



CHAPTER xv.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the Local Government Board relating to the Borough of Bradford (Yorks), the City of Chichester, the Local Government Districts of Cleator Moor and Hornsey, the Districts of Maryport, Southborough, and Tunbridge Wells, and the West Kent Main Sewerage District. A.D. 1886.

[25th September 1886.]

WHEREAS the Local Government Board have made the Provisional Orders set forth in the schedule hereto, under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875 :

38 & 39 Vict.
c. 55.

And whereas it is requisite that the said Order should be confirmed by Parliament, and that the provisions herein contained should be enacted with reference thereto :

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :

1. The Orders as set out in the schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby confirmed, and all the provisions thereof shall, from and after the dates therein respectively mentioned, have full validity and force. Orders in schedule confirmed.

2.—(1.) The Urban Sanitary Authority for the Borough of Bradford shall not under the powers of this Act, or of the Order relating to that borough hereby confirmed, purchase or acquire in the borough ten or more houses which after the passing of this Act have been, or on the fifteenth day of December last were, occupied either wholly or partially by persons belonging to the labouring class as tenants or lodgers, unless and until— Special provisions as to houses of labouring class.

(a.) They shall have obtained the approval of the Local Government Board to a scheme for providing new dwellings for such

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number of persons as were residing in such houses on the fifteenth day of December last or for such number of persons as the Local Government Board shall after inquiry deem necessary, having regard to the number of persons on or after that date residing in such houses and working within one mile therefrom and to the amount of vacant suitable accommodation in the immediate neighbourhood of such houses, or to the place of employment of such persons, and to all the circumstances of the case; and

(b.) They shall have given security to the satisfaction of the Local Government Board for the carrying out of the scheme.

(2.) The approval of the Local Government Board to any scheme under this section may be given either absolutely or conditionally, and after the Local Government Board have approved of any such scheme they may from time to time approve either absolutely or conditionally of any modifications in the scheme.

(3.) Every scheme under this section shall contain provisions prescribing the time within which it shall be carried out, and shall require the new dwellings proposed to be provided under the scheme to be completed fit for occupation before the persons residing in the houses in respect of which the scheme is made are displaced:

Provided that the Local Government Board may dispense with the last-mentioned requirement, subject to such conditions, if any, as they may see fit.

(4.) Any conditions subject to which the Local Government Board may have approved of any scheme, or of any modifications of any scheme under this section, or subject to which they may have dispensed with the above-mentioned requirement, shall be enforceable by a writ of mandamus to be obtained by the Local Government Board out of the Queen's Bench Division of the High Court of Justice.

(5.) If the said urban sanitary authority acquire or appropriate any house or houses for the purposes of this Act in contravention of the foregoing provisions, or displace or cause to be displaced the persons residing in any house or houses in contravention of the requirements of the scheme, they shall be liable to a penalty of five hundred pounds in respect of every such house, which penalty shall be recoverable by the Local Government Board by action in the High Court of Justice, and shall be carried to and form part of the consolidated fund of the United Kingdom:

Provided that the Court may, if it think fit, reduce such penalty.

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(6.) Subject to the provisions of this section, the said urban sanitary authority and the Local Government Board and their inspectors shall have and may exercise for any purpose in connexion with any scheme under this section all or any of the powers vested in them under the Public Health Act, 1875, in the same manner in every respect as if the preparation and carrying into effect of such scheme were one of the general purposes of that Act:

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Provided that all lands on which any buildings have been erected or provided by the said urban sanitary authority in pursuance of any scheme under this section, shall, for a period of twenty-five years from the passing of this Act, be appropriated for the purpose of dwellings, and every conveyance, demise, or lease of such lands and buildings shall be endorsed with notice of this enactment:

Provided also that the Local Government Board may at any time dispense with all or any of the requirements of this sub-section, subject to such conditions, if any, as they may see fit.

(7.) The said urban sanitary authority shall pay to the Local Government Board a sum to be fixed by that Board in respect of the preparation and issue of any Provisional Order in pursuance of this section, and any expenses incurred by that Board in relation to any inquiries under this section, including the expenses of any witnesses summoned by the inspector holding the inquiry and a sum to be fixed by that Board, not exceeding three guineas a day, for the services of such inspector.

3. The urban sanitary authorities mentioned in the Orders relating to the Local Government District of Hornsey and the City of Chichester shall not under the powers of this Act or the said Orders, without the consent of the Local Government Board, purchase or acquire in any city, borough, or other urban sanitary district, or in any parish or part of a parish not being within an urban sanitary district, ten or more houses which, after the passing of this Act, have been or on the fifteenth day of December last were occupied either wholly or partially by persons belonging to the labouring class as tenants or lodgers.

Restriction of power to take houses of labouring class.

4. For the purposes of sections two and three of this Act, the expression "labouring class" includes mechanics, artizans, labourers, and others working for wages, hawkers, costermongers, persons not working for wages, but working at some trade or handicraft without employing others except members of their own family, and persons, other than domestic servants, whose income does not exceed an average of thirty shillings a week, and the families of any of such persons who may be residing with them.

Definition of labouring class.

5. Whereas, for the purposes of the Burial Acts, 1852 to 1871, the Urban Sanitary District of Tunbridge Wells is subject to the jurisdiction of the Tunbridge Wells Local Board acting as the Burial Board, and the Local Government District of Southborough is subject to the jurisdiction of the Southborough Burial Board :

Be it enacted that, from and after the passing of this Act, the portion of the ~~Urban Sanitary District~~ of Tunbridge Wells included in the ~~Urban Sanitary District~~ of Southborough by the Provisional ~~Orders~~ districts of Tunbridge Wells and Southborough hereby confirmed shall be transferred from the District of the Tunbridge Wells Local Board acting as the Burial Board and shall form part of the District of the Southborough Burial Board :

Provided that nothing in this section contained shall be deemed or construed to injuriously affect any rights or privileges of the Tunbridge Burial Board existing at the passing of this Act.

Short title.

6. This Act may be cited as the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 7) Act, 1886.

SCHEDULE.

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BOROUGH OF BRADFORD (YORKS).

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Provisional Order to enable the Urban Sanitary Authority for the Borough of Bradford (Yorks) to put in force the Compulsory Clauses of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Bradford in the West Riding of the County of York, being the Urban Sanitary Authority for that Borough;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Bradford, in the West Riding of the County of York, as the Urban Sanitary Authority for that Borough, require to purchase and take the lands described in the Schedule hereto, for the following purposes, viz. :—

1. The lands mentioned in Part I. of the said Schedule for the purpose of widening and improving Union Street and Bridge Street, in the said Borough;
2. The lands mentioned in Part II. of the said Schedule for the purpose of widening and improving Manchester Road, College Road, Little Horton Lane, and Great Horton Road, in the said Borough;
3. The lands mentioned in Part III. of the said Schedule for the purpose of widening and improving Cemetery Road, Allerton Road, and Pearson Lane, in the said Borough;
4. The lands mentioned in Part IV. of the said Schedule for the purpose of widening and improving Highgate, in the said Borough;
5. The lands mentioned in Part V. of the said Schedule for the purpose of widening and improving Lumb Lane, Manor Row, and Kirkgate, in the said Borough;
6. The lands mentioned in Part VI. of the said Schedule for the purpose of widening and improving Vulcan Street, in the said Borough;
7. The lands mentioned in Part VII. for the purpose of widening and improving Westgate and Diamond Street, in the said Borough;

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8. The lands mentioned in Part VIII. of the said Schedule for the purpose of widening and improving Becksid Road, in the said Borough ;
9. The lands mentioned in Part IX. of the said Schedule for the purpose of making a new street from Leagrams Lane to Great Horton Road, in the said Borough ;
10. The lands mentioned in Part X. of the said Schedule for the purpose of making certain new streets and for widening and improving Gaisby Lane, in the said Borough :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by Section 176 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and by any other Statutes in that behalf, do hereby empower the said Urban Sanitary Authority, from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, to put in force, with reference to the lands described in the Schedule hereto, subject to the continuance of any existing public rights of highway, and for the purposes aforesaid, the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts, with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement, or any of them. Provided that the prescribed period for the compulsory purchase of the lands described in the Schedule hereto shall, for the purposes of Section 123 of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, be seven years from the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order.

Provisional Order for altering the Cleator Moor Local Board Act, 1881.

To the Cleator Moor Local Board, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Cleator Moor, in the County of Cumberland;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Local Government District of Cleator Moor, in the County of Cumberland, is an Urban Sanitary District, of which the Cleator Moor Local Board (herein-after referred to as "the Local Board") are the Urban Sanitary Authority, and the Cleator Moor Local Board Act, 1881 (herein-after referred to as "the Local Act"), is in force in the District;

And whereas by Section 34 of the Local Act the Local Board were empowered, in addition to any moneys they had borrowed or were authorised to borrow under any other Act, to borrow at interest on the securities therein mentioned all such sums as they might from time to time think requisite for all or any of the purposes of that Act not exceeding in the whole twenty-six thousand pounds;

And whereas doubts have arisen whether under the provisions of the Local Act the sum of seven thousand eight hundred and eighty pounds (being the amount owing at the passing of that Act in respect of moneys borrowed by the Local Board for works of water supply) mentioned in the preamble to that Act is repayable in accordance with the provisions of that Act, or in accordance with the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875, under which Act or under the Sanitary Acts the said moneys were originally borrowed:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by Section 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and by any other Statutes in that behalf, do hereby Order that, from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, the following provisions shall take effect, viz. :—

Art. I. The Local Act shall be altered so as to provide that, notwithstanding anything therein contained, the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875, relating to the repayment and re-borrowing of borrowed moneys, shall be deemed to have applied and shall hereafter apply to the said sum of seven thousand eight hundred and eighty pounds: Provided that the said sum shall be repaid within the periods for which the loans, in respect of which the said sum is owing, were originally sanctioned.

Art. II. The Local Act shall be further altered so as to provide as follows :—

(1.) The Local Board shall not, except as herein-after provided, borrow any further sums of money under the Local Act, but may exercise the power of re-borrowing therein contained, except as regards the said sum of seven thousand eight hundred and eighty pounds.

(2.) The Local Board may, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, and for the purposes of their water undertaking, borrow, on the security of the water rates and other revenue arising from their water undertaking, of the

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district fund and general district rate of the District, or upon any of such securities, either together or separately, any sum or sums, not exceeding in the whole the sum of six thousand pounds.

- (3.) For the purpose of raising money under the powers conferred by this Order the provisions of the Local Loans Act, 1875 (including the power of creating debenture stock), shall be available to the Local Board, and Sections 236 to 239, both inclusive, of the Public Health Act, 1875, shall apply to all money raised and borrowed under this Order, other than money borrowed under the provisions of the Local Loans Act, 1875.
- (4.) The moneys borrowed under the powers conferred by this Order shall be repaid within such period, not exceeding sixty years, as the Local Board, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, shall in each case determine, and the period so sanctioned shall be deemed to be the "prescribed period" within the meaning of the Local Loans Act, 1875, and is herein-after referred to as "the prescribed period."
- (5.) The Local Board shall repay the moneys borrowed under the powers conferred by this Order, other than money borrowed under the provisions of the Local Loans Act, 1875, either by equal annual instalments of principal, or of principal and interest, or by setting apart in every year as a sinking fund such a sum or sums as will, according to a reasonable calculation for the time being, with accumulations in the way of compound interest, be sufficient, after payment of all expenses, to pay off the money so borrowed within the prescribed period, and shall invest the same in the purchase of Exchequer bills or other Government securities, or in securities in which trustees are by law for the time being authorised to invest, or in mortgages, debentures, debenture stock, or other securities issued by any Local Authority, as defined by Section 34 of the Local Loans Act, 1875, other than the Local Board, the Local Board being at liberty from time to time to vary and transpose such investments.
- (6.) The Local Board may at any time apply the whole or any part of such sinking fund in or towards the discharge of the money for the repayment of which the fund is established: Provided that the Local Board pay into the fund each year, and accumulate until the whole of the money borrowed is discharged, a sum equivalent to the interest which would have been produced by the sinking fund or the part of the sinking fund so applied.
- (7.) The Local Board may, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, re-borrow moneys paid off otherwise than by instalments or by means of a sinking fund upon any of the securities mentioned in subdivision (2.) of this Article, for the purpose of discharging any loans contracted under that subdivision, other than loans contracted under the Local Loans Act, 1875: Provided that the money borrowed for such purpose shall be repaid in the manner provided by subdivisions (4.) and (5.) of this Article, and the time for repayment of the money so borrowed shall not, except with the sanction of the Local Government Board, extend beyond the unexpired portion of the prescribed period, and shall in no case be extended beyond the period of sixty years from the date of the original loan.
- (8.) The clerk to the Local Board shall, within twenty-one days after the expiration of each year ending on the Twenty-fifth day of March in which

any sum is required to be paid as an instalment or to be set apart for a sinking fund in respect of moneys borrowed under the powers conferred by this Order, transmit to the Local Government Board a return in such form as may be prescribed by that Board, and verified by statutory declaration, if so required by them, showing, for the year next preceding the making of such return, the amounts which have been paid as instalments, and the amounts which have been invested or applied for the purpose of such sinking fund, and the description of the securities upon which any investment has been made, and the purposes to which any portion of the sinking fund or investment or of the sums accumulated by way of interest has been applied during the same period, and the total amount (if any) remaining invested at the end of the year; and in the event of any wilful default in making such return, such clerk shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds, which shall be paid to the Local Government Board, and shall be recoverable by that Board in the same manner as penalties recoverable under the Public Health Act, 1875, in a summary manner, may be recovered by parties aggrieved within the meaning of that Act.

(9.) If it appears to the Local Government Board by that return, or otherwise, that the Local Board have failed to pay any instalment required to be paid, or to set apart any sum required for any sinking fund, or have applied any portion of the moneys set apart for any sinking fund, or of the sums accumulated by way of interest, to any purposes other than those authorised, the Local Government Board may by Order direct that the sum in such Order mentioned, not exceeding double the amount in respect of which default has been made, shall be paid by way of instalment, or be set apart and invested or applied as part of the sinking fund, and any such Order shall be enforceable by writ of mandamus to be obtained by the Local Government Board out of Her Majesty's High Court of Justice.

DISTRICT OF MARYPORT.

Provisional Order for partially repealing, altering, and amending certain Local Acts.

To the Trustees for the District and Harbour of Maryport, in the County of Cumberland, being the Urban Sanitary Authority for that District ; —

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the District of Maryport, in the County of Cumberland, as defined by the Maryport Improvement and Harbour Act, 1866, and modified by the Maryport District and Harbour Act, 1868, (herein-after referred to as "the District"), is an Urban Sanitary District, of which the Trustees for the District and Harbour of Maryport (herein-after referred to as "the Trustees") are the Urban Sanitary Authority, and the unrepealed portions of the said Local Acts, and of the Maryport District and Harbour (Gas) Act, 1877, and the Maryport Improvement Act, 1878 (which Local Acts are herein-after referred to collectively as "the Local Acts," and each Act separately as the Act of the year in which it was passed), and certain other Local Acts which do not affect the subject-matter of this Order, are in force in the District ;

And whereas by Section 11 of the Act of 1866 Sections 90 to 95 (both inclusive) of the Commissioners Clauses Act, 1847, were incorporated with that Act ;

And whereas by Section 71 of the Act of 1866 the Trustees are empowered to make byelaws with respect to streets and buildings ;

And whereas by Section 20 of the Act of 1877 the Trustees are, inter alia, empowered to make, supply, and sell gas within the limits of supply prescribed by the Act of 1866, and by the Maryport Town and Harbour Gas Act, 1869, herein-after referred to as "the gas limits" ;

And whereas by Section 41 of the Act of 1877 it is provided that for the purpose of diminishing the expense of assessing, making, levying, and collecting the gasworks rate under that Act, the Trustees may include the same in the district rate, and make, levy, collect, and recover such gasworks rate as part of the district rate ;

And whereas by Section 32 of the Act of 1877 the Trustees were empowered to borrow such moneys as they might think requisite for the purposes of that Act not exceeding in the aggregate twenty thousand pounds ;

And whereas by Section 51 of the Act of 1878 the Trustees were empowered to make and levy a rate to be called "the gasworks rate" :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by Section 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and by any other Statutes in that behalf, do hereby Order that, from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order (herein-after referred to as the commencement of this Order), the following provisions shall take effect:—

Art. I. Section 11 of the Act of 1866 shall be altered so as to provide that, except in so far as relates to the accounts of the Harbour Undertaking, Sections 90 to 95 (both inclusive) of the Commissioners Clauses Act, 1847, shall

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be deemed to have ceased to be incorporated with the Act of 1866, as from the Twenty-sixth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, and that from that date Sections 245, 247 (except so much thereof as has been repealed by the District Auditors Act, 1879), 249, and 250 of the Public Health Act, 1875, relating to accounts and their audit, and the provisions of the District Auditors Act, 1879, so far as the same are applicable, shall be deemed to have applied to such of the accounts of the Trustees under the Local Acts as relate to the District and to the audit of such accounts.

Art. II. Section 71 of the Act of 1866 shall be altered so as to provide that—

(1.) The Trustees shall have power to make byelaws for all or any of the following purposes; viz. :—

(a.) For preventing the use of any such building at any time when the means of entrance and exit are unsuitable or insufficient, or are not maintained in good order, repair, and efficient action, or are not properly used, or unless such means of entrance and exit and the mode of use thereof are in all respects in conformity with the requirements of the byelaws made in pursuance of this Article.

(2.) The Trustees may by any such byelaws determine to what extent or upon what conditions any duty or obligation thereby imposed or any expense thereby required to be incurred shall be discharged or defrayed by the owner or the occupier of any such building respectively:

Provided always, that no such determination shall be deemed to operate in such manner as to alter or affect any lease, contract, or agreement made or entered into between the landlord and tenant of any such building.

(3.) The Trustees may from time to time repeal, alter, amend, or vary any byelaws made under this Order, or may make other byelaws in lieu thereof or in addition thereto.

(4.) The provisions contained in the Public Health Act, 1875, with respect to byelaws, and the penalties which may be imposed thereby, and also the provisions of the said Act as amended by the Summary Jurisdiction Acts, with respect to the recovery and application of penalties, shall apply to all byelaws made, altered, amended, varied, or repealed by the Trustees under this Order, and to all penalties imposed thereby.

Art. III. Section 91 of the Act of 1866 shall be repealed, and in lieu thereof the following provisions shall take effect, viz.,—In addition to the water rents mentioned in Section 90 of the Act of 1866, the Trustees may demand and receive

for every watercloset beyond one and for every private bath in any dwelling-house or appurtenant thereto, any sum not exceeding five shillings per annum for every such watercloset, and any sum not exceeding ten shillings per annum for every such bath: Provided always, that if the Trustees make any charge for a supply of water to any watercloset or bath in accordance with the provisions of this Article, the like charge shall be made throughout the limits for the supply of water by the Trustees, subject nevertheless to the provisions of Section 92 of the Act of 1866.

Art. IV. Section 20 of the Act of 1877 shall be altered in such a manner that it shall be lawful for the Trustees to make, purchase, or hire, and to sell or let on hire within the gas limits, gas cooking ovens, stoves, ranges, meters, burners, or other fittings or apparatus used in the supply or consumption of gas for lighting, heating, motive power, or for other purposes.

Art. V. Section 51 of the Act of 1878 shall be altered (1.) by the omission therefrom of the words "as by the Act of 1877 provided," and (2.) by the addition thereto of the following proviso; viz,—

"Provided always, that the Trustees may, if they think fit, include such rate
" in, and make and levy the same as part of the district rate."

Art. VI. The Act of 1877 shall be further altered so as to provide as follows:

- (1.) The Trustees may, subject to the sanction of the Local Government Board, and for the purposes of their gas undertaking, as defined by Section 18 of the Act of 1877, borrow on the security of the revenue of their gas undertaking, and of the district fund and district rate, or of any or either of such securities, any sum or sums not exceeding in the whole the sum of ten thousand pounds, in addition to the sums which they are authorised to borrow under the Act of 1866, the Act of 1868, and the Act of 1877.
- (2.) For the purpose of raising money under this Order, the provisions of the Local Loans Act, 1875 (including the power of creating debenture stock), shall be available to the Trustees, and Sections 236 to 239, both inclusive, of the Public Health Act, 1875, shall apply to all money raised and borrowed under this Order, other than money borrowed under the provisions of the Local Loans Act, 1875.
- (3.) The moneys borrowed under the powers conferred by this Order shall be repaid within such period, not exceeding fifty years from the time of borrowing, as the Trustees, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, shall in each case determine, and such period shall be deemed to be the "prescribed period" within the meaning of the Local Loans Act, 1875, and is herein-after referred to as "the prescribed period."
- (4.) The Trustees shall repay the moneys borrowed under the powers conferred by this Order, other than money borrowed under the provisions of the Local Loans Act, 1875, either by equal annual instalments of principal, or of principal and interest, or by setting apart in every year as a sinking fund such a sum or sums as will, according to a reasonable calculation for the time being, with accumulations in the way of compound interest, be sufficient, after payment of all expenses, to pay off the moneys so borrowed within the prescribed period, and shall invest the same in the purchase of Exchequer bills or other Government securities, or in securities in which trustees are by law for the time being authorised to invest, or in mortgages, debentures, debenture stock,

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or other securities issued by any Local Authority, as defined by Section 34 of the Local Loans Act 1875, other than the Trustees, the Trustees being at liberty from time to time to vary and transpose such investments.

The Trustees may at any time apply the whole or any part of such sinking fund in or towards the discharge of the money for the repayment of which the fund is established: Provided that the Trustees pay into the fund each year, and accumulate until the whole of the money borrowed is discharged, a sum equivalent to the interest which would have been produced by the sinking fund or the part of the sinking fund so applied.
- (6.) The Trustees may re-borrow moneys borrowed under the powers conferred by this Order and paid off otherwise than by instalments or by means of a sinking fund upon any or either of the securities mentioned in subdivision (1) of this Article for the purpose of discharging any loans contracted under that subdivision, other than loans contracted under the Local Loans Act, 1875: Provided that the money borrowed for such purpose shall be repaid in the manner provided by subdivisions (3) and (4) of this Article, and the time for repayment of the money so borrowed shall not extend beyond the unexpired portion of the prescribed period.
- (7.) The clerk to the Trustees shall, within twenty-one days after the expiration of each year ending on the Twenty-fifth day of March in which any sum is required to be paid as an instalment or to be set apart for a sinking fund in respect of moneys borrowed under the provisions of this Order, transmit to the Local Government Board a return, in such form as may be prescribed by that Board, and verified by statutory declaration, if so required by them, showing, for the year next preceding the making of such return, the amounts which have been paid as instalments, and the amounts which have been invested or applied for the purpose of such sinking fund, and the description of the securities upon which any investment has been made, and the purposes to which any portion of the sinking fund or investment or of the sums accumulated by way of interest has been applied during the same period, and the total amount (if any) remaining invested at the end of the year; and in the event of any wilful default in making such return, such clerk shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds, which shall be paid to the Local Government Board, and shall be recoverable by that Board in the same manner as penalties recoverable under the Public Health Act, 1875, in a summary manner, may be recovered by parties aggrieved within the meaning of that Act.
- (8.) If it appears to the Local Government Board by that return, or otherwise, that the Trustees have failed to pay any instalment required to be paid, or to set apart any sum required for any sinking fund, or have applied any portion of the moneys set apart for any sinking fund, or of the sums accumulated by way of interest, to any purposes other than those authorised, the Local Government Board may, by Order, direct that the sum in such Order mentioned, not exceeding double the amount in respect of which default has been made, shall be paid by way of instalment, or be set apart and invested or applied as part of the sinking fund, and any such Order shall be enforceable by writ of mandamus to be obtained by the Local Government Board out of Her Majesty's High Court of Justice.

Art. IX. Sub-section (4.) of Section 29 of the Act of 1878 shall be altered by the insertion therein of the words “the expiration of each year ending on the Twenty-fifth day of March in” in lieu of the words “the First day of January succeeding each year during.”

SOUTHBOROUGH.

Provisional Order for altering the provisions of a Local Act and certain Confirming Acts.

To the Tunbridge Wells Local Board, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Tunbridge Wells, in the Counties of Kent and Sussex ;—

To the Southborough Local Board, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Southborough, in the said County of Kent ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS under the provisions of “The Tunbridge Wells Improvement Act, 1846” (herein-after referred to as “the Local Act”), certain Commissioners, called the Tunbridge Wells Improvement Commissioners, were appointed for carrying the Local Act into execution;

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And whereas by Section 70 of the Local Act it was enacted that the limits of the Local Act should comprehend and include the parts of the respective Parishes of Tunbridge and Speldhurst, in the County of Kent, and Frant, in the County of Sussex, respectively therein mentioned ;

And whereas the Local Act has been partially repealed and altered by the following Provisional Orders of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, viz.:

A Provisional Order dated the Seventh day of July, One thousand eight hundred and sixty, and duly confirmed by the Local Government Supplemental Act, 1860 (No. 2), (which Order and Act are herein-after respectively referred to as "the Order of 1860" and "the Confirming Act of 1860");

Two Provisional Orders both dated the Eleventh day of June, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and duly confirmed by the Local Government Supplemental Act, 1864 (No. 2), (which Orders and Act are herein-after respectively referred to as "the Orders of 1864" and "the Confirming Act of 1864");

A Provisional Order dated the Twenty-first day of June, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and duly confirmed by the Local Government Supplemental Act, 1866 (No. 4), (which Order and Act are herein-after respectively referred to as "the Order of 1866" and "the Confirming Act of 1866");

And whereas the District within which the Local Act as partially repealed and altered by the Orders of 1860, 1864, and 1866, and the Confirming Acts of 1860, 1864, and 1866, is in force, is an Urban Sanitary District (herein-after referred to as "the Tunbridge Wells District"), of which the Tunbridge Wells Local Board (by that name or by the name of the Tunbridge Wells Improvement Commissioners) are the Urban Sanitary Authority ;

And whereas the Local Government District of Southborough, in the County of Kent, is an Urban Sanitary District, of which the Southborough Local Board are the Urban Sanitary Authority :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by Section 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and by any other Statutes in that behalf, do hereby Order that, from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, the following provisions shall take effect, viz. :—

Art. I. The Local Act, as partially repealed and altered as aforesaid, shall be further altered so as to provide as follows, viz. :—

(1.) The portion of the Tunbridge Wells District described in the Schedule hereto shall cease to be within the limits of the Local Act as altered as aforesaid, or to form part of that Urban Sanitary District, and shall be included in the Local Government District of Southborough.

(2.) The Southborough Local Board shall, for the purposes of the Public Health Act, 1875, have jurisdiction to the exclusion of any other Sanitary Authority in the portion of the Tunbridge Wells District hereby included in the Local Government District of Southborough.

Provisional Order for altering certain Local Acts.

To the West Kent Main Sewerage Board; —

To the Beckenham Local Board, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Beckenham, in the County of Kent; —

To the Bromley Local Board, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Bromley, in the same County; —

To the Dartford Local Board, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Dartford, in the same County; —

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Bromley Union, in the same County, being the Sanitary Authority for the Rural Sanitary District of that Union; —

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Lewisham Union, in the same County, being the Sanitary Authority for the Rural Sanitary District of that Union; —

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by the West Kent Main Sewerage Act, 1875 (herein-after referred to as "the Act of 1875"), the West Kent Main Sewerage District (herein-after referred to as "the Sewerage District") was constituted, and the West Kent Main Sewerage Board (herein-after referred to as "the Sewerage Board") was established and incorporated, for the purpose of constructing and maintaining main sewers and other works for the more effectual sewerage of parts of the western portion of the County of Kent;

And whereas the Beckenham Local Board, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Beckenham, in the County of Kent, the Bromley Local Board, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Bromley, in the same County, the Dartford Local Board, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Dartford, in the same County, the Guardians of the Poor of the Bromley Union, in the same County, being the Sanitary Authority for the Rural Sanitary District of that Union (herein-after called "the Bromley Rural Authority"), and the Guardians of the Poor of the Lewisham Union, in the same County, being the Sanitary Authority for the Rural Sanitary District of that Union, are (subject as regards the Dartford Local Board to an Agreement dated the Twenty-sixth day of May, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, and made between that Local Board and the Sewerage Board) the Constituent Authorities (herein-after referred to as "the Constituent Authorities") of the Sewerage Board ;

And whereas by Section 9 of the Act of 1875 the Sewerage Board were empowered to make and maintain the works therein mentioned, and by Section 41 of that Act the powers of the Sewerage Board in relation to their sewage lands were defined ;

And whereas by Section 55 of the Act of 1875 it is enacted that where the occupier of a mill or work uses or desires to use a drain therefrom into any sewer of the Sewerage Board, or into any sewer of the Constituent Authority for the district in which the mill or work is situate communicating with a sewer of the Sewerage Board, the Sewerage Board may assess on him, for purposes of the Act of 1875, a main sewer rate of an amount proportionate to the extent of the use which he thereby makes of the sewer of the Sewerage Board, and to the benefit which he derives therefrom ;

And whereas by Section 26 of the West Kent Main Sewerage (Amendment) Act, 1879 (herein-after referred to as "the Act of 1879"), it was enacted that nothing in that Act contained should be held to prejudice, alter, or affect the provisions of the Agreement made the Fourth day of July, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, between the Sewerage Board, of the one part, and the Bromley Local Board, of the other part, and set forth in Schedule B. to that Act ;

And whereas under the powers of the Public Health Act, 1875, the Beckenham Local Board and the Bromley Local Board have together constructed a sewer called the "Ravensbourne Joint District Sewer" (which sewer drains portions of the Parishes of Beckenham and Bromley), and the Bromley Local Board and the Bromley Rural Authority have together constructed a sewer called the "Chislehurst Joint District Sewer" (which sewer drains portions of the Parishes of Chislehurst and Bromley), both of which sewers communicate with the sewers of the Sewerage Board ;

And whereas the Bromley Rural Authority has applied to the Local Government Board to alter and amend the Act of 1875 and the Act of 1879 :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by Section 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and by any other Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order that, from and after the date of the Act

namely,—

Art. I. Section 9 of the Act of 1875 shall be altered so as to have effect as if it had originally authorised the Sewerage Board to erect and maintain labourers' cottages, stables, and sheds to be used in connexion with the works and undertaking of the Sewerage Board.

Art. II. Section 41 of the Act of 1875 shall be altered so that the provisions therein contained shall apply to the lands numbered 85, 89, and 90 on the 25-inch Ordnance map of the Parish of Dartford acquired by the Sewerage Board for the purposes of that Act or any Act amending or extending the same.

Art. III. The Act of 1875 shall be altered so as to provide as follows ; viz.,—

(1.) The expression "work" in Section 55 shall include breweries, tanneries, factories, and other works of every description which, directly or indirectly, discharge water used in, or refuse resulting from, any process carried on therein, into any drain or sewer communicating, directly or indirectly, with a sewer of the Sewerage Board.

(2.) The provisions of Section 55 as altered by this Article shall extend and apply to every mill and every work discharging as aforesaid into any such drain or sewer, whether such mill or work be situate within or without the district of any of the Constituent Authorities, and whether the drain or sewer into which any such mill or work discharges as aforesaid is situate within or without the district of any of the Constituent Authorities.

(3.) The Sewerage Board may levy and recover summarily from the occupier of any such mill or work as aforesaid the amount of any main sewer rate assessed upon such occupier :

Provided always, that in assessing and levying any main sewer rate upon the occupier of any mill or work as aforesaid deduction shall be made of the amount payable by such occupier to any authority other than the Sewerage Board on account of any contribution to the Sewerage Board for the period in respect of which such main sewer rate is assessed.

(4.) Any occupier of any such mill or work as aforesaid who deems himself aggrieved by reason of any main sewer rate made, assessed, or levied under the provisions of the Act of 1875, as altered by this Order, whether the said rate shall be made, assessed, or levied in respect of any mill or work as aforesaid situate within or without the district of any of the constituent authorities, or by reason of any other occupier of any such mill or work as aforesaid, whether the same be situate within or without the district of any of the constituent authorities, not being assessed to such rate, or by reason of such other occupier being insufficiently assessed thereto, may appeal to the next Court of Quarter Sessions for the county, division, or place in which the cause of appeal has arisen under and according to the provisions of section 269 of the Public Health Act, 1875, as altered by the Summary Jurisdiction Acts ; and the Sewerage Board and any such other occupier as aforesaid may appear and defend the proceedings.

Provided that if any such appeal is made on the ground that some other such occupier as aforesaid has not been assessed to such rate, or has been

insufficiently assessed thereto, the notice of appeal shall specify such ground, and shall be served upon such occupier as well as upon the Sewerage Board.

Provided also, that for the purpose of any such appeal the fifteen days mentioned in sub-section (1) of section 31 of the Summary Jurisdiction Act, 1879, and the seven days mentioned in sub-section (2) of the same section shall be calculated from the demand of the rate instead of from the times in such sub-sections mentioned.

Art. IV. The Act of 1879 shall be altered in such a manner that paragraphs 3 and 4 of the Agreement set out in Schedule B. to that Act shall be repealed, and so as to provide that the Bromley Local Board shall contribute to the Sewerage Board in accordance with the provisions of Section 59 of the Act of 1875; and the other provisions of the said Act and the Act of 1879 relating to the contributions of Constituent Authorities shall apply to such contribution.

Art. V. The Act of 1879 shall be altered so as to empower the Sewerage Board to take over the Ravensbourne Joint District Sewer and the Chislehurst Joint District Sewer on payment to the Beckenham Local Board, and to the Bromley Local Board, and to the Bromley Rural Authority respectively, of such sum or sums of money as the Beckenham Local Board, the Bromley Local Board, and the Bromley Rural Authority, may respectively up to the time of the transfer have actually expended or paid in the construction and maintenance of the said sewers, including interest paid or accrued on any loans for the construction of the said sewers, but with a deduction of any outstanding balance of any such loan; and from the date of such transfer the Sewerage Board shall be liable to pay any outstanding balance of any such loan, together with the interest accruing thereon after the time of transfer. The moneys payable to the said three authorities in pursuance of this Article shall be applied by those authorities respectively in or towards the discharge, whether by a sinking fund or otherwise, of other loans raised by them for the purposes of the Public Health Act, 1875. Any doubt, difference, or question arising as to the construction of this Article, or as to the terms of transfer, or as to the mode of carrying into effect this Article, or otherwise in relation to the same, may, on the application of the Sewerage Board, or of either of the said Local Boards or of the said Rural Sanitary Authority, be referred to the Local Government Board, whose decision thereon shall be final and conclusive.

Art. VI. Sections 10, 11, and 22 of the Act of 1879 shall be repealed, except so far as they may have been acted upon, and the Act of 1879 shall be altered so as to provide that the Sewerage Board shall, for the purposes of Section 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, be deemed to be a Local Authority, and the Sewerage District to be the district of a Local Authority, within the meaning of the last-mentioned Act, and the provisions of Sections 297 and 298 of the Public Health Act, 1875, shall apply to any Provisional Orders under the Act of 1879 as hereby altered.

Art. VII. The costs, charges, and expenses properly incurred by the Bromley Rural Authority, and by the Sewerage Board, of and occasioned by and preliminary and incidental to this Order, and the confirmation of the same by Parliament, shall be paid by the Sewerage Board out of moneys received by

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them under the Act of 1875, and any Act amending or extending the same, and the provisions of Section 298 of the Public Health Act, 1875, shall apply to such costs, charges, and expenses.
