



CHAPTER lxiii.

An Act to confirm certain Orders of the Local Government Board under the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879, relating to the Parishes of Aldham, Barford-Saint-Michael, Birch, Chappel, Copford, Deddington, East Donyland, Easthorpe, Fingringhoe, Fordham, Fryerning, Great Tey, Great Wigborough, Ingatestone, Inworth, Layer-Breton, Layer-de-la-Hay, Layer-Marney, Little Horksley, Little Tey, Little Wigborough, Marks Tey, Messing, Mount Bures, Peldon, Virley, Wakes Colne, West Bergholt, and Wormingford.

WHEREAS the Local Government Board have made the Orders set forth in the schedule hereto, under the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879 :

And whereas the said Orders have become provisional, and it is requisite that the same should be confirmed by Parliament :

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :

1. The Orders set out in the schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby confirmed, and shall come into operation from and after the twenty-fifth day of March next ensuing the date of this Act.

BANBURY AND WOODSTOCK UNIONS.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Banbury Union, in the Counties of Oxford, Northampton, and Warwick ;—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Woodstock Union, in the County of Oxford ;—

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Barford Saint Michael, in the said Banbury Union ;—

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Deddington, in the said Woodstock Union ;—

To the Highway Board for the Wootton Highway District ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879, We, the Local Government Board, are empowered to deal by Order with isolated and detached parts of divided Parishes, and in certain cases to deal with areas for highway purposes ;

And whereas the said Parish of Barford Saint Michael is included in the said Banbury Union, and the said Parish of Deddington is included in the said Woodstock Union ;

And whereas the said Parish of Barford Saint Michael is a Highway Parish, in the said Wootton Highway District ; and the said Parish of Deddington is, for highway purposes, divided into several Highway Parishes, one of which is the Highway Parish of Deddington, in the said Highway District ;

And whereas a proposal having been made that a certain part of the said Parish of Barford Saint Michael which is isolated and detached from the remainder, and is bounded by the Parish of Deddington and the Chapelry of Barford Saint John, and is the detached part of the Parish numbered 3 on Sheet X. (dated 1886) of the Six-Inch Ordnance Plan of the County of Oxford, should be separated from the said Parish of Barford Saint Michael and be amalgamated with some adjoining Parish or Place, or be otherwise dealt with under the said Acts, We caused local Inquiry to be held, after notice duly given as required by the Act first above-mentioned, and report has been made to Us thereon ;

And whereas it is expedient that the aforesaid isolated and detached part of the said Parish of Barford Saint Michael should be separated therefrom and be

amalgamated with the said adjoining Parish of Deddington ; and the Education Department have given their sanction thereto, in accordance with Section 4 of the Act first above-mentioned, so far as such arrangement may affect the constitution of any School District :

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows :—

Article I.—All the aforesaid isolated and detached part of the said Parish of Barford Saint Michael shall cease to be part of that Parish and shall be amalgamated with the said Parish of Deddington.

Article II.—The said isolated and detached part shall cease to be part of the said Highway Parish of Barford Saint Michael and shall be amalgamated with the said Highway Parish of Deddington.

Article III.—This Order shall take effect on the Twenty-fourth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, unless the same should in the meantime become Provisional in pursuance of Section 2 of the said Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876.

WHEREAS by the provisions of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, as amended and extended by the Poor Law Act, 1879, We, the Local Government Board, are empowered to deal by Order with parts of divided Parishes ;

And whereas the said Parishes of Fryerning and Ingatestone are included in the said Chelmsford Union ;

And whereas it is expedient that the said parts of the said Parish of Ingatstone should be amalgamated with the said adjoining Parish of Fryerning ; and the Education Department have given their sanction thereto, in accordance with Section 4 of the Act first above-mentioned, so far as such arrangement may affect the constitution of any School District :

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows:—

Article I.—All the parts of the said Parish of Ingatstone shall be amalgamated with the said Parish of Fryerning ; and the said Parish of Fryerning, as so altered, shall be designated the Parish of Ingatstone and Fryerning.

Article II.—This Order shall take effect on the Twenty-fourth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, unless the same should in the meantime become Provisional in pursuance of Section 2 of the said Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876.

And whereas the several Parishes named in Column 1 of the Schedule to this Order are divided Parishes within the meaning of the said Acts, certain parts thereof, which are described in Column 2, being isolated and detached or nearly detached from the remainder ; and a proposal having been made that each of the said parts should be separated from the Parish to which it now belongs and be amalgamated with some Parish which it adjoins, or be otherwise dealt with under the said Acts, We caused local Inquiry to be held, after notice duly given as required by the Act first above-mentioned, and report has been made to Us thereon ;

And whereas it is expedient that each of the aforesaid parts should be separated from the Parish to which it now belongs, and should be amalgamated with the Parish named in Column 3 of the said Schedule opposite to the description of such part, and the Education Department have given their sanction thereto, in accordance with Section 4 of the Act first above-mentioned, so far as such arrangement may affect the constitution of any School District :

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows:—

Article I.—The several parts described in Column 2 of the Schedule to this Order, being parts of the several Parishes named in Column 1 thereof, shall respectively cease to be parts of such Parishes, and each of such parts shall be amalgamated with the adjoining Parish which is named in Column 3 opposite to the description of such part.

Article II.—This Order shall take effect on the Twenty-fourth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, unless the same should in the meantime become Provisional in pursuance of Section 2 of the said Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876.
