CHAPTER ciii.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the Local Government Board relating to the Rural Sanitary District of the Abergavenny Union, the Borough of Bolton, the Local Government District of Clay Lane, the Rural Sanitary District of the Clutton Union, the Darenth Valley Main Sewerage District, the Rural Sanitary District of the Great Ouseburn Union, the Borough of Halifax, the Local Government District of Huyton-with-Roby, the Port of Lowestoft, the Improvement Act District of Lowestoft, the Boroughs of Preston and Saint Helens, and the Local Government Districts of Stone and Widnes. A.D. 1879.

WHEREAS the Local Government Board have, as regards the districts and boroughs herein mentioned, made the Provisional Orders set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed, under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875:

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. The Orders as set out in the schedule hereunto annexed shall be and the same are hereby confirmed, and all the provisions thereof shall, from and after the passing of this Act, have full validity and force.

2. This Act may be cited as the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (Abergavenny Union, &c.) Act, 1879.

RURAL SANITARY DISTRICT OF THE ABERGAVENNY UNION.

Provisional Order to enable the Sanitary Authority for the Rural Sanitary District of the Abergavenny Union to put in force the Compulsory Clauses of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts, 1845, 1860, and 1869.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Abergavenny Union, in the Counties of Monmouth and Hereford, being the Sanitary Authority for the Rural Sanitary District of that Union ; —

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Guardians of the Poor of the Abergavenny Union, in the Counties of Monmouth and Hereford, as the Sanitary Authority for the Rural Sanitary District of that Union, require to purchase and take the lands described in the Schedule hereto, for the purpose of constructing works for supplying the part of the Parish of Llantillio-Pertholey, in the County of Monmouth, which is comprised in the said Rural Sanitary District, with water, and for obtaining access to the lands required for such works ;

And whereas the said Sanitary Authority made due publication in the newspaper and served the several notices, as required by the Public Health Act, 1875, and presented a petition to the Local Government Board, stating as required by that Act, and praying, with reference to the said lands, to be allowed to put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts, with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement ;

And whereas upon receipt of such petition the Local Government Board directed Local Inquiry to be held as to the propriety of assenting to the prayer thereof, which Inquiry was held after due public notice, and report has been made to them thereon ;

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, do hereby empower the said Sanitary Authority, from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, to put in force, with reference to the lands described in the Schedule hereto, the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts, 1845, 1860, and 1869, with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement, or any of them.

Provisional Order for altering the Bolton Improvement Act, 1877.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Bolton, in
 the County of Lancaster, being the Urban Sanitary Authority for
 that Borough ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Borough of Bolton, in the County of Lancaster, is an
 Urban Sanitary District, of which the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses, acting
 by the Council, are the Urban Sanitary Authority, and the Bolton Improve-
 ment Act, 1877, is in force in the said District ;

And whereas by Section 87 of the said Act it is enacted as follows :

“ In order to secure that due notice be given to the Corporation of any
 inmate of any building used for human habitation who is suffering from
 smallpox, cholera, or any contagious or infectious fever, the following provisions
 shall have effect ; (that is to say,)

“ (1.) If any such inmate be suffering from any such disease as aforesaid, the
 occupier or person having the management or control of such building
 shall, so soon as he shall become aware of the existence in any such
 inmate of any such disease, forthwith give notice to the Corporation
 at the Town Hall of the existence in such inmate of such disease :

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- “ (2.) If such inmate be not a member of the family of such occupier or person, the head of the family (resident in such building) to which such inmate belongs, or if there be no such head, then such inmate (unless prevented by reason of such disease or of youth) shall, on becoming aware of the existence in such inmate or in his own person, as the case may be, of such disease, forthwith give notice thereof to such occupier or person :
- “ (3.) The Corporation shall provide and supply gratuitously to every registered medical practitioner resident or practising in the borough, forms for the certificate or declaration by such medical practitioner of the particulars herein-after mentioned in relation to such cases, according to the form set forth in the Fifth Schedule to this Act :
- “ (4.) Every medical practitioner attending on or called in to visit such inmate shall, on becoming aware that such inmate is suffering from any such disease as aforesaid, forthwith fill up, sign, and send to the Corporation at the Town Hall a certificate or declaration stating, according to the forms prescribed and supplied to him by the Corporation, the name of such inmate, the situation of such building, and the name of such occupier or person, and the nature of the disease from which such inmate is suffering :
- “ (5.) The Corporation shall pay to every medical practitioner who shall in pursuance of this section duly make and give any such certificate or declaration a fee of two shillings and sixpence for each such certificate or declaration :
- “ And any person who shall offend against this enactment (unless ignorant thereof, the burden of the proof of which shall be on him) shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.”

And whereas by Section 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, the Local Government Board are empowered, on the application of the Sanitary Authority of any Sanitary District, by Provisional Order, wholly or partially to repeal, alter, or amend any Local Act, other than an Act for the conservancy of rivers, which is in force in any area comprising the whole or part of any such District, and not conferring powers or privileges on any persons or person for their or his own pecuniary benefit, which relates to the same subject-matters as the Public Health Act, 1875 ;

And whereas the first-mentioned Act is a Local Act within the meaning of the above-recited section of the Public Health Act, 1875, and the said Urban Sanitary Authority have applied to the Local Government Board to alter and amend the same ;

And whereas the Local Government Board, on receipt of such application, directed Local Inquiry to be held on the subject, which Inquiry was held, after due public notice thereof, and report has been made to them thereon :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, do hereby Order that, from

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and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, the following provisions shall take effect; viz., A.D. 1879.

Art. 1. Section 87 of the said Local Act shall be altered and amended in the following manner; viz.,

- (a.) By the insertion therein, after the word "cholera," of the words "scarlatina, scarlet fever, typhoid fever, typhus fever, relapsing fever, puerperal fever, and diphtheria," and by the omission therefrom of the words "or any contagious or infectious fever."
- (b.) By the insertion in Sub-section (1), after the word "building," of the words "or if such occupier or person is prevented by reason of such disease, the person in charge of such inmate."
- (c.) By the insertion in Sub-section (3), after the word "forms," of the words "addressed and stamped for transmission through the post."

Art. 2. The said Local Act shall be further altered and amended so as to provide as follows:

- (a.) The said Urban Sanitary Authority may from time to time, by resolution, order that, subject to the approval of the Local Government Board, any acute infectious disease, other than those mentioned in Section 87 of the said Local Act as hereby altered, shall be deemed to be within and subject to the provisions of that section.
- (b.) Any such order of the Urban Sanitary Authority may be permanent or temporary only, and if temporary, the period during which it is to continue in force shall be specified therein; and when the Local Government Board have approved of any such order the Urban Sanitary Authority shall give public notice of the order by causing a copy thereof to be affixed to the principal door of every church and chapel in the Borough to which notices are usually affixed, and by publishing the same by advertisement in some one or more of the local newspapers circulated in the Borough; and after such public notice has been given the provisions of Section 87 of the said Local Act, as hereby altered and amended, shall, so long as the order continues in force, apply to the acute infectious disease specified therein, in like manner in all respects as if the disease were mentioned in that section.
- (c.) The Local Government Board, on receiving such evidence as they deem sufficient, may certify with respect to any such order that public notice thereof has been duly given as required by the said Local Act as hereby altered and amended, and the production of the London Gazette containing a copy of the certificate of the Local Government Board to that effect shall be conclusive evidence that public notice of the order has been so given.

Art. 3. The Fifth Schedule of the said Local Act shall be altered by the substitution in the note to that Schedule of the words "under a penalty not exceeding ten pounds in case of offence against the enactments of the above-mentioned section," in lieu of the words "under penalty of five pounds in case

And whereas by a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board dated the Eighth day of May, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and duly confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Order Confirmation (Darenth Valley) Act, 1878 (herein-after called "the Confirmation Act"), subject to the provisions of that Act, the Urban Sanitary District of Sevenoaks and certain parts of the Rural Sanitary Districts of the Dartford and Sevenoaks Unions, therein termed "the Constituent Districts," were formed into a United District, to be called the Darenth Valley Main Sewerage District, for the purpose of carrying into effect a system of sewerage for the use of the Constituent Districts;

And whereas by the said Provisional Order as confirmed by the said Act it was ordered that the governing body of the said United District should consist of three ex-officio and eighteen elective members, and should be called the Darenth Valley Main Sewerage Board (herein-after referred to as the Joint Board), and that the ordinary meetings of the Joint Board should be held alternately at Sevenoaks and Farningham at such time as the Joint Board might appoint;

And whereas the Joint Board were duly elected in accordance with the provisions of the said Provisional Order, and of the Act confirming the same;

And whereas it has been proposed that the Confirmation Act should be altered and amended so as to enable the Joint Board to hold their ordinary meetings in the Metropolis instead of at Sevenoaks and Farningham, and to provide that the Joint Board may borrow for the purpose of defraying the costs, charges, and expenses of and incidental to the formation of the said United District, which are payable by them, and that the Local Government Board should issue a Provisional Order for those purposes;

And whereas the Local Government Board directed Local Inquiry to be held on the subject of the proposed alteration of the Confirmation Act, and the same was held after due public notice, and report has been made to them thereon:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the several Statutes in that behalf, do hereby Order that, from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, the following provisions shall take effect; viz.,

Art. 1. The Confirmation Act shall be altered and amended so as to provide that the ordinary meetings of the Joint Board may be held within the Metropolis as defined by the Metropolis Local Management Act, 1855, instead of alternately at Sevenoaks and Farningham.

Art. 2. The Confirmation Act shall be further altered and amended so as to provide that the Joint Board may, subject to the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875, as to Borrowing Powers, borrow on the credit of any fund or rate applicable by them to the purposes of the Public Health Act, 1875, such sum or sums of money as may be necessary to defray so much of the costs,

*Provisional Order for permanently constituting a Port Sanitary Authority ;
and for other purposes.*

To the Lowestoft Improvement Commissioners, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Lowestoft, in the County of Suffolk ; —

To the Directors and Acting Guardians of the Poor within the Hundred of Mutford and Lcthingland, in the County of Suffolk, being the Sanitary Authority for the Rural Sanitary District of that Hundred ; —

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 287 of the Public Health Act, 1875, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may, by Provisional Order, permanently con-

And whereas the Port of Lowestoft, in the County of Suffolk, is a Port established for the purposes of the laws relating to the Customs of the United Kingdom;

And whereas the Improvement Act District of Lowestoft, in the same County, is an Urban Sanitary District, of which the Lowestoft Improvement Commissioners are the Urban Sanitary Authority, and part of such District forms part of, or abuts on, the said Port;

And whereas part of the Hundred of Mutford and Lothingland, in the same County, is a Rural Sanitary District, of which the Directors and Acting Guardians of the Poor of that Hundred are the Rural Sanitary Authority, and part of such District forms part of, or abuts on, the said Port;

And whereas such Urban and Rural Sanitary Authorities are Riparian Authorities of the said Port;

And whereas by an Order dated the Twenty-fifth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, the Local Government Board did constitute the Lowestoft Improvement Commissioners the Port Sanitary Authority, until the Twenty-ninth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, for so much of the Port of Lowestoft as is therein mentioned;

And whereas the Local Government Board have proposed to issue a Provisional Order for permanently constituting the Lowestoft Improvement Commissioners the Port Sanitary Authority for so much of the said Port as is herein-after described, and accordingly directed Local Inquiry to be held on

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the several Statutes in that behalf, do, by this Order, permanently constitute the Lowestoft Improvement Commissioners the Port Sanitary Authority for so much of the Port of Lowestoft as lies between Mutford Lock at the head of Lake Lothing Inner Harbour and the mouth of the new Harbour of Lowestoft, and as abuts on the Urban Sanitary District of Lowestoft ; together with the waters abutting on such part of the said Port, and the place for the time being appointed as the Customs Boarding Station for such part of the said Port, and every other place for the time being appointed for the mooring or anchoring of ships for such part of the said Port, under any regulations for the prevention of the spread of disease issued under the authority of the Statutes in that behalf ; and the water-sides, docks, basins, and creeks of and belonging to such part of the said Port.

Sections 134 to 140, both inclusive, as to Prevention of Epidemic Diseases.

Sections 141 and 142, relating to Mortuaries.

Sections 173 and 174, relating to Contracts.

Sections 175, 176, and 177, relating to Purchase of Lands.

Sections 179, 180, and 181, relating to Arbitration.

Sections 182 to 186, both inclusive, and Section 188, relating to Byelaws.

Section 189 (except as regards the offices of Surveyor and Collector),

Section 191, Sections 192 to 196, both inclusive, and Sections 197, 200, 203, 204, 205, and 206, relating to Officers and Conduct of Business of Local Authorities.

Sections 245, 247, 249, and 250, relating to Audit.

Sections 251 to 269, both inclusive, relating to Legal Proceedings.

Section 278, relating to settlement of disputes as to Boundaries.

Such rateable value to be ascertained from the Valuation Lists in force for the time being for the purposes of the Poor Rate.

Provisional Order for altering the Saint Helens Improvement Act, 1869.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Saint Helens,
in the County of Lancaster, being the Urban Sanitary Authority for
that Borough; —

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Borough of Saint Helens, in the County of Lancaster, is
an Urban Sanitary District, of which the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses,
acting by the Council (herein-after referred to as "the Corporation"), are the
Urban Sanitary Authority, and the Saint Helens Improvement Act, 1869
(herein-after called "the Local Act"), is in force in the said District;

And whereas by Section 326 of the Local Act it is enacted as follows; viz. :

" Subject and according to the provisions of this Act the Corporation may
" from time to time enter upon, take, and use such of the lands and waters
" delineated on the deposited plans and described in the book of reference as
" they think requisite for the purposes of this Act, other than lands belonging
" to or reputed to belong to the Earl of Sefton ; "

And whereas by Section 327 of the Local Act it is enacted that " The Cor-
" poration may from time to time, for all or any of the purposes of this Act,
" by agreement, purchase any land or any estate, term, or interest therein,
" or any easement, power, or privilege (not of water) therein, thereunder,
" thereover, or thereupon, which shall be deemed necessary by the Cor-
" poration, and may erect any new building on any land now or by this
" Act vested in them or hereafter to be so acquired as aforesaid, and take down
" or alter all or any of the buildings so vested in or to be acquired by them, or
" any part of the same respectively, and may appropriate all or any part
" thereof, or of the land which shall have been cleared by the taking down of
" any such building, for all or any of the purposes of this Act ; "

And whereas by Section 335 of the Local Act it is enacted that " The Cor-
" poration shall, before or at any time within twenty years after the completion
" of the work for the purposes whereof any lands are acquired, sell or dispose
" of, and convey such parts of those lands as are not wanted for the purposes
" of the same work, or of any other work for the time being authorised to be
" made by the Corporation, but nothing in the present section shall compel the
" Corporation to sell or dispose of the rents reserved in any such conveyances
" or leases as aforesaid ; "

And whereas by Section 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, the Local
Government Board are empowered, on the application of the Sanitary Authority
of any Sanitary District, by Provisional Order, wholly or partially to repeal,
alter, or amend any Local Act, other than an Act for the conservancy of rivers,
which is in force in any area comprising the whole or part of any such District,
and not conferring powers or privileges on any persons or person for their or

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his own pecuniary benefit, which relates to the same subject-matters as the Public Health Act, 1875 ;

And whereas the Local Act is a Local Act within the meaning of the above-recited section of the Public Health Act, 1875, and the Corporation, as the Sanitary Authority of the said Borough, have applied to the Local Government Board to alter and amend the Local Act as herein-after set forth ;

And whereas the Local Government Board, on receipt of such application, directed Local Inquiry to be held on the subject, which Inquiry was held, after due public notice, and report has been made to them thereon :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, do hereby Order that, from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, the following provisions shall take effect ; viz.—

Art. 1. Sections 326 and 327 of the Local Act shall be altered and amended so as to provide that the Corporation may, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, appropriate for any of the purposes of the Public Health Act, 1875, for which the same may be required, any lands acquired by them under the provisions and for the purposes of the Local Act.

Art. 2. The provisions of Section 335 of the Local Act shall not apply to any lands which, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, may be appropriated by the Corporation for any of the purposes of the Public Health Act, 1875, as aforesaid.

Stone Order.

*Provisional Order for extending the Local Government District of Stone, and for
other purposes.*

To the Stone Local Board, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Stone, in the County of Stafford ; —

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Stone Union, in the same County, being the Sanitary Authority for the Rural Sanitary District of that Union ; —

To the persons who were the Surveyors of Highways for the Highway Township of Stone, in the said County, next before the month of August, 1878 ; —

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS a Special Drainage District was constituted under the name of the Stone Special Drainage District, on or about the Thirtieth day of November,

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A.D. 1879. One thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, in pursuance of a Resolution of
Stone Order. the Guardians of the Poor of the Stone Union, in the County of Stafford, acting as the Sanitary Authority for the Rural Sanitary District of that Union, and in accordance with the provisions of Section 277 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and part of the Highway Township of Stone which was then comprised in the said Rural Sanitary District, was included in such Special Drainage District ;

And whereas the said Guardians, as such Sanitary Authority as aforesaid, have incurred a debt, amounting to the sum of two hundred and fifty-one pounds six shillings, in respect of a proposed system of sewerage for the said Special Drainage District ;

And whereas there is a sum of three hundred and eighty-three pounds standing to the credit of the Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Stone, in the books of the said Guardians, being the balance of a sum of five hundred and thirty pounds raised by a rate for Special Expenses levied in the said Special Drainage District ;

And whereas by an Order dated the twenty-seventh day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, the Local Government Board declared that the said Special Drainage District should be a Local Government District, to be designated the Stone Local Government District ; and a Local Board having been duly elected for the said Local Government District, held their first meeting in the month of August, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight ;

And whereas separate Surveyors of Highways were formerly appointed for the said Highway Township of Stone, and there is due to the persons who were the Surveyors of Highways for the said Township next before the said month of August, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, the sum of twenty-six pounds six shillings and twopence, in respect of moneys expended by them for highway purposes in excess of the proceeds of the Highway Rates ; and the said persons are in possession of certain plant and materials for watering, cleaning, and repairing the roads, the cost of which was defrayed out of the Highway Rates levied in the said Township ;

And whereas by Section 270 of the Public Health Act, 1875, the Local Government Board are empowered, by Provisional Order, to declare the whole or any portion of a Rural Sanitary District immediately adjoining a Local Government District to be included in such last-mentioned District, and it is enacted that thereupon the included area shall, for the purposes of that Act, be deemed to form part of the District in which it is included by such Order ;

And whereas by Section 275 of the said Public Health Act, 1875, it is enacted that every Order made by the Local Government Board under Part VIII. of that Act, which includes Section 270 above recited, shall specify the day on which such Order shall come into operation (in that Act referred to as the commencement of the Order) ; that from and after the commencement of the Order all the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, obligations, and property which under that Act are exerciseable by or attaching to or vested

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in the Sanitary Authority having, under that Act, jurisdiction in any District or part of a District which is by such Order included in some other District, shall (so far as the same relate to the District or part of a District so included) pass to and vest in the Sanitary Authority of such other District; and that any Order made in pursuance of that part of the Act may, if necessary, provide for the settlement of any differences, or the adjustment of any accounts or apportionment of any liabilities arising between districts, parishes, or other places in consequence of the exercise of any powers conferred by that part of the Act, and may direct the persons by whom and to whom any moneys found to be due are to be paid, and the mode of raising such moneys; and that where any Local Government District is increased in extent under that part of the Act, the Order shall prescribe the number of members to be elected for the District when altered;

And whereas by Section 304 of the said Public Health Act, 1875, it is enacted that, on the application of any authority from whom or to whom any powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, obligations, and property, or any of them, are at any time transferred, or alleged or claimed to be transferred, in pursuance of that Act, or any Provisional Order made thereunder, or on the application of any person affected by such transfer, the Local Government Board may, by order, settle any doubt or difference, and adjust any accounts arising out of or incidental to such powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, obligations, or property, or to the transfer thereof, and direct the parties by whom and to whom any moneys found to be due are to be paid, and the mode of raising such moneys; and that any provisions contained in any order so made shall be deemed to have been made in pursuance of and to be within the powers conferred by that section, subject to this proviso, that where any such order directs any rate to be made, or other act or thing to be done, which the party required to make or do would not, apart from the provisions of that Act, have been enabled to make or do by law, such order shall be provisional only until it has been confirmed by Parliament;

And whereas doubts have arisen whether the liability for the payment of the said debt of two hundred and fifty-one pounds six shillings, so incurred by the said Rural Sanitary Authority as aforesaid, and of the said sum of twenty-six pounds six shillings and twopence, so due to the persons who were the Surveyors of Highways for the Highway Township of Stone aforesaid, has been transferred to the Stone Local Board; and whether the said sum of three hundred and eighty-three pounds standing to the credit of the Overseers of the Parish of Stone, and the said plant and materials for watering, cleaning, and repairing the roads, should not be transferred and handed over to the said Local Board;

And whereas application has been made to the Local Government Board, in accordance with the provisions of Section 304 of the said Public Health Act, 1875, above recited, to settle the doubts which have arisen as aforesaid;

And whereas the Local Government Board proposed to issue a Provisional Order under Section 270 of the Public Health Act, 1875, above recited, to extend the said Local Government District of Stone, by declaring that portion

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A.D. 1879. of the Highway Township of Stone which is situate in the Rural Sanitary
Stone Order. District of the Stone Union to be included in such last-mentioned District;

And whereas the Local Government Board directed Local Inquiry to be held on the subject of such application as aforesaid, and as to the proposed extension of the said Local Government District, which Inquiry was held, after due public notice thereof, and report has been made to them thereon :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, do hereby Declare that All that part of the Highway Township of Stone which is situate in the Rural Sanitary District of the Stone Union shall be included in, and shall, for the purposes of the Public Health Act, 1875, be deemed to form part of, the Local Government District of Stone.

And We hereby Order as follows ; viz.,

Art. 1. This Order shall come into operation on the Twenty-ninth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

Art. 2. The number of members constituting the Local Board for the Local Government District of Stone, as hereby altered, shall be and remain the same as before the date of this Order.

And whereas We, the Local Government Board, find that the liability for the payment of the said debt of two hundred and fifty-one pounds six shillings, and of the said sum of twenty-six pounds six shillings and twopence, has been transferred to the Stone Local Board, and that the said sum of three hundred and eighty-three pounds, and the said plant and materials for watering, cleaning, and repairing the roads, should be transferred to and handed over to the said Local Board :

Now therefore, We do hereby further Order as follows ; viz.,

Art. 3. The said Guardians, as the Rural Sanitary Authority, shall, within one calendar month after the said Twenty-ninth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, pay and transfer to the said Local Board the said sum of three hundred and eighty-three pounds so standing to the credit of the Overseers of the Parish of Stone as aforesaid.

Art. 4. The Stone Local Board shall, upon payment to them by the Guardians, as the Rural Sanitary Authority, of the said sum of three hundred and eighty-three pounds, forthwith pay out of the District Fund or General District Rate of their District, to the person or persons entitled thereto, the said debt of two hundred and fifty-one pounds six shillings, and, to the persons who were the Surveyors of Highways in the said Highway Township of Stone next before the constitution of the Local Government District of Stone, or their executors, administrators, or assigns, the said sum of twenty-six pounds six shillings and twopence.

Art. 5. Upon payment of the said sum of twenty-six pounds six shillings and twopence in manner herein mentioned, the persons who were the Surveyors of Highways in the Highway Township of Stone next before the constitution of the Local Government District of Stone, their executors, administrators, or assigns, or other the persons for the time being in possession or having the

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custody of the said plant and materials for watering, cleaning, and repairing the roads, shall forthwith transfer and hand over such plant and materials to the said Local Board, or to one of their officers or servants appointed by them to receive the same on their behalf.

And whereas the said Sanitary Authority have made due publication in the newspaper and served the several notices, as required by the Public Health Act, 1875, and have presented a petition to the Local Government Board, stating as required by that Act, and praying, with reference to the said lands, to be allowed to put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts, with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement;
