



CHAPTER cxciii.

An Act for the Abolition of the Forest of Dean Turnpike Trust. A.D. 1888.  
[10th August 1888.]

WHEREAS it was provided by the Annual Turnpike Acts Continuance Act, 1885, that the Act relating to the Forest of Dean turnpike trust, specified in the schedule annexed hereto, should continue in force until the first day of November one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one and no longer, unless Parliament in the meantime should otherwise provide: 48 & 49 Vict. c. 37.

And whereas it is expedient that other provision should be made with respect to the continuance of the Act relating to the said turnpike trust:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. The Act specified in the schedule annexed hereto shall continue in force until the first day of November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight and no longer. Determination of Act. 21 & 22 Vict. c. lxxxvi.

2. This Act may be cited for all purposes as the Forest of Dean Turnpike Trust Abolition Act, 1888. Short title.
