and to alter the Level of

the Top-water in that Part of the same River;

(2.) To alter, divert, or otherwise interfere with, either temporarily or permanently, any Turnpike Roads, public Carriageroads, or other Roads or Ways, Haling-paths, Drains, Streams, Canals, or Railways below Hoxne Mill which it may be necessary to interfere with for the Purposes of the Works, with the Consent of the Trustees or other Authority having the Management or Control of the same, and to deposit Soil, Earth, and other Things on the same and the Banks, Slopes, and Sides thereof:

(3.) To alter, raise, or lower, or remove and rebuild the Bridges, Culverts, Arches, Openings, Floodways, and other Works over or in the River Waveney or the Valley thereof below Hoxne Mill, and Drains and Watercourses in or near the Lines of the Works by this Act authorized, and to construct new or additional Bridges, Culverts, and Openings, Ap-

proaches, and other Works in or near those Lines.

Roads which may be interfered with.

40. If and as far as the Commissioners from Time to Time find it requisite for the Purposes of the Works by this Act authorized, they may, in addition to any Works before in this Act described, alter or divert,

divert, temporarily or permanently, the Turnpike and other public Roads numbered on the deposited Plans and described in the deposited Book of Reference, subject to the following Restriction; namely, that any such permanent Alteration or Diversion of a Turnpike or other public Road shall be subject to the Provisions with respect to the Alteration or Diversion of Turnpike or public Roads contained in any General Act relating to Turnpike Roads or Highways for the Time being in force.

41. Provided always, and notwithstanding anything in this Act Not to take contained empowering the Commissioners to execute and maintain the special Works and the subsidiary Works respectively, it shall not Bridges be lawful for the Commissioners, in exercise of any of the Powers by this Act granted, to take, use, enter upon, interfere with, or alter any Bridge or the Works or Approaches of any Bridge, for the Maintenance and Repair whereof the County Rates of the Counties of Norfolk and Suffolk respectively or either of them are or may be either in part or wholly liable (all which Bridges, Works, and Approaches are in this Act called the County Bridges), without in every Case the Consent in Writing of the Court of Quarter Sessions for those Counties respectively interested therein under the Hand of the Clerk of the Peace for that County respectively.

42. The Commissioners shall from Time to Time maintain the Works by this Act authorized as far as any Bodies or Persons other than the Commissioners are not liable to maintain the same respectively.

Power to Commissioners to maintain Works.

43. If in or by reason of the Execution of any of the special Works, or of any of the subsidiary Works by this Act authorized, the Commissioners shall alter, interfere with, or affect the County Bridges Bridges. or any of them, so that the Maintenance and Repair thereof shall by reason of any Work or Act of the Commissioners in any respect become more onerous, the Commissioners shall from Time to Time make good to the Justices of Norfolk or Suffolk, as the Case may be, by the Hand of the Clerk of the Peace for the same County, any and every Excess of Expenditure which the respective Justices may in the Exercise of their Discretion, and whether by way of Precaution or to prevent Mischief, or by way of Remedy or actual Maintenance or Repair, see fit from Time to Time to incur in and about the Maintenance and Repair of the County Bridges, or any of them, which may be so altered, interfered with, or affected, and shall fully indemnify and save harmless the Rates of the County or Counties affected from any and every such Excess of Expenditure, and any Difference which shall at any Time arise, under this Provision or with reference to the Matters thereof, between the Justices of either of the said Counties on the $\lceil Local. \rceil$

tenance of County

the one hand and the Commissioners on the other hand, shall be decided by the Surveyor of the County affected, commonly called the County Surveyor, and the principal Engineer of the Commissioners, or, failing Agreement between them, by a competent Engineer to be for that Purpose appointed in Writing under their respective Hands, or, failing such Appointment, then on the Application of either Party by an Arbitrator to be appointed by the Board of Trade; and all Monies which shall from Time to Time become payable by the Commissioners to the Justices of either of the said Counties, under or in consequence of the Provisions of this Act, may be sued for and recovered for the Use of the Justices of the respective County in the Name of the Clerk of the Peace for the Time being of that County in any Court of competent Jurisdiction.

Power to keep open Channel. 44. The Commissioners may from Time to Time and at all Times, by digging, dredging, or otherwise, scour and deepen the Channel of the River Waveney below Hoxne Mill, so as to keep the same open and free from Obstructions that would impede the Flow of Water or Navigation.

Works not to affect Banks, &c. within Borough of Beccles.

45. Nothing in this Act shall authorize the Commissioners to execute any Work affecting the Banks of the River Waveney or the Sewerage or Drainage of Lands adjoining thereto within the Limits of the Municipal Borough of Beccles without the previous Consent of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of that Borough in Writing under their Common Seal.

Power to hold up Water in dry Seasons.

46. The Commissioners may from Time to Time, when and as they think fit, hold up and detain by means of the Works authorized by this Act the Water of the River Waveney between Hoxne Mill and Beccles at such Place or Places as they think expedient, so as to make the same available for Purposes of Irrigation or other agricultural Purposes, but not so as to impede or interrupt the free and accustomed Flow of Water from Hoxne Mill, or otherwise injuriously interfere with or affect the Working or Use of that Mill.

Property in Works to vest in Commissioners.

47. The Right and Property of and in all Works, Sluices, Bridges, Engines, Implements, Materials, Goods, Articles, and Things made, provided, or had by the Commissioners for the Purposes of this Act, shall be and the same are hereby vested in the Commissioners.

Commissioners of Sewers not to interfere with Act.

48. This Act shall have full Effect notwithstanding any Juris-diction or Authority vested in any Commissioners of Sewers or other Commissioners or Body.

49. Except only as is by this Act expressly provided, nothing in this Act shall alter or affect any Obligation or Liability of any Person to cleanse or maintain any Drain or Watercourse within the Limits of Obligations. this Act or the Banks thereof, or to impose the same on the Commissioners or any other Person, but every such Obligation and Liability shall remain as if this Act had not been passed; and for the Purpose of enforcing every such Obligation or Liability, the Commissioners shall have and may exercise all such Powers and Authorities in that Behalf as Persons interested in Lands within the Limits of this Act have or may exercise, or as by the Laws from Time to Time in force relating to Sewers are had or might be exercised by any Commissioner of Sewers.

Act not to relieve other Parties from

50. For the Purposes of the Works by this Act authorized and Power to shown on the deposited Plans, and also for the Purpose of executing take Lands for specified this Act, and subject to the Provisions of this Act, the Commissioners Works. from Time to Time may enter on, take, and use such of the Lands shown on the deposited Plans and specified in the deposited Book of Reference as may be required for the Purposes of the Works hereby authorized: Provided always, that it shall not be lawful for the Commissioners to enter, or take, or use any Lands situate in any of the Parishes of Billingford, Oakley Thorpe, Abbotts, and Hoxne, except with the Consent of the Owners thereof respectively for the Time being in Writing first obtained.

51. For any of the subsidiary Works by this Act authorized the Power to Commissioners may from Time to Time enter on, take, and use all or take Lands referenced any Part of the Lands described and numbered in the deposited Plans for subsiand Book of Reference, although not lying within the Limits of diary Works. Deviation of the Works in and by this Act particularly described and authorized to be executed: Provided always, that it shall not be lawful for the Commissioners to enter on, take, or use any Lands situate in any of the Parishes of Billingford, Oakley, Thorpe Abbotts, and *Hoxne*, except with the Consent of the Owners thereof respectively for the Time being in Writing first obtained.

52. The Powers of the Commissioners for the compulsory Purchase Powers for of Lands for the Purposes of this Act shall not be exercised after the Expiration of Ten Years after the passing of this Act.

compulsory Purchases limited.

53. The special Works shall be completed within Twelve Years from the passing of this Act, and on the Expiration of that Period the of Works. Powers by this Act granted to the Commissioners for executing the same, or otherwise in relation thereto, shall cease to be exercised, except as to so much thereof as is then completed.

Period for Completion

Power to Commission-ers to purchase Lands by Agreement.

54. In addition to the Lands which the Commissioners are by this Act authorized to take compulsorily, they for the Purposes of this Act may from Time to Time purchase by Agreement any Lands, and may hold the same, so that the Lands held by the Commissioners under this Section do not exceed in the whole at any one Time One hundred Acres.

Power to Commissioners to hold, sell, or let Lands. 55. Notwithstanding anything in this Act or in any Act incorporated wholly or in part with this Act, the Commissioners may hold any Lands acquired by them under this Act, and may at any Time and from Time to Time sell, lease, or otherwise dispose of the same or any Part thereof absolutely or for such Terms of Years or other Interests, at or for such Rents or other Considerations, and subject to such Covenants, Conditions, and Stipulations or on such other Terms as they deem expedient with reference to the Circumstances of each Case.

Provision as to Bungay and Beccles Navigation.

56. For the Purposes of this Act and subject to the Provisions thereof, the Commissioners may take and use all Property, Rights, Powers, and Authorities for the Time being held or enjoyed under an Act of the Twenty-second Year of the Reign of King Charles the Second, for making navigable the Rivers commonly called Brandon and Waveney, and for the Purposes of such taking and User, and the Purposes of the Sale, Leasing, or other Disposition of the Property, Rights, Powers, and Authorities aforesaid, the same respectively shall be deemed Lands within the Meaning of this Act and of any Act incorporated with this Act; and if the Commissioners in exercise of the Powers conferred on them by this Act and subject to the Provisions thereof, acquire and take the whole of the Property, Rights, Powers, and Authorities aforesaid, the Authority of the Commissioners by the last-mentioned Act constituted shall absolutely cease.

Saving
Rights of
Proprietor of the

Navigation.

57. Provided always, that if William Butcher of the City of Norwich, Land Agent, his Heirs or Assigns, or other the Owner or Owners from Time to Time of the Property, Rights, Powers, and Authorities held or enjoyed under the last-mentioned Act (hereinafter called the Proprietor of the Waveney Navigation) by Writing under his or their Hand so require (then notwithstanding anything in this Act contained) it shall not be lawful for the Commissioners to take, use, enter upon, continue in possession of, or injuriously affect that Property or those Rights; Powers, and Authorities, or the Messuages, Lands, Navigation, Waters, and Hereditaments, held or enjoyed by the Proprietor of the Waveney Navigation under the same Act, or otherwise, in connexion with the Rivers and Navigation therein mentioned

mentioned (all which Property and Premises are herein-after called the Waveney Navigation) or any of them or any Part thereof respectively, unless and until after the making and publishing of the Award, and according to the Award of the Arbitrators or Umpire appointed to arbitrate, define, and decide the Matters next following; that is to say,

- (1.) The Nature and Extent consistent with the Powers and Conditions by this Act granted and imposed of the Works to be executed and maintained by and at the Expense of the Commissioners:
- (2.) The Nature, Extent, and Amount of the Compensation (pecuniary and other) to be paid and made by the Commissioners to the Proprietor of the Waveney Navigation in respect of the taking, using, entering upon, and injuriously affecting the Premises for the Purposes of or by reason of the Execution of the Works of the Commissioners:
- (3.) Fit and proper Provision for the subsequent Maintenance, Repair, and User of the Commissioners Works so far as those Works affect directly or indirectly the Waveney Navigation:
- (4.) All Engineering Matters incidental to those several Matters respectively.
- 58. If that Arbitration be so required then the Commissioners and Mode of the Proprietor of the Waveney Navigation shall respectively imme- Appointdiately thereafter appoint an Arbitrator to act in the Premises, or, Arbitrator. failing Appointment of an Arbitrator by the Commissioners or the Proprietor, an Umpire may and shall, on the Application of either of the Parties, be appointed by the Board of Trade, and the Arbitrators and Umpire respectively shall have, exercise, and be subject to all the Powers, Authorities, Conditions, and Regulations conferred and imposed respectively on Arbitrators and Umpires by the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, and the Reference shall be conducted according to the Provisions of that Act applicable thereto.

59. The Commissioners may from Time to Time purchase and Power to take by Agreement any Easement or Right which they think it acquire necessary or expedient for the Purposes of this Act to acquire, and for Easements. that Purpose every such Easement or Right shall be deemed Lands within the Meaning of this Act and any Act incorporated with this Act.

60. The Commissioners shall from Time to Time make or cause to Power to be made such Valuations of the Lands within the Limits of this Act make Valuaas they deem necessary or proper for the Execution of this Act.

Liability to Acre Taxes.

61. The Lands within the Limits of this Act shall be liable to an annual Acre Tax of such Amount as the Commissioners from Time to to Time think fit, according to the Degree in which those Lands respectively are or will be in the Judgment of the Commissioners benefited by the Execution of the Works authorized by this Act, and for that Purpose the Commissioners may from Time to Time classify those Lands in such Manner as they think fit according to the Degree of such Benefit.

Power to assess Acre Taxes.

62. Subject to the Provisions of this Act, the Commissioners once or oftener in a Year as they from Time to Time think fit, may assess on the Lands within the Limits of this Act such Acre Tax or Acre Taxes as they from Time to Time think requisite.

Acre Tax prospective or retrospective.

63. The Commissioners may assess any such Acre Tax prospectively in order to raise Money to pay Expenses to be incurred, or retrospectively in order to raise Money to pay Expenses incurred, or partly prospectively and partly retrospectively, provided that no Money so raised shall be expended in Payment of Expenses incurred at a Period exceeding Twelve Months before the making of the Rate or Tax.

Occapier to deduct from Rent. 64. Every Occupier of Lands within the Limits of this Act shall pay the Acre Tax assessed thereon, and may deduct the Amount paid by him for Acre Tax out of the Rent payable by him, and he shall be discharged from so much Money as the Acre Tax paid by him amounts to as if the same were actually paid to the Person entitled to receive the Rent of the Land in his Occupation.

Lessee for Lives, &c. not to deduct.

65. Provided, that any Occupier of Lands, being Lessee thereof under a beneficial Lease for Lives, or under any Lease or Agreement of the Term whereof at the Time appointed by the Commissioners for the Payment of any Acre Tax Five Years or more are unexpired, shall not be entitled to deduct the Amount of the Acre Tax paid by him out of the Rent reserved by his Lease or Agreement.

Owner to pay where no Occupiers.

66. Where any Lands assessed to the Acre Tax are unoccupied at the Time of Assessment the Owner thereof shall pay the Acre Tax thereon.

Who to be deemed Owner.

67. For the Purposes of this Act the Owner of Land shall be the Person who is for the Time being entitled to receive the Rackrent of the Land, or who would be entitled to receive the same if the Land were let at a Rackrent (any Rent not less than Two Thirds

of the net annual Value of Land being deemed for this Purpose a Rackrent).

68. A Creditor of the Commissioners, being Owner or Occupier No Set-off of Lands, shall not be entitled to set off any Money payable to him as such Creditor against any Money payable by him to the Commissioners in respect of any Acre Tax.

- 69. Where any Person liable to pay any Acre Tax fails for Distress for Twenty-one Days to pay the same, a Justice, on the Application of Acre Tax. the Commissioners, and after Summons served on the Person so failing, may issue his Warrant of Distress, and the Bailiff or other Person to whom the Warrant is addressed shall seize and distrain any Goods or Chattels of the Person so failing being on the Lands in respect of which the Acre Tax is payable by him.
- 70. All such Distresses may be impounded, sold, replevied, and Sale of Disdealt with as in case of Distress for Rent in arrear on Lease for tress, &c. Years.
- 71. The Surplus, if any, arising from the Sale of any such Goods Return of and Chattels (after Payment thereout of the Acre Tax and the Expenses of the Distress and Sale) with the unsold Goods and Chattels (if any) shall be returned on Demand to the Person whose Goods and Chattels are distrained.

72. Where sufficient Distress for levying the Acre Tax and Expenses Distress on is not found on the Lands assessed, then those Lands shall remain as Goods at Security for Payment thereof, and all Goods and Chattels from Time Lands. to Time thereafter found thereon may be distrained, dealt with, and sold as by this Act provided with respect to the original Distress until all Arrears of Acre Tax and Expenses, and the Expenses of every further Distress, and all other Costs and Charges incurred by reason of the Nonpayment of the Acre Tax, are fully paid and satisfied.

73. Any Number of Names or Sums may be expressed in any Warrant for the Purposes of this Act, and either in the Body of the Warrant or in a Schedule thereto.

Several Names in One Warrant.

74. A Distress levied under this Act shall not be unlawful, nor Rules as to shall any Person making it be a Trespasser on account of any Defect Distress. or Want of Form in the Warrant or in any other Proceeding relative to the Distress, nor shall any such Person be a Trespasser ab initio on account of any Irregularity afterwards committed by him, but all Persons aggrieved by any Defect, Want of Form, or Irregularity may

recover

recover by Proceedings in any Court of competent Jurisdiction full Satisfaction for the special Damage.

Power to let Lands for Payment of Acre Tax.

75. Where any Acre Tax is unpaid for Twelve Months after it ought to be paid, and sufficient Distress is not found on the Lands assessed thereto, the Commissioners may demise so much of the Lands as they deem sufficient to any Person for any Term not exceeding Three Years at the best yearly Rent that can be reasonably had, and may appoint a Person to deliver Possession of the demised Lands to the Lessee, and he shall deliver Possession thereof accordingly, and the Commissioners may distrain for any Rent so reserved, and enforce the Covenants of the Lease as if they were entitled to the immediate Reversion of the Lands demised.

Notice before letting.

76. Provided, that where any Lands are so let, Notice of the Intention to let the same and the Time and Place of the letting, and a short Description of the Lands to be let, shall, Twenty-one Days at least before the Day appointed for the letting, be posted by the Commissioners on some conspicuous Place on or near the Lands.

Application of Rents.

77. The Commissioners shall apply the Rents received by them under any such letting in or towards Payment of the Acre Tax and Expenses unpaid, rendering the Surplus, if any, from Time to Time on Demand to the Persons appearing to them to be entitled thereto.

Recovery of Acre Tax.

78. The Commissioners may recover any Acre Tax, with Costs, by Proceedings in any Court of competent Jurisdiction.

Power to borrow on Mortgage of Acre Taxes.

79. The Commissioners may from Time to Time borrow at Interest, on the Security of the Acre Taxes leviable under this Act or any Part thereof, such Sums of Money as they think requisite for the Execution of this Act, not exceeding in the whole the Sum of Twenty-five thousand Pounds, and may mortgage the Acre Taxes leviable under this Act, or any Part thereof, to secure the Repayment of the Money so borrowed with Interest accordingly.

Power to borrow from Public Works Loan Commissioners.

80. The Commissioners may borrow of the Public Works Loan Commissioners, and those Commissioners may lend to them, such Sum of Money as the Public Works Loan Commissioners think fit for the Purposes of this Act.

Instalments or Sinking Fund.

81. The Commissioners shall pay off any Money borrowed by them either by Instalments or by means of a Sinking Fund invested in Government Securities, and increased by Accumulation in the way of Compound Interest or otherwise, as follows, (that is to say,) as to any Money borrowed before the Expiration of Ten Years from the passing

of this Act within Thirty Years after the Expiration of those Ten Years, and as to any Money borrowed after the Expiration of those Ten Years within Thirty Years after the same is borrowed.

82. If the Commissioners at any Time pay off otherwise than by Power to Instalments or a Sinking Fund any Money borrowed by them, they reborrow. may from Time to Time reborrow the same or any less Amount in manner aforesaid, and so toties quoties, but so that the total Amount at any one Time borrowed by them and remaining unpaid shall not exceed the Sum of Twenty-five thousand Pounds.

If the Commissioners at any Time while any Money remains Power for due on any Mortgage under this Act fail to exercise all or any of Mortgagees to levy Acre their Powers for assessing and enforcing the Payment of Acre Taxes, Taxes. so as to provide for the Payment of and pay the Interest and Principal Money payable on the Mortgage or any Part thereof respectively, then and in every such Case, for the Purpose of obtaining Payment of Interest or Principal, any Receiver appointed on behalf of the Mortgagees or any of them shall have and may in the Name of the Commissioners (but without being obliged to use their Common Seal) exercise with respect to the Acre Taxes mortgaged the like Powers, Rights, and Remedies for assessing the Lands liable thereto, and for collecting, receiving, and enforcing the Acre Taxes so assessed as are by this Act given to the Commissioners.

85. 99. The Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Beceles acting by the Council of the Borough may, if they in their absolute Discretion think fit, from Time to Time out of their Corporate Property or Borough Fund, or any Fund for the Time being applicable by them in this Behalf, contribute towards the Expenses of the Alteration, Removal, or rebuilding of Beccles Bridge such Sum or Sums as the Commissioners from Time to Time by Writing under their Common Seal require, not exceeding in the whole the Sum of One thousand Pounds, and for that Purpose the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses may raise Money by Mortgage of their Corporate Property or Borough Fund, or of any such Fund as aforesaid.

Contribution by Commissioners of Beccles Navigation.

100: The Commissioners for executing the Acts relating to the Beccles Navigation may, if they think it expedient so to do, and subject to such Conditions and Stipulations as they may deem necessary, apply the whole or any Part of the Sum or Sums of Money in the Hands of themselves or their Treasurer, and may direct the Trustees or Trustee for the Time being of any Sum or Sums of Money belonging to or in the Control of the said Commissioners, to contribute the same Sum or Sums or any Part thereof towards the taking down and rebuilding Beccles Bridge, whether such Sum or Sums of Money be or be not, under the Provisions of the Acts relating to the said Beccles Navigation, applicable to the taking down and rebuilding the said Bridge.

Contribution by County of Norfolk.

101. If the Justices of the Peace for the County of Norfolk in General or Quarter Sessions assembled think fit they may, from Time to Time, out of the County Rates for that County, contribute towards the Expenses of the Alteration, Removal, or rebuilding of Beccles Bridge such Sum or Sums as those Justices may in their absolute Discretion think fit, but not exceeding in the whole the Sum of One thousand Pounds.

Contribution Suffolk.

102. If the Justices of the Peace for the County of Suffolk in by County of General or Quarter Sessions assembled think fit they may, from Time to Time, out of the County Rates for that County, contribute towards the Expenses of the Alteration, Removal, or rebuilding of Beccles Bridge such Sum or Sums as those Justices may in their absolute Discretion think fit, but not exceeding in the whole the Sum of One thousand Pounds.
