CHAPTER xcii.

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board for Ireland relating to Wexford. A.D. 1890.

[4th July 1890.]

WHEREAS the Local Government Board for Ireland have made the Provisional Order set forth in the schedule hereto annexed under the provisions of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878: 41 & 42 Vict. c. 52.

And whereas it is requisite that the said Order should be confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. The Order set out in the schedule hereto annexed shall be and the same is hereby confirmed, and all the provisions thereof shall, from and after the passing of this Act, have full validity and force. Order in schedule confirmed.

2. This Act may be cited as the Local Government Board (Ireland) Provisional Order Confirmation (Wexford) Act, 1890. Short title.

SCHEDULE.

THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD FOR IRELAND.

WEXFORD BURIAL GROUND.

Provisional Order.

WHEREAS the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of Wexford (herein-after called the Burial Board) being the Urban Sanitary Authority and Burial Board of the Urban Sanitary District consisting of the Borough of Wexford have at a special meeting duly convened in pursuance of the Public Health (Ireland) Act 1878, section 172, determined that a new Burial Ground shall be provided for the said District, and are about to take the lands and premises herein-after mentioned for the purpose of forming such Burial Ground :

And whereas the said lands are not nearer than one hundred yards to any dwelling-house, and are not situated in any urban sanitary district :

And whereas the Burial Board has presented a petition to the Local Government Board for Ireland (herein-after called the Local Government Board) in pursuance of the said Act praying that the Burial Board may be allowed to put in force the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement, with reference to the lands and premises herein-after mentioned, which are required for the said Burial Ground :

And whereas all advertisements and notices required by the said Act having been previously published served and given, the Local Government Board has caused a local inquiry to be held as to the propriety of assenting to the prayer of the said petition and it appears to the Local Government Board to be proper to assent thereto :

It is ordered by the Local Government Board as follows :—

Compulsory
powers to take
land.

1. From and after the time of the confirmation of this Order by Parliament, the Burial Board shall be empowered to put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement with reference to the lands and premises following :—Part of the lands of Crosstown containing seven acres and thirty-nine perches statute measure or thereabouts in the possession of Patrick Furlong or those claiming under him, bounded on the north and west by land in the possession of the said Patrick Furlong or those claiming under him on the east by land in the possession of the said Patrick Furlong or those claiming under him and David Furlong (representatives of Johanna Furlong) and on the south by land in the possession of the said David Furlong and Richard McDonald and secondly that part of the lands of Crosstown aforesaid containing three roods and nine perches statute measure or thereabouts part of which is in the possession of Peter Cassin and other part in the possession of the said David Furlong lying between the public

road leading from Wexford to Crosstown and the said lands firstly mentioned bounded on the east by land in the possession of the said David Furlong on the north by land in the possession of the said David Furlong and the said Patrick Furlong on the west by land in the possession of the said Peter Cassin, said David Furlong and said Richard MacDonald and on the south by the said public road leading from Wexford to Crosstown all which lands are situate in the Parish of Ardavan, Barony of Shelmalier East and County Wexford and are delineated in a plan thereof deposited at the Town Clerk's Office in Wexford.

2. In this Order, the expression the Lands Clauses Acts means the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act 1845, as the same is amended by the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts Amendment Act 1860, the Railways Act (Ireland) 1851, the Railways Act (Ireland) 1860, the Railways Act (Ireland) 1864, and the Railways Traverse Act.

3. The power of compulsory purchase given by this Order shall not be exercised after the expiration of three years from the time of the confirmation of this Order by Parliament.

4. The costs and expenses of and incident to the application for preparation making and confirmation of this Order shall be paid by the Burial Board.

Costs of Order.

5. This Order may be cited and referred to for all purposes as the Wexford Burial Ground Provisional Order 1890.
