CHAPTER clxiv.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the Local Government Board relating to the Rural Sanitary District of the Abergavenny Union, the Improvement Act District of Bradford (Wilts), the Local Government District of Brigg, the Boroughs of Brighton and Cheltenham, the Local Government District of Ebbw Vale, the Improvement Act District of Leek, the Boroughs of Liverpool and Preston, the Local Government District of St. Columb, the Borough of Tiverton (two), the Local Government District of Tredegar, and the Special Drainage District of Washington. [22d July 1878.] A.D. 1878.

WHEREAS the Local Government Board have, as regards the districts herein mentioned, made the Provisional Orders set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed, under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875 :

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be confirmed by Parliament, and that the provisions herein contained should be enacted in reference to certain of the said Provisional Orders :

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :

1. The Orders set out in the Schedule hereunto annexed shall be and the same are hereby confirmed, and all the provisions thereof shall, from and after the passing of this Act, have full validity and force. The Provisional Orders in schedule confirmed.

2. When and so soon as the new road and footpaths intended to be constructed by the Urban Sanitary Authority of the Borough of Brighton through the centre of the lawn or ornamental garden of Brighton

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been declared to be a highway under the provisions of section one
38 & 39 Vict. hundred and fifty-two of the Public Health Act, 1875, it shall be
c. 55. lawful for the Urban Sanitary Authority by a resolution, a copy of
which shall be put up at each end of Lower Rock Gardens, to declare
that the present roads and footpaths situate on the east and west
sides of Lower Rock Gardens, or such parts thereof as do not form
part of the new road and footpaths, shall, after the expiration of
seven days from such copy being so put up, be closed, and after the
expiration of the said seven days the Urban Sanitary Authority shall,
at their own expense, convert the whole or such part of the site of
the present roads and footpaths into areas or forecourts to the houses
in Lower Rock Gardens aforesaid, according to the respective widths
or frontages of such houses, and such areas or forecourts shall thence-
forth vest in and become the property of the respective owners,
lessees, and occupiers of such houses, according to their respective
estates or interests in such houses, in exchange for the rights of
such owners, lessees, and occupiers respectively in the present
roads and footpaths, and in the lawn or enclosure aforesaid.

3. If the Urban Sanitary Authority for the borough of Liverpool shall put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts, 1845, 1860, and 1869, or any of them, conferred upon them by the Provisional Order relating to that borough, and hereby confirmed, with reference to the lands required for the widening of Brythen Street, and numbered 310 in the schedule to such Provisional Orders, and on the deposited plans therein referred to, which are vested in Joseph Walmsley and others, or any part thereof, the said Urban Sanitary Authority shall (if required by or on behalf of the said Joseph Walmsley and others) take the whole of the adjoining lands vested in the said Joseph Walmsley and others situate between Williamson Square and Charles Street, together with the Theatre Royal and buildings thereon; and the powers and provisions conferred by the said Provisional Order with respect to the purchase and taking of lands shall extend and apply to such adjoining lands and to the said Theatre Royal and buildings.

4. When and so soon as Stanley Street, in the borough of Liverpool, shall have been widened, and the proposed new street in continuation of Stanley Street from Victoria Street to Whitechapel shall have been respectively completed by the Urban Sanitary Authority of the said borough under the powers of the Provisional Order relating to that borough, and hereby confirmed, and such new street

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shall have been declared to have been a highway repairable by the inhabitants at large, it shall be lawful for the Urban Sanitary Authority, by a resolution or resolutions, a copy of which shall be put up at each end of Stanley Street and also at each end of such new street respectively, to declare that after the expiration of seven days from such copy being so put up the streets called Poplar Lane, and also Bakehouse Lane from Stanley Street to Cumberland Street, and the parts of Stanley Street not forming part of the said new street, and the parts of Brokers Alley, Matthew Street, and Derby Street, as the case may be, respectively shown upon the deposited plan referred to in the said Order as intended to be closed shall be closed; and after the expiration of the said seven days the said streets and parts of streets shall be closed accordingly, and all rights of way over the same respectively shall thereupon be absolutely extinguished: Provided that the closing of the said streets and parts of streets respectively shall not take place until the interests of all parties (except the Earl of Derby) in the lands shown upon the deposited plan abutting upon both sides of the said streets and parts of streets respectively proposed to be closed, or in the lands shown upon the said deposited plan with which the said streets or parts of streets respectively form the means of communication, shall have been respectively acquired, surrendered, or determined.

5. In constructing, using, and maintaining the new street from Fishergate Hill to Marsh Lane, in the borough of Preston, mentioned in the Provisional Order relating to that borough hereby confirmed, the Urban Sanitary Authority of that borough shall not, without the written consent of the London and North Western Railway Company and the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, the proprietors of the North Union Railway, and of the Ribble Navigation Company, alter, interfere with, or damage the tunnel or works of the Ribble Branch Railway, and the Urban Sanitary Authority shall only be empowered to acquire from the said Companies an easement for the construction, use, and maintenance of a public road or street over the top of the said tunnel, and not the power to take the said tunnel or works or any part thereof.

6. When the Provisional Order hereby confirmed, whereby the Local Government District of Saint Columb is dissolved, comes into operation, so much only of the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, obligations, and property exerciseable by, or attaching to, or vested in the Saint Columb Local Board, as are exerciseable

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Guardians of the Poor of the Abergavenny Union, in the Counties of Monmouth and Hereford, as the Sanitary Authority for the Rural Sanitary District of that Union, require to purchase and take the lands which are described in the Schedule hereto for the disposal of the sewage of the part of the Parish of Llanfoist, in the County of Monmouth, which is comprised in the said Rural Sanitary District ;

And whereas the said Sanitary Authority made due publication in the newspaper and served the several notices, as required by the Public Health Act, 1875, and presented a Petition to the Local Government Board, stating as required by that Act, and praying, with reference to the said lands, to be allowed to put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts, with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement ;

And whereas upon receipt of such Petition the Local Government Board directed Local Inquiry to be held as to the propriety of assenting to the prayer thereof, which Inquiry was held, after due public notice, and report has been made to them thereon :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, do hereby empower the said Sanitary Authority, from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, to put in force, with reference to the lands described in the Schedule

IMPROVEMENT ACT DISTRICT OF BRADFORD.

Provisional Order for partially repealing and altering a Local Act; and for other purposes.

To the Commissioners for executing the powers and provisions of a Local Act of Parliament passed in the third year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act for paving, lighting, watching, and improving the Town of Bradford, in the County of Wilts," being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Bradford, in the County of Wilts; —

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS under the provisions of a Local Act of Parliament passed in the third year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act for paving, lighting, watching, and improving the Town of Bradford, in the County of Wilts," (herein-after called "the Local Act,") certain Commissioners were appointed to execute the Local Act in the limits of the Town of Bradford, in the County of Wilts, as therein defined;

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And whereas the Town of Bradford as defined by the said Local Act is an Urban Sanitary District, of which the said Commissioners are the Urban Sanitary Authority;

And whereas by Section 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, the Local Government Board are empowered, on the application of the Sanitary Authority of any Sanitary District, by Provisional Order, wholly or partially, to repeal, alter, or amend any Local Act, other than an Act for the conservancy of rivers, which is in force in any area comprising the whole or part of any such District, and not conferring powers or privileges on any person or persons for their or his own pecuniary benefit, which relates to the same subject-matters as the Public Health Act, 1875;

And whereas the Local Act is a Local Act within the meaning of the above-recited section of the Public Health Act, 1875;

And whereas the said Commissioners, as such Sanitary Authority as aforesaid, applied to the Local Government Board to alter and amend the Local Act, so as to carry out the purposes herein-after mentioned;

And whereas the Local Government Board, on receipt of the said application, directed Local Inquiry to be held on the subject thereof, and the same was held, after due public notice, and report has been made to them thereon:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, do hereby order that, from and after the Twenty-ninth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, the following provisions shall take effect; viz. :—

I. Sections 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, and 10 of the Local Act shall be wholly repealed, except so far as the same shall have been acted upon, and so far as it may be necessary to continue the same for enabling the Commissioners to carry out the purposes of the Local Act, and to discharge their duties as an Urban Sanitary Authority until the day on which the Commissioners to be elected as herein-after provided shall come into office.

Provided, that all matters and things commenced under the authority of the said sections, and not concluded before the said Twenty-ninth day of September, may be continued under the same authority until concluded, and that entries prior to such day in the book of proceedings of the Commissioners, in pursuance of Section 10 of the Local Act, shall be admitted as evidence, as provided in that section.

II. Twelve persons, who shall have the qualification required by the law for the time being in force with regard to the election of members of a Local Board, shall be elected in the manner provided by the Public Health Act, 1875, with respect to such election, as Commissioners under the Local Act, within two calendar months after the said Twenty-ninth day of September, or within such further time as the Local Government Board may by Order allow; and all the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875, relating to the qualification, disqualification, nomination, election, continuance in, and retirement from, office of members of Local Boards, and the filling up of casual vacancies, shall apply to the qualification, disqualification, nomination, election, continuance in, and

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A.D. 1878. retirement from, office of the Commissioners, and the filling up of casual vacancies, as if the Commissioners were a Local Board within the meaning of that Act.

III. For the purposes of the first election of the Commissioners, such person as the Local Government Board shall, by Order, appoint shall be the Returning Officer.

Such election shall be conducted in accordance with the Rules, excepting Rule 55, contained in Schedule II. to the Public Health Act, 1875, as if it were the first election of a Local Board for a District constituted after the passing of that Act, and the Commissioners then elected shall come into office on the day on which the first meeting of the Commissioners shall be held after the Returning Officer shall have made his certificate of election in accordance with Rule 42 or Rule 52, as the case may require, of the said Schedule II.

Provided, that the Returning Officer shall give notice of the said election, in accordance with Rule 36 of the said Schedule II., within fourteen days from the said Twenty-ninth day of September, and shall specify in such notice the dates on which the several proceedings necessary to complete such election shall be taken, notwithstanding anything in the said Public Health Act, 1875, to the contrary.

IV. The said first meeting of the Commissioners shall be held at such place and on such day (not being more than ten days after the Returning Officer shall have made his certificate of election as aforesaid) as the Returning Officer may, by written notice to each person elected, appoint; and on and after such day all the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875, relating to Local Boards, shall apply to the Commissioners as if they were a Local Board within the meaning of that Act, and the Commissioners may, from time to time, appoint out of their own number so many persons as they may think fit for any of the purposes of the said Local Act which in the opinion of such Commissioners would be better regulated and managed by a Committee, subject to the provisions contained in Section 200 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and to the provisions of Section 204 of the same Act.

V. On the day on which the said Commissioners elected at the first election as aforesaid shall come into office, the Commissioners who were authorised to act as Commissioners under the Local Act and have not been elected at such election shall cease to be Commissioners.

Provided, that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to alter or affect the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, obligations, and property of the Commissioners under the said Local Act, except as herein expressly provided.

VI. The order in which the said Commissioners elected at the first election as aforesaid shall go out of office shall be regulated by the said Commissioners as if such election were the first election of a Local Board for a District constituted after the passing of the Public Health Act, 1875.

VII. Section 107 of the Local Act shall be altered so as to provide that for all the purposes of the Local Act and of the Public Health Act, 1875, the Town of Bradford shall comprise and be deemed to extend over all those parts

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of the four several Tithings in the Parish of Bradford called the Borough or
Borough Tithing, Leigh and Woolley, Troll, and Winsley, lying within
a circle two miles in diameter, the centre of which is a messuage called the
"Swan Inn," situate in the said Town of Bradford.

WHEREAS in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, the
Vestry of the Parish of Scawby-cum-Sturton, in the County of Lincoln, acting
as the Sewer Authority for that Parish under the Sewage Utilization Act,
1865, and the Sanitary Act, 1866, borrowed the sum of one hundred and
ninety-five pounds, for the execution of Works of Sewerage in a portion of
the said Parish, of which the sum of seventy-eight pounds or thereabouts now
remains unpaid ;

And whereas by a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board dated
the Fourth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and
duly confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirma-
tion (Atherton, &c.) Act, 1877, part of the said Parish of Scawby-cum-Sturton,
including the portion in which the said Sewerage Works were executed, was
included in the Local Government District of Brigg, in the County of Lincoln ;

And whereas by Section 297 of the Public Health Act, 1875, it is enacted
(inter alia) that any Act confirming any Provisional Order made in pursuance

by any Provisional Order made by the Local Government Board and confirmed
by Parliament ;

And whereas it having been proposed that the Local Government Board
should issue a Provisional Order to alter and amend the Local Government
Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (Atherton, &c.) Act, 1877, so far as it
relates to the said Provisional Order, so as to provide for the payment of the
outstanding balance of the said sum of one hundred and ninety-five pounds,
the Local Government Board directed inquiry to be held on the subject, and

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, do hereby Order that, from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, the said Local Government Board's Provisional Order Confirmation (Atherton, &c.) Act, 1877, shall, so far as it relates to the said Provisional Order of the Fourth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, be altered so as to provide that the Brigg Local Board shall from time to time make separate assessments, and levy and make such a rate or rates, in the nature of a General District Rate, upon that part of the Parish of Scawby-cum-Sturton which was included in their District by the said Provisional Order as shall be sufficient to defray, in the manner provided by Section 234 of the Public Health Act, 1875, the said sum of seventy-eight pounds, or so much thereof as shall be then due and owing, in respect of the said sum of one hundred and ninety-five pounds, and the interest due or to become due thereon, within the period for which the borrowing of the said sum of one hundred and ninety-five pounds has been sanctioned.

WHEREAS by Section 270 of the Public Health Act, 1875, the Local Government Board are empowered, by Provisional Order, to declare the whole or any portion of a Local Government or Rural Sanitary District immediately adjoining a Local Government District to be included in such last-mentioned District, and it is enacted that thereupon the included area shall, for the purposes of that Act, be deemed to form part of the District in which it is included by such Order ;

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And whereas by Section 275 of the said Public Health Act, 1875, it is enacted that every Order made by the Local Government Board under Part VIII. of that Act, which includes Section 270 above-recited, shall specify the day on which such Order shall come into operation (in that Act referred to as the commencement of the Order); and that where any Local Government District is diminished or increased in extent under that part of the Act, the Order shall prescribe the number of members to be elected for the District when altered;

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, do hereby Declare that all those portions of the Rural Sanitary Districts of the Bedwelty and Crickhowell Unions respectively which are described in the Schedule hereto shall be included in, and shall, for the purposes of the Public Health Act, 1875, be deemed to form part of, the Local Government District of Ebbw Vale.

*Provisional Order for partially repealing, altering, and amending the Leek
Improvement Act, 1855.*

To the Leek Improvement Commissioners, being the Sanitary Authority

WHEREAS the Improvement Act District of Leek, in the County of
Stafford, is an Urban Sanitary District, of which the Leek Improvement
Commissioners are the Urban Sanitary Authority, and the Leek Improvement

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And whereas by Section 133 of the said Act the Commissioners are empowered from time to time to borrow on mortgage, on the security of the lands from time to time vested in them under that Act, and the tolls and rates granted by that Act, and their gas rents and other property and effects, any sums (in addition to the sum of six thousand five hundred pounds due and owing on mortgage as therein mentioned) not exceeding in the whole forty thousand pounds, and after having paid off (otherwise than by the sinking fund) any money so borrowed or due and owing, they may re-borrow the amount so paid off, and so toties quoties ;

And whereas by Section 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, the Local Government Board are empowered, on the application of the Sanitary Authority of any Sanitary District, by Provisional Order, wholly or partially, to repeal, alter, or amend any Local Act, other than an Act for the conservancy of rivers, which is in force in any area comprising the whole or part of any such District, and not conferring powers or privileges on any persons or person for their or his own pecuniary benefit, which relates to the same subject-matters as the Public Health Act, 1875 ;

And whereas the first-mentioned Act is a Local Act within the meaning of the above-recited section of the Public Health Act, 1875, and the said Commissioners, as such Sanitary Authority as aforesaid, have applied to the Local Government Board to issue a Provisional Order to partially repeal, alter, and amend the said Local Act as herein-after mentioned ;

And whereas upon receipt of the said application the Local Government Board directed Local Inquiry to be held on the subject thereof, and such Inquiry was held after due public notice, and report has been made to them thereon :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, do hereby Order that, from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, herein-after referred to as "the commencement of this Order," the following provisions shall take effect ; viz.,—

Art. 1. Section 133 of the said Local Act shall be altered and amended so as to enable the said Commissioners to borrow, under the provisions thereof, such further sums as the Local Government Board may approve, in addition to the sums of forty thousand pounds and six thousand five hundred pounds therein mentioned, provided that the total amount owing in respect of sums borrowed under the provisions of that section shall not at any time exceed the sum of fifty thousand pounds.

Art. 2. So much of Section 133 aforesaid shall be repealed as prevents the said Commissioners from re-borrowing any money which has been paid off by means of the sinking fund mentioned in the said Local Act, whether such money has been already or may hereafter be so paid off.

Art. 3. Section 136 of the said Local Act shall not be applicable to any sums which after the commencement of this Order may be borrowed or re-borrowed under Section 133 as hereby altered and amended, but the provisions of Sub-sections (1), (4), (5), and (6) of Section 234 of the Public Health Act, 1875,

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A.D. 1878. shall apply to the borrowing, re-borrowing, and repayment of such sums, as if they were borrowed or re-borrowed under the provisions of that Act and not of the said Local Act; provided that when any money is re-borrowed for the purpose of repaying any sum or sums borrowed before the commencement of this Order, the time for the repayment of the money so re-borrowed shall be such period as may be sanctioned by the Local Government Board, and shall in no case be a longer period than sixty years from the date of the original loan.

Art. 4. The said Local Act shall be further altered, and shall provide that —

- (a) The Treasurer of the Commissioners shall, within twenty-one days after the expiration of each year during which any sum is required by the said Local Act as hereby altered and amended to be set apart for a sinking fund, or to be paid as an instalment in respect of moneys borrowed or re-borrowed, whether before or after the commencement of this Order, under the provisions of the Local Act as hereby altered and amended, transmit to the Local Government Board a return, in such form as may be prescribed by that Board and verified by statutory declaration, if so required by them, showing the amount which has been paid as an instalment, and the amount which has been invested or applied for the purpose of such sinking fund during the year next preceding the making of such return, and the description of the securities upon which any investment has been made, and the purposes to which any portion of the amount paid as an instalment, or of the sinking fund, or investment, or of the sums accumulated by way of interest, has been applied during the same period, and the total amount (if any) remaining invested at the end of the year.
- (b) If it appears to the Local Government Board, by that return or otherwise, that the Commissioners have failed to pay any instalment or to set apart the sum required for the sinking fund, or have applied any portion of the money set apart for the sinking fund or of the sums accumulated by way of interest, to any purposes other than those authorised, they may, by Order, direct that a sum not exceeding double the amount in respect of which default has been made shall be paid, set apart, and invested or applied as part of the sinking fund; and any such Order shall be enforceable by writ of Mandamus, to be obtained by the Local Government Board out of Her Majesty's High Court of Justice.

Provisional Order to enable the Urban Sanitary Authority for the Borough of Liverpool to put in force the Compulsory Clauses of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts, 1845, 1860, and 1869.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Liverpool, in the County of Lancaster, being the Urban Sanitary Authority for that Borough;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Liverpool, in the County of Lancaster, acting by the Council, as the Urban Sanitary Authority for that Borough, require to purchase and take the lands which are described in the Schedule hereto, for making certain new streets, for altering, widening, and improving certain existing streets, for effecting certain other street improvements, and extending the North Haymarket, in the said Borough;

And whereas the said Council, as such Urban Sanitary Authority as aforesaid, have made due publication in the newspaper and served the several notices, as required by the Public Health Act, 1875, and have presented a petition to the Local Government Board, stating as required by that Act, and praying, with reference to the said lands, to be allowed to put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts, with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement;

And whereas the District of Saint Columb is a Local Government District within the meaning of Section 270 above mentioned, and the Saint Columb Local Board have incurred certain debts, amounting to the sum of one thousand one hundred and eighty pounds, for the construction of works for the supply of water to their District ;

And whereas the Local Government Board having deemed it expedient to dissolve the said Local Government District, and to merge it in the Rural Sanitary District of the Saint Columb Major Union, directed local inquiry to be held on the subject, and the same was held, after due public notice, and report has been made to them thereon :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, do hereby Order that the following provisions shall take effect, viz. :—

I. The Local Government District of Saint Columb shall be dissolved, and shall be merged in the Rural Sanitary District of the Saint Columb Major Union, in the County of Cornwall, and shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the Guardians of the Poor of that Union, as the Sanitary Authority for such Rural Sanitary District.

“ ‘ paving and otherwise improving the Town of Tiverton, in the County of
