

### CHAPTER ci.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the Local A.D. 1885. Government Board relating to the Rural Sanitary District of the Atherstone Union, the Local Government District of Festiniog, the Rural Sanitary District of the Leyburn Union, the Borough of Newport (Monmouthshire), the Local Government District of Rawden, and the Rural Sanitary Districts of the Tadcaster and Wangford Unions. [22nd July 1885.]

HEREAS the Local Government Board have made the Provisional Orders set forth in the Schedule hereto, under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875:

38 & 39 Vict.

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be confirmed by Parliament, and that the provisions herein contained should be enacted with reference thereto:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. The Orders set out in the Schedule hereto shall be and the Orders in same are hereby confirmed, and all the provisions thereof shall, from confirmed and after the dates therein respectively mentioned, have full validity and force.

Schedule

2. The sanitary authorities mentioned in the said Orders shall special not under the powers of this Act or the said Orders, without the provision as consent of the Local Government Board, purchase or acquire in any labouring city, borough, or other urban sanitary district, or in any parish or class. part of a parish not being within an urban sanitary district, ten or more houses which, after the passing of this Act, have been or on the 15th day of December last were occupied either wholly or partially by persons belonging to the labouring class as tenants or lodgers.

For the purposes of this section the expression "labouring class" includes mechanics, artizans, labourers, and others working for wages, hawkers, costermongers, persons not working for wages, but working at some trade or handicraft without employing others except members of their own family, and persons, other than domestic servants, whose income does not exceed an average of thirty shillings a week, and the families of any of such persons who may be residing with them.
