



CHAPTER lxii.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the Local Government Board relating to the Local Government District of Ashford, the Improvement Act District of Bournemouth, the Urban Sanitary District of Folkestone, the Local Government Districts of Ilfracombe and Mirfield, the Rural Sanitary District of the Reigate Union, and the Port of Wisbech. A.D. 1880.
[19th July 1880.]

WHEREAS the Local Government Board have, as regards the districts and Port herein mentioned, made the Provisional Orders set forth in the schedule hereto, under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875 :

38 & 39 Vict.
c. 55.

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be confirmed by Parliament :

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :

1. The Orders as set out in the schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby confirmed, and all the provisions thereof shall, from and after the passing of this Act, have full validity and force. The Orders in schedule confirmed.

2. This Act may be cited as the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (Ashford, &c.) Act, 1880. Short title.

Provisional Order to enable the Port Sanitary Authority for the Port of Wisbech to put in force the Compulsory Clauses of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts, 1845, 1860, and 1869.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Wisbech, acting by the Council, being the Port Sanitary Authority for the Port of Wisbech ; —

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board dated the Thirtieth day of April, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and duly confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (Aysgarth Union, &c.) Act, 1879, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Wisbech, in the County of Cambridge, acting by the Council, were permanently constituted the Port Sanitary Authority for the Port of Wisbech, and all the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations of an Urban Sanitary Authority under (inter alia) Sections 175, 176, and 177 of the Public Health Act, 1875, were, for the purposes of that Order, assigned to the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses, acting by the Council, as such Port Sanitary Authority ;
