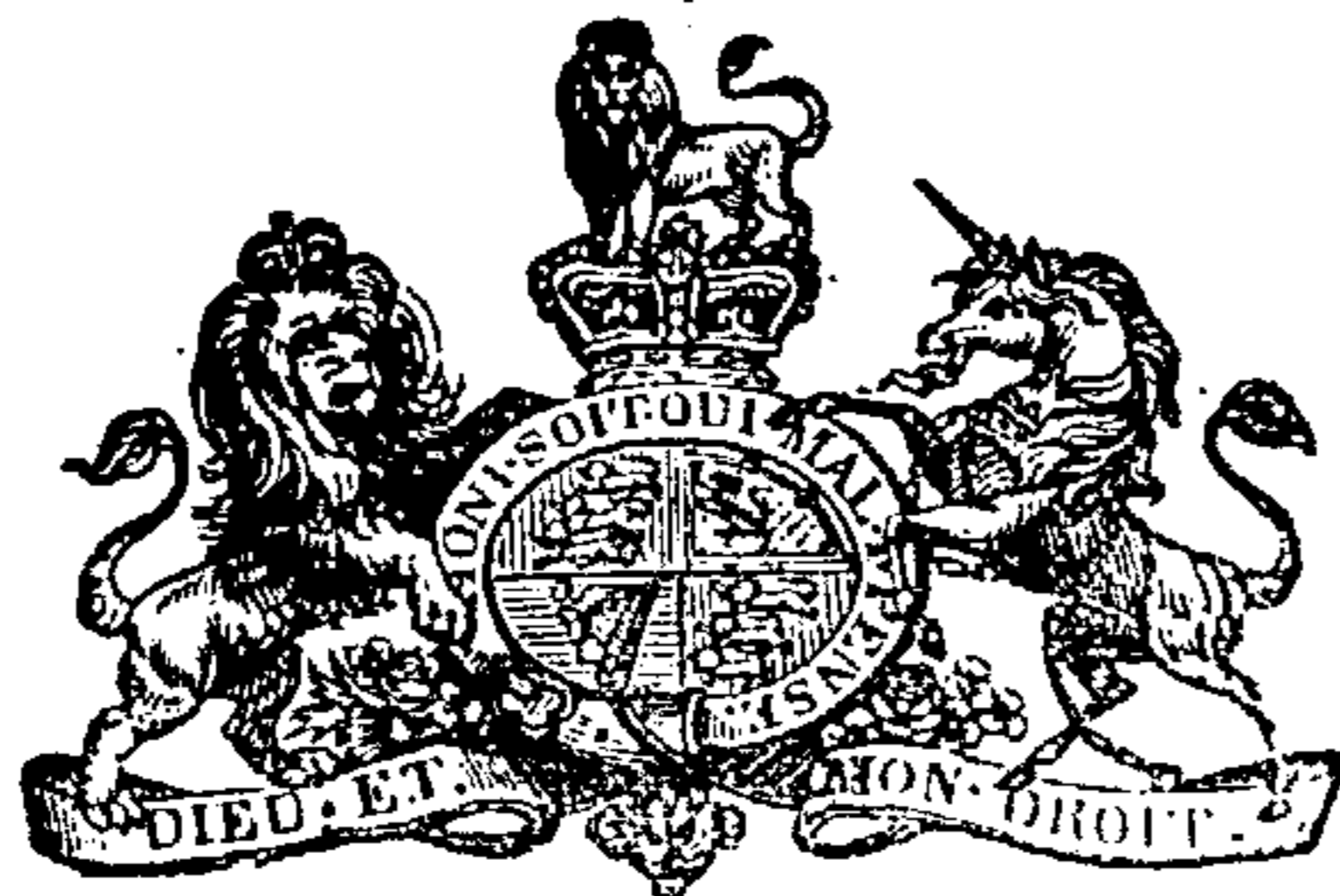

CHAPTER lxxxvi.

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board for Ireland relating to Waterworks in the Town of Downpatrick. A.D. 1890.
[4th July 1890.]

WHEREAS the Local Government Board for Ireland have made the Provisional Order set forth in the Schedule hereto annexed, under the provisions of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878: 41 & 42 Vict.
c. 52.

And whereas it is requisite that the said Order should be confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. The Order set out in the Schedule hereto annexed shall be and the same is hereby confirmed, and all the provisions thereof shall, from and after the passing of this Act, have full validity and force. Order in

WHEREAS, the Guardians of the Poor of the Downpatrick Union (hereinafter called the Sanitary Authority), being the Rural Sanitary Authority of the Rural Sanitary District consisting of the Downpatrick Poor Law Union and including the Town of Downpatrick, in the County of Down, are about to construct Waterworks for the purpose of supplying Water to the said Town for drinking and domestic purposes, and have presented a Petition to the Local Government Board for Ireland (hereinafter called the Local Government Board) in pursuance of the provisions of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, praying that they may be allowed to put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement with reference to certain lands, lands covered with water, and rights to take and convey water required for the purposes of the said Waterworks :

And whereas, the Sanitary Authority has deposited in the Office of the Local Government Board, in Dublin, Plans, and a Book of Reference (hereinafter called the deposited Plans and Book of Reference) showing the Works intended to be executed, and the lands, lands covered with water, water, and rights to take and convey water, required for the purposes of the said Works :

And whereas, all advertisements and notices required by the said Act having been previously duly published, served, and given, the Local Government Board has caused a Local Inquiry to be made as to the propriety of assenting to the prayer of the said Petition, and it appears to the Local Government Board to be proper to assent thereto :

It is ordered by the Local Government Board as follows :—

Compulsory

1. From and after the time of the confirmation of this Order by Parliament, the Sanitary Authority shall be empowered to put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement with reference to the lands, lands covered with water, water, and rights to take and convey water, described in the deposited Plans and Book of Reference.
2. In this Order the expression "Lands Clauses Acts" means the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, as the same is amended by the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts Amendment Act, 1860; the Railways Act (Ireland), 1851; the Railways Act (Ireland), 1860; the Railways Act (Ireland), 1864; and the Railways Traverse Act; and the terms "Land" and "Lands" in the said Acts, shall, for the purposes of this Order, extend to and include lands, messuages buildings, easements, and hereditaments of any tenure, and water, lands covered with water, and rights to take and convey water.

3. The powers of compulsory purchase conferred by this Order shall not be exercised after the expiration of three years from the time of the confirmation of this Order by Parliament. Duration of Order.
4. All the costs, charges, and expenses of and incidental to the applying for, preparing, obtaining, and confirming this Order and otherwise in relation thereto, shall be paid by the Sanitary Authority, and charged upon the area of charge declared by an Order of the Local Government Board bearing date the Fourteenth day of February, 1878, to be the area of charge for all expenses incurred, or which might be incurred, for the purpose of providing a supply of water to the said Town of Downpatrick, viz., the Townland of Demesne of Down, situate in the Downpatrick Electoral Division of the said Union. Provision for costs and expenses.
5. This Order may be cited for all purposes as the "Downpatrick Waterworks Provisional Order, 1890." Short title of Order.
