

CHAPTER xcviii.

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order made by the Board of A.D. 1890.

Trade under the General Pier and Harbour Act, 1861,
relating to Saint Mary's (Scilly). [25th July 1890.]

WHEREAS a Provisional Order made by the Board of Trade under the General Pier and Harbour Act, 1861, is not of any 24 & 25 Vict. validity or force whatever until the confirmation thereof by Act of Parliament:

And whereas it is expedient that the Provisional-Order-made by the Board of Trade under the said Act, and set out in the schedule to this Act, be confirmed by Act of Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. The Order set out in the schedule to this Act shall be and Confirmation of Order in the same is hereby confirmed, and all the provisions thereof in schedule.

manner and form as they are set out in the said schedule shall, from and after the passing of this Act, have full validity and force.

2. This Act may be cited as the Pier and Harbour Order Short title. Confirmation (No. 4) Act, 1890.

SCHEDULE.

ST. MARY'S (SCILLY).

Order for the maintenance and regulation of a Harbour Pier and Works at St. Mary's in the Islands of Scilly in the County of Cornwall.

Undertakers.

1. Thomas Algernon Smith Dorrien Smith of Trescoe Abbey in the Islands of Scilly his executors administrators assigns and successors in title during the continuance of the present lease of the Scilly Islands dated the 17th day of July 1886 (in this Order called the lease of 1886) and after the expiration or sooner determination of that lease the Personage for the time being entitled to the Duchy of Cornwall shall be the Undertakers for carrying this Order into execution and shall have and may exercise the powers privileges and authorities conferred by this Order.

Limits of Order.

2. The limits within which the Undertakers shall have authority and which shall be deemed the limits to which this Order and the power to levy rates extend shall comprise the harbour and all piers and works by this Order authorized and the works accesses and conveniences connected therewith and the area below high-water mark comprised south-eastward of an imaginary line drawn from the Newman Rock off the north-west headland of Garrison Hill at Saint Mary's in the Islands of Scilly and running thence in a direct line to the westernmost end of Newford Island which limits are in this Order termed the limits of this Order and any buoy belonging to the Undertakers if moored within six hundred feet of the head of the existing pier shall when used by vessels be deemed to be included within such limits.

Order to apply works.

3. This Order shall apply to the existing harbour pier and works of the Under-takers and the conveniences connected therewith in the same manner as if such harbour produced in the converse given by this Order.

Incorporation of Lands Clauses Act.

4. The Lands Clauses Consolidation Let 1845 and the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts Amendment Act 1860 except the provisions of the former Act relating to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement and with respect to the entry upon lands by the Promoters of the Undertaking shall be incorporated with this Order.

Power to take lands by agreement.

5. For the purposes of the works authorized by this order the Undertakers may from time to time by agreement enter on take and use all or such parts of the lands and foreshore and bed of the sea shown on the plans deposited with reference to this Order as they may think requisite for the purposite es of this Order.

Description of works.

6. The works authorized and confirmed by this Order comprise the for allowing:—
(1) A pier breakwater slipway jetty quay and landing place with all proper works approaches and other conveniences connected therewith for the embarking and landing of passengers goods fish and merchandize and for other purposes commencing at a point at the end of the High Street St. Mary's near the north end of the house in the occupation of Robert Pender in the Island of St. Mary's Isle of Scilly Cornwall extending in a northerly direction and then in a north-easterly direction a total length (including the

existing pier) of One thousand and seventeen feet or thereabouts with an arm One hundred and fifty feet long extending in a south-east direction from the easterly portion of the said works which said pier breakwater slipway jetty quay landing-place works and approaches will be situate in or abut upon the Island of Saint Mary's in the Islands of Scilly aforesaid and so that the pier and works to which this order relates are throughout to be deemed to comprise the existing pier:

(2.) The sufficient and effectual dredging scouring cleansing and removing of any rocks banks of sand or mud within or adjoining the said Pier harbour and works or in the approach thereto:

And the Undertakers may construct and maintain in connection with the said pier and works all necessary wharves landing-places sheds houses and other necessary and incidental works and conveniences connected therewith Provided that works authorized by this section below high-water mark shall not be commenced without the assent of the Board of Trade thereto having been first tained.

7. ect to the provisions of this Order the Undertakers may in the execution Power to of the works thorized by this Order deviate vertically from the levels of such works as shown the deposited sections to any extent not exceeding five feet.

8. Every person who wilfully obstructs in any manner the execution of or remainstance. damages in any manner any of the works authorised by this Order shall be obstruction and damage guilty of an offence and for every such offence shall be liable to a penalty not to works. exceeding five pounds.

9. When a certificate has been obtained from the Board of Trade that all Power to consents and approvals on the part of the Board of Trade required under this levy rates. Order or otherwise necessary for the due construction of the works authorized by this Order have been given the Undertakers may subject and according to the provisions of this Order demand recover and receive for the use of the works or any part thereof in respect of vessels boats passengers animals fish goods minerals and other matters and things described in the schedule to this Order any sums not exceeding the several rates specified in such schedule and all such rates on vessels and boats shall be payable and paid by the owner agent master skipper or other person in charge of such vessels and boats.

10. The Undertakers may demand recover and receive such rates or other Rates for use considerations as they may think reasonable for the use of any warehouses of warehouses &c. offices sheds moorings weighing machines cranes lifts and other works buildings machinery and conveniences belonging to the Undertakers for the use of which rates are not specially fixed in the schedule to this Order.

11. The Undertakers may from time to time lease the rates authorized by this Power to Order for any period not exceeding seven years and for such rent or consideration and on such terms and conditions as they may think fit and the lessee shall have and may exercise during the continuance of his lease the same powers of levying and recovering the rates as the Undertakers have or might exercise under The Harbours Docks and Piers Clauses Act 1847 and this Order and shall be subject to all the provisions as to accounts or otherwise to which the Undertakers are subject under this Order but during the continuance of the lease of 1886 the persons entitled thereunder as Undertakers shall not grant any lease under this Order for any term extending beyond the continuance of the lease of 1886.

St. Mary's (Scilly).
Rates may be levied though works not completed.

12. When and so soon as it shall be at any time or from time to time certified in writing under the hand of an officer to be appointed for the purpose by the Board of Trade and paid by the Undertakers that the works authorized by this Order have been so far completed as to afford accommodation for the landing and embarking or shipping of passengers and goods by means of such works the Undertakers may notwithstanding the twenty-fifth section of The Harbours Docks and Piers Clauses Act 1847 and although the whole of the works authorized by this Order shall not then have been completed demand receive and recover such of the rates or such proportion of all or any of the rates specified in the schedule to this Order as shall in the opinion of the Board of Trade be commensurate to the accommodation afforded.

Power to compound for rates.

13. The Undertakers may from time to time confer vary or extinguish exemptions from and enter into compositions with any person or persons with respect to the payment of the rates authorized by this Order but so that no preference be in any case given and that anything done under this section not prejudice the other provisions of this Order.

Board of Trade may reduce rates.

14. If at any time and from time to time the clear annual average of the then three last preceding value payment of all expenses and outgoings shall exceed interest at the rate of ten per centum per annum on the entire sum from time to time appearing to the Board of Trade to have been expended in executing the pier and the works authorized by this Order including in such expenditure the sum of 10,000l. already expended on the existing pier and works the Board of Trade may if in their discretion they think fit on application in writing from six or more of the owners of vessels or boats using the pier and after hearing the Undertakers reduce the rates leviable under this Order to such amounts as will be sufficient to provide the aforesaid interest at the rate of ten per centum per annum with power to the Board of Trade at any time and from time to time to raise them again to not exceeding the amounts specified in the schedule to this Order.

Annual account to be sent to Board of Trade.

15. The Undertakers within one month after sending to the clerk of the peace a copy of their annual account in abstract (which account shall be made up at the end of the day on the 25th day of March in each year) shall send a copy of the same to the Board of Trade and the sixteenth section of the General Pier and Harbour Act 1861 Amendment Act shall apply to and include any and every such account—If the Undertakers refuse or neglect to comply with this provision they shall for every such refusal or neglect be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

Certain fishing vessels under stress of weather exempt from rates.

...

16. Fishing vessels belonging to countries with which for the time being treaties exist exempting from duties and port charges such vessels when forced by stress of weather to seek shelter in the ports or on the coasts of the United Kingdom shall when forced by stress of weather to make use of the harbour pier or works and not breaking bulk while making use thereof be exempt from rates leviable under this Order.

Exemption of Board of Trade officers.

17. Officers of the Board of Trade being in the execution of their duty shall at all times have free ingress to and passage and egress on into along through and out of the harbour pier and works by land and with their vessels and otherwise without payment.

18. All persons going to or returning from any life-boat or using any apparatus for saving life and being persons either belonging to the crew of the life-boat or to the coastguard or being persons for the time being actually employed in saving life or in exercising or using the life-boat or the apparatus for saving life and also all persons brought ashore from any vessel in distress shall at all times have free ingress passage and egress to or along and from the harbour pier and works without payment.

St. Mary's (Scilly). Life-boat crew to be exempt from tolls.

19. The officers of the coastguard and all other persons for the time being actually employed in connection with the life-boat or the apparatus for saving apparatus may be attached to life may either permanently or temporarily and from time to time without harbour. payment attach or cause to be attached to any part of the harbour pier or works spars and other apparatus for saving life and may also either in course of using or of exercising the apparatus for saving life fire rockets over the harbour pier or works.

Life-saving

20. The rates received under this order shall be applied for the purposes and Application of in the Order following and not otherwise (that is to say):—

receipts.

- 1. In paying the costs of and connected with the preparation and making of this Order:
- 2. In paying the expenses of the maintenance repair improvement management and regulation of the pier and works authorised by this Order:
- 3. The surplus revenue (if any) after providing for the purposes aforesaid shall belong to the Undertakers for their use.
- 21. Sections sixteen seventeen eighteen and nineteen of The Harbours Docks Portions of and Piers Clauses Act 1847 shall not be incorporated with this Order but the Undertakers shall at their own expense when required by the Board of Trade provide to the satisfaction of the Board of Trade a site near the pier and build on such site a house and other proper accommodation for a life-boat rocket apparatus and other life saving apparetua and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten powers for every calendar month during which they omit to provide such accommodation after having been required so to do by the Board of Trade.

Harbours Clauses Act excepted.

22. No vessel shall without the consent of the Undertakers or their harbour master anchor within the limits of this Order.

23. The Undertakers may from time to time make bye-laws—

- (1.) For the regulation and control of vessels and boats within the limits of this Order:
- (2.) For the regulation and control of all persons who shall be employed within the limits of this Order and of goods ballast and traffic within those limits:
- (3.) For setting apart and appropriating any portion of the pier or works or conveniences to or for the use and accommodation of any particular trades persons companies vessels or class of vessels or goods: and
- (4.) For providing that no person company or vessel shall make use of any such parts of the pier or works or conveniences so set apart and appropriated without the consent in writing of the Undertakers under the hand of the harbour master:

But such bye-laws shall not come into operation until the same have received the the allowance and confirmation of the Board of Trade which shall be sufficient for all purposes.

Vessels not to anchor within limits of Order without consent.

Power to make bye-laws.

As to lights during construction of works.

24. Before commencing the works authorized by this Order the Undertakers shall apply to the Board of Trade for directions as to the lights to be exhibited and shall in all respects obey any directions given upon such application or afterwards from time to time given as to lights by the Board of Trade during the construction of the works and compliance with directions so given shall satisfy and be in lieu of every other statutory requirement as to lights during the construction of the works by this Order authorized If the Undertakers neglect to observe any directions of the Board of Trade as to lights during the construction of the works they shall for each offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

As to lights after completion of works. 25. After completion or permanent discontinuance or abandonment of the works authorized by this Order the Undertakers shall at the outer extremity of the works or the completed portions thereof exhibit for all or any part of the time from sunset to sunrise and according to the requirements of the traffic and the season of the year such light or lights (if any) as shall from time to time be directed by the Corporation of Trinity House Deptford Strond and shall apply to that Corporation for directions as to lighting and the Undertakers shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds for every calendar month during which they omit so to apply.

Provision against danger to navigation.

26. In case of injury to or destruction or decay of the pier or works or any part thereof the Undertakers shall lay down such buoys exhibit such lights or take such other means for preventing so far as may be danger to navigation as shall from time to time be directed by the Corporation of Trinity House Deptford Strond and shall apply to that Corporation for directions as to the means to be taken and the Undertakers shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds for every calendar month during which they omit so to apply or refuse or neglect to obey any direction given in reference to the means to be taken.

Powers to cease in certain events.

- 27. In the following cases (that is to say):—
- (1.) If within two years from the date of the passing of the Act confirming this Order the works authorized by this Order should not be substantially commenced; or
- (2.) If such works after having been commenced should be suspended for twelve consecutive calendar months;

the powers by this Order given for executing such works or otherwise in relation thereto shall cease to be exercised except as to so much of such works as shall be then completed unless the time for completion be extended by the special direction of the Board of Trade.

A certificate from the Board of Trade to the effect that the works have not been substantially commenced or that they have been virtually suspended for twelve consecutive calendar months shall for the purposes of this Order be conclusive evidence of the fact stated in such certificate.

Saving right under Crown Lands Act 1866. 28. This Order shall not be taken as a consent to the surrender of any rights interests powers authorities or privileges transferred to the management of the Board of Trade by the Crown Lands Act 1866 nor shall any works under this Order be commenced within the limits affected by any such rights interests powers authorities or privileges without the assent of the Board of Trade having been first obtained.

29. This Order shall not be taken as a consent to the surrender of nor shall anything in this Order prejudice or affect any property interest rights powers authorities or privileges of Her Majesty in right of Her Crown which are under the management of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Woods or either of them.

30. The consent of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales in right of his Duchy of Cornwall signified to this Order shall not be taken as a consent to the surrender of and nothing in this Order contained shall prejudice or affect any woods. property rights powers authorities or privileges of his Royal Highness or of the Possessor of the Duchy of Cornwall for the time being.

31. This Order may be cited as The St. Mary's (Scilly) Pier Order 1890.
