CHAPTER cvii.

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order made by the Educa-A.D. 1878 tion Department under the Elementary Education Act, 1870, to enable the School Board for Portsmouth to put in force the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, and the Acts amending the same. [4th July 1878.]

WHEREAS the Lords of the Committee of the Privy Council on Education have made a Provisional Order under the authority of the Elementary Education Act, 1870, on behalf of the 33 & 34 Vict. School Board for Portsmouth, and it is requisite that the same c. 75. should be confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1. The following Order shall be and is hereby confirmed, and Corfirmation of Order. from and after the passing of this Act shall have full validity and force.
- 2. This Act may be cited as the Education Department Pro-Short title. visional Order Confirmation (Portsmouth) Act, 1878.

A.D. 1878. THE SCHOOL BOARD FOR PORTSMOUTH, COUNTY OF SOUTHAMPTON.

Provisional Order for putting in force the Lands Clauses
Consolidation Act, 1845.

At the Council Chamber, the 8th day of May 1878.

Whereas the School Board for Portsmouth, in the county of Southampton, require to purchase certain pieces of land for the purposes of the Elementary Education Act, 1870, and, not having been able to purchase the same by agreement, require to put in force the provisions of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, and the Acts amending the same, which apply to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement:

And whereas the lands so required to be purchased are set forth in the schedule hereunder written:

And whereas the said Board have made due publication of the notices, and have duly served the same, according to the requirements of the Elementary Education Act, 1870, and have presented a petition to the Education Department praying that an Order may be made authorising the said School Board to put in force the powers of the said Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement, in which petition were stated all the matters required by the said Elementary Education Act to be stated therein, and the same hath been supported by such evidence as the said Education Department required:

And whereas the said Department, having considered the said petition, and the proofs of the publication and service of the proper notices, have thought fit to proceed with the case, and have caused inquiry to be made in the district of the said Board wherein the said lands are situate as to the propriety of the proposed Order:

Now, therefore, the said Department, having received a report after such inquiry, and having duly considered the same, do hereby declare that it is proper, and do hereby order accordingly, that the said Board be authorised to put in force, with reference to the pieces of land set forth in the schedule hereunder written, the powers of the said Acts for the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement, or any of them.

SCHEDULE to the foregoing Order.

Portsea, Church Path.—Three houses and premises, being Nos. 1, 3, and 5, Upper Church Path; a piece of garden ground on the east side of No. 5, with a yard in continuation at the north end, having a frontage of about 34 feet in Crasswell Street; and a right of way or passage on the west side of No. 1, leading to the said piece of garden ground. Three houses and premises in Arundel Place; a house and premises in the rear of the said three houses; a shed attached to a house in Arundel Place, with a piece of garden ground of similar width as the said shed; a one-storey building at the end of Clarendon Place, with garden in front; also a right of way to the back of a beerhouse (the "Royal Oak") in Crasswell Street, and three houses, being Nos. 1, 2, and 3, Blucher Place, Upper Church Path.
