



CHAPTER xxiv.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the Local Government Board relating to the Boroughs of Accrington and Sunderland, the Local Government Districts of Altrincham, Brentford, Haworth, Heston and Isleworth, Swindon New Town, and Walton on the Hill, and the Rural Sanitary Districts of the Belper, Chorley, and King's Norton Unions. A.D. 1889.
[24th June 1889.]

WHEREAS the Local Government Board have made the Provisional Orders set forth in the Schedule hereto, under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875 :

38 & 39 Vict.
c. 55.

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be confirmed by Parliament, and that the provision herein contained should be enacted with reference thereto :

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :

1. The Orders set out in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby confirmed, and all the provisions thereof shall have full validity and force. Orders in Schedule confirmed.

2. The sanitary authorities mentioned in the said Orders shall not under the powers of this Act or of those Orders, without the consent of the Local Government Board, purchase or acquire in any city, borough, or other urban sanitary district, or in any parish or part of a parish not being within an urban sanitary district, ten or more houses which, after the passing of this Act, have been or on the fifteenth day of December last were occupied either wholly or partially by persons belonging to the labouring class as tenants or lodgers. Special provision as to houses of labouring class.

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Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 5) Act, 1889.

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For the purposes of this section the expression "labouring class" includes mechanics, artizans, labourers, and others working for wages, hawkers, costermongers, persons not working for wages, but working at some trade or handicraft without employing others except members of their own family, and persons, other than domestic servants, whose income does not exceed an average of thirty shillings a week, and the families of any of such persons who may be residing with them.

Short title.

3. This Act may be cited as the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 5) Act, 1889.
