## CHAPTER lxxxvii.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the Local A.D. 1879. Government Board for Ireland relating to the towns of 3d July 1879. Killarney and Parsonstown.

THEREAS the Local Government Board for Ireland have, as regards the towns herein mentioned, made the Provisional Orders set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed, under the provisions of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878:

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. The Orders set out in the schedule hereunto annexed shall be Orders in and the same are hereby confirmed, and all the provisions thereof shall, from and after the passing of this Act, have full validity and force.

# THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD FOR IRELAND. TOWN OF KILLARNEY.

Provisional Order.

WHEREAS the population of the town of Killarney, in the county of Kerry, as stated in the last parliamentary census, is less than six thousand:

And whereas the Towns Improvement (Ireland) Act, 1854, was adopted in Killarney on the 17th November 1874, and the population of the district comprised within the boundaries of the town of Killarney for the purposes of the said Act now exceeds six thousand, and the Town Commissioners of Killarney, acting under the said Act, have presented a petition to the Local Government Board for Ireland, in pursuance of the 7th section of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, praying for a Provisional Order to separate the said town and district for which the said Commissioners act as aforesaid from the rural sanitary district consisting of the Killarney Poor Law Union, wherein the said town is situate, and to constitute the said town and district an urban sanitary district:

And whereas public notice of the purport of the proposed Order having been duly given by advertisement in the manner provided by the said Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, no objection has been made to the proposed Order, and the Guardians of the Poor of the Killarney Union have passed a resolution to the effect that the said Board of Guardians have no objection to the proposed Order:

And whereas the Local Government Board for Ireland have inquired into and considered the matter of the said petition, and it appears to the said Board to be proper to comply with the prayer thereof:

It is ordered by the Local Government Board for Ireland as follows:-

- 1. From and after the time when this Order shall be confirmed by Act of Parliament, the said town and district constituting the town or township of Killarney for the purposes of the Towns Improvement (Ireland) Act, 1854, shall constitute an urban sanitary district subject to all the provisions of the Acts constituting the urban sanitary authority of such urban sanitary district, and to all the provisions of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, affecting urban sanitary districts.
- 2. This Order may be cited and referred to for all purposes as "The Town of Killarney Provisional Order, 1879."

And whereas public notice of the purport of the proposed Order having been duly given by advertisement in the manner provided by the said Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, no objection has been made to the proposed Order, and the Guardians of the Poor of the Parsonstown Union have passed a resolution to the effect that the said Board of Guardians have no objection to the proposed Order:

And whereas the Local Government Board for Ireland have inquired into and considered the matter of the said petition, and it appears to the said Board to be proper to comply with the prayer thereof:

It is ordered by the Local Government Board for Ireland as follows:—

- 1. From and after the time when this Order shall be confirmed by Act of Parliament, the said town of Parsonstown shall constitute an urban sanitary district subject to all the provisions of the Acts constituting the urban sanitary authority of such urban sanitary district, and to all the provisions of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, affecting urban sanitary districts.
- 2. This Order may be cited and referred to for all purposes as "The Town of Parsonstown Provisional Order, 1879."
