



CHAPTER CCXXV.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the Local Government Board relating to the Local Government Districts of Haslingden, Ramsbottom, and Rawtenstall. A.D. 1883.

[25th August 1883.]

WHEREAS the Local Government Board have, as regards the districts herein mentioned, made the Provisional Orders set forth in the Schedule hereto, under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875:

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be confirmed by Parliament, and that the provisions herein contained should be enacted with reference thereto:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. The Orders set out in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby confirmed, and all the provisions thereof shall, from and after the passing of this Act, have full validity and force. The Orders in Schedule confirmed.

2. Whereas it is expedient that, for the purposes of the election of members of the local board for the local government district of Haslingden, as extended by the Provisional Order relating to that district hereby confirmed (which local board, local government district as so extended, and Provisional Order are in this section respectively referred to as "the local board," "the district," and "the order") the district be divided into two wards: Special provision relating to the local government district of Haslingden.

Be it enacted as follows:

(1.) The district shall, for the purposes of the election of members of the local board, be divided into two wards, which shall be termed respectively the north ward and the south ward. District divided into two wards.

(2.) The north ward shall consist of the area coloured green on a map marked D., sealed with the official seal of the Local Govern- Boundaries of wards.

A.D. 1883. ment Board, and deposited in their office, a copy whereof, sealed in like manner, shall be deposited in the offices of the local board, and the south ward shall consist of the area coloured purple on the said map marked D.

Election of persons to represent south ward. (3.) Three persons, who shall have the qualification prescribed by the law in force for the time being with regard to the election of members of a local board, shall be elected as members of the local board by the persons qualified to vote in the south ward.

First election. (4.) For the purposes of the first election for the south ward the chairman of the local board, or if the chairman be unable or unwilling to act, or the office of chairman be vacant, such person as the Local Government Board shall, by their order, appoint, shall be the returning officer.

Such election shall be conducted in accordance with the rules, excepting Rule 55, contained in Schedule II. to the Public Health Act, 1875, as if it were the first election of a local board constituted after the passing of that Act, and the members then elected shall come into office on the day on which the first meeting of the local board shall be held after the returning officer shall have made his certificate of election in accordance with Rule 42 or Rule 52, as the case may require, of the said Schedule, and such members shall continue in office until the days herein-after fixed for their retirement.

Provided that the returning officer shall publish notice of the said election, in accordance with Rule 36 of the said Schedule, within fourteen days after the commencement of the order, and shall specify in such notice the dates on which the several proceedings necessary to complete such election shall be taken.

Retirement of first members. (5.) The three members so elected for the south ward shall go out of office in the following order; viz., one, to be selected by the local board by ballot, on the fifteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five; one of the remaining two, to be selected as aforesaid, on the fifteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six; and the remaining one, on the fifteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

Casual vacancies. (6.) Any casual vacancy in the places of the three members representing the south ward which may occur prior to the fifteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven shall be filled up like casual vacancies in the places of other members of the local board.

Retirement of members in office. (7.) On the day on which the first meeting of the local board shall be held after the returning officer shall have made his certificate with respect to the first election of the members to be elected

to represent the south ward as aforesaid, three of the eighteen members of the local board at the commencement of the order shall go out of office, one of such three members to be selected by the local board by ballot at the meeting of the local board immediately before the commencement of the order from among the members who would but for the order go out of office on the fifteenth day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, one other of such three members to be selected as aforesaid from among the members who would but for the order go out of office on the fifteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, and the remaining one of such three members to be selected as aforesaid from among the members who would but for the order go out of office on the fifteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six; and from the day on which the said three members shall go out of office the remaining fifteen members shall represent the north ward, and the number of the members of the local board shall, subject to the provisions of Rule 2 of Schedule II. to the Public Health Act, 1875, be eighteen.

3. The Haslingden Local Board shall not at any time within twelve months after the passing of this Act levy any general district rate within the parts of the townships of Henheads, Higher Booths, and Lower Booths included in the Local Government District of Haslingden by the Provisional Order relating to that district hereby confirmed; but, for the purpose of defraying the expenses incurred or payable by the said local board in the execution of the Public Health Act, 1875, during the said period of twelve months, the said local board may levy a rate, in the nature of a general district rate, in the said parts of the said townships: Provided always, that such rate shall not exceed three-pence in the pound, whatever be the amount of the general district rate levied in the rest of the district of the said local board.

4. Whereas it is expedient that, for the purposes of the election of members of the local board for the local government district of Ramsbottom, as extended by the Provisional Order relating to that district hereby confirmed, (which local board, local government district as so extended, and Provisional Order are in this section respectively referred to as "the local board," "the district," and "the order") the district be divided into four wards:

Special provision relating to the local government district of Ramsbottom.

Be it enacted as follows:

(1.) The district shall, for the purposes of the election of members of the local board, be divided into four wards, which shall be termed respectively the central ward, the north ward, the east ward, and the west ward.

(2.) The central ward shall consist of the area coloured pink on a map marked E. sealed with the official seal of the Local Government Board, and deposited in their office, a copy whereof, sealed in like manner, shall be deposited in the offices of the local board; the north ward, east ward, and west ward shall respectively consist of the areas coloured green, purple, and yellow on the said map marked E.

(3.) Nine persons, who shall have the qualification prescribed by the law in force for the time being with regard to the election of members of a local board, shall be elected as members of the local board, viz., three, by the persons qualified to vote in the north ward, three by the persons qualified to vote in the east ward, and three by the persons qualified to vote in the west ward.

(4.) For the purposes of the first elections for the north, east, and west wards the chairman of the local board, or if the chairman be unable or unwilling to act, or the office of chairman be vacant, such person as the Local Government Board shall, by their order, appoint, shall be the returning officer.

Such elections respectively shall be conducted in accordance with the rules, excepting Rule 55, contained in Schedule II. to the Public Health Act, 1875, as if each election were the first election of a local board constituted after the passing of that Act, and the members then elected shall come into office on the day on which the first meeting of the local board shall be held after the returning officer shall have made his certificate of election in accordance with Rule 42 or Rule 52, as the case may require, of the said Schedule, and such members shall continue in office until the days hereinafter fixed for their retirement.

Provided that the returning officer shall publish notice of the said elections, in accordance with Rule 36 of the said Schedule, within fourteen days after the commencement of the order, and shall specify in such notice the dates on which the several proceedings necessary to complete such elections shall be taken.

(5.) The members so elected for the north, east, and west wards respectively shall go out of office in the following order: viz., one from each ward, to be selected by the local board by ballot, on the fifteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five; one from each ward of the remaining two members representing each ward, to be selected as aforesaid, on the fifteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six; and the remaining member representing each ward, on the fifteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

(6.) Any casual vacancy in the places of the members representing the north, east, and west wards respectively which may occur prior to the fifteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven shall be filled up like casual vacancies in the places of other members of the local board.

(7.) On the day on which the first meeting of the local board shall be held after the returning officer shall have made his certificate with respect to the first elections of the members to be elected to represent the north, east, and west wards as aforesaid, nine of the twelve members of the local board at the commencement of the order shall go out of office, three of such nine members to be selected by the local board by ballot at the meeting of the local board immediately before the commencement of the order from among the members who would but for the order go out of office on the fifteenth day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, three other of such nine members to be selected as aforesaid from among the members who would but for the order go out of office on the fifteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, and the remaining three of such nine members to be selected as aforesaid from among the members who would but for the order go out of office on the fifteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six; and from the day on which the said nine members shall go out of office, the remaining three members shall represent the central ward, and the number of the members of the local board shall, subject to the provisions of Rule 2 of Schedule II. to the Public Health Act, 1875, be twelve.

5. Whereas the guardians of the poor of the Bury union, in the county of Lancaster, as the sanitary authority for the rural sanitary district of that union, have borrowed the sum of ten thousand pounds for the construction of certain permanent works in the part of the township of Tottington Lower End, which, after the commencement of the Provisional Orders relating to the local government districts of Haslingden and Ramsbottom hereby confirmed, will remain in the said rural sanitary district, of which sum nine thousand seven hundred and eighty-three pounds six shillings and eightpence now remains unpaid: Be it further enacted as follows:

The said sum of nine thousand seven hundred and eighty-three pounds six shillings and eightpence, or so much thereof as may be owing on the twenty-ninth day of September one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, shall be charged upon the part of

A.D. 1883. the township of Tottington Lower End, which, after last-mentioned date will remain in the said rural sanitary district to the exclusion of the remainder of the said township, and the payments made by the said guardians as such rural sanitary authority in respect of the said sum of nine thousand seven hundred and eighty-three pounds six shillings and eightpence, or so much thereof as shall be due as aforesaid, and in respect of interest thereon, shall be raised as special expenses in the contributory place formed by the said part of the township of Tottington Lower End.

Special provision relating to the local government district of Rawtenstall.

6. Whereas it is expedient that, for the purposes of the election of members of the local board for the local government district of Rawtenstall, as extended by the Provisional Order relating to that district hereby confirmed (which local board, local government district as so extended, and Provisional Order are in this section respectively referred to as "the local board," "the district," and "the order") the district be divided into three wards :

Be it enacted as follows :

District divided into three wards.

(1.) The district shall, for the purposes of the election of members of the local board, be divided into three wards, which shall be termed respectively the central ward, the east ward, and the north ward.

Boundaries of wards.

(2.) The central ward shall consist of the area bounded by a yellow line on a map signed by the Right Honorable Edward Richard Lord Hatherton, the Chairman of the Committee of the House of Lords to whom the Bill for this Act was referred, copies of which map shall be deposited at the office of the Local Government Board and at the office of the local board, and the east and north wards shall respectively consist of the areas bounded by red and purple lines on the said map.

Election of persons to represent wards.

(3.) Eighteen persons, who shall have the qualification prescribed by the law in force for the time being with regard to the election of members of a local board, shall be elected as members of the local board, viz., six by the persons qualified to vote in each ward; and, notwithstanding anything in the said order, the number of members of the local board shall, subject to Rule 2 of Schedule II. to the Public Health Act, 1875, be eighteen.

First election.

(4.) For the purposes of the first elections for the said wards, the chairman of the local board, or if the chairman be unable or unwilling to act, or the office of chairman be vacant, such person as the Local Government Board shall, by their order, appoint shall be the returning officer.

Such elections respectively shall be conducted in accordance with the rules, excepting Rule 55, contained in Schedule II. to the Public Health Act, 1875, as if each election were the first election of a local board constituted after the passing of that Act, and the members then elected shall come into office on the day on which the first meeting of the local board shall be held after the returning officer shall have made his certificate of election in accordance with Rule 42 or Rule 52, as the case may require, of the said Schedule, and such members shall continue in office until the days hereinafter fixed for their retirement.

Provided that the returning officer shall publish notice of the said elections, in accordance with Rule 36 of the said Schedule, within fourteen days after the commencement of the Order, and shall specify in such notice the dates on which the several proceedings necessary to complete such elections shall be taken.

(5.) The six members so elected for each ward shall go out of office in the following order: viz., two from each ward, to be selected by the local board by ballot, on the fifteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five; two from each ward of the remaining four members representing each ward, to be selected as aforesaid, on the fifteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six; and the remaining two members representing each ward on the fifteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

(6.) Any casual vacancy in the places of the members representing the said wards respectively which may occur prior to the fifteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven shall be filled up like casual vacancies in a local board.

(7.) The first meeting of the local board elected under the provisions of this section shall be held at such place and on such day (not being more than ten days after the completion of such election) as the returning officer may by written notice to each member of such local board appoint.

(8.) On the day on which the first meeting of the local board, elected under the provisions of this section, shall be held, all the persons who, previous to such meeting, composed the Rawtenstall local board, shall go out of office, and all the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, obligations, and property which are exercisable by or attaching to or vested in the persons who shall go out of office as aforesaid, shall pass to and vest in the local board elected under the provisions of this section, which last-mentioned local board shall be the local board for the district.

Special provision relating to the burial board for the central ward of the local government district of Rawtenstall. 20 & 21 Vict. c. 81.

7. Whereas by an Order in Council made on the thirteenth day of May one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five it was ordered that the Rawtenstall local board should be a burial board for the district of such local board, in accordance with the provisions of the Burial Act of 1857 :

And whereas the Rawtenstall local board as such burial board have provided a burial ground for their district, and for that purpose borrowed certain moneys amounting to the sum of fifteen thousand pounds, of which the sum of thirteen thousand three hundred and eighty-five pounds one shilling and threepence now remains unpaid :

And whereas the area for which the said local board was by the above-recited Order in Council constituted a burial board will, after the commencement of the Provisional Order relating to the local government district of Rawtenstall, confirmed by this Act, be co-extensive with the area which by section five of this Act will become the central ward of the said local government district as extended by the said Provisional Order ; and it is expedient that the members of the said local board elected to represent the said central ward shall form the burial board for that ward, and shall be deemed to be a burial board elected under the Burial Acts for the time being in force, and that provision should be made for the transfer to such burial board of the property and liabilities of the existing burial board :

Be it therefore further enacted as follows :

(1.) On and after the day on which the first meeting of the local board to be elected under the provisions of section five of this Act for the local government district of Rawtenstall, as extended by the said Provisional Order (herein-after referred to as "the extended district"), is held, the six members of such local board from time to time representing the central ward shall form the burial board for so much of the extended district as is included in that ward, and shall be deemed to be a burial board elected under the Burial Acts for the time being in force, and all the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, obligations, and property which prior to the commencement of the said Provisional Order were exerciseable by or attaching to or vested in the Rawtenstall local board acting as a burial board under the above-recited Order in Council, including the liability for the repayment of the said sum of thirteen thousand three hundred and eighty-five pounds one shilling and threepence and interest thereon, shall pass to and vest in the said burial board, and all expenses incurred by and debts transferred as aforesaid to the said burial board, including the said sum of thirteen thousand

three hundred and eighty-five pounds one shilling and threepence and interest thereon, shall, so far as the same are not otherwise provided for, be defrayed out of and charged upon a rate to be levied by the local board as and when requested by the said burial board, such rate being levied in the said central ward, and in the same manner as a general district rate, and sections two hundred and forty-five, two hundred and forty-seven (excepting sub-section (2)), two hundred and forty-nine, and two hundred and fifty of the Public Health Act, 1875, relating to accounts and their audit, and the provisions of the District Auditors Act, 1879, so far as the same are applicable, shall apply to the accounts of the said burial board and to the audit of such accounts.

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Local Government District of Haslingden, in the County of Lancaster, is an Urban Sanitary District, of which the Haslingden Local Board are the Urban Sanitary Authority;

And whereas the Haslingden Local Board have borrowed certain sums of money amounting in the whole to the sum of twenty-four thousand pounds, for the construction of certain permanent works in their District, of which the sum of twenty-one thousand nine hundred and sixty-five pounds four shillings and tenpence now remains unpaid;

And whereas the portion of the Rural Sanitary District of the Bury Union, in the same county, which is described in the Schedule hereto, immediately adjoins the Local Government District of Haslingden;

And whereas the portion of the Rural Sanitary District of the Haslingden Union, in the same County, which is described in the said Schedule immediately adjoins the Local Government District of Haslingden;

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by Section 270 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and by any other Statutes in that behalf, do hereby Declare that, from and after the commencement of this Order, all those portions of the Rural Sanitary Districts of the Bury and Haslingden Unions which are described in the Schedule hereto shall be included in, and shall, for the purposes of the Public Health Act, 1875, be deemed to form part of, the Local Government District of Haslingden;

And We hereby Order as follows; viz.: —

Art. I. This Order shall come into operation on the Twenty-ninth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-three (herein-after referred to as "the commencement of this Order").

Art. II. The number of members constituting the Local Board for the Local Government District of Haslingden, as hereby altered, shall, subject to the provisions of Rule 2 of Schedule II. to the Public Health Act, 1875, be the same as before the date of this Order.

Art. III. The said Local Board shall from time to time make separate assessments, and levy and make such rates, in the nature of a general district rate, upon the part of their District which constituted the Local Government District of Haslingden immediately before the commencement of this Order, as will be sufficient to defray, in the manner provided by Section 234 of the Public Health Act, 1875, the said sum of twenty-one thousand nine hundred and sixty-five pounds four shillings and tenpence, or so much thereof as shall be owing at the commencement of this Order, and the interest due or to become due thereon, within the respective periods for which the loans, in respect of which the said sum is owing, were originally sanctioned.

The SCHEDULE above referred to.

1st. All that portion of the Rural Sanitary District of the Haslingden Union, in the County of Lancaster, comprising the Township of Musbury and parts of the Townships of Haslingden, Henheads, Higher Booths, Lower Booths, and Tottington Higher End, coloured light yellow on a map marked A., sealed with the Official Seal of the Local Government Board, and deposited in their office, a copy whereof, sealed in like manner, shall be deposited in the offices of the Haslingden Local Board.

2nd. All that portion of the Rural Sanitary District of the Bury Union, in the County of Lancaster, comprising part of the Township of Tottington Lower End, coloured striped yellow on the said map marked A., a copy whereof shall be deposited in the offices of the Rural Sanitary Authority of the Bury Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Haslingden Union, in the same County, being the Sanitary Authority for the Rural Sanitary District of that Union ; —

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Local Government District of Ramsbottom, in the County of Lancaster, is an Urban Sanitary District, of which the Ramsbottom Local Board are the Urban Sanitary Authority ;

And whereas the Ramsbottom Local Board have borrowed certain sums, amounting in the whole to the sum of Ten thousand five hundred pounds, for the construction of certain permanent works in their District, of which the sum of Four thousand two hundred and sixty-six pounds thirteen shillings and fourpence now remains unpaid ;

And whereas the portion of the Rural Sanitary District of the Bury Union, in the same County, which is described in the Schedule hereto, immediately adjoins the Local Government District of Ramsbottom ;

And whereas the Guardians of the Poor of the Bury Union, as the Sanitary Authority for the Rural Sanitary District of that Union have borrowed the sum of Two thousand two hundred pounds for the construction of certain permanent works in the part of the Township of Tottington-Lower-End, which is situate in the portion of their District which is described in the said Schedule, of which the sum of One thousand six hundred and thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence now remains unpaid ;

And whereas the portion of the Rural Sanitary District of the Haslingden Union, in the same County, which is described in the said Schedule immediately adjoins the Local Government District of Ramsbottom :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by Section 270 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and by any other Statutes in that behalf, do hereby Declare that from and after the commencement of this Order, all those portions of the Rural Sanitary Districts of the Bury and Haslingden Unions which are described in the Schedule hereto, shall be included in, and shall, for the purposes of the Public Health Act,

Art. IV. The liability for the repayment of the said sum of One thousand six hundred and thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence, and the interest thereon, or so much thereof as shall be owing at the commencement of this Order shall be transferred to and be vested in the said Local Board, and that Local Board shall from time to time make separate assessments, and levy and make such rates, in the nature of a general district rate, upon the part of their District which immediately before the commencement of this Order formed a portion of the contributory place of Tottington-Lower-End in the Rural Sanitary District of the Bury Union, as shall be sufficient to defray, in the manner provided by Section 234 of the Public Health Act, 1875, the said sum of One thousand six hundred and thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence, or so much thereof as shall be owing at the commencement of this Order, and the interest due or to become due thereon, within the period for which the loan, in respect of which the said sum is owing, was originally sanctioned.

County, being the Sanitary Authority for the Rural Sanitary District

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Local Government District of Rawtenstall, in the County
of Lancaster, is an Urban Sanitary District, of which the Rawtenstall Local
Board are the Urban Sanitary Authority;

And whereas the part of the Rural Sanitary District of the Haslingden
Union, in the same County, which is described in the Schedule hereto,
immediately adjoins the Local Government District of Rawtenstall;

And whereas the Rawtenstall Local Board have under the Public Health
Act, 1875, borrowed certain sums amounting in the whole to the sum of three
thousand three hundred and seventy-five pounds, for the construction of certain
permanent works in their District, of which the sum of three thousand one
hundred and twenty pounds nine shillings and one penny now remains unpaid:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers
