

CHAPTER lxi.

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order under the 'Thames Valley Drainage Act, 1871, to enable the Thames Valley Drainage Commissioners to put in force the compulsory clauses of the Lands Clauses Acts relating to certain lands in the parish of Northmoor, in the county of Oxford, and in the parish of Appleton with the township of Eaton, in the county of Berks. [3rd July 1891.]

WHEREAS the Board of Agriculture have, in pursuance of the Thames Valley Drainage Act, 1871, duly made the Provisional Order contained in the schedule to this Act annexed, and it is by the said Act provided that no such Order shall be of any validity whatever until it shall have been confirmed by Parliament, and it is expedient that the said Order should be so confirmed :

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :

1. The Provisional Order contained in the schedule hereunto annexed is hereby confirmed, and from and after the passing of this Act shall be deemed to be a Public General Act of Parliament and to take effect accordingly.

THAMES VALLEY DRAINAGE.

Provisional Order to enable the Thames Valley Drainage Commissioners to put in force the compulsory clauses of the Lands Clauses Acts.

To the Thames Valley Drainage Commissioners, and to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Thames Valley Drainage Commissioners require to purchase and take the lands described in the schedule hereto for the purpose of constructing a lock and weir across the River Thames:

Now therefore the Board of Agriculture, in pursuance of the powers given to them by the Thames Valley Drainage Act, 1871, the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and by any other statutes in that behalf, do hereby empower the Thames Valley Drainage Commissioners, from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, to put in force, with reference to the lands described in the schedule hereto, and for the purposes aforesaid, the powers of the Lands Clauses Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement.

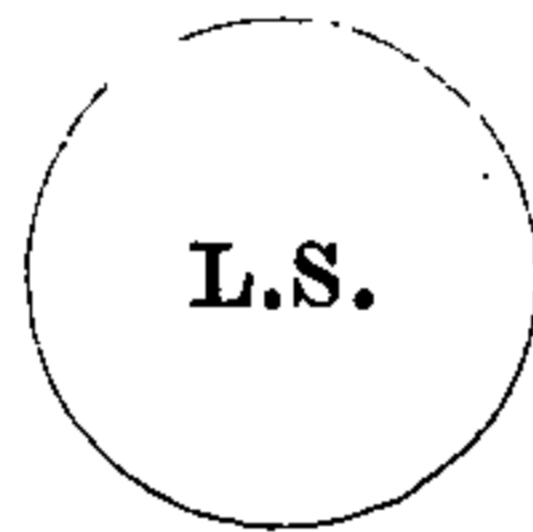
