

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order made by the Education A.D. 1886. Department under the Elementary Education Act, 1870, to enable the School Board for London to put in force the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, and the Acts [25th September 1886.] amending the same.

THEREAS the Lords of the Committee of the Privy Council on Education have made a Provisional Order under the authority of the Elementary Education Act, 1870, on behalf of the 33 & 34 Vict. School Board for London, and it is requisite that the same should c. 75. be confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1. The fellowing Order shall be and is hereby confirmed, and Confirmation from and after the passing of this Act shall have full validity and of Order. force.
- 2. This Act may be cited as the Education Department Pro- Short title. visional Order Confirmation (London) Act, 1886.
- 3. Nothing contained in this Act or in the Order hereby confirmed shall extend to authorise the School Board for London to take, use, rights of the Duchy of enter upon, or interfere with any land, soil, or water, or any rights in Cornwall. respect thereof, belonging to Her Majesty, Her heirs or successors, in right of the Duchy of Cornwall, without the consent in writing of some two or more of such of the regular officers of the said Duchy, or of such other persons as may be duly authorised under the provisions of the Duchy of Cornwall Management Act, 1863, section thirty-nine, 26 & 27 Viet. to exercise all or any of the rights, powers, privileges, and authorities c. 49. by the said Act made exerciseable, or otherwise for the time being exerciseable in relation to the said Duchy, or belonging to the Duke

A.D. 1886. of Cornwall for the time being, without the consent of such Duke testified in writing under the seal of the Duchy of Cornwall first had and obtained for that purpose, or to take away, diminish, alter, prejudice, or affect any property, rights, profits, privileges, powers, or authorities vested in or enjoyed by Her Majesty, Her heirs or successors, in right of the Duchy of Cornwall, or in or by the Duke of Cornwall for the time being.

Saving with respect to houses of labouring classes.

- 4.—(1.) The Board shall not under the powers of this Act purchase or acquire in any parish in the Metropolis twenty or more houses which after the passing of this Act have been or on the fifteenth day of December last were occupied either wholly or partially by persons belonging to the labouring class as tenants or lodgers, unless and until-
 - (a.) They shall have obtained the approval of the Secretary of State for the Home Department to a scheme for providing new dwellings for such number of persons as were residing in such houses on the fifteenth day of December last, or for such number of persons as the Secretary of State shall after inquiry deem necessary, having regard to the number of persons on or after that date residing in such houses and working within one mile therefrom and to the amount of vacant suitable accommodation in the immediate neighbourhood of such houses, or to the place of employment of such persons, and to all the circumstances of the case; and
 - (b.) They shall have given security to the satisfaction of the Secretary of State for the carrying out of the scheme.
- (2.) The approval of the Secretary of State to any scheme under this section may be given either absolutely or conditionally, and after the Secretary of State has approved of any such scheme he may from time to time approve either absolutely or conditionally of any modifications in the scheme.
- (3.) Every scheme under this section shall contain provisions prescribing the time within which it shall be carried out, and shall require the new dwellings proposed to be provided under the scheme to be completed fit for occupation before the persons residing in the houses in respect of which the scheme is made are displaced: Provided that the Secretary of State may dispense with the last-mentioned requirement subject to such conditions, if any, as he may see fit.
- (4.) Any conditions subject to which the Secretary of State may have approved of any scheme, or of any modifications of any scheme under this section, or subject to which he may have dispensed with

the above-mentioned requirement shall be enforceable by a writ of A.D. 1886. Mandamus to be obtained by him out of the Queen's Bench Division of the High Court of Justice.

- (5.) If the Board acquire or appropriate any house or houses for the purposes of this Act in contravention of the foregoing provisions, or displace or cause to be displaced the persons residing in any house or houses in contravention of the requirements of the scheme, they shall be liable to a penalty of 500l. in respect of every such house, which penalty shall be recoverable by the Secretary of State by action in the High Court of Justice, and shall be carried to and form part of the Consolidated Fund of the United Kingdom: Provided that the Court may, if it think fit, reduce such penalty.
- (6.) For the purpose of carrying out any scheme under this section the Board may, subject to the approval of the Lords of the Committee of the Privy Council on Education, appropriate any lands for the time being belonging to them or which they have power to acquire, and may purchase such further lands as they may require.
- (7.) The Board may, subject to such approval as aforesaid, ou any lands belonging to them, or purchased or acquired under this section, erect such dwellings for persons of the labouring class as may be necessary for the purpose of any scheme under this section, and may sell, demise, or let, or otherwise dispose of such dwellings and any lands purchased or acquired as aforesaid.
- (8.) All lands on which any buildings have been erected or provided by the Board in pursuance of any scheme under this section shall, for a period of twenty-five years from the passing of this Act, be appropriated for the purpose of dwellings, and every conveyance, demise, or lease of such lands and buildings shall be endorsed with notice of this enactment: Provided that the Secretary of State may at any time dispense with all or any of the requirements of this subsection, subject to such conditions (if any) as he may see fit.
- (9.) All buildings erected or provided by the Board for the purpose of any scheme under this section shall be subject to the provisions of the Metropolitan Building Act, 1855, and the Metro. 18& 19 Vict. polis Management Act, 1855, and any Acts amending those respective 18 & 19 Vict. Acts.

(10.) The Secretary of State may direct any inquiries to be held by his inspectors which he may deem necessary in relation to any scheme under this section, and for giving effect to any of the provisions of this section; and every such inspector shall, for the

purposes of any such inquiry, have all such powers as inspectors of the Local Government Board have for the purposes of inquiries 38 & 39 Vict. directed by that Board under the Public Health Act, 1875.

(11.) The Board shall pay to the Secretary of State a sum to be fixed by him in respect of any expenses incurred by him in relation to any inquiries under this section, including the expenses of any witnesses summoned by the inspector holding the inquiry, and a sum to be fixed by the Secretary of State not exceeding

three guineas a day, for the services of such inspector.

(12.) For the purposes of this section the expression "labouring class" includes mechanics, artizans, labourers, and others working for wages, hawkers, costermongers, persons not working for wages but working at some trade or handicraft without employing others, except members of their own family, and persons, other than domestic servants, whose income does not exceed an average of thirty shillings a week, and the families of any of such persons who

may be residing with them.

(13.) The Board, and the Lords of the Committee of the Privy Council on Education, and the Secretary of State, are hereby respectively authorised and empowered to do all acts, matters, and things for carrying into full effect every such scheme as aforesaid, and the Board and the Lords of the Committee of the Privy Council on Education shall for that purpose have the same powers as they have under the Elementary Education Acts, 1870 to 1880, for the purpose of providing sufficient school accommodation for their district, including the power of borrowing money under section 36 & 37 Vict. ten of the Elementary Education Act, 1873, and the carrying of such scheme into effect shall be deemed to be a work for which

Provisional Order for putting in force the Lands Clauses
Consolidation Act, 1845.

At the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 11th day of May 1886.

Whereas the School Board for London require to purchase divers pieces of land for the purposes of the Elementary Education Act, 1870, and not having been able to purchase the same by agreement, require to put in force the provisions of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, and the Acts amending the same, which apply to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement:

And whereas the lands so required to be purchased are set forth in the schedule hereunder written:

And whereas the said Board have made due publication of the notices, and have duly served the same, according to the requirements of the Elementary Education Act, 1870, and have presented a petition to the Education Department praying that an Order may be made authorizing the said School Board to put in force the powers of the said Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement, in which petition were stated all the matters required by the said Elementary Education Act to be stated therein, and the same hath been supported by such evidence as the said Education Department required:

And whereas the said Department, having considered the said petition and the proofs of the publication and service of the proper notices, have thought fit to proceed with the case, and have caused inquiry to be made in the district of the said Board wherein the said lands are situate as to the propriety of the proposed Order:

Now, therefore, the said Department, having received a report after such inquiry, and having duly considered the same, do hereby declare that it is proper, and do hereby order accordingly that the said Board be authorized to put in force, with reference to the pieces of land set forth in the schedule hereunder written, the powers of the said Acts for the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement, or any of them.

Broadwell and Filkins Order.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Witney Union, in the counties of Oxford and Gloucester;

To the churchwardens and overseers of the poor of the parish of Broadwell, and to the overseers of the poor of the hamlet of Filkins, in the said union:

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by the provisions of "The Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amend"ment Act, 1876," as amended and extended by "The Poor Law Act, 1879," we,
the Local Government Board, are empowered to deal by Order with parts of
divided parishes;

And whereas the said parish of Broadwell and the said hamlet of Filkins are included in the said Witney Union, and the said hamlet is a parish within the meaning of the said Acts;

And whereas the said hamlet of Filkins is divided into three parts, and a proposal having been made that each of the said parts of the said hamlet should be amalgamated with some adjoining parish or place, or be otherwise dealt with under the said Acts, we caused local inquiry to be held, after notice duly given as required by the Act first above-mentioned, and report has been made to us thereon;

And whereas it is expedient that the several parts of the said hamlet of Filkins should be amalgamated with the said parish of Broadwell, which they adjoin, and the Education Department have given their sanction thereto, in accordance with section 4 of the Act first above-mentioned, so far as such arrangement may affect the constitution of any school district:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to us by the statutes in that behalf, we hereby order as follows:—

Article I.—All the said parts of the said hamlet of Filkins shall be amalgamated with the said parish of Broadwell.

Article II.—This Order shall take effect on the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, unless the same should in the meantime become provisional in pursuance of section 2 of the said "Divided "Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876."

Given under the Seal of Office of the Local Government Board, this twenty-second day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.
