

CHAPTER clvii.

An Act to confirm an Order of the Boundary Commissioners for Scotland relating to the parish of New or East Kilpatrick in the counties of Dumbarton and Stirling.

A.D. 1891.

[21st July 1891.]

THEREAS the Boundary Commissioners for Scotland made the order set forth in the schedule hereto, but in pursuance 52 & 53 Vict. of the provisions of section forty-nine, subsection (4), of the Local c. 50. Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, the said order, having on the petition of the county council of the county of Stirling (which petition has not been withdrawn) been laid before Parliament, is to be deemed a provisional order only, and it is requisite that it should be confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Confirmation of Order in

1. The order set out in the schedule hereto shall be and the schedule. same is hereby confirmed, and all the provisions thereof shall have full validity and force, and shall come into operation as from the fifteenth day of May one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

Short title.

2. This Act may be cited as the New or East Kilpatrick Order Confirmation Act, 1891.

SCHEDULE.

ORDER BY THE BOUNDARY COMMISSIONERS FOR SCOTLAND.

COUNTIES OF DUMBARTON AND STIRLING.

PARISH OF NEW OR EAST KILPATRICK.

WHEREAS the parish of New or East Kilpatrick is situated partly in the county of Dumbarton and partly in the county of Stirling:

And whereas it appears to us, after communicating with the authorities and others interested, and considering all objections made to the terms of our draft Order, to be expedient to alter and adjust the boundaries of the said counties in manner herein-after provided:

Now, therefore, we, the Boundary Commissioners for Scotland, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, determine and order as follows:

- I. Subject to the provisions of the said Act, so much of the parish of New or East Kilpatrick as is situated in the county of Stirling shall cease to be part of that county, and shall form part of the county of Dumbarton.
- II. The present county councillor for the police burgh of Milngavie shall cease to act as a member of the County Council of Stirling, and shall, until the next election of a county council, be an additional member of the County Council of Dumbarton, with all the powers, rights, and duties of a county councillor for a police burgh.
- III. This Order shall come into operation on the 15th day of May 1891. Given under our hands and common seal this 24th day of October 1890.
