## *Cap. cxiv.*

An Act for maintaining and repairing, as Turnpike, a certain Road commencing at or near the North-west Gate of the *Woodside* Hotel Stable-yard in the Township or Chapelry of *Birkenhead*, and terminating at or near the Cottage of *Henry Berry* in the Township of *Little Meols* in the Parish of *West Kirby* in the County of *Chester*; and for levying Tolls for that Purpose.

[22d June 1841.]

**W**HEREAS the present Highway leading from *Woodside Ferry* in the Township or Chapelry of *Birkenhead* in the County of *Chester*, through the Village of *Bidsdon*, to and terminating at or near the Cottage of *Henry Berry* in the Township of *Little Meols* in the same County, is in Need of Improvement, and it would be of great Advantage to the Inhabitants of the several Parishes, Townships, or Places through which the said Highway passes, and to the Public in general, if the said Road were made Turnpike, and kept, maintained, and repaired under the Care and Management of the Trustees to be appointed by virtue of this Act; but the same cannot be effected without the Authority of Parlia-

ment: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That all Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the Time being acting for the said County Palatine of *Chester*, together with *James Aikin, Thomas Bolton, John Barton, Thomas Brassey, Robert Benn, Thomas Case*, the Honourable Sir *Edward Cust, John Davies*, Reverend *Joseph Gate, John Baskerville Glegg*, Reverend *William Goodwin, Hugh Hornby, Richard Houghton, John Holmes, John Huddleston, Samuel Johnson, William Tristram Keightley, Edward Keene, James Lawrence, George Hall Lawrence, William Laird, John Shaw Leigh, Thomas Morecroft, James Mellor*, Reverend *James Mainwaring, Francis Richard Price, Samuel Richardson*, Sir *Thomas Stanley Massey Stanley* Baronet, the Honourable *Edward John Stanley*, the Honourable *William Owen Stanley, William Stanley Massey Stanley, Henry Robertson Sandbach, John Ralph Shaw*, Reverend *Charles Swainson, Robert Simpson, Thomas Toulmin*, Sir *John Tobin* Knight, *Robert Vyner*, Sir *Joshua Walmsley, Thomas Webster, William Webster, John Nelson Wood, Hugh Williams, Joseph Wright, Thomas Brock Yates*, and their Successors, being duly qualified to act as Trustees of Turnpike Roads in *England*, shall be Trustees for putting this Act into execution.

Power to appoint additional Trustees.

II. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, at any Meeting under this Act, to elect any Number of Persons, duly qualified to act as Trustees of Turnpike Roads in *England*, not exceeding Three in the whole, to be Trustees for the Purposes of this Act, in addition to the Trustees hereby nominated; and such Trustees so elected shall have the same Powers and Authorities for executing this Act as if they had been hereby appointed.

First Meeting of Trustees.

III. And be it enacted, That the Trustees for executing this Act shall hold their First Meeting at the *Birkenhead* Hotel, or at some other convenient Place in the Neighbourhood of the said Road, on the *Fourth Monday* next after the Commencement of this Act, or as soon afterwards as conveniently may be, between the Hours of Ten of the Clock in the Forenoon and Two of the Clock in the Afternoon, and shall then, and from Time to Time thereafter, adjourn to and meet at such Times and Places in the Neighbourhood of the said Roads as they shall think proper.

Power to appoint Committees.

IV. And be it enacted, That the said Trustees may appoint Committees out of their own Number to take the Care and Management of any particular Part of the said Roads, or to execute any of the other Purposes of this Act, according to such Instructions and Regulations as shall be laid down by the said Trustees at any General Meeting; and the said Committee and their Surveyors may proceed and act according to such Appointment, but shall always be accountable according to the Instructions and Regulations so to be made.

V. And



V. And be it enacted, That this Act shall be put in execution for the Purpose of making Turnpike, and of more effectually improving, maintaining, and keeping in repair, the present Highway commencing at or near the North-west Gate of the *Woodside* Hotel Stable-yard in the Township or Chapelry of *Birkenhead* in the County Palatine of *Chester*, and leading from thence westwardly, and passing from and through and into the Parishes, Chapelries, Townships, and Places following, all in the same County Palatine of *Chester*; (that is to say,) the Township or Chapelry of *Birkenhead*, the Township of *Claughton-cum-Grange*, the Township of *Bidston*, the Township of *Moreton*, and the Township of *Saugan Massey*, all in the Parish of *Bidston*, the Township of *Grange*, the Township of *Newton-cum-Larton*, the Township of *Great Meols*, the Township of *Hoose*, and the Township of *Little Meols*, all in the Parish of *West Kirby*, and terminating at or near the Cottage in the said Township of *Little Meols* now or late in the Occupation of *Henry Berry*, and which Road shall henceforth be called "The *Woodside* Road."

Roads to which this Act is applicable.

VI. And whereas Maps or Plans describing the Line of the said Highway, together with Books of Reference thereto, have been deposited at the Office of the Clerk of the Peace for the said County Palatine of *Chester*; be it therefore enacted, That the said Map or Plan and Book of Reference shall remain in the Custody of the Clerk of the Peace for the said County, to the end that all Persons may at all seasonable Times inspect and peruse the same, and have Copies thereof and Extracts therefrom, paying to the said Clerk of the Peace the Sum of One Shilling for every such Inspection, and at the Rate of Sixpence for every One hundred Words of such Copies or Extracts; and the said Map or Plan and Book of Reference, or any Copy thereof respectively or of any Part thereof respectively, certified by the said Clerk of the Peace or his Deputy for the Time being to be a true Copy thereof, shall be good Evidence in all Courts of Law or elsewhere.

Map or Plan deposited at the Office of the Clerk of the Peace to remain there and to be open to Inspection.

VII. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees to make and improve the said Road herein-before described in the Line and through the Lands delineated in the Map or Plan and described in the Book of Reference herein-before mentioned, and in the Schedule to this Act set out, of such Width as they may think proper, not exceeding Forty Feet, together with such Footpaths, Bridges, Embankments, Ditches, Drains, Fences, and other necessary Works upon or near thereto, as they may think requisite.

Power to make Line of Road according to Plan.

VIII. And be it enacted, That the Freehold and Inheritance of the Land forming the Scite of the said Highway, and of the Footpaths thereof, shall not be vested in the said Trustees, but the same shall remain and be vested in the Persons in whom the same were vested immediately prior to the passing of this Act; and the said Trustees shall by means of this Act be entitled only to a perpetual Right of Way in, over, or upon the said Highway and Footpaths, or the Lands forming the Site thereof.

Freehold of Road to remain in former Owners.

IX. And



The Freehold and Inheritance of Lands to remain vested in the Persons of whom they are purchased.

IX. And be it enacted, That in case any Lands shall be hereafter purchased by the said Trustees for the Purposes of this Act, the Freehold and Inheritance of the Lands so purchased in case the same shall be of Freehold Tenure, or in case the same shall be of any other Tenure the Estate and Interest therein, shall not, (notwithstanding any Provisions in any of the Acts in force for regulating Turnpike Roads in *England*;) by means of any such Purchase, or any Conveyance or Assurance made in pursuance thereof, be vested in the said Trustees, but such Freehold and Inheritance, or the Estate and Interest in such Lands, shall, notwithstanding such Purchase and Conveyance or Assurance, remain and be vested in the Persons in whom the same were vested immediately prior to such Purchase by the said Trustees; and the said Trustees shall, by means of such Purchase and Conveyance or Assurance, be entitled to a perpetual Right of Way in or over or upon the Lands so purchased by them.

Right of Way to cease when Lands are not wanted.

X. Provided always, and be it enacted, That if at any Time any Lands purchased by the said Trustees under the Authority of this Act shall not be wanted for the Purposes thereof, and the Road for which the same was purchased shall cease to be a Highway, then the Right of Way in or over the said Lands shall cease and be extinguished, and the Freehold and Inheritance of the said Land in case the same shall be of Freehold Tenure, and the Estate and Interest in such Lands in case the same shall be of any other Tenure, shall be and remain in the Persons then entitled to the same, freed and discharged from such Right of Way.

What Powers Trustees to have over the Lands taken by them.

XI. Provided also, and be it enacted, That the said Trustees shall have the same Power and Authority of cutting and digging and using the Lands taken by them for the Purposes of this Act as the said Trustees would have had in case they had purchased the Fee Simple of or the whole Estate and Interest in the said Lands.

Power to get Stone for Fences.

XII. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees to dig for and take Stone, for the Purpose of erecting or repairing the Fences on the Sides of the said Road, in the same Manner as they are by Law authorized to dig for and take Stone for any other Purpose, and subject to the same Regulations.

Trustees may purchase or hire Land whereon to lodge Materials.

XIII. And for providing proper Places whereupon the Materials used for the Repairs of the said Road may be deposited and broken, and whereupon the Ground, Earth, Stone, and other Substances necessary to be removed for the Purpose of reducing any Inequality or Height in the said Road, and making the same sufficiently level and commodious, and whereupon the worn Materials may be laid, and also for the Purpose of providing the necessary Materials for filling up any Hollows or Cavities in any Part of the said Road, be it enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the said Trustees to treat, contract, and agree with the several Owners, Proprietors, and Occupiers of and Persons interested in and entitled unto any Lands, Grounds, or Hereditaments adjoining to the said Road, or any Part thereof,



thereof, for the Purchase or Hire of so much of such of the said Lands, Grounds, or Hereditaments adjoining the said Road as they shall think necessary for any of the Purposes lastly herein-before mentioned, and out of the Monies to be received by virtue of this Act to pay such Sum or Sums of Money as shall be agreed upon for such Lands and Hereditaments.

XIV. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees to cause the Whole or any Portions of the said Road to be watered in dry Seasons when and as they shall deem necessary.

Trustees may water the Roads.

XV. And be it enacted, That in all Cases where any Entrance shall be from the said Road to any Land or to any Buildings, such Entrance shall be properly covered with Stone, Gravel, or other hard Materials, and a proper Culvert or Drain made by or at the Expence of the Owner or Occupier of such Land or Building, so that such Road may not be injured by the Stoppage or running of Water, or by Carriages or Horses passing to or from the same by such Entrance; and in case such Owner or Occupier shall neglect to cover with proper Materials such Entrance, or to make such Culvert or Drain, or to keep the same respectively in proper Order, for the Space of Fourteen Days after Notice in Writing (setting forth this Provision) given to such Owner or Occupier, or left for him at his usual or last known Place of Abode, or upon the said Land or Building, by the Surveyor to the said Trustees, requiring such Owner or Occupier to make or repair the same, it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, or for their Surveyor, or any other Person acting by or under their Authority, to cover such Entrance with Stone, Gravel, or other hard Materials, and to make such Culvert or Drain, or to repair the same respectively (as the Case may be); and the Expences thereof shall be reimbursed and paid to the said Trustees by such Owner or Occupier (as the Case may be), and in case of Nonpayment of such Expences within Ten Days after the same shall have been demanded by or on behalf of the said Trustees, then such Expences shall and may be recovered, together with the Costs and Charges attending the recovering the same, by Distress and Sale of the Goods and Chattels of such Owner or Occupier, by Warrant under the Hand and Seal of some Justice of the Peace for the County Palatine of *Chester*, and which Warrant of Distress such Justice is hereby empowered and required to grant, on Proof made before him on Oath of such Expences having been incurred, and of such Notice having been given or left as aforesaid; and the Overplus (if any) shall be returned, on Demand, to the Person whose Goods and Chattels shall have been so distrained and sold.

Entrances to Fields, &c. to be made with hard Materials.

XVI. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees and they are hereby authorized and empowered to make such Ditches, Drains, or Watercourses, and of such Depth and Breadth, as they shall consider expedient, for the Purpose of keeping the said Road dry, and conveying the Water from the same into or through any Lands or Grounds adjoining or lying near to the said Road (not being a Garden, Orchard, Park, Paddock, planted Walk

Ditches, Drains, Bridges, &c. by whom to be made and cleansed.

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or

or Avenue to a House), and also such sufficient Bridges, Arches, or Culverts as shall be requisite or necessary, at the Expence of the said Trustees, out of the Monies to be received by virtue of this Act, any thing in any Law or Statute contained to the contrary notwithstanding; and all Ditches, Drains, Watercourses, Bridges, Arches, and Culverts to be made on the Sides of the said Road in pursuance of this Act shall, when so made and completed by the said Trustees, be for ever afterwards secured, cleansed, and kept open, repaired and maintained, by the Occupiers respectively of the adjoining Lands or Grounds; but all such Arches and Culverts as shall cross or pass through, under, or over the said Road shall be secured, cleansed, and kept open, repaired and maintained, by the said Trustees, subject to the Provisions of any Law or Statute relating to Turnpike Roads in *England*.

For preventing Drains, &c. from being allowed to enter into the Road.

XVII. And be it enacted, That in case any Owner or Occupier of any House, Building, Erection, Lands, or Premises adjacent to the same Road shall suffer any Water, Filth, Dirt, or offensive Matter or Thing to run or flow from the said Houses, Buildings, Erections, Lands, or Premises into or upon the said Road, and shall not, within Three Days after receiving Notice from the Trustees of the said Road, their Surveyor or Agent, stop such Water, Filth, Dirt, or offensive Matter or Thing from running or flowing into or upon the said Road, or the Footpaths adjoining thereto, he shall for every such Offence forfeit and pay any Sum not exceeding Forty Shillings, and that each Day of the Continuance of such Nuisance after the Expiration of the said Three Days shall be deemed and construed to be a separate Offence, and be punishable accordingly.

Power to erect Toll Houses.

XVIII. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, and they are hereby authorized and empowered, to erect and build upon the said Road, or upon the Sides thereof, when and where and as they shall judge proper, any Toll Houses, Toll Gates, or Toll Bars, and Weighing Machines, with suitable Outbuildings and other Conveniences thereto, and to take in and inclose such suitable Garden Plot for such Toll Houses, not exceeding One Eighth Part of a Statute Acre to each Toll House, as they respectively shall think proper, and from Time to Time to alter or to take down, and to re-erect or reconstruct, or to discontinue and remove the same, as they the said Trustees shall think fit.

Power to take Tolls.

XIX. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees to demand and take, at the several and respective Toll Gates or Toll Bars which shall by virtue of this Act be upon or on the Sides of the said Road, the Tolls following; (that is to say,)

Tolls.

For every Horse, Ass, Mule, or other Beast or Cattle drawing any Coach, Stage Coach, Landau, Berlin, Barouche, Sociable, Curricule, Chariot, Calash, Hearse, Litter, Break, Chaise, Phaeton, Whiskey, Gig, or Chair, or other such like Carriage, the Sum of Sevenpence:

For



For every Horse, Ass, Mule, or other Beast or Cattle drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, Dray, Van, Caravan, Tumbril, Drag, Bone Mill, Thrashing Machine, or other such like Carriage, having the Sole or Bottom of the Fellies of the Wheels thereof of the Breadth of Six Inches or upwards, the Sum of Three-pence :

And in case the Fellies of the Wheels thereof shall be of less Breadth than Six Inches, and not less Breadth than Four Inches and a Half, the Sum of Sixpence :

And in case the Fellies of the Wheels thereof shall be of less Breadth than Four Inches and a Half, the Sum of Nine-pence :

For every Horse, Ass, Mule, or other Beast or Cattle, laden or unladen, and not drawing, the Sum of Two-pence :

For every Drove of Oxen, Cows, or Neat Cattle, the Sum of Ten-pence *per* Score, and so in proportion for any greater or less Number :

For every Drove of Calves, Swine, Sheep, or Lambs, the Sum of Five-pence *per* Score, and so in proportion for any greater or less Number :

For every Carriage moved or propelled by Steam or Machinery, or by any other Power than Animal Power, the Sum of One Shilling for every Wheel thereof :

For every Waggon, Wain, Cart, or such like Carriage, having the Nails of the Tire of the Wheels thereof projecting more than One Quarter of an Inch above such Tire, or not having the Name of the Owner or Owners of any such Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other such like Carriage affixed in legible Characters on the Right or Off Side thereof, the Sum of Ten Shillings :

Which said Tolls shall be taken before any Horse, Mule, Ass, Beast, or other Cattle, or Carriage whatsoever, shall be permitted to pass through any Toll Gate or Bar which shall be by virtue of this Act upon or across the said Road, or on the Sides thereof; and said Tolls hereby granted, and all Tolls authorized to be taken under or by virtue of this Act, shall be and the same are hereby vested in the said Trustees.

XX. And be it enacted, That in all Cases in which there shall be a fractional Part of a Halfpenny in the Amount of any of the Tolls by this Act authorized to be collected the Sum of One Halfpenny shall be payable in lieu of such fractional Part.

No Fraction of a Halfpenny in Tolls.

XXI. Provided also, and be it enacted, That nothing herein contained shall extend, or be deemed or construed to extend, to empower the said Trustees to demand or take more than One full Toll for passing on the whole Line of Road.

Limiting the Number of Tolls to be taken.

XXII. Provided always, and be it enacted, That after the respective Tolls hereby authorized to be taken shall have been paid for the passing of any Horse, Beast, Cattle, or Carriage whatsoever through any Toll Gate or Toll Bar to be erected by virtue of this Act, such Horse, Beast, Cattle, or Carriage shall, upon a Ticket being produced denoting such Payment on that Day, be permitted to

to pass Toll-free through the same, and also through such other Toll Gate or Toll Bar, if any, as shall be expressed to be freed by the Ticket for such Payment, at any Time or Times during the same Day, such Day to be computed from Twelve of the Clock in one Night to Twelve of the Clock in the next preceding Night, except as herein-after mentioned.

Tolls for Horses drawing Stage Carriages to be paid every Time of passing and repassing;

XXIII. And be it enacted, That the Tolls hereby granted shall be paid for or in respect of Horses or Beasts drawing any Stage Carriage, of whatever Description, carrying Passengers for Hire or Reward, for each Time of the passing and for each Time of the repassing of such Carriage along the said Road; provided nevertheless, that no further or additional Toll shall be payable in respect of such Carriages on account only of the Horses or Beasts drawing the same having been changed.

and for Horses drawing Post Chaises, &c. on each fresh Hiring.

XXIV. And be it enacted, That the Tolls hereby granted shall be paid for or in respect of Horses or Beasts let out to Hire, whether for riding, or for drawing any Post Chaise or other Carriage, upon any Occasion of a distinct or new Hiring of such Horses or Beast.

Horses returning through Toll Gates with different Carriages not to be exempted from Payment of Toll.

XXV. And be it enacted, That no Horse or other Beast or Cattle in respect of which the Toll chargeable by this Act upon any Horse or other Beast or Cattle drawing any Caravan, Waggon, Wain, Cart, Tumbril, or other Carriage of the like Description shall have been paid, shall be entitled to the Exemption from the Payment of further Toll on repassing on the same Day through any of the same Toll Gates or Toll Bars, if drawing at the Time any Caravan, Waggon, Wain, Cart, Tumbril, or other Carriage of the like Description, different from that which was drawn by such Horse or other Beast or Cattle when such Toll was previously paid, but in such Case Toll shall be demandable and paid in respect of every such Horse or other Beast or Cattle as if no Toll had been previously paid on that Day.

Steam Carriages to pay each Time of passing.

XXVI. And be it enacted, That the Tolls hereby made payable for or in respect of any Carriage propelled, drawn, or moved by Steam, Gas, Machinery, or any other like Power, shall be paid every Time of the passing and repassing of such Carriage along the said Road.

Weight of One-horse Carts limited.

XXVII. And be it enacted, That the Weight to be allowed to Carts or other such like Carriages drawn by only One Horse or other Beast upon the said Road shall not exceed the following; (that is to say,) from the First Day of *May* to the Thirty-first Day of *October* (both Days inclusive) One Ton and Fifteen Hundred Weight for each such Carriage and the Lading thereof, and from the First Day of *November* to the Thirtieth Day of *April* (both Days inclusive) One Ton and Ten Hundred Weight for each such Carriage and the Lading thereof.

XXVIII. And



XXVIII. And be it enacted, That all Carts and other such like Carriages drawn by only One Horse or other Beast upon the said Road shall and may be weighed at any Weighing Machine to be erected upon the said Road, and the like additional Tolls may be demanded and recovered for the Overweight thereof as are by Law payable in respect of Carts or other Carriages drawn by Two or more Horses; and all the Powers, Regulations, and Penalties now in force relating to the weighing of Carts or other such like Carriages passing on the said Road, drawn by Two or more Horses, shall be applicable to Carts or other such like Carriages passing on the said Road drawn only by One Horse or other Beast, and to the Drivers and Owners thereof respectively.

XXIX. Provided also, and be it enacted, That nothing contained in any Act for regulating Turnpike Roads in *England*, or in this Act, shall extend or be construed to extend to exempt from the Payment of Toll any Horse or other Beast drawing any Carriage laden with Stones, Gravel, or other Materials for the making or repairing any Road or public Highway in any other Parish than those through which the Road comprised in this Act passes, or shall hereafter be made to pass, or for the making or repairing any Road or public Highway in any other Parish or Parishes than that wherein the same are found, unless the drawing of such Carriage so laden as aforesaid along the said Road comprised in the Act shall be between the First Day of *May* and the First Day of *November*, or in the Time of hard Frost in the Winter Season.

XXX. Provided always, and be it enacted, That no Exemption from Toll shall be claimed or allowed, by virtue of any Law now in being for regulating Turnpike Roads, for or in respect of any Horse, Ass, Mule, Beast, or other Cattle drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or any other such Carriage which shall be employed in carrying or conveying any Corn or Grain in the Straw, Hay, Straw, Fodder, Dung, Lime, or Sand for the Improvement of Land, or other Manure, or any Plough, Harrow, or Implements of Husbandry, unless the Tires of the Wheels of such Waggon, Cart, Wain, or other Carriage shall be of the Breadth of Four Inches and a Half, or more, if drawn by One, Two, or Three Horses, Beasts, or other Cattle, or of the Breadth of Six Inches or more, if drawn by more than Three Horses, Beasts, or other Cattle, nor unless the whole Sole or Bottom of such Wheels, when rolling on a flat or level Surface, shall bear equally on such flat or level Surface, and the Nails of the Tires of such Wheels be in all such Cases countersunk so as not to project more than One Eighth of an Inch beyond the Surface of such Tires.

XXXI. And whereas great Injury may be done to the said Roads by the Lessees or Renters of the Tolls accepting an inadequate Composition for the Tolls of Carriages liable to be charged in respect of Overweight; be it therefore enacted, That if any Lessee or Renter of the Tolls by this Act granted, or any Deputy or Agent of such Lessee or Renter, shall make Composition, by the Year or otherwise, with any Person whomsoever, for or in lieu of the Tolls of any Carriage of whatever Description, every such Lessee or

Renter, Deputy or Agent, shall, on Conviction thereof by Confession or upon the Oath of any Witness before any One of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the County Palatine of *Chester*, forfeit and pay, in addition to the Costs and Charges attending the Conviction, any Sum not exceeding Five Pounds, and shall also forfeit his Contract, Lease, or Agreement for renting the Tolls, if the said Trustees shall think proper to order that the same shall be made void, and every such Composition shall be null and void; and one Moiety of every such Penalty shall be paid to the Informer, and the Remainder thereof to the said Trustees, to be applied to the Purposes of this Act.

Road to be Turnpike, and public on Payment of Tolls.

XXXII. And be it enacted, That from and after the Commencement of this Act the said Road shall be and remain a Turnpike Road, and all Persons, Horses, Cattle, and Carriages shall have free Liberty (upon Payment of the respective Tolls by this Act granted) to pass over the same without any Hindrance or Interruption of or by any Person whomsoever.

Penalty for evading Tolls.

XXXIII. And be it enacted, That if any Person, after having travelled with Horses, Carts, or Carriages upon the said Road or any Part thereof, shall quit the same, and again enter upon and use the said Road for any Distance exceeding One hundred Yards, without paying the Toll authorized to be collected by virtue of this Act, every Person so offending shall for every such Offence forfeit and pay a Sum not exceeding Forty Shillings, one Moiety whereof shall be paid to the Informer, and the other Moiety to the said Trustees, to be applied to the Purposes of this Act.

Application of Monies.

XXXIV. And be it enacted, That all Monies which shall be received by the said Trustees by virtue of this Act shall be applied, in the first place, in discharging the Expences of applying for and obtaining this Act, or otherwise incident thereto, with lawful Interest for any Money which may have been or which may be advanced for the Payment thereof from the Time the same shall have been advanced to the Time of the same being repaid; in the second place, in defraying the Expences of erecting and providing Toll Gates or Toll Bars, and Toll Houses and other Buildings, and of making, improving, and maintaining the said Road, and of otherwise putting this Act into execution; thirdly, in discharging the Interest of the Monies which may at any Time hereafter be borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls by this Act authorized to be taken; and, lastly, in discharging any Principal Monies which may hereafter be borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls by this Act authorized to be taken.

No Money to be expended in repairing Streets in a Town.

XXXV. And be it enacted, That no Money shall be laid out on any Part of the said Road which shall be within the Limits of any Act of Parliament passed for the Improvement of any Town, nor shall any be collected therein, nor shall this Act be construed in any Manner to affect the Liability of the Persons now liable to repair the same.



XXXVI. And be it enacted, That no Trustee or Clerk acting under the Authority of this Act, if not otherwise interested, shall be deemed incompetent to give Evidence, or shall be disqualified from giving Evidence, in any Action, Suit, or other Proceeding brought by or against him in such his Capacity of Trustee or Clerk, by reason of his being Plaintiff or Defendant in such Action, Suit, or Proceeding.

Trustees and Clerk competent Witnesses in Actions.

XXXVII. And be it enacted, That nothing herein contained shall be deemed to exempt the said Road from the Provisions of any general Act relating to the Consolidation or other improved Arrangement of Turnpike Roads which may pass during the present or any future Session of Parliament.

Road liable to the Provisions of any general Act.

XXXVIII. And be it enacted, That this Act shall commence on the passing thereof, and shall continue in force for the Term of Thirty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the Session of Parliament which shall then next follow.

Commencement and Continuance of this Act.

XXXIX. And be it enacted, That in construing this Act Words importing the Singular Number shall be understood to include the Plural Number, and Words importing the Plural Number shall be understood to include the Singular Number; and the Word "Person" shall be understood to include a Corporation; and Words importing the Masculine Gender shall be understood to include Females as well as Males; and the Word "Lands" shall be understood to include Messuages, Tenements, and Hereditaments; unless in any of the Cases aforesaid there be something in the Subject or Context repugnant to such Construction.

Construction of certain Terms in this Act.

XL. And be it enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such.
