## Cap. lxxv.

An Act to extend the Time limited for the Completion of the Bridge, Roads, and other Works authorized by the "*Wilford Bridge Act, 1862*;" and for other Purposes. [17th June 1867.]

**W**HEREAS by the "*Wilford Bridge Act, 1862*," (herein-25 & 26 Vict. c. cxvi. after called "the Act of 1862,") Sir *Robert Jukes Clifton* Bart., his Heirs and Assigns (herein-after called "the Undertakers"), were authorized to make and maintain in the Manner therein provided a Bridge for Carriages, Horses, Cattle, and Passengers across the River *Trent* near to the Town of *Nottingham*, with all necessary and convenient Roads and other Works in connexion therewith, from the Northern to the Southern Side of the River, at or near the Place where the *Wilford Ferry* crossed the same, and to discontinue the said *Wilford Ferry*, and they were empowered by the same Act to take Tolls for passing over the said Bridge and Roads, and to raise Monies, and do various other Matters in relation thereto: And whereas it was by the Act of 1862 provided that the Bridge and Roads thereby authorized should be completed within Five Years after the passing of the same Act, and that on the Expiration of that

Period the Powers of the Undertakers for making the same, or otherwise in relation thereto, should cease to be exercised, except with respect to so much thereof as should be then completed: And whereas a considerable Portion of the Bridge, Roads, and other Works authorized by the Act of 1862 still remains to be constructed, and it is expedient that the Time limited by the same Act for the Completion thereof, and the Powers thereby granted to the Undertakers in respect thereof, should be extended for a further Period: And whereas by the Act of 1862 it was provided that in making the Bridge, Roads, and other Works authorized by the same Act the Undertakers might deviate from the Levels thereof as referred to on the Datum Line shown on the deposited Sections, but not to any Extent exceeding Three Feet, and it is expedient to alter or vary the said Limit of Deviation: And whereas the Objects aforesaid cannot be accomplished without the Authority of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, as follows:

Short Title.

1. This Act may be cited for all Purposes as "*The Wilford Bridge Act, 1867.*"

Extension of Period limited by recited Act for Completion of Bridge, &c.

2. The Time limited by the Act of 1862 for the Completion of the Bridge, Roads, and other Works thereby authorized, and the Powers by the same Act granted to the Undertakers in respect thereof, shall (except as to the Power for the compulsory Purchase of Land) be and the same are hereby extended for the Period of Three Years from the passing of this Act, and on the Expiration of that Period the said Powers shall cease to be exercised, except as to so much of the said Bridge, Roads, and Works as shall then be completed.

Part II. of 26 & 27 Vict. c. 92. incorporated.

3. Part II. of "*The Railways Clauses Act, 1863,*" shall be and the same is hereby incorporated with this Act, and shall apply to the Extension of Time hereby granted, and the Expression "*the Railway*" in that Act shall be taken to mean the Bridge and Works by the Act of 1862 authorized.

Alteration of vertical Deviation from Levels on Sections.

4. Whereas by the 20th Section of the Act of 1862 it is provided that the Limit of vertical Deviation from the Levels shown on the deposited Sections of the Bridge, Roads, and Works by the same Act authorized shall not exceed Three Feet: Be it enacted, That in making the Bridge, Roads, and other Works the Undertakers, notwithstanding anything in the said Act contained, may deviate vertically

vertically from the said Levels to an Extent not exceeding Six Feet, but only for the Purpose of raising the same.

5. All the Costs, Charges, and Expenses of and incident to the preparing for, obtaining, and passing of this Act shall be paid by the Undertakers. Expenses of of Act.
